Under the direction of the Executive Committee there was published the annual Handbook of the Association and from time to time Bulletins reporting the activities of the Association.

In connection with the Fifty-fourth Games, the Veterans Association held a noteworthy banquet at the Algonquin Club, Boston, on May 30, 1930, to commemorate the founding of the Association. A full account of this banquet appears in a recent Bulletin.

The Executive Committee submits to this Convention, and recommends for adoption, a budget calling for expenditure of \$16,390 and expected revenue of \$16,525.

The Executive Committee recommends to the Convention that the invitation of the University of Pennsylvania to hold the Fifty-fifth Track and Field Meeting at Franklin Field, Philadelphia, be accepted.

The Executive Committee has made available slow motion pictures of outstanding track and field performers at the 1930 Outdoor Meeting which it believes are valuable for training. There are two reels, a track and a field reel, either of which may be had for \$25 or both for \$50.

The Executive Committee has carefully considered the matter of liability for injuries received by spectators, officials and others not actually competing and has authorized the proper officers to procure insurance policies covering damages for such injuries at all the meets of the Association.

The Executive Committee has been and is conducting some experiments that may make a notable contribution to the accuracy of the conduct of track meets. An instrument has been designed and built to measure the velocity of wind at a given moment with special application to the granting or refusing of records.

A study is being conducted on the effect of wind on field event implements with the help of various aeronautical schools, and another on the problem of improved electrical timing.

An invitation has been received from the three California universities to hold the Track and Field Championship Athletic Meeting for 1932 at Berkeley, California. The Advisory and Executive Committees, having very carefully considered such invitation, make recommendation which will be reported orally hereafter in the convention.

The Executive Committee having authorized the establishment of Collegiate Indoor Records, and having considered the records placed before them accompanied by the proper certification of officials, recommend that such records be accepted as I.C.A.A.A. Collegiate Indoor Records (see list on page 138).

The Executive Committee recommends action on the applications for membership as follows: That the applications of Lehigh and William and Mary be accepted and that the application of Temple be laid on the table.

FIFTY-FOURTH ANNUAL TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP ATHLETIC MEETING.

The Fifth-fourth Track and Field Championship Meeting was held at Soldiers Field, Cambridge, on May 30 and 31, 1930.

The meeting was highly successful in every respect. By almost imperceptible improvements year after year the meet has arrived at a smoothness of running and a well ordered uniformity that seem to leave but little to improve. The favorable weather after a week of rain was most agreeable to athletes and spectators alike. With the exception of the fiftieth anniversary in 1926 the largest crowd of spectators in the history of the Association was present.

For three years Stanford had had its own way with the point score, but last year, as was expected, her leadership was challenged by her Western rival, Southern California. Southern California with 44 $\frac{1}{4}$ points finished just 8 points ahead of the deposed champion, whose 36 $\frac{1}{4}$ points would have been enough to win in many other years. Southern California's 44 $\frac{1}{4}$ points was the highest score made since 1918, when Cornell scored 47 points. Despite winning the championship Southern California won only two first places, while Stanford won four. Columbia, Harvard and Yale won each two. Harvard, third, was the first of the Eastern teams to finish, with 23 $\frac{1}{2}$. Michigan, with 14 $\frac{1}{4}$, was fourth and Yale fifth, with 12 $\frac{3}{4}$. Columbia was sixth, with 10. The Westerners showed, however, unusual balance, taking 24 track and 20 $\frac{1}{4}$ field points with seventeen men in eleven events. Of the 120 track points but 27 were won by seniors, while 41 out of the 105 field points were won by men who will not compete for their college again.

Southern California's team was composed of nine sophomores, who scored 27 $\frac{3}{4}$ points; four juniors, who scored 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ points, and two seniors, who scored 5 $\frac{1}{4}$. This would seem to foreshadow some writing on the wall, especially as the point score of most of the other teams was materially assisted by men who graduated last year.

Several novelties were introduced which added materially in expediting the conduct of the meet. The pictures of all the point-winners which are secured for the Souvenir Volume were this year taken in a roped area on the infield prior to the giving out of prizes to the winners. This not only saved confusion but insured a complete record of the meet. The chief judge had provided various colored slips on which each man assigned to pick a place wrote down the number of his choice. This not only promoted a greater accuracy and care in the judges but left a permanent record.

An effort was made to test various mechanical devices. It was hoped to test out the photo-electric timing devices, but these were found to be only in an experimental stage. A device for measuring and automatically recording the velocity of the wind at all speeds, invented by James A. Taylor, was tested and found to work admirably. This device records on a revolving drum the slightest breeze. Accompanying the instrument is a weather vane on which the operator records in a prepared space the direction of the wind in relation to the runner. A device of this sort has long been needed for the settling of disputes relating to the granting

of a record. It is still in an experimental stage but should prove ultimately to be efficient. It is assumed that for the adequate testing of races at least three of these devices should be placed along the course.

Three records were broken and one equaled. Probably the most outstanding record was that of Harlow P. Rothert of Stanford in the shot put. His put of 52 feet $\frac{1}{4}$ inch was 1 foot 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches further than his previous record. For three years this record has been broken either by Rothert or his redoubtable partner, Krenz. With the passing of these two men the records in their respective specialties seem to be temporarily safe. The annals of the Association do not show two other competitors like these.

Eric C. W. Krenz, who was second in the shot with a put 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches further than the 1929 record, created a new record in the discus, raising his own record from 154 feet 11 inches to 163 feet 7 $\frac{3}{8}$ inches.

Kenneth M. Churchill of California, who was third last year, broke the record in the javelin throw with a magnificent heave of 212 feet 5 inches, several feet further than he had ever thrown the implement before.

Frank C. Wykoff of Southern California twice equaled the record in the 100-yard dash of 9.7 seconds. His previous performances had warranted the expectation not only that he would break the record but that he would do it very decisively.

TENTH ANNUAL INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIP ATHLETIC MEETING.

The 1931 Indoor Meet was held on March 7, at the 102d Engineers Armory, New York City. Every year it has been necessary to note that the meet was much improved over the previous year. This year's meet furnished the most brilliant set of performances and the most remarkable outpouring of enthusiastic spectators that the Association has ever seen. With the Armory jammed to more than its proper capacity, one record after another was smashed until only four on the whole list were left intact.

We have become accustomed to examine watches microscopically to see if the necessary tenth or fifth had been attained to smash a record. This year, however, the Two Mile record was broken by 5 seconds, the One Mile by 2.6 seconds, the One Mile Relay by 2.8 seconds and the Freshman Medley Relay by 2.5 seconds.

The meet was won by Pennsylvania with a total score of 38-1/10 points, the largest in the history of the Indoor Meet, by a team composed of men who were responsible for the breaking of four records, the One Mile Run, the One Mile Relay, the 35-lb. Weight and the Pole Vault. Outstanding among these men was Bernard E. Berlinger, a senior, who broke the Pole Vault record with Everett L. Colyer of Cornell, at 13 feet 8½ inches; who won the Shot Put and tied for fifth place in the High Jump. During his three years of competition Berlinger made an incidental record of scoring the greatest number of points, 27½, which any man has scored in the Indoor Meet, displacing the figures of 25 points scored by Sol Furth, of N.Y.U. His total for this year's meet was 10 points.

Harvard was second with 19 points, scored by nine men in five different events, including the splendid performance of Eugene Record in winning the hurdles. Cornell, tied for first place last year with Pennsylvania, was third, with 17-7/10 points, scored by eight men, including Colyer with his record-breaking performance in the Pole Vault. New York University was fourth, with 12 points made by five men. Georgetown was fifth, with 11 points made in three events.

Many little improvements had been provided, suggested by the experience of former years. The High Jump platform had been filled out to cover a solid area rather than the skeleton form. A new Pole Vault runway had been constructed. The Pole Vault and Broad Jump pits had been filled with earth rather than sand and sawdust. Carefully prepared slips had been provided for the judges for recording their results and a new type of High Jump mat, which seemed to give general satisfaction, was used in place of the old-fashioned sawdust pit. As usual, the meet started on the dot of eight o'clock and was conducted with the customary precision and absence of delay.

The first record to go was that of the 35-lb. Weight, conducted in the afternoon, in which Fred A. Steiner of Pennsylvania, won with a magnificent throw of 54 feet 9 inches, displacing the record of Norwood G. Wright of Cornell, 53 feet 11½ inches, made in 1928. The first record in the evening was the Mile, which Carl A. Coan of Pennsylvania won in

4 minutes 15.2 seconds, breaking by 2.6 seconds the performance of James J. Connolly of Georgetown, which had stood since 1923. Manhattan College, a newcomer in the winners' column, provided the next record, winning the Freshman Medley Relay in 7 minutes 39.3 seconds, wiping out Pennsylvania's old record of 7 minutes 41.8 seconds. The next record performance was that of Aloysius J. Kelly of Georgetown, who equaled the record for the 70 Yard Dash with his 7.1 seconds. The next record to go was the Two Mile Run in which Joseph P. McCluskey of Fordham, a sophomore and a newcomer to the indoor ranks, created a new mark of 9 minutes 17.8 seconds, or just 5 seconds lower than Paul E. Rekers' of Penn State performance of last year. Everett E. Utterback of Pittsburgh broke his old record of 23 feet 5½ inches in the Broad Jump with a splendid leap of 23 feet 9¾ inches. The last track event furnished not only the most exciting contest but perhaps the most impressive record, for Pennsylvania in winning the One Mile Relay in 3 minutes 17.8 seconds broke both the Intercollegiate and World indoor records. The record which aroused the most popular interest after the close of all the running events was the Pole Vault, in which Bernard E. Berlinger and Everett L. Colyer raised the former record of 13 feet 7¾ inches, made by Frederic H. Sturdy of Yale to 13 feet 8¼ inches.

While the Association has discouraged special events, it has always believed in affording to its undergraduates the courtesy of its splendid track and it therefore extended to Russell H. Chapman, Bates '31, Philip A. Edwards, N.Y.U., '29, Wallace E. Viles, Bates '31, Frank Nordell, N.Y.U., '34, and Charles Thompson of Northeastern an invitation to attempt to break the Indoor 880 Yard record. Chapman, who was ineligible to run for Bates as a senior, had justified the expectation that he was capable of breaking the record of 1 minute 51.4 seconds. The race was added to the end of the program. The lead was taken at the gun by Phil Edwards. At the second lap Chapman rushed to the front and from that point on was never headed. The first quarter was run in 55.6 seconds, and if it had not been for the slowness of this quarter there can be little doubt that the record would have been shattered. As it was, the time of 1 minute 51.5 seconds was just one-tenth of a second slower than the world's record performance of Lloyd Hahn, made on the same track in 1928, and was the second fastest half mile ever run indoors or outdoors.

CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS OF 1930.

The Twenty-second Annual 'Varsity and Eleventh Annual Freshman Cross-Country Runs of the Association were held over the same course at Van Cortlandt Park, New York City, on November 17, 1930, as has been used for the previous three years.

The runs were held in the rain over a course soaked by four continuous days of heavy downpour. While the course was extremely heavy and muddy over the hills where considerable new work had been done, it was in fairly good condition on the level spaces.

For the first time in the history of the runs the 'varsity event was won by a Westerner. Clark S. Chamberlain of Michigan State after a remarkable performance came in an easy winner by 30 yards in front of Richard J. Detwiler of Penn State. The time of 30 minutes and 19.2 seconds was an exceptionally fine feat. Chamberlain with a two-miler's pace was 50 yards in the lead at the mile mark. During the race he increased this at one time to 100 yards. The leaders of the pack behind him took turns in attempting the pursuit. Detwiler of Penn State, Lerner of N. Y. U., Coan and McKniff of Pennsylvania at one time or another were in the lead. At the end of the first lap Chamberlain was still 76 yards ahead. At this stage McCluskey of Fordham, Freshman winner in 1929, and one of the championship possibilities, drew up from the ruck even with Detwiler. Along the hill on the second lap McCluskey and Detwiler steadily gained. Chamberlain inadvertently ran inside of a course signpost, stopped dead and retraced his steps only to see Detwiler and McCluskey run past him and go into a lead of 30 or 40 yards. With this disheartening accident many a runner would have been discouraged. Chamberlain, however, kept doggedly on, apparently out of the race. Rekers and Meisinger of Penn State were almost on him. For the next half-mile there ensued a series of sprints, challenges and desperate efforts to forge to the front by all five leaders. Gradually Chamberlain drew up to the first two and with seemingly unabated strength a half-mile from the finish Chamberlain passed into the lead again. From this point to the finish he was never headed.

The 'varsity team race was won by Penn State with the phenomenally small score of 29 points, the smallest score since the record performance of Cornell in 1921, when they finished with 18 points. Penn State placed three men in the medal winners and with eighth and fourteenth places scored less than half of the points scored by the second team, Syracuse, with 67 points. Harvard was third with 98, N. Y. U. fourth with 107 and Cornell fifth with 167. The surprise of the meet was the failure of Pennsylvania to do better than tenth place.

The Freshman Run was won by a nicely balanced team from Syracuse, which scored 70 points. Manhattan, a new entrant in the list of winners, was second with 103. Princeton had 131 and Maine and Pennsylvania followed closely behind with 133 and 137, respectively.

The individual honors were taken easily by two Manhattan runners, Frank A. McKenna and Frederick B. Knepper. The time of 14 minutes 55 seconds was exceptionally good, considering the condition of the course.




