Trojans Take 14th NCAA Title

The University of Southern California won its 14th NCAA Track and Field Championship as two records were broken and one was equalled in the 1950 meet held at Memorial Stadium in Minneapolis, June 16 and 17.

The Trojans scored 49% points to 28 for Stanford and 27 for Yale, the closest pursuers for the team title. In all, 47 of the 76 teams entered were able

to score in the national collegiate championship meet.

Don McEwen of Michigan was magnificent in breaking Greg Rice's NCAA record with a 9:01.9 2-mile. Jim Fuchs of Yale was below par in raising his own meet record in the shot put to 56'113'/6". Dick Attlesey of USC ran another of his many 13.9 hurdle races to tie the record in his heat. A head-

wind of up to 15 mph prevented fast final marks.

Four of six defending champions retained their titles. Don Gehrmann in the mile and Bud Held in the javelin became the only men in their events ever to win three championships. Bobby Smith of San Diego again won the pole vault, and Fuchs was a repeat winner in the shot. Charley Moore (440) and Vic Frank (discus) fell to fourth place. A seventh champion, Dick Phillips, did not defend his high jump title because of injuries.

High point honors went to Bill Albans, who, single handed, put North Caro-

lina into fourth place with 22 points.

An outstanding feature of the meet was the excellent starting by Rut Wa'ters of Northwestern. After innumerable attempted breaks during the preliminaries, the runners learned they could not beat the gun, and there was not a single false start during the finals. So competent was Walters that Bob Boyd told him before the start of the 100: "I feel all right now that I know it's going to be a fair start."

The team battle was actually more interesting than the final scores indicate. Southern California trailed badly at first, going scoreless in five of the first seven events, while Stanford was scoring 24 points before the first running event. USC crashed through with 25½ points in the last four events.

None of the experts at the meet could explain the slow times turned in by all but two of the distance runners. A 60-degree temperature may have hurt the sprinters, but it was ideal for distance running. The track is not regarded as slow, although each race was slower than expected. A fairly strong wind and a reckless pace in the mile might be part of the answer.

A crowd of over 10,000 attended the meet.

Following is a review of the highlights of the meet, event by event:

Held at the "Set" position for three or four seconds, the field in the 100-yard dash final was off to a perfect start. Donnie Anderson said, "I had a good start and led until the wind hit me at 60 yards." But the wind had little effect on Bob Boyd. The 6'3", 205-pound Loyola football star who had run only once in competition before this year drew away to win by two feet in the surprisingly slow time of 9.8. Six of the nine starters were closely bunched, about a yard behind Anderson, while Weisman trailed by another yard.

Charley Parker of Texas ran a front race all the way in the 220 final to win comfortably. After the race, he explained, "I decided to sprint all the way.

Patton taught me that in 1943." In contrast was little Donnie Anderson who never before figured in a national race at this distance. Anderson coasted the curve and then put on a dazzling finish in the stretch which swept him past, in order, Chuck Peters, Bob Tyler, and Paul Bienz. Anderson was closing fast on Parker at the finish. Another powerful finish was put on by little-known Walt McKibben of Occidental who almost caught Bienz at the tape. Bob Tyler, who should be a powerful 220 man, faded mysteriously after reaching the stretch in third place behind Parker and Bienz. Bob Boyd withdrew.

The quarter-mile field ran the first curve in lanes from a staggered start with the runners breaking for the pole on the back stretch. At this point George Rhoden of Morgan State moved over in front of Rice's Tom Cox to take the pole. Tall, smooth-striding Rhoden, a member of the Jamaican Olympic team, passed the 220 mark in 21.7, followed by Bill Parker of Occidental and Cox. Defending champion Charley Moore of Cornell, usually a front runner, was simply outrun by these sprinters. Cox passed Parker on the turn, and set out after Rhoden. But down the long home stretch, not a

runner changed position.

Bob Chambers of Southern California led the powerful 880 field through a 54-second first quarter, followed by Bill Brown of Morgan State, Len Truex of Ohio State and Bob Pruitt of SC, but in the third 220 Chambers and Pruitt faded. Truex, the Buckeyes' surprising sophomore, led at the 660 in 1:23. Brown and John Barnes of Occidental were fighting it out for second when the latter was forced to cut his stride and fall back. Brown grabbed the lead at the head of the stretch. Barnes regained his stride and fought back strongly but could not hold off Truex. Joe Deady of Georgetown, in his first big-time season, finished fast for fourth.

George Wade of Yale, the IC4A champion, set a fast mile pace, but he could not get away from defending champion Don Gehrmann. Wade ran 58 and 2:04, too fast for any but the best. After 2½ laps he stepped off the track. Bob Karnes of Kansas made a run at Gehrmann, but broke his rhythm to drop in behind Gehrmann instead of taking the lead. Gehrmann led Karnes at the three-quarters in 3:11 and appeared to be overstriding and working hard. But he began to pull away, and on the back stretch, Bill Mack came up alongside Karnes. Both men sprinted to the curve with Mack moving into second place. At this point, Tom Kirwan of Penn, an erratic runner, was fourth, three yards behind Karnes. Wally Wilson of USC, the surprise of the race after failing to qualify in the 880, was two yards behind Kirwan and far ahead of the sixth man. Kirwan came up strongly around the turn to take second place. Whitey Overton, Olympic steeplechaser, finished fast in sixth place.

The two-mile was expected to be the greatest race at this distance in collegiate history. There was Jim Newcomb, SC's Indian who had never lost a race in any kind of school competition, and who had run a 4:07.7 mile the previous week. There was Warren Druetzler of Michigan State who ran the equivalent of a 9:01 two-mile in Europe in the summer of 1949. There was Don McEwen, a 21-year-old Michigan sophomore from Canada, who had run 9:02. These were the big three, but men like Dick Hart of Penn, Bob Black of Rhode Island State and Bill McGuire of Missouri also threatened to scare the NCAA record of 9:02.6.

Jim Brown of Arkansas led for the first lap in 66, followed by McEwen. Whitey Overton led at the half in 2:14.5. McEwen was still second, followed by red-headed Herb Semper of Kansas, and Hart. McEwen took the lead, passing the three quarters in 3:24, trailed by McGuire, Semper and Hart. Mc-

Ewen passed the mile in 4:32.5, followed by McGuire, Newcomb, Semper, Druetzler, Black, and Hart. Then McEwen began to pour it on. His fifth lap, in 67½, opened up a ten yard lead on Newcomb, with Druetzler another 20 yards back and Semper and Black following. McEwen ran his sixth lap in 66. Newcomb, completely bewildered by this amazing pace, was now four seconds behind, but still in the running. Semper was third, seven seconds behind Newcomb and leading Druetzler and Black. Another 66 second lap by McEwen cracked Newcomb completely. The Chief lost all his remaining energy and fell 12 seconds behind. Semper ran 8:07 for 1¾ miles, only three seconds behind Newcomb. Druetzler was trailing Semper, but Black dropped out. The last lap was anti-climactic. McEwen, completely run out, staggered around in 70 seconds. Newcomb, who had lost all his fight, matched that time, but summoned up some of his reserve to outsprint Semper to the tape.

The wind almost ruined a good field of high hurdlers. Bill Fleming hit a hurdle, and Roy Grieve fell. Bill Albans broke the third hurdle, but he was rugged enough to keep his feet. Jim Gehrdes, who is one of the world's best, ran the poorest race of his career. And Dick Attlesy could not break 14 flat.

Bill Fleming, who had not decided to enter the low hurdles until the last moment, led Albans by a foot to the eighth hurdle, which he hit. Albans and Attlesey swept past. Bob Bryan of Stanford closed fast for fourth.

It looked like an eight-way tie for first in the high jump at 6'4" as everybody missed twice at 6'6". But on their last jumps, Vern McGrew, winner of the 1948 Olympic Trials at 6'8¼", and Virgil Severns of Kansas State, who jumped that same height in the Texas Relays, went over safely. McGrew then

cleared 6'7" on his initial attempt to win his first national title.

Albans, who had bettered 24'9" twenty-three times during the 1950 season without going over 24'10½", led the broad jump qualifiers with a jump of 24'9¼". Springy-legged Henry Aihara of Southern California took advantage of a tail wind to soar 25'1½" on his first jump of the finals. But big Jerome Biffle of Denver, who said "I liked that pit better than any I've jumped in," leaped 25'4¾" immediately following Aihara's 25-footer. Albans was consistent, jumping 24'5¼" and 24'7½" and passing. Herb Hoskins of Kansas State had final jumps of 24'7¾" and 24'8".

In the pole vault, four men cleared 14 feet, George Mattos of San Jose who has not failed at 14 feet since early season, defending champion Bobby Smith of San Diego, and the IC4A co-champions George Appel of Yale and Art Sherman of Rhode Island State.

Appel and Sherman did not come close at 14'27%", but Mattos almost cleared, sailing six inches above but dropping on the cross bar. Later he said, "I died on that one." Bobby Smith, who had pointed for this meet all year, came through like a true champion, even though he said, "I was all tied up." He soared over on his third attempt to win.

Despite Jim Fuchs' amazing record in the shot put, he had competition from Otis Chandler of Stanford on the first day of the NCAA meet. Chandler put 56'5½" in the trials, only 1¾" shy of Fuchs' best qualifying throw. In the finals, Fuchs upped his record to 56'11¾6" on his first effort, then hit 56 even and then fouled. On a put for the photographers he reached 57'2½".

Handsome Dick Doyle of Montana continued to win every discus title in sight with a throw of 171'5" in the trials. Doyle uses the old, orthodox discus form, with the addition of a deep knee bend of his own. In second place, again defeating the powerful Yale duo of Fuchs and Frank, was USC's giant sophomore, Sim Iness.

Two-time javelin champion Franklin "Bud" Held of Stanford had worked out only once a week all season, gradually slipping from his 233'4½" high down to something under 220 feet. But he was still good enough to win.



Location and date of marks made in foreign meets are included only where it is a competitors' best performance of the season. Otherwise they are listed in chronological order following the domestic meets. In the track events, times made at equivalent metric distances are indicated with an "m". Times which were made with an assisting wind of more than 4.473 miles per hour are indicated with a "w". Non-winning times are indicated with an "n" where the position finished is not shown. Low hurdle and 220yard dash times made around a turn are indicated with a "t". Acknowledgement is made to D. H. Potts, Northwestern University, for assistance in compiling the 1950 Honor Roll.







Mathias vs. Thorpe, No Contest

A young man not yet old enough to vote, whose achievements on the cinderpath belie his age, embarks in this season of 1951 on his intercollegiate competitive career in track and field.

We refer to Bob Mathias of Stanford University, who less than three years ago as a 17-year-old high school lad did the man's job of winning the Olympic

decathlon championship.

Last season, as a freshman not yet eligible for ordinary collegiate competition, Mathias bettered all records for the gruelling 10-event competition by scoring the sensational total of 8,042 points.

This year, possibly competing in as many as eight events on the collegiate dual meet menu, Mathias is destined to prove a genuine "one-man track team"

for Coach Jack Weiershauser at Stanford.

Mathias' decathlon achievements cast no doubt on his being hailed as the greatest all-around track and field athlete of all time. His record total in the 50 National AAU Decathlon Championship was 142 points greater than the old record set by Glenn Morris, the illustrious Colorado A&M graduate, in 1936.

Jim Thorpe, acclaimed after the 1912 Olympics by the King of Sweden as The Greatest Athlete in the World," would have scored 6,968 points that

year under the recent decathlon scoring system which has been the yardstick for Mathias and Morris.

Kansas's Jim Bausch, who won the Olympic title in 1932 would have scored a mere 7,396 points. Jesse Mortensen of Southern California, now coaching West Point's track legions, would have tallied just 7,252 points in 1931 when he was the "uncrowned" world decathlon champ. The score of Illinois' Harold Osborn, the 1924 Olympic titlist, would have been 6,872 points.

Two other American decathlon greats of more recent years, Bob Clark of the University of California and Bill Watson of the University of Michigan. stand head and shoulders above the rest of the pack, but still fall 500 points below Mathias' teen age effort. Clark posted 7,601 points in the '36 Olympics and Watson compiled 7,523 in the 1940 National championship.

In the world of track and field, figures do not lie. And these figures underline

Mathias' greatness.

When Bob won the 1950 national crown in his home town of Tulare, Calif... his marks were better in six events and equal in a seventh when compared to Morris' 1936 Olympics performance. Mathias is better than Bausch (1932) Olympics) in eight events! Mathias is likewise better than Osborn (1924) Olympics) in eight events! And Mathias is also better than Thorpe (1912) Olympics) in eight events!

Mathias, although yet to attain maturity, is now one of the real veterans of decathlon competition. He has negotiated the two-day 10-event grind on seven occasions. He first competed in the Southern Pacific Association AAU championships in Los Angeles in 1948. He followed that year with the National AAU championships and the Olympic Games. In 1949 he competed in the Nationals and in an international competition at Oslo. Last summer he again competed in the Nationals and then performed in the Swiss championships.

His average score for these seven meets is 7,388 points. His average achievements in the 10 events have been 11.2 in the 100 meters, 21-111/4 in the broad jump, 44-65% in the shot, 5-11% in the high jump, 51.6 in the 400 meters, 15.2 in the hurdles, 141-614 in the discus, 11-11 in the pole vault, 170-314 in the javelin and 5:01.1 in the 1500 meters.

These mean figures compiled from 17 to 19 years of age in conditions varying from good to sloppy and against sometimes indifferent competition are better than Thorpe's performances of the 1912 Olympic Games in six events while the Carlisle Institute immortal holds the edge in three events with one

THE EAST

Yale was the undisputed monarch of Eastern Collegiate track and field in 1950. Bob Giegengack's spirited Elis won the indoor and outdoor Heptagonal and outdoor IC4A team titles and led the section by placing a strong third in the NCAA championships.

However, this is another year. Top honors are up for grabs, with half a dozen or more schools in contention. Yale, hit hard by graduation losses, which eliminated an unusually large number of Eastern stars, may not be in the picture at all on the 1951 whirl around the board and cinder circuit.

Gone from the New Haven scene are the incomparable Hardware Twins, Jim Fuchs and Vic Frank; George Wade, 4:10.3 miler; Henry Stoltmann. fiery middle-distance competitor, and other useful talent.

The Elis are not completely destitute. They still have pole vaulting strength, with George Appel and Neil King, a few weight-men and a scattering of runners who should do well, like Fred Efinger and Ted Mearns

But lacking the solid bank of points provided by Fuchs, the world's best shotputter, and Frank, one of the world's best discus-throwers (who complemented each other like ham and eggs in each other's specialty), Yale now is just one of a mob that includes Army, Cornell and Princeton of the Heptagonal set and Manhattan, Seton Hall, Penn State, Georgetown and, perhaps others, in the more inclusive circle of the IC4A.

Along with the Yale aces, the roll of graduated heroes includes the stellar NYU quartet of Reggie Pearman, Hugo Maiocco, Ira Kaplan and Stan Lampert (whose loss will reduce the Violets to the status of an also-ran for the first time in years); Browning Ross and George Thompson, Villanova; Tom Kirwan, Dick Hart, Bob Mullen and Ben Kreitzberg, Pennsylvania; Phil Thigpen, Seton Hall; Jim Gehrdes and Wilbert Lancaster, Penn State; Joe Cianciabella, Manhattan; Ron Wittreich, Princeton; Dick Phillips and Josh Tobey. Brown; Bob Black and Art Sherman, Rhode Island; Bill Mitchell, Georgetown, and Neil Pratt and Dick Church, Syracuse,

That's a big loss for a single year and, in the over-all national picture, there understandably may be a slight decline in the caliber of Eastern track in 1951.

However, the section has not been completely denuded of talent. Among the topnotchers who remain in competition are Andy Stanfield, Seton Hall's great sprinter; Charley Moore and Bob Mealey of Cornell; Dick Maiocco of NYU; Joe Deady of Georgetown; Bob Carty of Manhattan; Bob Jachens of Trinity; John Thomas of Pennsylvania and Gil Borjeson of Brown.

The as yet unessayed sophomore crop includes two first-magnitude stars from abroad: John Joe Barry of Villanova, the American-born Irishman who won the National A.A.U. indoor mile title last winter, and Morrie Curotta of Seton Hall, who ran for Australia in the 1948 Olympics.

In looking over the field for 1951, Manhattan stands out as winter-book favorite for IC4A honors. George Eastment's Jasper squad has its usual relay strength plus such likely individual scorers as Carty, sprinter-broad jumper; Lindy Remigino and John O'Connell, promising sophomore sprinters; Pat Duffy and Joe Seebode, milers; Bill Lucas, two-miler; John Ogle, a potential record-breaker in the weights, and Jim Gillcrist, a reliable jumper.

Seton Hall has a big start in championship competition with Stanfield, the top broadjumper in the East as well as its best sprinter, and also is relying on Curotta, Don Shanks, a good two-miler, and strong relays. Georgetown has Deady, Carl Joyce and a flock of other middle-distance talent. Villanova has Barry, Jim Reardon, another Irish Olympian, and good relays. Penn State, which swept 1950 cross-country honors, has a lot of middle distance and distance potential, plus a 6-5 high-jumper in Vic Fritts. Coach Emil Von Elling will try to rally NYU around Dick Maiocco and Larry Ellis, who could be the East's best miler.

In the Heptagonal league, Army, with two-miler Shea, pole-vaulter Dick Bastar and hurdler Hal Shultz, and its usual great depth, stands out as the team to beat. Cornell will have a lot of scoring punch with Moore, Mealey, Meredith Gourdien, an invaluable all-around performer, weightman Art Gardiner and Walt Ashbaugh (after he gets through with basketball) but the Big Red is short of manpower. Princeton, whose leader is broadjumper Ed Davis, doesn't have many standout individuals but will make its presence felt on balance. Dartmouth will score with hurdlers Pete McCreary and Ed Myers and highjumper Nelson Ehringer.

The most spectacular team competition of 1950 was produced in the indoor IC4A championships, won by Michigan State (which bows out of IC4A track competition with its admission into the Big Ten). Karl Schlademan's Spartans scored 21 points, to Seton Hall's 20, Manhattan's 191/2 and Yale's 191/10-as a tantalizing series of good and bad breaks raised and dashed the hopes of the seesawing contenders.

Yale, with Fuchs, Frank and Wade all breaking meet records, made a runaway of the outdoor IC4A championships, rolling up 42 points to 24 for NYU, 22 for Michigan State, 191/2 for Cornell, 151/2 for Penn State and 15 for Seton Hall (whose Stanfield broke down in an effort to bag an unprecedented sprintslow-hurdles-broad jump triple).

Yale finished off by itself in both Heptagonal meets, outscoring Army 511% to 39\(\frac{1}{2}\) indoors, and beating off Cornell's bid, 62\(\frac{1}{2}\) to 44\(\frac{1}{2}\) outdoors.

Manhattan took over from NYU as Metropolitan Intercollegiate ruler. The Jaspers beat the Violets, 77 to 60½ indoors, and 98½ to 76% outdoors.

THE SOUTH

Only North Carolina University and Duke have won track titles in the Southern Conference since the 1933 schism lopped off its Deep South reaches.

And of those 16 carnivals Carolina has won 12.

Those 13 schools, which for geographic reasons severed themselves from the top-heavy and unwieldy Southern, formed the Southeastern Conference and Louisiana State University's dominance over that domain has been just as pronounced in track as has the Tar Heels' in the SC. In 18 championships the Tigers have been high score team 13 times. But they were not last year. That was Alabama's meet, its first in history. Georgia Tech has won three and Georgia one.

In 1949, largely due to the efforts of the late grand old man of Southern collegiate athletics, W. A. "Bill" Alexander, of Georgia Tech, plans were perfected to determine again track supremacy of the broad territory of the original Southern Conference. An inter-Conference meet was set up in Atlanta with the first three finishers in each event in each Conference making up the field. The Southeastern has shown surprising strength in running away with both, 92-39 in 1949 and 82-49 last year.

The charges of veteran Coach Bob Fetzer, at North Carolina, have prevailed for the past four years in their Conference championships and despite what appear to be crippling losses there is not enough evidence now in sight to

finger any other team for the 1951 outdoor championship.

All coaches in the Conference who were bold enough to risk a prediction as early as the change of the year were unanimous in their opinion Carolina would repeat. One or two lumped Duke and Maryland with the Tar Heels in a packet and one thought North Carolina State might come up with a jolting

There is plenty of room for an upset in the Southern this year. Last year's Conference championship place winners were heavily packed with seniors. There will be space up front for bright young boys in the 1951 outdoor cam-

paign.

But along with North Carolina's normal loss by graduation the Tar Heels lost their Golden Boy, Bill Albans, Mr. Track of Chapel Hill. Of all Bob l'etzer's greats he never had one exceeding the color and ability of the New lersey nomad. He just sort of wandered in to Carolina following the war and he wandered away in just about the same manner as the new year dawned.

In his first year of participation he won 18 firsts and a second in his first 19 events. In the 1949 indoor meet he won five Conference sprinting, hurdling and jumping titles. In the outdoor championships of 1950 he won three titles, setting a Conference record of 22.9 in the 220 low hurdles and having a 14.2 high hurdles run, better than prevailing SC record, annulled by too brisk a tall wind. He added the broad jump (24.10) to his crowns and by tieing for third (6 feet) in the high jump swelled his individual score to 171/2 for the day. North Carolina scored 73.9 points in winning over Duke at 47.7.

Moving on to the SC-SEC inter-conference classic, Albans won three firsts in meet-record time and placed second in a fourth event. He again did the low hurdles in 22.9 but eased up to 14.3 in the high hurdles and jumped 24 feet, 51/2 inches. His 6-4 in the high jump was good only for runner-up spot. Herb Neff of Tennessee did 6-51/2.

Along with Albans, North Carolina loses Bob Kirk, javelin; Halstead Holden, 880; Jack Moody, high jump, and Sam Magill, two-mile run, all holding 1950 SC championships in their respective events. But even these heavy losses fail to cause too much gloom in Chapel Hill. The durable Tar Heels, like OF Man Riber, roll on. There are some sophomores, Bobby Byrd, half miler; Bobby Bell, hurdler; Sam Jordan, jumper, and Bill Cornell, javelin, who are expected to help.

Only three title holders of the Conference outdoor championship will return. Of the trio one is the twin sprint champion, Tommy Woodlee, of South Carolina. John Conner, Duke, pole vaulter, and Tyson Creamer, Maryland miler,

will defend their crowns.

In the Southeastern Conference the situation is more intriguing. Alabama returned all of its principal point makers except George Cross, third-place shot man in the SEC championship. Alabama scored 421/3 points to win over the 41 for the perennial champion, Louisiana State. Auburn was third with 38, The defending champions will have only limited additional strength from

new men while Louisiana State is counting on some help from sophomores. Coach Al Moreau has bright newcomers for the hurdles, quarter and discus

with one good sprinter.

Alabama's Crimson Tide returns dual weight champion, Carl Shield, and low hurdles champion, Marvin Cichowski. LSU brings back its lone titlist, Bill Covington, quarter-miler. Only 10 of the Tigers' points were scored by seniors last year, however, and with well distributed recruits coming up as potential point makers the flip of the coin is as good a way as any to determine

the Alabama vs. LSU chances.

Auburn's prospects appear dimmer than either of the other top trio of 1950 Seniors tallied 19 of their points including the 10 Whitey Overton, ace distance man, brought home in the mile and two-mile runs. He has produced 37 Conference meet points for Auburn during his career. Dean of SEC track coaches, Wilbur Hutsell, will miss Overton's reliable 10 per meet. But the Plainsmen mentor has one bright spot in his immediate track future in a hamhanded husky named Jim Dillion. He is a lad with a natural bent for throwing things. Throwing the discus around as a freshman he has made the mediocre Conference record of 154.13/4 look silly. He does comparatively well with the shot. During one freshman meet, without training for the event, he asked t be allowed to throw the javelin. It sailed 165 feet to win. During a track workout he picked up a heavy cane, being used for a vault cross bar, and flund it half the distance of the football field. He may become one of the SEC best pitchers in briefs.

With Auburn in recession Tennessee, which scored 281/3 points for fourth place, should move into a challenger's role. The Vols have added Alf "Swede" Holmberg to a formidable distance squad and will be heavy point prospect for the mile and two-mile events. Holmberg finished first and Bob Tren

second in the four-mile SEC Cross Country Championship.

Tulane, third place at 291/3 points last year, lost its sprint ace, Paul Bienz three-year dual champion, and his annual 10-plus points, 38 in three years will be missed The Greenies' prospects were not too bright.

In the Conference eight championships will have titlists defending. In addition to Shield, who will try his dual shot and discus victory again for his old Olympic weight tossing coach, Tom Lieb, there will be Jack Stroud, of Tennessee, expected to be of aid to the Vols in their championship bid by retaining his javelin crown. And Herb Neff is another Tennesseean expected to strengthen the Vol cause by outjumping his opponents again in the high leap. The field events seem to be well defended with Dick Fos, of Tulane, in the saddle again in the broad jump.

In the cinder events Cichowski beat out Jack DeMedicis, of Auburn, in the low hurdles but the Auburn timber topper won the high stick race and will be back. Bill Geary will be back running the 880 for Tulane. The battle of Covington and Cichowski in the 440 was classic last year. The LSU boy, Covington, staggered into the tape and Cichowski dived at it and fell flat on

his face. Their duel will be renewed.

One of the unique track meets of the country, the Southern Relays, is held in Birmingham each April. Originated by a group of Magic City sportsmen, Athletic Affairs Committee of Chamber of Commerce, the project was planned simply to bring to this section of the South one of the fine relay carnivals of the country.

With backing of the Chamber of Commerce and financial support from business and civic leaders, who underwrite the loss, Southern Relays were

launched in 1949.

Its second renewal last April, drawing more than 30 Universities and Colleges, including Yale, Pennsylvania, Oklahoma A & M. Michigan and Illinois, provided high hope for the future of the event.

The 1951 event, scheduled on April 13-14, fits into the national relay meet schedule perfectly. Sponsors of the carnival anticipate still a great increase

for their third renewal.





THE MISSOURI VALLEY

Track performances by Big Seven and Missouri Valley conference athletes reached an all-time high during 1950 as school, meet and league records were surpassed nearly every time the lads pulled off their sweat suits.

As a fitting climax to the season, Herbie Semper, sterling University of Kansas distance ace, captured the national cross country crown during the autumn of 1950. It was the first time an athlete from this sector ever won that rugged four-mile grind.

Earlier in the year as a sophomore Semper hung up new Big Seven records at two-miles both indoors and out. He wheeled the distance in 9:26.8 on the boards at Kansas City and later in the spring hit 9:21 at the league's outdoor carnival in Lincoln, Nebr.

Semper also teamed with Bob Karnes, Pat Bowers and Cliff Abel to give the Jayhawkers a clean sweep of the four-mile relay crowns at the Texas, Kansas and Drake carnivals. It was the only event swept by one school at the three major relay attractions that annually draw the cream of the Midlands' track talent.

But other athletes and other schools also came through with top-drawer performances. Coach Ralph Higgins' Oklahoma A&M runners had a tremendous year, starting with a mile relay victory in the Sugar Bowl and winding up with a smashing 3:12.7 effort to win the mile relay at the Modesto, Calif., Relays.

Composed of Bill Gilchrist, Ralph Taylor, John Voight and Dick Stolpe, the Aggie foursome at Modesto ran the fastest mile relay ever turned in by a team from the Missouri Valley area.

Other Aggie highlights included a sweep of the mile, two-mile and half-mile baton trophies at the Drake relays and a 1:25.5 clocking in winning the 880-yard stick-passing scramble at Kansas. A&M's time at the Jayhawker affair was only a half second off the listed world record.

The University of Oklahoma's Bill Carroll proved he was one of the nation's premier vaulters by consistently topping 14-foot and reaching his peak with a 14-5 effort at the Kansas Relays for a meet record.

Missouri's Bill McGuire, who'll be around again in the spring of 1951 to duel Semper for national as well as sectional fame at the longer distances, won the Drake two-mile race in 9:16.7, a superlative effort in view of freezing temperature and a track soggy from snow which still blanketed much of the infield.

Kansas and Nebraska shared Big Seven conference championships, the Jayhawks winning indoors and Nebraska outdoors, while Oklahoma A&M pread-eagled the field at the annual Missouri Valley league get-together. The Valley conducts only an outdoor track meet.

Only twice in the 34-year history of Southwest Conference track meets have performers been able to hit 50 feet or better with the shot put.

Nationally, the conference has produced its share of outstanding sprinters. hurdlers and distance runners. In the shot put, though, SWC representatives

yearly have been overshadowed.

Yet the shot putters are expected to attract the attention in the 1951 track season-locally and perhaps nationally. Two sophomores, one a holder of the national high school shot put record, and two juniors are the reasons

It's Texas A&M's young sophomore Darrow Hooper on whom everyone is counting to lead the Southwest Conference out of the shot put wilderness

As a COLLEGE SPRINT MEDLEY-3:27.1-Compton (Williamson, Gentry, Brown, Walt college freshman last year, the 210-pounder consistently hit just under 50 feet, his best effort being 50 feet 23/4 inches.

Southern Methodist's Bill Forester is the other promising sophomore shot putter. Forester, who trailed Hooper all during his high school days, bested Hooper for the first time early in 1950. But he never broke the 49-foot

mark as the Aggie youngster did later in the season.

Hooper and Forester will face serious competition from Texas Christian's John Morton, winner of the 1950 SWC shot put title, and Texas' Bill Milburn, runner-up to Morton. The TCU junior won the event with a heave of 49 feet 41/2 inches to Milburn's 49 feet 3/4 inch.

A "cooling off" period is due for the Southwest Conference track meet this season as far as records are concerned. The heavy turnover in standards—

mix in 1949 and five in 1950—probably won't be equalled.

Graduation carved out the names of such fine performers as sprinter Charles Parker of Texas, discus thrower George Kadera and low hurdler Hob Hall of Texas A&M, quartermiler Tom Cox and javelin thrower Tobin Rote of Rice, and high jumpers Robert Walters of Texas and Vern McGrew

Parker and McGrew won 1950 NCAA championships, Parker in the 220 and McGrew in the high jump. Cox finished second in the NCAA 440-vard dash and posted the best quartermile time in the nation last year, 46.9. Walters had the highest leap, 6 feet 85% inches. Both were new records made in the 1950 SWC meet.

Javelin thrower Ray Marek of Texas and Hurdler Paul Leming of Texas A&M are the only returning conference trackmen who succeeded in 1950

against outside competition.

Marek's javelin throw of 197 feet 73/4 inches at the Texas Relays and 205-43/4 inches at the Kansas Relays, were good for first places. Leming, as a sophomore, was the surprise winner of the low hurdles at the Drake Relay in 24.2 and took a strong third in the high hurdle event at the same carnival.

Rice's halfmiler, Otha Byrd; Arkansas' twin two-milers, James Brown TEAM SCORES—Big Seven Conference 79, Southwest Conference 52. and James West; Texas A&M's miler, Julian Herring, and Texas' quarter miler, Bobby Dillon or broad jumper Charles Meeks may take up some of the slack left by the departed stars.

It was the Rice senior's second consecutive 880 title.

Track feats at Arkansas have been quiet since Clyde Scott left. But the Porkers came up with two sleepers-Brown and West-at the last conference meet, who finished one, two in the two mile run. Brown this year should clip the record of 9:30.7. He was timed in 9:24.9 in a dual track meet with Oklahoma A&M.

Herring has a long way to come in the mile to stay in step with the fast national milers. His best effort in 1950 was 4:17.4 recorded in the conference

when he upset his teammate and defending titlist, J. D. Hampton.

As a sophomore, Dillon could do no better than third in the conference meet, trailing Rice's Cox and Arkansas' Norman Price to the tape. But the football star was clocked under 49 seconds as Cox reeled off his blazing 46.9 Price won't be back.

Meeks has been brought along slowly. A nervous-type of jumper, the Texas senior hasn't competed against outside competition except at the Texas Relays. He reached his peak in the SWC meet with a leap of 24 feet 434 inches. He may blossom out in his final year.

Joining Hooper and Forester as promising sophomore trackmen will be Rice's Bobby Dean and Billy Daniels, Baylor's John Jeans, Texas' Gib Dawson

and Texas A&M's Bill Stalter.

Dean and Daniels may be used as sprinters, quartermilers or low hurdlers, whatever Coach Emmett Brunson decides he needs. Both compiled outstanding records in their senior high school year. Daniels established a new schoolboy 440 state record of 49.0.

Jeans confines his talent to the high jump and consistently hangs around 6 feet 4 inches. With Walters and McGrew gone, the Baylor lad could emerge

with the title in this event.

Dawson sat out his freshman year but should make Texas a valuable sprinter, especially as Coach Clyde Littlefield rebuilds his sprint relay team which will be minus Parker and Perry Samuels. Dawson, who attended high

school in Arizona, is credited with a 9.7 performance.

This sophomore football star will probably join with Carl Mayes, Floyd Rogers and Ralph Persons-all juniors-to form the new Texas sprin quartet. Mayes, Rogers and Persons can travel the 100 in 9.8. Rogers and Mayes joined with Parker and Samuels to set a new 440-yard relay record of 41.2 in the SWC meet.

Texas and Texas A&M again are expected to stage a two-way fight for the SWC champions which the Longhorns won with 60 ponits. The Aggies


