1951 NCAA Track and Field Meet

Under a hot sun in Washington Stadium at Seattle last June, 10,000 spectators saw smiling Jack Davis and grim Don Laz better existing meet records while the University of Southern California's maroon-shirted horde was winning the fastest meet in the 30-year history of the NCAA Track and Field Championships.

Laz, the blond vaulting stylist from Illinois, swung his tall body over the bar at 14 feet 9¾ inches to erase Bill Sefton's 14-year-old record, and Davis, USC's sophomore replacement for Dick Attlesey, finished a fifth of a second under the high hurdle mark with a 13.7-second race. However, his time was not allowed to stand as a record since the entire final field in the highs was judged to have gotten off ahead of the gun.

In no other NCAA meet have winning marks been so outstanding. In addition to the two mentioned above, four other performances made in the 1951 meet had been bettered only once in the previous championships and two others only twice before

George Rhoden, the long-striding Jamaican from Morgan State, was the meet's only double winner. Rhoden, the world's record holder at 400 meters, ran away with the 440 in 46.5 and came back to take the 220 in 20.7 seconds.

Rhoden's victories ruined doubles for two other athletes. Arthur Bragg, the American 100-meter champion in 1950 and a Morgan State sophomore last spring, won the 100 in 9.6 but finished behind his teammate in the 220. Cornell's Charley Moore, America's hope in the Olympic 400 meter hurdles, finished second to Rhoden in the quarter-mile and then won the low hurdles in a fast 22.7.

Southern California scored 56 points in winning its 15th NCAA team title—exactly half of the 30 meets which have been contested since 1921. Cornell University came through brilliantly for second with 40 points, 34 of them by Moore and Meredith Gourdine. Morgan State (Rhoden and Bragg, Inc.) scored 38, while Occidental's 24 points beat out Michigan State for fourth by one point.

Following is a brief description of each event:

ONE-MILE RUN-Occidental's Bob McMillen, starting from lane one, set a fast pace as expected. At the quarter he led in 60.8 seconds, three yards ahead of Warren Druetzler of Michigan State. Druetzler, a veteran of two years running in Sweden, confidently let McMillen go away to an eight-yard lead at the end of two laps in 2:03.8. Druetzler had previously said he would not follow McMillen's pace, which he considered too fast. He said later, "I could tell I was right after a little running. It was my day." He passed the half in 2:05. McMillen pulled away to a 12-yard margin at the three-quarters in 3:06.4. Then Druetzler, crossing the line in 3:08 just ahead of Missouri's Bill McGuire and Washington State's Bill Parnell, began to cut down the lead with long strides. He caught the Olympic steeplechaser with 200 yards to go and McMillen was unable to offer a fight. Into the stretch, Parnell, the British Empire mile champion, edged ahead of McMillen, but the game Oxy runner fought back to retake second place by two feet. The winner ran his last lap in 60.8 to 63.1 for Mc-Millen, 61,2 for Parnell and 65,2 for McGuire. Druetzler's winning time, 4:08.8, was the second fastest NCAA mile ever run. Eight of the 13 finishers ran the fastest miles of their lives, with Fred Dwyer of Villanova, the IC4A champ, not even getting a place in 4:13.8.

440-YARD RUN—Jim Lavery of Drake, a place-winner last year, failed to qualify for the 1951 final, although he ran 47.9 in his heat. After four false starts, the finalists got off fast with USC's John Bradley leading the way. Rhoden caught Bradley at 150 yards and was a yard ahead at the 220 in 22 flat. The 1949 champ. Charley Moore, was caught in the pack around the turn, but ran

away from all but Rhoden in the stretch. Rhoden's 46.5 has only been bettered once in an NCAA meet.

SHOT PUT—Parry O'Brien, Southern California's confident sophomore, who had never lost in a college meet, was out to beat Texas A&M's equally confident soph, Darrow Hooper, who had said, several weeks before the meet, "I think I can beat O'Brien." But the Trojan tried too hard; he fouled on throws of 54 and 55 feet; going into his final throw he was 7 inches behind Hooper's leading 53 feet 11 inches. Pointing to the sky, O'Brien shoved across the circle and let fly. To the close observer, he was near Hooper's mark. Tensely, O'Brien stood in the circle, watching them measure. For a full minute he watched, then he turned and shook hands with the tall, well-built Hooper. He had lost by one inch. Bob Carey of Michigan State again proved to be a great competitor, finishing third on his best-ever throw.

100-YARD DASH—The starter fired a consistently fast gun and the runners knew it. After the heats, where the main casualties were Big Ten champ Jesse Thomas and UCLA's injured Rod Richard, the sprinters started their guessing game in the final. After three false starts, the field finally got away. Art Bragg was an easy winner in 9.6, four feet ahead of Drake's promising Negro sophomore, Jim Ford. UCLA's stocky Bob Work was a bare six inches behind Ford and well ahead of the bunched pack. Andy Stanfield of Seton Hall, whose injured leg almost eliminated him from the trials, withdrew from the final.


JAVELIN THROW—This was great competition. The seven qualifiers were grouped from Chuck Missfeldt of Oregon at 211 feet down to George Holley of Colorado at 206 feet. Texas' foot baller, Ray Marek, threw over 204 but couldn't buy a place in the finals. Big John White of California took over the lead at 212' 10½" midway through the last round, but on his last attempt, Missfeldt, to the delight of the crowd of partisan Northwesterners, got off his winning toss, good for 219' 444".

HIGH HURDLES—USC's freckled, smiling Jack Davis tried one break, then got off to a one-foot lead. He barely led teammate Art Barnard to the eight hurdle, with Auburn's greatly improved senior, Jack DeMedicis, a close third at that point. Barnard hit the eighth hurdle which was made unfairly heavy with a 2" x 3" board across the top. He did well to stay in the race. Two other finalists hit those hurdles and walked in. Davis won by three yards over DeMedicis with Barnard a yard farther back. Four of the first five men were clocked faster than ever before. Davis was amazed upon hearing that his time was not allowed as a meet record. He said, "I didn't get a rolling start. I was rocking back at the gun."

BROAD JUMP—George Brown of UCLA and Gourdine both fell off more than a foot from their best marks. Only USC's Frank Flores in third place came through with an improvement, jumping 23' 10", best of his career. Only Brown could improve after the preliminary round, moving up from 24' 3½" to his winning 24' 53½" mark, 4½ inches ahead of Gourdine. Asked about the poor jumping, Brown said, "It was a good pit, except that the board is too hard. I was too nervous the first day and just didn't have it today."

880-YARD RUN—Stacey Siders, Illinois soph, led from the start followed by a closely-bunched mob, passing the 220 in 24.5 and the 440 in 52.8. Olympian Clem Eischen of Washington State passed Siders in the third 220 and Oxy's John Barnes soon broke loose from the pack of elbows and went after him. Eischen eased past the 660 pole in a fast 1:21.5. Around the last turn it was a two-man race, but in the stretch the 21-year-old Barnes pulled away to win handily in 1 minute 50.7 seconds. NYU's little battler. Larry Ellis, nipped surprising Leon Lepard of Abilene Christian for third. Two yards back, Oregon's fast-closing Jack Hutchins, another Canadian Olympian. edged out Joe Deady of Georgetown. It took a 1:52.1 race to get into the money.

HIGH JUMP—Four jumpers cleared 6' 6" on their first attempts. First over was Lew Hall, a Florida sophomore who used a floating belly roll. Then came

Herm Wyatt, the smooth Negro western roller from San Jose; then George Widenfeldt, the veteran Swede who is an exchange-student at Washington, and who used a reverse scissors; then Barney Dyer, a Utah blond, straddled over. Fifth man to clear the height, on his second try, was Walt Davis, the 6' 8" Texas A&M basketball star, who had spent the night before the meet waiting in an airport and did not arrive until after the event had started. Hall, a colorful, sunburned tow-head, hit the bar at 6' 7" but it stayed on, which made him the 1951 champ. With head judge Les Steers leaping into the air with him, Hall, a 6' 1½", 184-pounder, rapidly cleared 6' 8" and 6' 9" to post the second best mark in the meet's history. Then he calmly had the bar raised to 6' 11½". He failed to come close twice, but on the third attempt he was in the pit looking up while the bar bounced up and down and one end finally fell off. Steers clapped both hands on top of his head as he watched. Hall said, "My shin splints are killing me."

220-YARD DASH—George Rhoden, who ran 21 flat for 200 meters around a turn last year, was overlooked in the pre-meet speculation because he was not expected to enter this event. But after his easy 21.3 heat, the 23-year-old Jamaican was a solid favorite to win. Running with a long, stretching stride, Rhoden won by a full yard over Bragg. Walt McKibben of little Occidental, who placed fourth in 1950, again finished powerfully to beat impressive Thane Baker of Kansas State by a foot for third.

DISCUS THROW—This event was settled in the preliminary rounds. First Stanfords' Bob Mathias, a tremendous competitor, reached his personal best with a 164' 9½" throw. But Jim Dillion, another great sophomore, spun his long arms like a heliocopter blade and sent the flying saucer out 167' 5¾", also his best up to that time and enough to win the title. Indiana's Clifton Anderson and Idaho's Duane Taylor were just shy of the 160-foot arc.

TWO-MILE RUN—Jim Brown of Arkansas led through the first 440 in 65.5 seconds and then defending-champion Don McEwen of Michigan took over. With Herb Semper of Kansas, Charles Capozzoli of Georgetown and Brown on his heels. McEwen clocked 2:14.1, 3:23.2 and 4:32.5. Then he picked up the pace to 5:39.8 and Brown dropped back 12 yards. After another lap, even faster, McEwen was fifteen yards out on Semper and Capozzoli in 6:46.4. At seven laps McEwen was all alone at 7:54.4. Capozzoli pulled even with Semper in 7:59 but the red-headed NCAA cross-country champ held on and they put on such a last-lap fight that they almost ran up McEwen's heels in the home stretch. McEwen crossed in 9:03.2 and Capozzoli outsprinted Semper for second in 9:04.5, fastest time ever made by an American sophomore. Like the mile this was easily the fastest field in NCAA meet history.

LOW HURDLES—Speedy Jesse Thomas led by two yards half way through the race, but he faded to fourth at the end as Moore closed with an unbelievable burst of speed to beat Gourdine by a foot. Davis ran his fastest flight of lows but was still four feet back at the tape. Kansas' consistent Jack Greenwood was a close fifth behind Thomas.

POLE VAULT—With Nebraska's Don Cooper injured, this was to be all Don Laz. But Laz had a poor record in national meets and looked anything but a 15-footer at 13' 6" and 14'. He was in pain from stomach cramps and missed his first vault at 14'. Two-time NCAA winner Bobby Smith of San Diego State continued a mediocre year by missing at 14'. USC's Walt Jensen and Jack Rowan cleared 14' the first time around, but the latter injured his foot doing it and had to be carried from the field. Florida's Leroy Poucher and San Jose's George Mattos made 14' on their third attempts, but along with Jensen could go no higher. Las managed to scrape over 14' 3" to win the event. Abruptly his cramps disappeared; he said, "I'm warmed up now"; and he looked like a truly great vaulter as he cleared 14' 6" and 14' 934". The crowd sat patiently after the rest of the meet was finished as he tried and failed three times at 15'.



Joe Schatzle, Bob Carty, Lindy Remigino and Jack O'Connell, the quartet of sprinters which piled up an unprecedented 23 points in the IC4A 100 and 220yard dashes only to drop a 331/4 to 291/2 decision to a senior-laden Cornell squad for the team championship, is back ready to write further sprint history. And Coach George Eastment, still hard at the task of bringing the Bronx School its first IC4A squad triumph, has real additional help in weight-thrower Steve Dillon, high jumper Frank Gaffney and Vernon Dixon and Lou Jones, a pair of sophomore sensations who will give the Jaspers scoring strength in the 440 and 880 events.

But after Manhattan, the Eastern picture for 1952 is in a confused state as far as predictions go. This is due to the probability of sure point-scorers being called into military service and the hit and miss way freshman are to be used in varsity athletic competition. At the advanced date of this writing, the Ivy League is in agreement against the use of first year students and Manhattan and many other independent schools with recognized track and field strength

are adopting the same policy.

While freshman good enough to become sizeable point-scorers in varsity competition are not in the dime a dozen variety, there are a few around the East who could make title contenders out of average squads. Penn State, strengthened by Ollie Sax, a 48.3 quarter-miler in high school and other stickout sophomores, may push Manhattan due to points scored by freshman Roosevelt Grier, a 220 pounder who will be over 200 feet in the javelin and 50 feet in the shot put. The Jaspers themselves could cash in by using Charley Pratt, a freshman out of Palyra (N.J.) High School, who appears to have the talent to score in the high and low hurdles and the broad jump. Many other similar examples could be cited,

Barring the unpredictable, the lineup behind Manhattan shapes up as follows: Penn State, Villanova, Georgetown, Yale, Cornell, Harvard, Army, Seton Hall and Pennsylvania. The Villanova boost is based on Miler Fred Dwyer, good enough to win the IC4A indoor and outdoor mile crowns as a sophomore, and the Irish contingent of John Joe Barry, Cummin Clancy and Jim Reardon. Georgetown's points are concentrated in the flat races from 440 yards to two miles. The returning Hoya standouts are Charles Capozzoli, a 9:04.5 two-miler, Joe LaPierre, a 4:10.8 miler, and a good trio of half-milers, Tom Voorhees, Racely Saunders and Carl Joyce. Cornell will build around versatile Meredith Courdine, IC4A low hurdle and broad jump champ and record holder in the latter event.

Army lost just one trackman in its cribbing scandal but has little moving up. The biggest Eastern loss by graduation was Seton Hall's Andy Stanfield who closed out with two indoor crowns and two firsts and a second outdoors in his IC4A curtain call which included a new American record of 20.6 seconds for 220 yards around a turn. Among the other departing stars were Cornell's Charley Moore, Bob Mealey and Walt Ashbaugh; Tufts' Tom Bane and Bob Backus; Penn State's Ted Roderer, Yale's George Appel, Temple's Dick Lyster, NYU's Dick Maiocco and Georgetown's Joe Deady.

To the Eastern track follower, the biggest thrill of the 1951 season came in the result story of the Coliseum Relays in Los Angeles. Having few opportunities to crow over national triumphs on the cinders, the triumphs of Manhattan, Morgan State and Georgetown in the relays and Stanfield in the individual events were indeed heart-warming.

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The indoor season had Manhattan, making up for its tough luck loss the previous year, winning the IC4A indoor title with 29 points. Seton Hall, persistent runner-up of late, was second with 27 2/7. Army was the Heptagona indoor winner over Yale, Princeton and Cornell. The Metropolitan intercollegi ate titular derby had Manhattan winning the varsity honors but yielding to Fordham in the freshman division,

On the way to its first IC4A championship since 1936, Cornell won the outdoor Heptagonal with Yale, Navy and Harvard bringing up the rear. The Met outdoor games was a duplication of the indoor finish with Manhattan and Fordham taking the varsity and freshman laurels.

The big goal for the IC4A schools this year is to supply an Olympic champion and help from graduates is in order. The 1948 Games at London marked the first time since the modern Olympics started in 1896 that an Eastern college stu dent or graduate did not win an Olympic crown. The IC4A winning skein wa not broken as Guinn Smith of California won the pole vault, an event he had captured in IC4A competition eight years earlier.

However, the prospects are bright for one or more Olympic Gold Medals being awarded an Eastern athlete this summer since Moore is the American record holder in the 400-meter hurdles and appears to be the world's best in tha race, since Yale graduate Jim Fuchs holds the world mark in the shot put, and since Stanfield at his best may be the world's fastest human. Among the other "old grads" who will be pointing for Olympic titles are Harvard weightman Sam Felton, Yale discuser Vic Frank, Penn State distance men Curtis Stone and Horace Ashenfelter and NYU's quarter-miling Maiocco brothers, Hugo and Dick.

THE SOUTH

Normalcy returned to Southeastern Conference track and field in 1951. For the 14th time in the 19 years of the SEC championships Louisiana State was on the throne again. Alabama, winner for the first time in 1950, yielded its spot in a close race scoring 39 points against 47 for Ole Lou. Only once before has Louisiana scored less and won but both Georgia Tech, in 1949, and Alabama last year compiled fewer points as champions,

But while the SEC seemed to have set its house in routine track order, up in the Atlantic Seaboard section of the South the Southern Conference was greeting a brand new champion, Maryland. The Terrapins, plodding along in a steady rain, outscored the favored North Carolina Tar Heels, 67.93 to 52.85. UNC was gunning for its fifth straight win and 13th in the 17 championships.

In winning, Maryland picked up five firsts against four for North Carolina. Due to prevailing conditions there were no outstanding performances.

It had been predicted North Carolina might edge out another victory, even after the team had lost its wonder boy of 1950, Bill Albans. But Albans absence and without the 171/2 points he scored in 1950, Tar Heel scoring power was trimmed too fine. The Heels had lost a lot of other point winners from their 1950 championship team.

Morty Cohen tallied 13 for Maryland to lead the scoring pace. Only Tyson Creamer, of Maryland, in the mile, and Johnny Conner, of Duke, pole vaulter, retained their 1950 titles. All records stood up as the SC athletes battled against

the handicap of the elements.

In the Southeastern, run under fine weather conditions, although on the same dates, May 18-19, it was a different story. Excellent marks were registered with three records being broken. All new standards were set in the field events.

Big sophomore Jim Dillion of Auburn, who later went on to take the NCAA title in the discus, did 161' 91/2" in the meet. His best for the season, set up

later, was 167' 534".

The high jump record fell to Herb Neff, of Tennessee, who cleared 6' 61/2" beating out J. "Pappa" Hall of Florida who did 6' 51/2". It was the second straight title for Neff. Hall later turned in a sensational 6' 9" jump and won the National Collegiate and National AAU titles. Hall, who looks like and is a fine football player, will be back again this Spring for track to renew his rivalry with Neff.

The pole vault mark was lifted to 14' 278" by LeRoy Poucher, of Florida,

who closed out a brilliant career with the 'Gators.

The distance running was dominated by Tennessee but the biggest disappointment of the meet was the failure of Alf Holmberg, the Swede, to establish any new records. In the mile run Holmberg, John Trent and Frankie Albertson, all of Tennessee, were so far ahead they manipulated a three-way tie for the finish. Holmberg got fouled up in the 880 and would have been disqualified if he had not dropped out. He ran the two-mile then and won in the slow time of 9:53.3. The mile affair was negotiated in a mediocre 4:27.3 pace.

In the Southeastern-Southern inter-conference meet for the third year the SEC completely dominated competition, 94 to 37. With Alabama, for the second year, leading the team scoring, the SEC grabbed 12 of the 15 first places.

Dillion threw 161' 8" for a new meet discus record. Poucher put up a new

pole vault height and Jud Webster of Alabama set a new 880 mark of 1:54.2. The outlook for 1952 in the two big Southern collegiate loops is made un-

certain by freshman eligibility. But in the SEC there is no reason to point a predicting finger at any team other than LSU. Alabama will have a new track coach, Herbert Hodges, who moved down from Beloit College to replace Tom Lieb, who resigned and moved to the West Coast,

Possibility of an Olympic championship or even a world's record for Florida's Hall at high jumping; collegiate record hurling for Auburn's Dillion in the discus; and improved shot putting with Carl Shield of Alabama and Dillion

duelling will intrigue track fans.

In the Southern Conference the race should be wide open again. The veteran Bob Fetzer will not long be out of the picture with North Carolina and Maryland may find itself this Spring in the same situation Alabama noted last year.

Birmingham's unique collegiate track event, Southern Relays, the only major relay meet in the country sponsored by a Chamber of Commerce organization, in its third annual renewal was featured by Ohio State and Louisiana State.

While no team championship is declared, Buckeye athletes shared the biggest

medal harvest with Ole Lou's Tigers, taking two relay races each.

The committee for the meet has announced dates for 1952 as April 4-5. This is a definite bid for Eastern and Mid-Western colleges whose Spring holidays hit at about this date.

Duke dominated the Florida Relays held on University of Florida campus with Henry Poss leading the way. He won the 100-yard dash, broad jump and

anchored one of Duke's four winning relay teams.

The 1952 Florida Relays will be held March 28-29, one week before the Southern.

THE MIDDLE WEST

Midwestern colleges, which contributed nine undergraduates and four alumni to the 1948 American Olympic track and field team, should have an even larger representation at Helsinki than they had at London.

Such veteran internationalists as Wisconsin's middle-distance great Don Gehrmann; Indiana's Fred Wilt, Uncle Sam's greatest threat to Scandinavian domination of the longer grinds; and Illinois's Bob Richards, one of the world's four 15 loot pole vaulters, are likely to give global competition another whirl.

Among the 1950 graduates who probably will stay in training with the hope of wearing the starred-and-striped shield overseas are Warren Druetzler, of Michigan State, NCAA mile champion, and Don Laz, of Illinois, NCAA champ in the pole vault and another member of that 15-foot quartet.

Then there is the bumper crop of running and leaping and weight-propelling talent on the campuses of the Big Ten Conference schools and their neighbors. The intercollegiate season will sift out the worthiest of these, and it may well be that the survivors will include several whose names are as yet unknown to any sort of fame.

Illinois, winner of the Big Ten indoor and outdoor team titles and the Central Collegiate Open championship, lost only four lettermen from its 1950 squad, Coach Leo Johnson's returning heroes include Cirilo McSween, a 47.7 quartermiler who won Conference championships in that event both indoors and outdoors last year; Joe Gonzalez, Big 10 title-holder in the 60 indoors and the 220 outdoors; Tom Floyd, who shared the Conference high jump crown indoors, and stacey Siders, Central Collegiate Open 880 champ in 1:53.3.

Other lettermen with honor roll marks include Joel McNulty, a 14.5 high hurdler, and Dick Coleman, a 14-½ pole vaulter. Bob Wood, a weightman ineligible last year, and Henry Cryer, who ran a 1:53.9 half-mile indoors before being felled by scholastic difficulties, are expected to be available. The weight department, headed by Captain-elect Marv Berschet, also will have a promising sophomore in John Bauer, who had a 56-5½ mark with the 12-pound shot in high school. Other sophomores of which great things are expected are Pole Vaulter lim Wright, 13-½ in high school, Gene Maynard, a 1:58.9 schoolboy half-miler, and Hurdlers Joe Corley and Willie Williams. Jerry Kats, injured last year, also is counted on to add strength to the Illini's barrier brigade.

Michigan State, runnerup in its first Big 10 outdoor championship competition and highest-scoring Midwestern team in the NCAA meet, lost Jesse Thomas, a fine sprinter and hurdler who won Conference titles in the 100 and the 220 lows, and Don Makielski, Big 10 champ in the 880 outdoors, in addition to Druetzler. But the Spartans figure to be just as strong if not stronger than last year.

Returning lettermen include Bob Carey, Big 10 champ in the shot and possessor a 53-23% record; Jim Kepford, a 4:16.3 miler and 9:21.5 2-miler, and Dick Ienaon, a 23.1 man in the low hurdles. Coach Karl Schlademan's sophomore hopefuls are Louis Vargha, sprinter and quarter-miler; Dick Jarrett, a 1:53.6 miler as a freshman; Ron Barr and Canadians Lyle Garbe and John Cook in the distances; John Corbelli, brother of Letterman Joe, in the hurdles (15 and 1 m a freshman) and Don Schiesswohl, who surpassed 50 feet with the shot as a thinic.

Indiana, which finished third in last year's Big 10 outdoor meet with only five fewer points than the total with which it had won the title the year before, figures to have its best balanced squad of the postwar era. That means the Hoosiers

again may have the top dual-meet team in the Midwest. They beat Illinois in-

doors and Michigan State outdoors while going undefeated last season.

Coach Gordon Fisher's principal loss from 1950 was Clif Anderson, Big 10 champ in the shot indoors and with the discus. Returning are Jim Harper, Conference titlist in the high jump outdoors and a share-holder in the indoor crown; Jack Hagan, a 4:16.6 miler, and Dave Martin, a 23.6 low hurdler. Sophomores include Fred Watson, a sprinter; Mel Edwards, quarter-miler and hurdler; Marshall Jones, hurdler; Greg Lawson and John LaBrash, half-milers; Lowell Zellers, whose indoor marks as a freshman were 1:57.8 in the 880; 4:20.3 in the mile and 9:35 for 2 miles the first time he ever ran that distance; Jim Parkinson, pole vaulter; Ken Sambursky, broad jumper, and Al Wilson, discus tosser. Fisher also will have two fine freshman prospects in Jim Lambert, the nation's top scholastic miler of 1951 (4:22.3) and Bill Bergmann, who has put the 16pound shot 48 feet and has a 55-4 mark with the 12-pounder.

Michigan, fourth-place finisher in last year's Big 10 outdoor meet, lost Don Hoover, its Big 10 indoor champion in both hurdles, but still has the great Don McEwen, NCAA champion and record-holder in the 2-mile. The stocky Canadian is Big 10 champion both indoors and outdoors at that distance and in the mile outdoors, in which he holds the Conference meet record of 4:09. His NCAA

2-mile record, 9:01.9, was set in 1949.

Coach Don Canham's returning lettermen also include Charles Whiteaker, a 1:54.1 half-miler, and he has promising sophomores in Jack Carroll, a :48.9 quarter-miler; John Ross, 1:55.3 half-miler and 4:18 miler, both Canadian, Roland Nilsson, 52-foot shot putter and 161-footer in the discus from Sweden; Roy Pella, a 150-foot discus thrower; and Milt Mead, 6-51/4 high jumper. Ross Coates,

a freshman, has run the 100 in :09.9.

Iowa, which made its best showing in 13 years in the 1950 Big 10 outdoor, finishing fifth, will have most of its point-scorers back plus a large group of newcomers with high potentials. The sophomores include LeRoy Ebert (49.6 in the 440 and 1:55.3 in the half); Ted Wheeler (1:57 in the half, 4:16.7 in the mile and 9:30 for 2 miles); Loranzie Williams (9.8 in the 100 and 23-4 for the broad jump) and Jon Wardell (6-4 high jumper). Clyde Gardner, ineligible last year, holds the national interscholastic discus record at 179-234 and has thrown the college-weight platter nearly 155 feet. Dick Fowler, a freshman, was the national leader in the 180-yard low hurdles among last year's schoolboys. The other frosh prospects include Bob Clark, a 49.5 quarter-miler; Jim Milani, low hurdler, and Mike Korns, shot putter. Coach Francis Cretzmeyer also will have a 4:17 miler and 9:17 2-miler from Canada, Rich Ferguson.

Purdue lost its Big 10 outdoor high hurdle champion, Bob Hocker, but Coach Dave Rankin is expecting great things from Denis Johansson from Finland, who has run 1,500 meters in 3:49.6, considered equivalent to a 4:07 mile. John Stayton, who ran 4:14.7 indoors before being laid low by the flu bug, is expected to do considerably better this season. Sophomore prospects include Ben Youtsey, a 50-second quarter-miler, and the freshman possibilities are topped by Sprinter Dick McComb and High Jumper Dave Burke. Jack Blair, a 24-foot

broad jumper, will return to competition after a year's layoff.

Minnesota has a sophomore mile hopeful in Denny Hanson, who has run 4:20, and it may be that Byrl Thompson will return to school. If so he will be among

the title contenders in both the shot and discus.

Wisconsin is expecting an upsurge with most of its veterans returning, including Luke Collins, outdoor Big 10 440 champion in 1949. Frank Duis, a transfer student, has run the 880 in 1:53 and the mile in under 4:17. Steve Murphy, a

freshman, has a 4:21 high school mile record.

Ohio State, cut down by injuries to a ninth-place finish in last year's Big 10 outdoor, its poorest showing in 28 years, might rebound to the first division, but freshmen will have to supply the depth. Joe Morgan, a 50-foot shot putter, is the only sophomore counted on to be outstanding. Len Truex, Conference indoor champion in the 880 and mile, and Gene Cole, holder of the national scholastic 440 record, will be back. Cole, who tried the shorter sprints last year,

was bothered by a bad leg all season. Truex was timed in 4:09.7 in losing to McEwen in the Big 10 outdoor mile and later won the National AAU metric-mile. Northwestern, which failed to score in last year's Big 10 outdoor, has an al-

ready established star in Sophomore Sprinter Jim Golliday, National AAU 100meter champion and winner of 9 of 10 races on a triumphant European tour last

Notre Dame's first season under the coaching of the former Irish 440 and 880 star and Canadian Olympian, Alex Wilson, was not a success, four all-time Irish record-holders having been lost from the 1950 season. Wilson still faces a formidable rebuilding job with John Mohar, 1:54 half-miler, and Paul Ewing, 9.8 man in the 100, as his nucleus for 1952.

George Rider, starting his 30th year as coach at Miami University, is due for the routine advance from vice-president to president of the National Track Coaches Association. Rider has two hopes for the second Olympics representation of his career: Jim (Boxcar) Bailey, a 200-pounder sprinter, who won the Drake Relays 100 last year, and Roger Moore, a 21.5 performer in the 220 and 48.6 quarter-miler last season. Rider says Moore's steady development is a close parallel to that of Jim Gordon, who represented Miami in the 1932 Olympics. Mlami won the Mid-America Conference title for the fourth straight year in 1951 and was undefeated in dual competition.

McGuire ran Herb Semper of Kansas into the ground with a record-shattering 4:11.8 mile which wiped off the 4:12.6 Big Seven record which had been held by Bob Karnes of Kansas for only

McGuire's mile time was the only new record, although many outstanding performances were turned in during the loop meet. Thane Baker, Kansas State sophomore, swept the sprints with 9.8 in the 100 and 21.3 in the 220-and has two more years of competition. Two Oklahoma juniors won the 440 and 880 Jerry Meader taking the quarter in 48 seconds and Don Crabtree leading the

half in 1:54.2.

Another sweep was marked up by Jack Greenwood, the splendid Kansas senior taking the low hurdles in 23.3 and the high barriers in 14.6. Three other seniors climaxed their college careers with victory in the field events. Clair Mayes of Oklahoma won the shot with 50 feet 534 inches; Laddie Stovall of Missouri broad-jumped 24 feet 25% inches; and Leonard Kehl of Nebraska shared the pole vault prize with Jerry Lemon of Oklahoma at 13 feet 834 inches.

A good tipoff on what to expect in 1952 is the fact that the other Big Seven field event champs will be back. Sophomores were Jim Robertson of Iowa State who won the discus with 153-5%, and George Holley of Colorado, who got 201with the javelin. And Junior Bob Gorden of Missouri will have a chance t

defend the high jump title he won last year with 6 feet 5% inches.

Outside of the Conference meet, the outstanding performance by a Big Sever track man was Nebraskan Don Cooper's pole vault of 15 feet 3/8 inch in the Kansas Relays. It made him the first college vaulter and the third man in history to clear 15 feet. The following week at the Drake Relays Cooper suffered pulled leg muscle after clearing 14-6, and the injury put him out of competition for the rest of the season. Cooper will head a contingent of post-graduate star who will stay in competition this spring for a shot at the Olympic Games.

Oklahoma A, and M, added another chapter to its long reign in the Missour Valley Conference, scoring 901/2 points in the annual meet. Trailing wer Wichita 45, Drake 421/2, Bradley 391/2, Houston 101/2, Tulsa 8 and Detroit 1.

But the standout individual of the Valley meet was Soph James Ford of Drake He won the 100-yard dash in 9.5 seconds, to wipe out the 9.6 record which ha been the conference standard since Roland Locke of Nebraska established it 1926. Ford helped Drake capture four relay titles in the Drake Relays, an looms as one of the nation's top sprinters in this, his junior season.

This spring, however, the Aggies may have to struggle to retain the title. addition to Ford, Tommy Deckard has a half-dozen other stars scheduled to r turn at Drake including Jim Lavery, the Canadian quarter-miler, Dewey Johnson the Conference mile champ, sprinter George Nichols, and Arnold Betton, who was ineligible last spring but who jumped 6 feet 9 inches in the Ozark AAU meet.

THE SOUTHWEST

Track and field supremacy again becomes an argument between the Texas Agales and Texas in 1952, as it has almost every year since the Southwest Confersince's founding nearly four decades ago. The balanced Aggies, defending champlons and rulers four times in the past five years, return a brilliant crew of field performers while Texas expects improvement in the sprints, hurdles and relays. Arkansas also may be surprising strong this spring.

Clarence Darrow Hooper, greatest shot putter in Southwest history, won the NCAA crown as a sophomore and bids for an Olympic berth this summer. The algantic weight man set a new Conference shot record of 54-71/2 in his first year, won the discus and led the Aggies to an overwhelming victory over Texas in the

Conference meet.

Last season was one of embarrassment for Clyde Littlefield, Longhorn coach noted for the production of outstanding sprinters. He watched in anguish as IIII Stalter won the 100 and 220 and anchored A, and M,'s championship sprint

Littlefield meets the challenge this year, however, with sophomores Charles Thomas, Dean Smith and Jim Brownhill and veterans Carl (Red) Mayes, injured

in 1951, and Floyd Rogers.

The three rookies, along with the departed S. M. Meeks, ran a 41.5 sprint relay as freshmen. The National Junior AAU was Thomas' springboard to fame as he set a new 200-meter record. Don Barton, intramural record holder, provides additional sprint help.

Improvement by Stalter, a surprise in his sophomore year, could alter Longhorn plans, however. Jack Troxell, Arkansas sophomore, carries a 9.7 100 repu-

tation to the varsity.

Overall depth again makes the Aggies the foremost favorite, for Coach Frank Anderson depends on thirds and fourths as much as he does blue ribbon winners. Last year the Aggies placed in all 16 events at the Conference meet while also presenting ten first place winners. Nine of the 14 individual 1951 champions are hade, and six first place returnees wear the Maroon and White of Aggieland.

Walter Davis. Conference high jump champion at 6-6, had 6-9 and 6-8 leaps to his credit despite a late start because of basketball. Don Graves-13-7 in the pule vault-and Bobby Ragsdale, with a 24-41/2 broad jump in the books, give

the Apples adequate field representation to go with Hooper and Davis.

Davis faces a tough field in defense of his championship, however. Texas' Phil Ransopher and Ray Womack, a 6-6 leaper, and the brilliant Rice sophomore. II. C. Derryberry, offer the sternest competition. Emmett Brunson, Rice coach. mays Derryberry is as good at this stage of his career as was Vern McGrew, Olympic product of the Houston school. Derryberry did 6-53/4 twice in freshman competition.

Magadale's broad jump disputes will come from Texas' Morris Johnson and

High Hazard, a transplanted Pennsylvanian at Arkansas.

In the javelin Texas lost the champion, Ray Marek, but counts on SWC runnerup Don Klein, with a throw of 194-81/4, and Jim Dowies. Arkansas challenges with the versatile Hazard, while SMU presents Pat Knight.

Hoper is the class of the shot and discus divisions, of course, with SMU's IIII Forester, Rice's Ronnie Berger and Texas' Bill Milburn fighting for the

other positions.

Hurdling competition will be extremely keen, with all but two of 1951's 12 place

winners in the SWC meet returning.

Val Joe Walker of SMU was an excellent high hurdler as a junior, but injuries held back Rice's Bill Howton, and Paul Leming of the Aggies never could round into form. With a 14.1 timing, Walker should be among the nation's best this year. Leming's 14.4 makes him a firm contender, while Howton shows much promise.

Arkansas may slip in for high hurdles points with Bill Heffington, Jerry Bogard and Lee Yoder available. Texas provides a point-maker in Willie Valls, a junior

Billy Bless of the Aggies reigns in the low hurdles. His 23 flat time is surpassed by few in the land. Walker, Ragsdale, Leming and Ralph Person of Texas constitute the competition. Another man to watch here is Texas' Thomas, whose

speed and strength make him a standout.

In the 440 the Aggies lost their first three places—Don Mitchell, James Mc-Carty and Bernie Place. However, Coach Anderson rarely lacks quarter-mile talent. Injuries hounded James Baker last year, but he ran a 48.4 as a freshman and might surpass that time in 1952. Robert Mays, Carrol Libby and Robert Shaeffer are counted upon for help.

Bob Carson, Joe Carson, Bobby Dillon and Bob Eschenburg give Texas a sound quartet to match A, and M, in the 440 and mile relay, although mile relay triumphs are infrequent achievements over the relay-conscious College Station

entry.

Arkansas representatives in the 440 include Rick Heber and Sammy Smith.

while Rice nominates Billy Ed Daniels and Charles Petkousek.

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THE ROCKY MOUNTAINS

Skyline (Mountain States Conference) track and field fans who cheered Utah's Redukins for winning their second consecutive cinder championship in 1951, may have more to cheer about when the 1952 campaign rolls around.

Coach Sherman R. (Pete) Couch has all but four of his 1951 point-getters back and should be able to mould another well-balanced unit for an assault on Skyline einder marks. Couch, like most other mentors however, has his fingers crossed in to what the draft might do to his 1952 prospects.

At this writing, Colorado A&M and Montana University appear to be the ablest

of the challengers to Utah's track and field supremacy.

Utah, showing fine balance between track and field, amassed 621/2 points in the 1961 Conference showdown, while new-member Montana, a challenger all the way, placed a close second with 59. Following were Colorado A & M with 361/2. Wyoming with 31, Brigham Young with 17, Utah State with 12 and Denver with 7

The 1951 season was studded with highlights and close contests which lured good crowds to dual meets and to Eastern and Western Division meets, and set the stage for a brilliant showdown at the University of Utah stadium for Con-

ference honors.

Perhaps the most significant happenings of the '51 season were the performannes of Utah's two sensational sophomore jumping jacks-Fred Pratley and IIII Dyer. Both were consistent at clearing 6-feet-7-inches during the season, the two tying for first place in one dual meet at that height, with Pratley finally sopping the Conference title and setting a new Conference record at that figure.

Dyer's performance earned for him a trip with the U.S. track and field squad which toured the Orient during the summer. Both represented the Conference In the NCAA meet in Seattle, and each was a participant in the National AAU most in California. Pratley divided his talents and added the Conference high hundle championship to the Utah point column, Barring calamities, both have Iwn more years of competition remaining.

Another highlight came in the Western Division meet where a pair of speed murchants wrote something for Ripley to study, Utah's Dale Newbold (also a amphomore) and Montana's Joe Luckman thrilled a good turnout at Utah State when they finished in a dead heat in the 100 at 9.9. And if that wasn't enough, this same pair baffled the judges again in the 220, finishing step for step in another blanket finish.

Newbold established his superiority however, in the Conference meet in Salt alle, winning the century in 9.8, and finishing second to Wyoming's amazing

Mickey Dunn in the 220.

And to Dunn must go the plaudits as the circuit's most outstanding track and half performer in many years. The Cowboy cavorter won five firsts in the East-In Division meet (100, 220, high and low hurdles, high jump and broad jump), then wound up with Conference championships in the 220 yard dash and the low hundles, plus seconds in the 100 and the high sticks. In a dual meet on the eastrn slope, Dunn clipped off the 440 in 47.9.

Only two records fell in the 1951 windup. Pratley's mark of 6'7" in the high sump broke the old mark of 6'534" set by Utah's Fred Sheffield in 1946 and burly Morris of Utah State hung up a new mark in the shot put, tossing the mellet 50 ft. 11/8 ins.—a mark which surpassed the 49'6" he himself set a week

weller in the Western Division meet.

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Montana, a new member of the Skyline Conference in 1951, made a strong challenge in its first bid for the Conference pennant. New Mexico, also a new

member, did not participate in the 1951 windup.

Montana's Mike Fleming was undefeated in the 880 during the season and romped off with the Conference half mile crown in 1:55.9. Bill Rife was undisputed kingpin in the mile event and Bob Ripke proved the best in the discus event. Joe Luckman and brother Jack gave the Grizzlies a tough one-two punch in the sprints, broad jump and shot, while John Badgley was a steady point-getter in the hurdles.

Barring an official envelope from Uncle Sam, the following are among those who will be back for more digits in 1952: Newbold in the sprints; Pratley and Dyer in the high jump; Doug Hart in the distances; Pratley and George Yates in the hurdles; Dowd Jessen and Don Stevens in the weights. Add to those

names that of Clayne Jensen in the hurdles.

Jensen, conference high stick champion in 1950 and second place finisher in the low barriers in that season, appeared headed for a terrific season in 1951. He copped both events in two dual meets during the '51 season, then turned an ankle during a 440 wind sprint just prior to the Western Division meet at Utah State. He missed the Western Division and Conference meets, but has another

year left to make up for last year's bad luck.

In addition to the top undergraduates, a number of outstanding former varsity performers will be competing this spring with an eye on an American Olympic team berth. Ralph Roylance who set the Conference javelin record while attending Utah State two years ago is still one of the nation's top spear throwers. Last spring Roylance got off three throws over 220 feet in the Brigham Young University Relays, his longest being measured at 227'71/2". Several weeks later in an exhibition event during a high school meet at his home town of Smithfield, Utah, Roylance had a throw of 233'1034". Jerome Biffle, former NCAA broad jump champ from Denver University, is now in the Army, somewhere in Alabama at the latest report, and is expected to be a contender for the trip to Helsinki. The versatile Dunn might also continue his running and jumping this spring.

Californians who like to crow over their track and field champions had a planty joyous season in 1951-and the Olympic year of '52 looks just as rosy or the prides of the Pacific, with the "big three" qualifying meets for the United States Olympic Team all being held in the Golden State.

Illyh points of the campaign of '51 can best be classified in this order:

The continued collegiate team dominance by Southern California, this time under its second new coach-Jesse Mortensen-in three years. The frolans won their third successive NCAA team title in the championships at earlie, were unbeaten in dual competition and came up with two outstanding aphomore champions in Hurdler Jack Davis (NCAA highs and AAU lows) and Shot-Putter Parry O'Brien (AAU).

The rise of little Occidental College as a track and field power under the by lant regime of Payton Jordan. The Tigers lost only to Southern California turing the season, finished fourth in the NCAA championships and anticipate well balanced team of even greater strength in '52, paced by Bill Albans, who

outhern California came up with one of its greatest teams from the standpoint of mass strength and set a new Pacific Coast Conference meet scoring of 841/2 points. Mortensen, who returned to his alma mater from West Point after Jess Hill, the successor to the famed Dean Cromwell, had shifted track to football. SC scored in every event and had individual champions in John Bradley (440), Jim Newcomb (mile and two-mile), Jack Davis (high and low hurdles), mile relay team, Parry O'Brien (shot put), Larry Goins (pole vault) and Walt Jensen (pole vault)

WCLA was an easy second in the PCC meet, although scoring less than half as many points as SC. Brown won the broad jump with one of his more modest home, only 24-31/2, and tied with teammate Bobby Work for the 220 title. Work alm won the 100 and Captain Hugh Mitchell edged Washington State's favored Then Rinchen in a record-breaking 1:51.6 half-mile, giving the Bruins four

the remaining PCC events were taken by Stanford's defending Olympic depathlon titlist, Bob Mathias, who spun the discus 160' 41/2" on his last throw to solve Idaho's Duane Taylor by 1/2 inch; by three northerners, Dan Miller of Chapten State, Eric Roberts of Washington State and Goran Widenfeldt, a Swall h exchange student at Washington, who tied in the high jump at 6' 5"; and by OSC's Lyle Dickey who shared the pole vault honors with Jensen.

in the Northern Division meet the WSC Cougars once again showed the way fallying 501/2 points to 34 for runner-up-and-coming Oregon. The Cougars ware led by their 1948 Olympians, Eischen and Bill Parnell, Parnell, the Hittish Empire Games mile champion, won the ND mile easily in 4:13.8 and want on to grab a close third in the National Collegiate mile in 4:09.6. Eischen translation the Division meet 880 in 1:52.5 and followed that up with a strong 1 51 3 for second in the NCAA half.

Oregon's resurgence was highlighted by Chuck Missfeldt's winning of the NCAA javelin title at Seattle with a 219' 434" heave on his last try. Three days later Missfeldt got off a prodigious 228' 8½" throw in an exhibition on his home field at Eugene during the Big Ten-PCC dual meet. The Coast Conference, although giving an uninspired performance, managed to win that one from its Midwestern rivals, 771/2-541/2. Mathias' 173-4 discus throw, a new meet record and also best in the nation by a collegian last spring, was the best PCC effort.

The Trojans maintained their policy of staging a top intersectional dual or triangular meet in mid-season by taking on Illinois and Michigan. Don Laz of the Illini set a new American Collegiate pole vault record of 15 ft. 134 in. in this meet. This year SC has a three-way meet slated for April with Texas Aggies and Texas U., with a real shot-putting duel in prospect between O'Brien and Texas A.&M.'s Darrow Hooper, NCAA champion.

Outstanding meet on the Los Angeles calendar was once again the Coliseum Relays. Again mythical national relay titles were decided with eastern baton quartets hogging honors when Manhattan won both the 440 and 880 events,

Morgan State the mile relay and Georgetown the two-mile.

One cannot complete a summary of the 1951 season without referring to the two big relay carnivals on the schedule—the West Coast Relays at Fresno and the California Relays at Modesto. A meet-record distance medley of 10:00.6 by Occidental featured the Fresno meet, although it was something of a disappointment to the talented Tiger quartet of Walt McKibben, Hal Butler, John Barnes and Bob McMillen who had hoped to crack wide open the world mark of 9:59.4.

A new American Collegiate javelin record of 237' 10" by Bill Miller of Arizona

State (Tempe) made the headlines at Modesto.

Regarding Barnes and McMillen, they reached their peak at the Compton Invitational Meet early in June and were only slightly less impressive in the NCAA meet two weeks later. At Compton Barnes ran the years' fastest halfmile, 1:50.1 (less than a second off the world record), in beating Olympic champ Mal Whitfield, but was disqualified for cutting in. He followed that up with a clear-cut win at Seattle in 1:50.7. McMillen defeated one of Sweden's ranking milers, Alf Holmberg, currently a student at the University of Tennessee, and Willi Slijkuis, Holland's "king of the finish," in a stirring 4:09.0 mile a Compton and then took a second in the fast NCAA mile.
