

2. That each committee submit nominations for Referee and officials of meets, but appointments of the same to be made by the Board.
3. That no committee make any financial commitment without the approval of the Treasurer or the Board.
4. That the Chairman of the Outdoor Meet Committee submit to the Board Meeting on March 12, 1937, the members of that Committee and plans for the Meet.

The Board appointed Mr. James A. Taylor as Executive Officer.

Mr. Rupert B. Thomas Jr., Princeton, was appointed Referee of the 1937 Indoor Meet, with power to appoint officials thereof.

The Board approved Randalls Island Stadium as the place for the Outdoor Meet and appointed a committee to conclude a contract with the City of New York therefor.

The Board decided that the shot put and the 35-lb. weight should not be held inside the Garden, and that the trials in the dash, hurdles, 600-yard run, and the broad jump be held in the afternoon.

The Board decided that the annual convention be held March 12, 1937, at 8:00 p.m. in the Columbia University Club, New York.

The report of the Treasurer for the fiscal year March 6, 1936, to March 12, 1937, shows a balance in bank of \$1,600.

SIXTIETH ANNUAL TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP MEET.

The Sixtieth Annual I.C.A.A.A. Track and Field Championships were held at Franklin Field, Philadelphia, on Friday, May 29, and Saturday, May 30, 1936. Probably none of the championship meets have been conducted under such ideal conditions of weather and probably none have been more smoothly conducted. Each event started on the minute scheduled and there were no untoward incidents. From the financial standpoint, however, the meet was extremely disappointing, due unquestionably to the great number of important sport events scheduled for Philadelphia on Memorial Day.

Probably no meet in recent years provided keener competition or greater uncertainty as to results. Twenty-eight teams scored points and a majority of the events were won by the legendary dark horses, who materialized performances wholly unexpected from them. The championship was won by Cornell, whose last victory was scored in 1919. Until nearly the close of the meet the competition of Harvard made the result uncertain. Nine men from Cornell scored 29½ points in eight events. Harvard, with seven men scoring in eight events, won 19 16/21 points. Dartmouth scored 19 3/7 points, of which three first places accounted for 15 points. Pittsburgh, in fourth place, also scored three first places and a third, for 18 points. Manhattan was fifth with 15 points, 12 of which were scored in the 800-meter run. Pennsylvania was but one point behind and Princeton in seventh place had 13 points.

The victory of Cornell marked the first championship of an Eastern college since the winning by Yale of the 1924 championships.

For the interest of the spectators, and at the request of the Olympic Committee to provide competition for Olympic Team candidates, two special events were held for invited competitors—a 10,000-meter run, and a 1,000-meter run.

The 10,000-meter run was won by an I.C.A.A.A. veteran, Edwin C. Veysel of Colby in 32 minutes 12.2 seconds. The race resulted in a stirring finish, in which Veysel won over Stanley Wudyka. Thomas J. Ottey, another I.C.A.A.A. veteran from Michigan State, was third, with William J. Smith fourth and Jesse R. Cavileer Jr. of the Margate A.A., fifth.

The 1,000-meter run, which was held after the formal program on Saturday, was a splendid contest. The event was won by Charles Hornbostel, formerly Indiana University headliner, in 2 minutes 14.9 seconds. Harry Williamson, formerly of North Carolina, put up a splendid battle. Ernest Federoff, formerly of Temple, was third, and Frederick Rayson fourth.

CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS OF 1936

The twenty-eighth annual Varsity and seventeenth annual Freshman Cross-Country Runs were held on November 16, 1936, over the reconstructed Van Cortlandt Park (New York) course. Although the sun shone, a bitter northwest blast was particularly trying. Within the last fifteen years no I.C.A.A.A. championship has faced such difficult conditions. Due to the construction of the parkway and the obliteration of parts of the course, a new course was laid out taking the ridge in reverse direction from other years with the return course on the west side instead of the east side of the ridge. The three miles of the Freshman course was provided by an extra loop on the north end, with the usual two-and-a-half-mile laps for the Varsity.

Michigan State runners made nearly a clean sweep, taking both individual first places with Kenneth E. Waite in the Varsity and Richard D. Frey in the Freshman, their single entry in the event, and scoring 46 in the Varsity to Manhattan's 66. This constitutes their fourth consecutive team win in the main event and the third individual.

Manhattan was the only winner beside Michigan State by taking the Freshman team race by nearly half the score of Penn State, runner-up. Manhattan finished four men in the first eleven and then were in twenty-second place, making 50.

SIXTEENTH INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP MEET.

The Sixteenth Indoor Track and Field Championship Meet was held in Madison Square Garden, New York, on Saturday, March 13, 1937. Growing familiarity with the facilities of the Garden and experience of the officials produced the smoothest running and most prompt of the indoor meets. The general excellence of performance and the many surprises of the competition also made it one of the most interesting in many years.

Columbia fulfilled predictions and easily won the championship with 35 4/15 points, 15 points above the runner-up, Princeton, which amassed 19 16/21. Manhattan, the defending champion, was a fraction of a point below Princeton, with 19 3/7. Dartmouth was next with 15 3/7, followed by Syracuse with 12.

Columbia's victory was the more amazing since in the previous year their total score was 1 point. Benjamin W. Johnson, ineligible a year ago, was easily the outstanding athlete, scoring 10 points in the dash and the broad, with a record jump in the latter, and establishing time in the dash which will be difficult to lower. Columbia won four first places and tied for a fifth and scored points in six of the twelve events. The performance of Princeton was somewhat similar, with a record of 4 in 1936. Both Manhattan and Dartmouth had been among the leaders for several years.

Three records were broken—the broad jump by Benjamin W. Johnson of Columbia, with 24 feet $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch; the 60-yard hurdles by John M. Donovan of Dartmouth, who broke the record of longest standing in winning the 60-yard hurdles in 7.5 seconds in the second semi-final. This record was held by Harold E. Barron of Penn State, and was made in 1922. The shot put record was amazing. Two men broke the record and their performances resulted in a tie. Dimitri N. Zaitz of Boston College and Daniel Taylor of Columbia threw 50 feet 9 $\frac{1}{8}$ inches for a tie for first place, almost a foot ahead of the record by William Niblock of Bowdoin, made in 1934. The performance of Johnson, while exceptional, broke no record, due to the event being on the program for the first time.

While it is unfortunate that disqualifications should occur—and there were several—for infractions of the rules, it is encouraging to note that the other runners will be protected, and such disqualifications as there were will probably have a very salutary effect.

There were several innovations. One was the changing of the track measured in meters to an eleven-lap track, necessitating the cutting down of each straightaway 6 feet. The change to yards after three years of the metric system in the Garden seemed to arouse but little comment. For the first time the 35-lb. weight and the shot put were held outdoors, in the parking space adjacent to the Garden. A canvas cover was provided, in case of bad weather. It was not necessary, however. For the first time indoors adjustable standards for the pole vault were tried and proved to be most satisfactory. Also, for the first time in many years, music was furnished by a college band—that of Manhattan—and the result was gratifying.
