GLENN DAVIS WINS SULLIVAN AWARD

Glenn Davis, 1956 Olympic 400 meter champion, is the 1958 winner of the James E. Sullivan A.A.U. Memorial Award.

In the closest vote in the history of the award, Davis edged Raper Johnson, world decathlon record-holder from U.C.L.A. The balloting left the issue in doubt until the deadline had passed.

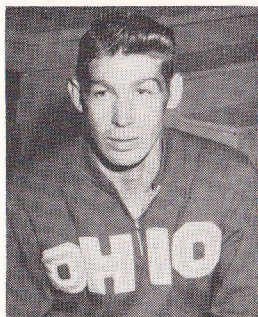
Davis received 237 first place votes out of a total of 663 and received 1868 points on a basis of five points for first choice, three for second and one for third. Johnson was the choice of 236 for first place and tallied 1793 points.

In third place was Tommy Kono, York A.C. weightlifter with 60 firsts and 692 points. Fourth was David Jenkins, Colorado Springs, Colo. figure skater with 43 first places and 527 points. Fifth was Sylvia Ruuska, Berkeley Y.M.C.A. swimmer with 40 firsts and 469 points. Frank McKinney, Indianapolis A.C. swimmer was sixth with 30 firsts and 324 points. Terrence McCann, Tulsa Y.M.C.A. wrestler, was seventh with 17 firsts and 167 points.

Davis is the world's and Olympic record holder over the 400 meter hurdles and also established a world's record in the 440 yard run flat during 1958. He won the 400 meter hurdles, the 400 meter run and was a member of the victorious 1600 meter relay in the 1958 U.S.S.R.-U.S.A. dual meet.

His citation for the balloting read "He has been an inspiration to his teammates and his spirit and desire to succeed has been contagious. His record shows full compliance with the amateur code at all times. He gives freely of his time for exhibitions and clinics and has delivered many fine talks to youth groups. He is modest to a fault and popular with officials as well as with the athletes."

Johnson won the acclaim of Russian track fans at Moscow this summer when he established a new world's record for the decathlon.

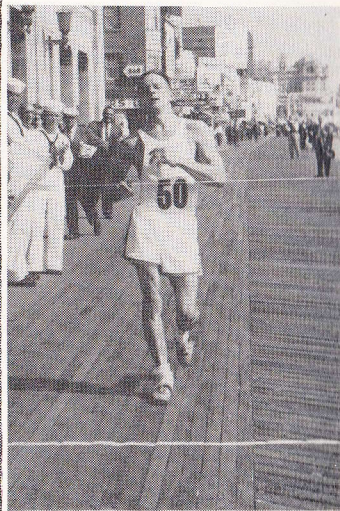

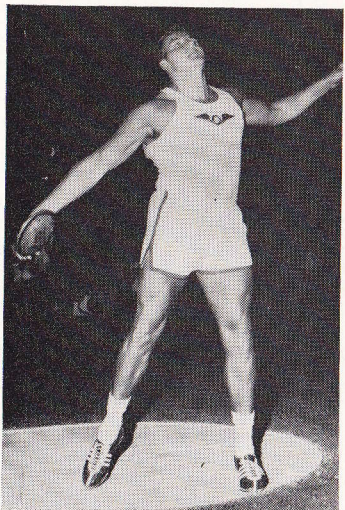
