## THE NATIONAL MEET, 1935

Held at Edwards Track Stadium, University of California, June 21-22, 1935.

For the second time in as many years, the track and field championships of the N.C.A.A. were held in the Far West; the fourteenth annual games were held June 21 and 22 at Edwards Track Stadium on the campus of the host institution, the University of California.

Confidence in the ability of the organization to promote a meet which would be truly national in character and which would be athletically and financially successful—this confidence being based upon a steadily growing interest in track and field athletics on the part of the San Francisco Bay Region public—prompted the Associated Students of the University of California to guarantee to the N.C.A.A. \$12,500, to be expended in paying the railroad and Pullman fare of the outstanding athletes of the United States to the meet.

The knotty problem of the selection of athletes whose 1935 performances merited their inclusion in the list of "expense allowed" performers was undertaken by the Track and Field Rules Committee, under the chairmanship of T. Nelson Metcalf. The committee's original selections numbered 127 athletes, representing 66 universities and colleges. Of these, 114 accepted expense allowances offered and appeared at Berkeley for the competition.

It is of interest to note (since the figures are a key to the athletic caliber of the athletes to whom allowances were offered) that 84 of the 114 reached the finals of the competition and scored 424 of the total 465 points.

The University of California is gratified to be able to report that the gross receipts of the meet more than covered the amount necessary to meet the guarantee and the expenses of the meet. Gross receipts from ticket sales and other sources were \$22,449.80. The operating expenses were \$6,621.15, leaving a balance of \$15,830.41 which was prorated among the contestants and coaches. Men placing in the first eight in their events received full railroad and Pullman fare; others received refunds of 33 per cent.

The meet attracted entries from 75 institutions, with 303 individual athletes entered. Of these, more than 250 athletes engaged in the actual competition, and 47 teams were represented in the scoring.

The seemingly impossible feat attempted and accomplished by Jesse Owens of Ohio State University in scoring four first places in national competition—the 100 and 220-yard dashes, the 220-yard low hurdles and the broad jump—was easily the outstanding performance of the meet, and one which will long be remembered by the spectators who witnessed it. Meeting exceptionally fast fields, Owens ran only to win in the sprints and the low hurdles, but in the

broad jump he broke a record that had stood for ten years by two and one-half inches, leaping 26 feet 1 $\frac{3}{8}$  inch in the trials the first day of the meet.

Owens' four firsts contributed the major portion of Ohio State's point total, giving that institution second place in team scoring but failing by 34 points to approach the smashing team victory scored by the University of Southern California. The Trojans gained only two individual championships (in the pole vault, in which two of their vaulters, William Sefton and Earl Meadows, shared a new N.C.A.A. record of 14 feet 1 $\frac{1}{8}$  inch; and in the discus throw, won by Kenneth Carpenter), but their incomparable team strength and balance gave them points in eight events.

N.C.A.A. records in the running events were not threatened, although competition was exceptionally close—a statement borne out by the fact that not one of the 1934 champions who returned to the competition was successful in his defense of the championship—but the competition in the field events produced three new records: the pole vault mark already mentioned; the javelin performance of Charles Gongloff, University of Pittsburgh, who set a new mark of 221 feet 3 $\frac{1}{8}$  inches, and Owens' winning mark in the broad jump, also noted above.


