

THE OLYMPIC STADIUM AND GROUNDS

(From *British Olympic Journal*)

The ground, where in 1928 the Olympic Games will be held, covers an area of 40 acres (including grounds for training and motor car parking, 128 acres), is situated in the southern part of central Amsterdam. Many tram lines which will be extended to quite near the Stadium, will bring visitors within twenty minutes to the center of the Dutch capital. The large area for the parking of motor cars, with its own repair shops and boxes, is able to accommodate 4,000 private cars. Besides the main Stadium, there will be a swimming stadium, a pavilion for fencing and one for indoor sports, a cricket ground and a lawn tennis stadium (three center and ten other hard courts). Further, a post office will be erected, and a large Exhibition Hall for the "Concours d'Art" with a garden where sculpture will be exhibited.

The chief building, the Grand Stadium, planned by the architect, J. Wils, will accommodate 40,000 visitors. There are about 20,000 seats and half of them will be covered. The whole building is 285 yards in length and 185 yards in depth. Not less than 4,500 piles, varying in length from 12 to 16 yards, had to be driven into soft ground. Building in Holland is not easy as the surface has to be raised about six feet, for which work a million cubic yards of sand had to be distributed. In the center of the Stadium lies the football ground on international dimensions. Around it there will be a cinder racing track, 436 yards in length and nearly nine yards across. Round the race course the cycling track will be constructed, which will be the same width but will be 545 yards long. A kind of deep gutter between the track and the spectators will prevent umbrellas, etc., from falling on the track, and iron palings will protect visitors against accidents.

The competitors will be seated near, and the press will be excellently accommodated opposite the finish—600 seats are reserved for press representatives. There will also be a large telegraph room and 45 telephone cabins.

Though the Stadium itself is made from concrete, a wall in typical Dutch red bricks will surround the whole. The two covered stands are in the center. One contains the Royal and other official boxes, and under the other stand lies the Marathon Gate.

There will also be a Marathon Tower (150 feet high) bearing on the top a large plate, from which a permanent smoke column will mount to the skies during the Games. Left of the Marathon Tower will be erected the monument to the memory of the late F. W. C. H. Baron van Tuyl van Serooskerkin, the first President of the Dutch Olympic Committee.

With regard to the great influx of visitors that may be expected in Amsterdam during the period of the Olympic Games, the Organizing Committee of the Dutch Olympic Committee has created Central Housing Office, where all the available housing accommodations will be centralized and where all information about housing possibilities can be obtained.

In order to avoid possible misunderstanding, it is necessary that all applications for housing should be addressed to *The General Secretary of the Dutch Olympic Organizing Committee, Weesperfijde 32, Amsterdam*. In their own interest visitors should therefore abstain from any private initiative in this matter.



Hahn was the outstanding performer at middle distance running during the last indoor season and he was unbeaten in about fifteen races. One of his triumphs was a victory over Edvin Wide, the Swedish star, in which Hahn missed by a fifth of a second the one-mile indoor record of 4:12 made by Paavo Nurmi in March, 1925, and equaled a few days later by Joie Ray. Hahn established new indoor records in 1927 for 1000 yards, 2m.12 4-5s., and 1000 meters, 2m. 26 2-5s.



The year opposite their names is given for the purpose of showing when they scored their first triumph for the N.Y.A.C., but reference to the tables of previous champions in this issue of the Almanac will show the versatility of those athletes who were proficient in several of the events that make up a track program. Following is a condensed history of the club since its organization.


N.Y.A.C. HISTORY, 1868-1927.

- 1868, September 8—Organized at the Knickerbocker Cottage, Sixth Avenue between 27th and 28th Street, now Mouquin's restaurant. . . . November 11—First amateur athletic games given in the United States, held at Empire City Skating Rink—afterwards American Institute—63d Street and Third Avenue. . . . Members had the use of Mair's Gymnasium on St. Mark's Place near Second Avenue.
- 1870—Boathouse built on the Harlem River.
- 1871, October 21—First outdoor amateur athletic meet (in the United States), held on the club's first track, at 130th Street and Harlem River, the land now being used for the foundations of the Harlem Bridge. Headquarters at Wood's Gymnasium, 6 East 28th Street, now the site of St. George's Hotel.
- 1873, July 2—Club's representative competed in the first Harlem River Regatta. William B. Curtis winning the sculling race and the prize, the "Diamond Sculls," which was presented by a member of the club, Mr. Eugene M. Earle.
- 1874—Clubroom located at Broadway and 36th Street. Room about as large as the present domino room. . . . June 27—Opening of the new club grounds at Mott Haven, on the banks of the Harlem River.
- 1876, July 29—First open handicap athletic meeting in the United States, held on the club's grounds. . . . September 30—First amateur championship of America held on the Mott Haven grounds, under the auspices of the New York A.C.





NEW HOME OF THE NEW YORK ATHLETIC CLUB.

1871. July 21—Opening of the new two-story boathouse at the foot of 138th Street and Harlem River, Mott Haven. . . . September 30—Club held the first amateur swimming championships on the Harlem River, open to all amateurs of the United States and Canada.
- 1878—Club held the first athletic meeting at Gilmore's Garden (the site of old Madison Square Garden), famous as an exhibition hall for athletic contests.
1879. February 21-22—Held an "Assault at Arms," or amateur championships in sparring, fencing and wrestling, at Booth's Theatre, 23d Street and Sixth Avenue. At this period the club had 170 members. . . . August 9—Club Regatta held on Harlem River. Two four-oared centipede crews competed, which was the first competition with this kind of a boat. . . . Club compiled and published a series of rules governing amateurs in sparring, foil fencing, fencing with broadsword and single stick, collar-and-elbow and Greco-Roman wrestling. These were the first rules ever used in the United States by amateurs. . . . Club was the first to establish the definition of an amateur; the first to frame and apply a code of rules for the government of athletic meetings; and the first to offer prizes for open amateur games, and to hold an amateur championship meeting. It built the first cinder path in the United States; was the first to combine rowing with athletic sports, and to give swimming, boxing, wrestling, fencing and cross-country championships.
- 1880—Boathouses anchored off club grounds at Mott Haven, which brought the boating and athletic elements more closely together.
- 1882—Club's headquarters located at Crescent Gymnasium, 23d Street near Sixth Avenue. . . . William R. Travers became president of the club and the membership increased some thousands. . . . Initiation fee raised from \$10.00 to \$25.00.
1883. April 14—Initiation fee raised from \$25.00 to \$50.00. . . . May 1—Rob Rogers, famous athletic trainer of the London Athletic Club, engaged. He was the club's first trainer, and died on August 9, 1884. . . . November 6—First cross-country championships held under the club's auspices.
1885. February 5—New Clubhouse at 55th Street and Sixth Avenue opened.
- 1887—Purchased Travers Island, country home of the club.
- 1888—Clubhouse erected at Travers Island, afterward destroyed by fire.
- 1889—Initiation fee raised from \$50.00 to \$100.00.
- 1890—Clubhouse erected at 59th Street and Sixth Avenue (Central Park South), considered to be one of the most palatial in the world and a most fitting tribute to the band of athletes who, in September, 1868, started the organization with only locker room in the old Lair's Gymnasium.
- 1897—New clubhouse erected at Travers Island. . . . Initiation fee raised from \$100.00 to \$200.00.
- 1912—Members of the club scored the greatest number of points of any club in the world at the Sixth Olympiad, held at Stockholm, Sweden, in July.
1913. March 12—Forty-fifth anniversary of founding of club observed by a dinner at the city clubhouse. . . . July 17-19—Twenty-fifth anniversary of the purchase of Travers Island was celebrated at the Travers Island clubhouse and grounds, the program consisting of exhibitions and competitions in all branches of sport. Champions, both past and present, took part in some capacity. The Metropolitan Rowing Club, champion eight-oared crew of 1883, rowed a match race against the club's champion crew of 1888. . . . December 2—Initiation fee for the resident class of membership was reduced from \$200 to \$100 until the limit of 3,500 resident members and a waiting list of 100 had been established. Within some three months over 700 new members were elected.
1914. May 6—Fee for life membership was reduced from \$1,000 to \$500 until the limit should be reached. In some two months this was accomplished, and a total of 118 new life members were elected. . . . December 1—Proceeds of the sinking fund enabled the club to retire the entire issue of Travers Island 5% debenture bonds (\$125,000) one year before the same became due. . . . Notable features of the year were the winning of English championships, viz., 880 yards by Homer Baker, and the running high jump by Wesley M. Oler Jr.
- 1917—Club refrained from entering athletes in any championship contests and devoted all of its resources toward supplying the camps and transports with athletic paraphernalia. Many sets of athletic events were held for the soldiers and sailors at Travers Island and at the various camps and stations. In addition, the Government was presented with six ambulances purchased from donations received from members, and a complete trailer or kitchen from the "Veterans' Association". . . . Constitution, by-laws and house rules of the club were revised and amended. . . . February 3—Resident membership initiation fee permanently reduced to \$100; non-resident membership initiation fee to \$50.






