





FINANCING AMERICAN OLYMPIC TEAMS

BY GEORGE W. GRAVES,

Treasurer and Chairman American Olympic Finance Committee.

Thousands of young men and women athletes, skilled in every branch of winter and summer sport, members of clubs, colleges, the Army and the Navy, are already in training for the International Olympic Games. Oarsmen, Yachtsmen, Riders in the Equestrian Games, are engaged in study and training. All of these athletes hope to win the honor of representing the United States in the February Winter Games at Lake Placid, New York, and the July Summer Games at Los Angeles, California, where arrangements have been completed to receive the thousands of spectators and visiting athletes from more than fifty nations of the world to meet in friendly rivalry.

The American Olympic Committee, with President Hoover as Honorary President; the Secretaries of State, War and the Navy as Honorary Vice-Presidents, and the executive officers of the American Olympic Association, representing the seventy-eight organizations which are members of the Association, is charged with the duty of placing a representative and well-equipped American team in the Games.

This Committee has nothing to do with the preparations, which are handled by the Organizing Committees of both cities where the Games are held; nor with the Games, which are conducted by the officials of the International Federation of various Games. This Committee concerns itself solely with the American Olympic team—its selection, building up and financing—and its participation in the Games.

Consider, if you please, the importance and magnitude of this undertaking; the number of coaches, trainers and assistants required to secure an actual working team of more than 600 athletes in twenty-five games, obtained in sectional and final tryouts from over 10,000 candidates.

The entire personnel of the American team—coaches, trainers, assistants and athletes—must be transported to and from the games, comfortably housed, athletically clothed, fed scientifically, physically trained to a high degree of perfection, for a period before the games, properly equipped and provided with every facility to insure the highest standards of performance in the games.

The American Olympic team must be given the same opportunity to exhibit its skill in the various games, demonstrations and events, as all other competing nations afford the members of their Olympic teams—all of which, you will appreciate, requires a large sum of money.

To the American public who have supported American Olympic teams in the past, and those who may in the future, it might be proper to state that this Committee has no national subsidy or endowment—the financing of the team is as truly representative of the spirit of America as the team itself—and everyone is privileged to join in the work.

Local city campaign committees, and the intercollegiate governing bodies in the colleges and universities, composed of many voluntary workers in numerous cities, are at work in the interest of the American Olympic team. They go forth with the approbation of many hundreds of Mayors, Governors and United States Senators, who have graciously consented to serve as Honorary Chairmen, and members of their city and state committees.

You have been told of the Olympic Games and their importance in our national and international lives. It has been my pleasure to tell you of the necessity for the Olympic Campaign, and something of the expenditures required. As the Olympic Games are the greatest amateur athletic event of the modern age, so the responsibility for supporting the American Olympic team is one of the most sporting challenges which is given to the American people.
