

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## **RANDY MATSON TOP TRACKMAN OF 1965**

Performances during the indoor and outdoor seasons did not come close to equaling the dazzling running, jumping and throwing during the meets leading up to the Olympic Games in Tokyo. Although champions remained in competition, the record breaking was held to a minimum.

Hats off to Ralph Boston and Harold Connolly for setting new world marks in the long jump and hammer throw (there is a pending record to erase Harold Connolly's record breaking performances at Modesto and in the Southern Pacific AAU Championships), and to the authors of the fastest six miles ever run in the United States or in the world up to that time, Billy Mills and Gerry Lindgren who finished in almost a dead heat in the National championships. But the one man who captured the public's eye was Randy Matson, the big Texan who attends Texas A&M.

Only two years ago, Matson was an alternate on the USA team for the European tour as a high school senior who finished fourth in the National championships (59-1 $\frac{1}{4}$ ). In the Olympic year Matson won the National AAU title and finished runner up to the world champion Dallas Long in the Olympics. His best put in 1964 was 65-5 $\frac{1}{2}$ .

1965 was The Matson Year. He was taking dead aim on the Dallas Long world record set in the USA-USSR meet at Los Angeles a year ago, 67-10. At the Corpus Christi Relays his winning toss was 66- $\frac{3}{4}$ , followed up by 67-9 in winning at the Texas Relays and then a new world record at a quadrangular meet on April 9—67-11 $\frac{1}{4}$ . In another triangular meet on April 30 Matson moved his world mark up to 69- $\frac{3}{4}$  before making the greatest toss in track history—70 feet 7 inches in the Southwest Conference Championships on May 8. Handicapped by a slight leg injury, Matson returned to international competition to win against the Soviet Union and go on to win the title in the World University Games at Budapest.

One of the fine comebacks of the year was John Pennel, injured just prior to the Olympic Games. Although out of competition for almost nine months and training for a scant three weeks, Pennel, 1963 winner of the James E. Sullivan Award, won the pole vault at the National AAU outdoor championships at San Diego with a 17-0 vault.

The most disappointing note of the year was the loss to the Soviet Union at Kiev after six straight successes. Nothing can de-

tract from the Soviet's 118-112 victory in spite of a couple of injuries and illness to Billy Mills which didn't help the American cause.

Against the USSR, the Americans won all flat races through Grelle's victory in the 1500 meters and the 4x400 meter relay team scored a come from behind victory over the Soviets on the strength of an excellent anchor leg by Ollan Cassell who made up 12-14 yards on the opposing runner. Grelle was the only member of the team who had competed against the Soviets in the inaugural dual meet in 1958.

To cap the most ambitious track and field program ever developed by indoor meet directors, Valery Brumel and Igor Ter Ovanesyan of the USSR returned to re-claim the National high jump and long jump titles, as veterans Ralph Boston, Jack Yerman and Jim Grelle won the hurdles, 600-yard run and one-mile run. Sam Perry regained the sprint title. Lt. Ron Zinn of the U.S. Army won his final National title before being fatally wounded in Viet Nam in July.

Newcomers winning titles indoors included Ted Nelson in the 1000-yard run, shotputter John McGrath, and polevaulter Billy Pemerton.

Billy Mills, winner of the three-mile run was tapped for the Dieges and Clust Award as the outstanding performer in the indoor championships. He became the first man in history to win the award for both the indoor and outdoor championships by his selection at San Diego after his record-breaking performance in breasting the tape by an eyelash ahead of Gerry Lindgren in the six-mile run.

Ron Clarke of Australia was the outstanding man in the outdoor invitation meets. He was credited with world records for the three mile run and the 5000 meters in the invitation race at the longer distance at the Compton Relays.

Jim Ryun, the amazing 18-year high school senior from Wichita, Kan., proved to be the American hope for the future in the 1500 meters-one mile run. In the national championships at San Diego he was credited with a new American record of 3:55.3 in winning the title for the first time. He defeated the remarkable Peter Snell to win the National one-mile run.

Only three men retained their titles in the 78th Annual AAU outdoor championships as newcomers came bursting to the forefront to capture National titles. Ralph Boston in the long jump, Harold Connolly in the hammer throw and Bob Schul in the three

mile run were the only victors who also had gained titles at New Brunswick a year ago.

Two veterans, Rex Cawley and George Young, bounced back to once again prevail in the intermediate hurdles and the steeplechase. The only foreigner to gain a national title was the world record-holder in the discus throw, Ludvik Danek of Czechoslovakia.

The youngest of the first time winners was 18-year old Jim Ryun in the mile run and oldest was quartermiler Ollan Cassell, 27.

George Anderson and Adolph Plummer won the two sprints; Morgan Groth earned top honors in the half-mile run; Olympic champion Billy Mills captured the six-mile run and Ron Laird came home first in the two-mile walk. Willie Davenport, an Army private stationed in Germany, won the high hurdles.

In the field events John Pennel won the pole vault, Otis Burrell topped the high jumpers, Art Walker, another member of the U.S. Army, won top honors in the triple jump, John McGrath repeated his indoor triumph in the shot put and Bill Floerke caused a mild surprise by winning the javelin throw although he did rank among the top throwers in the nation before the championships.

The United States teams for the indoor and outdoor international meets were selected by the men's track and field committee on the basis of the two national championships.

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**UNITED STATES WOMEN WIN  
FOUR INTERNATIONAL DUAL MEETS**

The United States track and field women began preparing for the 1968 Olympic Games at Mexico City at the National Indoor Championships in Madison Square Garden and continued to show progress both at the outdoor national championships at Columbus, Ohio, and during the subsequent European tour.

Mention must be made of the victories of the National team in indoor meets at Wembley Stadium and in Berlin following the indoor season followed up by significant triumphs against Poland and West Germany. We cannot be lulled into compacency because the hard cold facts are that the USSR women's team continued its domination of the Americans by winning its seventh consecutive meet in the series when the two teams met in Kiev.

Our sprinters continued to hold up well, although they were not unbeatable. In all five international meets we had athletes capable of holding their own against top-ranked foreign stars. Improvement is still needed in the other events before we have a well-balanced team capable to meeting any foreign team on equal terms.

If asked to select the three outstanding performers in national and international competition during 1965, one could not fail to mention sprinter Wyomia Tyus, Tennessee State; and our two teen-age middle distance stars Janell Smith, Fredonia, Kan., and 15-year old Marie Mulder who recently moved from Northern California to the Washington, D.C. suburbs.

For general improvement in women's track we need look no further than the number of records set in national championships. For example in the outdoor championships new records were set in every running and hurdles event while RaNae Bair of the San Diego Women's Track and Field Association again shattered the meet mark in the javelin throw.

Wyomia Tyus continued to electrify audiences with a world record performance for 100 yards in Kingston, Jamaica and then another world record performance in the 100 meters in Kiev.

But the "Middle Distance Twins," the misses Smith and Mulder, made a shambles of American records. In fact, Miss Mulder set championship meet marks for both the 880-yard run and the 1500-meter run (first time on the program) on successive days at Colum-

bus. She covered the half mile in 2:11.1 and came back to run 1500 meters the following day in 4:36.5.

By way of comment, one of the great stimuli to competition for our women was during the indoor season when many outstanding European stars competed in almost every meet on the circuit.

In the indoor meet against Great Britain, the winners for the United States included newcomer Barbara Ferrell, Los Angeles, in the 60-yard sprint; Tammy Davis in the hurdles; Janell Smith in the 600 yards; high jumper Pat Winslow and shotputter Lynn Graham.

Going on to Berlin, Ferrell and Marilyn White divided honors in the two sprints; Tammy Davis landed one of two hurdles events; Janell Smith ran away with the 400 meters, edging the co-champion indoors, Norma Harris of Chicago; Winslow repeated in the high jump, and Willye White copped the long jump.

Outdoors in the USSR-USA meet Tyus and teammate Edith McGuire copped the sprints, we won the sprint relay by an eyelash and Marie Mulder won the admiration of the track fans with an excellent 2:07.3 in the 800 meters to finish second.

Although Irena Kirzenstein of Poland won both sprints, the USA team victory was made possible by Janell Smith and Marie Mulder winning the middle distance runs; Cherrie Sherrand prevailed in the hurdles, Eleanor Montgomery captured the high jump; Lynn Graham won the shot put and RaNae Bair had the finest throw of her career, winning the javelin with a toss of 184-11½ for an American record.

The 62-55 triumph over West Germany depended on Tyus and McGuire coming back to win the sprints, Smith again winning the 400 meters, Montgomery landing the high jump, Bair taking a first place in the javelin, Willye White scoring a clearcut victory in the long jump and the relay team, anchored by Miss Tyus, ran the Germans into the ground.

The first direct step in preparation for the Mexico City Olympics was the selection of four middle distance runners to compete in the "Little Olympics" scheduled during the second week of October, a comparable period to when the 1968 Olympic Games will be held.

Madeline Manning, National AAU Girls' Champion (14-17 years old), won the 400 meter run at Mexico City with a 56.0 performance as another teenager, Dino Lowery, a former teammate of Miss Mulder for the Will's Spikettes in California, was third in 61.0.

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
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USA 4 x 100 M Relay Team



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
