



Eleven (Of 19) Individual Champions Return To Defend Titles In 1971 Meet

The University of California, with an even more brilliant cast, and 11 of 19 individual champions will be back to defend their titles in the 1971 National Collegiate track and field championships at the University of Washington, June 17-19.

Nobody is safe.

If you doubt it, consider the following:

—In the 1970 championships at Des Moines, Texas A&M's Curtis Mills managed to finish only third in the 440 after setting a world's record of 44.7 in the 1969 meet.

—Redlands' Jerry Proctor, defending champion in the long jump, finished fourth.

—USC's Ole Oleson, defending champion in the 3-mile, finished 12th.

—UCLA's Jon Vaughn, first in 1968 and second in 1969, failed to qualify for the pole vault finals.

SO LOADED WAS THE MEET that five non-winners—Southern Illinois' Ivory Crockett in the 100, UCLA's John Smith in the 440, William & Mary's Howell Michael in the mile, Arkansas State's Tom Hill in the high hurdles and Oregon's Bouncy Moore in the long jump—went on to win titles the next weekend in the National AAU championships.

The contention this year figures to go even deeper. Only seven 1970 champions graduated, so there'll be title defenders in all individual events except the 220, 440, 880, 6-mile, discus, hammer and decathlon.


California, the team titlist with 40 points, loses only Don Couser, lead-off runner on the 440 relay team. Returning are sprinters Eddie Hart and

Isaac Curtis, who contributed 32 of the 40 points, and triple jumper Rich Dunn whose surprise second clinched victory.

Also back are Jim Penrose in the discus, Bruce Kennedy in the javelin and Jim Fraser in the horizontal jumps.

THE PRIZE RECRUIT is Rick Brown from Los Altos High, called by UCLA coach Jim Bush "the greatest young middle-distance prospect I've ever seen." In the '70 state meet, Brown won the 440-880

double and anchored his mile relay team to victory.

Also moving from Los Altos to Berkeley is Chris Adams, interscholastic discus record holder.

The Bears will be improved, but their chief challengers, UCLA, Oregon, Kansas and USC, may be even more improved.

Top newcomers at UCLA are France's Francois Tracanelli in the pole vault and Merritt JC's Warren Edmonson in the sprints. Others include two state jaycee champions, Fresno's Rick Fletcher in the high jump and San Diego Mesa's Pete Jones in the javelin; 16-foot vaulter Steve Hardison from Fresno; winners of the past two state high school two miles, Ruben Chapmans and Ron Johnson and footballer James McAlister in the long jump.

Top returnees are Reggie Robinson in the sprints, Wayne Collett and John Smith in the 440, Bob Langston and Paul Williams in the half, Steve Lang, high jump; Denny Rogers, triple jump; Mark Ostoich, weights; and Jean Pierre Corval and Collett in the hurdles.

OREGON RETURNS AL HEARVEY in the sprints; Steve Prefontaine, Steve Savage, Mike McClendon, Rick Ritchie and Bob Rhen in the mile; Prefontaine in the 3-mile, Savage in the steeplechase, Bouncy Moore and Ivory Harris in the long jump, Marty Hill in the high jump, Allen Paz in the pole vault, Pete Schmock in the shot, Gary Wolf in the discus and Mac Wilkins and Mark Richardson in the javelin.

Among the newcomers are Canadian quarter-milers Craig Blackman and John Swainson (both 47.5), Swedish half-miler Nils-Erik Emilsson (1:49.3) and Australian long jumper Ross Blackman (25-4).

Kansas, the last non-Pacific Coast school to win the NCAA (1960), returns Jim Neihouse and Brian McElroy in the 880, Jay Mason in the 3-mile, Bob Bornkessel in the intermediates, Karl Salb and Steve Wilhelm in the shot, Salb in the discus, Phil Reaves in the long jump and Bill Penny in the hammer throw.

AN IMPRESSIVE PREP HARVEST includes sprinters Mark Lutz (9.4w) from Rochester, Minn., and Tom Scavuzzo (9.5w) from Denver, half-miler Kevin Reabe (1:50.6) from Waterford, Mich., hurdler Gregg Vandaveer (13.9) from Shawnee, Okla., and high jumper Barry Schur (6-9) from Tucson.

Jaycee transfer Mike Stull from Pennsylvania has gone 24-8 and 48-6 in the horizontal jumps and footballers Marvin Foster (47.0) and Xerk White (47.2) plan to skip spring practice to run the quarter.

USC, one-time perennial champion which slipped to 10th last year, is counting on four who sat out 1970—long jumper Henry Hines, shotputter Doug Lane, javelin thrower Andy Barnett and vaulter Bob Pullard.

TOP PREP RECRUITS include half-miler Nathan Burks from Oakland, long jumper Lynn Swann from San Mateo, hurdler Bobby Coffman from Houston, and high jumper Dean Owens from El Cajon. Jaycee transfers include hurdler Eddie Johnson and high jumper Larry Hollins from Mira Costa and an all-around talent from Jamaica via Mesa (Ariz.), Henry Jackson.

The Trojans also hope to land two L.A. City College standouts, sprinter Willie Deckard (9.4, 20.7) and hurdler Lance Babb (52.5).

Best of the returnees are Edesel Garrison in the 440, Fred Ritcherson in the 6-mile, Jeff Marsee in the 3-mile, and Joe Antunovich in the discus. Footballer Sam Cunningham could be a sleeper in the decathlon.

Here's how the individual events shape up:

100—Crockett (9.2) rates the nod over defending champion Hart (9.2) and

runnerup Curtis (9.3). Missouri's Mel Gray (9.2), last year's favorite, hopes to atone for his sixth-place finish. Other challengers include Kentucky's Jim Green (9.2), Michigan State's Herb Washington (9.2), Oregon's Hearvey (9.4), UTEP's Harrington Jackson (9.2), Memphis State's Gerald Tinker (9.3), Texas A&M's Rockie Woods (9.3) and UCLA's Edmonson (9.3). San Jose State, eligible again, will contend with Kirk Clayton and Billy Gaines (both 9.3). Frosh hopefuls include SMU's Gene Pouncy (9.4), Stanford's Ken Curl (9.3w) and Indiana's Glen Love (9.3w).

220—Gray (20.4) looks best, along with Indiana's Mike Goodrich (20.7), Hart (20.5), Green (20.8), Curtis (20.8), Tinker (20.6), North Carolina Central's Larry Black (20.5) and Lutz (20.7w).

440—Curtis Mills (44.7) will try to regain supremacy against a strong field that includes UCLA's Smith (45.7), Rutgers' Tom Ulan (45.7), USC's Garrison (45.5), Adelphi's Clyde McPherson (46.2), Abilene Christian's Roger Colglazier (46.2) and Texas' Dave Morton (46.0).

880—Oregon State's Pat Collins (1:46.5) and Wisconsin's Mark Winzenried (1:47.3) are the standouts. South Carolina's Bob Kaczka (1:48.6) will be back, along with BYU's Steve Bergeson (1:48.4), UTEP's Kerry Ellison (1:48.9), North Texas State's Dennis Stephens (1:48.8), Florida's Eamonn O'Keefe (1:48.8), Rice's Steve Straub (1:48.6) and the Kansas duo of Neihouse (1:49.0) and McElroy (1:49.1). Frosh hopefuls include California's Brown, Kansas' Reabe and Manhattan's Joe Savage.

MILE—Villanova's Marty Liquori (3:57.6) hopes to join Wisconsin's Don Gehrmann (1948-50), Villanova's Ron Delany (1956-58) and Oregon's Dyrol Burleson (1960-62) as only three-time winners in history. Top challengers are AAU champion Michael (3:59.0) and Bowling Green's Dave Wottle (3:59.0). Other contenders include Westmont's Dennis Savage (4:00.7), Stanford's Duncan MacDonald (3:59.6), Villanova's Chris Mason (3:59.9), Oklahoma State's Peter Kaal (4:01.1), Wyoming's Wayne Jensen (4:01.8), Western Kentucky's Hector Ortiz (4:00.4) and the Oregon entry of McClendon (4:00.7), Rhen (4:01.6) and Ritchie (4:01.8).

THREE-MILE—Prefontaine (13:12.8) and Minnesota's Garry Bjorklund (13:16.6), who went 1-2 as freshmen last year, figure to lead the pack again. Other contenders include Stanford's Don Kardong (13:28.0), Penn State's Greg Fredericks (13:30.0), USC's Marsee (13:40.2) and Kansas' Mason (13:41.0).

SIX-MILE—It's anybody's race. BYU's Dave Hindley (28:19.1) and Cornell's Jon Anderson (28:19.8) look best, along with USC's Ritcherson (28:36.8), C. W. Post's Ron Stonitsch (28:40.9) and Villanova's Donal Walsh (28:54.0). Bjorklund (27:30.8) and Prefontaine (28:12.0) would rate as favorites if they decided to switch from the three mile. UTEP's John Bednarski (27:59.8) hopes to make up for a disappointing 16th last year.

STEEPLECHASE—Sid Sink (8:40.9) of Bowling Green will be hard pressed to defend his title against the same people who chased him last year, including Oregon's Savage (8:38.6), Western Michigan's Jerry Liebenberg (8:44.4), Eastern Kentucky's Ken Silvius (8:47.4) and Washington's Jim Johnson (8:47.6). Other challengers include Harvard's Dave Pottetti (8:47.5), BYU's Hindley (8:52.2), Minnesota's Don Timm (8:50.2) and Indiana's Steve Kelley (8:48.3). Oregon State hopes for the return of '69 champ Jim Barkley (8:44).

HIGH HURDLES—Could be the race of the day, with co-world record holder

Hill (13.2) trying to atone for last year's fifth-place finish. Defending champion Paul Gibson (13.6) of UTEP is back, along with runnerup Marcus Walker (13.3) of Colorado, North Carolina Central's Ron Draper (13.6), Michigan's Godfrey Murray (13.7) and Tennessee's Bill High (13.5). Others are San Jose State's George Carty (13.5) and Penn State freshman Fred Singleton, who had a wind-blown 13.4 for the 39-inch hurdles last year.

INTERMEDIATES—A rematch between world record holder Ralph Mann (48.8) of BYU and UCLA's Collett, who also broke the world record in finishing second at Des Moines. Kansas' Bornkessel, ineligible last year, has run 49.8 for the 400-meter hurdles. Richmond hopes for the return of Carl Wood, 50.0 in 1969. Other contenders include Idaho State's Jim Wharton (50.6), UTEP's Ron Rondeau (50.7), Washington State's Dick Olsen (50.9), Washington's Jim Seymour (51.2) and Texas A&M frosh Gary West.

HIGH JUMP—The defending champion is Wisconsin's Pat Matzdorf (7-1½) but the man to beat is Olympian Reynaldo Brown (7-3¼) of Cal Poly SLO. Top challengers include Washington State's Peter Wright (7-1), BYU's Ken Lundmark (7-1¼), BYU's Chris Celion (7-1), UTEP's Scott English (7-¾), Maryland's Joe David (7-1½), Arizona's Lorenzo Allen (7-1¼), Indiana's Gary Haupt (7-0), Minnesota's Tim Heikkala (7-0), Tennessee's Lonnie Hance (7-0), Oregon's Hill (7-0) and USC's Hollins (7-0). Peruvian Fernando Abugattas (7-1) has transferred to New Mexico and will be eligible. Top freshman is San Diego State's Jerry Culp (7-¾).

LONG JUMP—Two former champions, Redlands' Proctor (26-4) and San Diego State's Arnie Robinson (25-10½), and Oregon's Moore (25-10) are the favorites, along with USC's Hines (26-5). Top challengers include Wichita State's Preston Carrington (25-5½), Oregon's Harris (25-5¼), Kansas' Reaves (25-2¼), Washington State's Norbert Payton (25-1½) and California's Fraser (25-½). San Jose State has a contender in Chuck Sundsten (25-4¼).

POLE VAULT—It may take 18 feet to win this one. UCLA's Tracanelli (17-8½) flirted with the height in Europe last summer. Other contenders include UTEP's Paul Heglar (17-2), BYU's Alti Alarotu (17-5), Stanford's Casey Carrigan (17-4¼), Colorado's Mike Wedman (17-0), Tennessee's Bob Sprung (16-8¼), USC's Pullard (16-7) and San Diego State's Rick Olander (16-5¼). USC's Steve Smith (16-8¾) has transferred to Long Beach State. A frosh hopeful is UTEP's Bill Curnow (15-9).

TRIPLE JUMP—Defending champion Mohinder Gill (53-2) of Cal Poly and AAU champion Milan Tiff of Miami (Ohio) are the men to beat. Contenders include Stanford's Allen Meredith (52-3), Western Michigan's Don Rencher (52-9¼), UTEP's Larry Vanley (51-6½), New Mexico's Chuck Steffes (52-½), Oregon State's Robert Reader (51-10¼), Pittsburgh's Bryant Salter (50-8¼), Middle Tennessee's Barry McClure (50-4), Cincinnati's Al Lanier (49-9¼), UCLA's Rogers (51-4), San Jose State's Adrian Porter (50-6¼) and the California entry of Fraser (51-1¼) and Durin (50-11¼). Among the frosh hopefuls are Penn State's Gene White (50-¾) and Washington's Grant Birkinshaw (50-4).

SHOT PUT—The Kansas duo of Salb (67-¾) and Wilhelm (65-1) will be gunning for a 1-2 with the former seeking his third straight title. Top challengers include USC's Lane (62-10½), Oregon's Schmock (62-4),

UCLA's Ostoich (62-2), UTEP's Vince Monari (62-1) and Fred DeBernardi (60-6½), Utah State's Brian Caulfield (60-0) and USC's John Buehler (59-11). SMU's Sam Walker (63-5¼) will be a threat if he decides to compete, as will be Kentucky freshman Jesse Stuart (60-10).

DISCUS—This one is wide open. Kansas' Salb (190-3), USC's Antunovich (192-7) and the UTEP entry of DeBernardi (189-8) and Monari (192-6) look like the standouts. Other contenders include Oregon's Wolf (185-8½), California's Penrose (184-10), Arizona's Steve Gunzel (185-6), Stanford's Steve Davis (183-6), UCLA's Ostoich (180-6), Kansas' Wilhelm (177-5) and Iowa State's George Amundson (173-2).

JAVELIN—Arizona State's Mike Murro (300-0), the 1969 champion who missed last year's meet, hopes to return and reclaim his title from Tennessee's Bill Skinner (291-8½). Washington's Cary Feldman (262-5), throwing before a hometown crowd, could surprise. Other challengers include Maryland's Jack Bacon (260-7), Pittsburgh's Bob Kouvolo (256-2), Oregon State's George Rigby (250-0), USC's Barnett (255-4), California's Kennedy (249-10), San Jose State's Mike Metz (251-2), Oklahoma's Willie Franklin (252-6) and the Oregon entry of Wilkins (257-8) and Richardson (247-3).

HAMMER—No real standout here. Top contenders are Washington State's Tony Tenisci (194-7), Kent State's Al Schoterman (192-7), Dartmouth's Bill Dinneen (192-1), Harvard's Ed Nosal (192-5), Army's Bill Diehl (190-5), Ohio U.'s David Leitch (185-3), Northeastern's Tom Siros (188-3) and Kansas' Penny (191-1).

DECATHLON—The favorite is Jorma Vesala (7282), a native of Finland who represents Los Angeles State. Teammate Fred Dixon (6915) is a contender along with Colorado's Mike Wedman (7045), Utah's Doug Wells (6817), San Diego State's Don Bajema (7101), Ohio State's Ray Hupp (6790), Florida State's Charles Galloway (6821) and New Hampshire's Gary King (6746). USC's Jackson will be given a trial this spring. Another possibility is California freshman Adams, the high school discus record holder who has 9.8 speed and coordination.

440 RELAY—Defending champion California returns three-fourths of its team, including Hart and Curtis, the 1-2 finishers in the 100. UCLA, with the addition of Edmonson (9.3), could be the team to beat. Returning are Robinson (9.3), Ronnie Welch (9.4) and Steve Gibson (9.5). Indiana, led by Goodrich (9.2) and Larry Highbaugh (9.3), adds fresman Love (9.3w). USC, second with a makeshift team at Des Moines, adds Deckard (9.4). Texas A&M, hampered by injuries last year, returns the foursome of Rockie Woods, Donny Rodgers, Curtis Mills and Marvin Mills which set a world record of 1:21.7 in the 880 relay. UTEP, which shared last year's fastest time of 39.4 with UCLA, needs replacements for graduates Mike Fray and Clyde Glosson. North Carolina Central, led by Larry Black, is a threat, as is San Jose State with Clayton and Gaines.

MILE RELAY—UCLA, led by Collett and Smith who had respective 400 meter clockings of 44.9 and 45.0 last year, will be a threat to the world record of 3:02.8. Edmonson (47.0) and Reggie Echols (47.4) could fill the other two spots although coach Bush says that sprinter Gibson will be tough to keep off the team. Texas A&M, led by the Mills brothers, should be a contender. Rice, second last year, needs a replacement for Bill Askey who anchored in 46.1. Third-place Tennessee loses Hardee McAlhaney but returns Gary Womble (45.8) and adds freshman Darwin Bond (46.9).

NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

California Triumph First In 48 Years; BYU's Mann Sets 440-Hurdles Record

Forty-eight-point-eight seconds!

An incredible time . . . an incredible race . . . but even more spine-tingling was the incredible empathy it created between Ralph Mann and those appreciative and knowledgeable Des Moines track fans.

When Mann split the twine at the end of the 440-yard intermediate hurdles race in the National Collegiate Track Championships last June 20, it was as if time itself stopped for a few eerie minutes.

Mann, a junior at Brigham Young University, and Wayne Collett, a junior at UCLA, had waged mortal combat. Collett had the disadvantage of drawing lane 8. Mann had the disadvantage of never having beaten Collett.

And they had raced often in high school in southern California. "I lost to him as many times as I ran him," Mann was to recall later. "All I ever saw of him was the back of his shorts."

BUT THIS WAS TO BE MANN'S DAY. As he walked back up the track, you could see he was an emotionally drenched youngster. Friends began running to him, apparently with times they had heard.

But the Des Moines crowd, steeped in 61 years of Drake Relays tradition, was equally fast. It knew something remarkable had happened.

And then the public address announcer was droning, "a new national collegiate record, a new American record, a new world . . ." and the crowd went wild. And Mann made them part of his happiness. He kissed the palms of his hands and bent over and patted the Tartan track and ran up and down, waving his arms. The fans loved it.

Mann's 48.8 broke the world record of 49.3 set by Gert Potgieter of South Africa in 1960. Collett's 49.2 also was under the record.

Des Moines is a familiar stopover for Charlie Smith, midlands sports editor for United Press International. He has covered five straight Texas-Kansas-Drake Relays, the midland track writers' version of the triple crown.



"Best features of that tour," says Smith, "are Jones Ramsey's enchiladas in Austin, Jay Simon's fried chicken in Lawrence and Maury White's prime ribs in Des Moines."

Before joining the UPI in 1969, Smith was sports columnist for the Topeka Capital-Journal for six years and two years on the sports

staff of the Dallas Morning News, which he joined on graduating from the University of Texas.

The 1970 outdoor championships were as remarkable as Mann's race and as bizarre as California's team victory—its first since 1922. The Golden Bears of rookie coach Dave Maggard parlayed a first-ever one-two finish by Eddie Hart and Isaac Curtis in the 100-yard dash into the team title.

BUT IF CAL'S WIN was bizarre—the Bears had finished third in the Pacific-8

meet behind UCLA and Oregon—the pole vault had to be utterly unreal.

The Saturday session began under threatening skies and the first running event, the 3,000-meter steeplechase, was run in a downpour. Bowling Green's Sid Sink proved he runs contrary to his name and set one of four meet records, a sloshing 8:40.9.

Though the skies later cleared and sunshine bathed the 12,500 spectators, the pole vault was moved into nearby Drake Fieldhouse. It didn't become evident until late in the day what a historic decision that was. Moving the event indoors, of course, precluded all chances for records.

At 17 feet, Alti Alarotu of Brigham Young sailed over on his first try, Paul Heglar of Texas-El Paso on his second and Jan Johnson of Kansas on his third and final attempt.

At 17 feet, 4 inches, Johnson startled those present by going over on his first attempt. The bar bounced, but stayed on the standards. Heglar bowed out after three straight misses. Alarotu missed his first try, then astounded all by passing his last two chances.

JOHNSON, A WELL-MUSCLED SOPHOMORE from Chicago whose previous best was 16-6½ at the Big Eight Indoor, nearly scraped the ceiling at 17-7, shooting over the bar on his first try by what looked like a foot.

By now, the roar inside the gym had grown to sizeable proportions. The running events were over and the press corps, as well as several hundred spectators, converged around the pole vault pit.

Alarotu scratched when the bar was moved to 18 feet. As it teetered there, just under the rafters, a sense of urgency descended on those present.

Bill Hatcher, Johnson's pole-vaulting teammate, didn't help matters. As Johnson placed his pole in the box and found the tip a full two feet short of the bar, Hatcher said, "Jan, you've got a chance to make history." Johnson, who admitted later he loved the sudden attention he commanded, smiled and countered, "Bill, I thought you were my friend."

Johnson made a gallant effort to become the first man in history to go 18 feet. He saved his best effort for his third try. He was over the bar, but brushed it on the way down. It teetered, then fell on top of him.

"I POPPED IT WITH MY CHEST on the way down," Jan explained. "On the way down, I was saying, 'Oh, my God, please stay up!' It was just a matter of being over-anxious. If I'd just relaxed and hung on for a second, I'd have made it."

At any rate, it was a spectacular end to a great meet.

On Friday, Bob Bertelsen of Ohio University set a meet record of 27 minutes, 57.5 seconds in the six-mile run. And Saturday, Oregon's Steve Prefontaine joined Mann and Sink with another meet mark, 13 minutes, 22 seconds in the 3-mile run.

Drake's Rick Wanamaker delighted the Des Moines fans by winning the decathlon with 7,406 points, a new event on the NCAA program.

There were other equally fine marks. Villanova's Marty Liquori repeated in the mile run, a championship he took away from Jim Ryun the year before, with a 3:59.9 clocking. Another Villanovan, Larry James, won the 440-year dash in 45.5, relegating world record-holder Curtis Mills of Texas A&M to third place behind Murray State's Tom Turner.

ONE OF THE MEET'S FINEST RACES came in the 880-yard run. Kansas State's Ken Swenson, the scourge of the midlands relay carnivals for three years, won his first outdoor title in 1:46.3, a full second under his previous best

time. Swenson, who anchored Kansas State to 13 relay trophies on the Texas-Kansas-Drake circuit, held off Oregon State's Pat Collins (1:46.5) with his customary gutty finish.

"These races are fun to watch," Swenson said, "but when you run them, they're kinda tense."

That pretty well summed up the 49th National Collegiate championships. They were fun to watch and the competitors gave their all.

NATIONAL COLLEGE DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS

Cal Poly's Successful Crown Defense Surprise To Its Coach, If No One Else

Prior to the start of the 1970 National College Division Track and Field Championships, held at Macalester College in St. Paul, Minn., June 12-13, Dick Purcell was a rather pessimistic individual.

Purcell was track coach at Cal Poly (SLO), defending champions for the eighth annual meet. He couldn't see how his Mustangs should be rated the favorites for the team championship.

Dick, who announced his resignation as Cal Poly track coach following the meet, figured the loss of Selmer Olson, a junior weightman, would be the difference in the Mustangs repeating. Olson had hurt his back following the California Collegiate meet and wouldn't be competing.

In addition, Cal Poly had only one defending champion, Mathyas Michael in the 880-yard run, and very few men among the leaders in season marks. One other athlete, Mohinder Gill, was the favorite in the triple jump.

HOWEVER, WHEN THE TWO-DAY MEET WAS COMPLETED, the Mustangs had scored in 11 of 21 events to finish with 49 points and win their third consecutive College Division track title.

The Pioneers from C. W. Post of Greenvale, N.Y., were second with 45 points and Occidental of California third with 44.

What may have been the turning point for Cal Poly was the six points picked up on opening night by weightman Wayne Barbee. He was fourth in the hammer throw and fifth in the discus.

In winning the title the two previous years, the Mustangs had failed to score in the weights, and with Olson's loss, Purcell was skeptical.

Michael, a sophomore from Ethiopia, and Gill, a sophomore from India, claimed the only individual titles for Cal Poly. Michael was one of two defending champions to retain their crowns, capturing the 880 run in 1:49.9.


Gill won the triple jump with a leap of 51-4½. **THE OTHER SUCCESSFUL** title defender was Jackie Causey of Southwestern Louisiana in the high jump, but only via a jump-off with Morgan State's Eric Howard after both went 6-10.

C. W. Post. The College Division cross-country champion accounted for two of the meet's four records.

He broke the 6-mile mark Friday night in a sensational two-man battle with John Cragg of St. John's (Minn.) University. Stonitsch won the event with a brilliant last lap kick, crossing the line in 28:46.9, while Cragg finished 25 yards back in 28:52.1. The old mark was 29:16.6 set by Jim Keefe of Central Connecticut State in 1964.

Stonitsch came back Saturday to break the 3-mile record. Taking the lead after the third lap, the 145-pounder led the final two miles as he crossed the line in 13:56.0, 20 yards ahead of Bill Scobey of Humboldt (Calif.) State, who set the mark of 14:00.4 in 1969.

SHARING INDIVIDUAL HONORS with Stonitsch was Chuck Smith of Occidental. A senior who was competing in track for the first time, Smith won the 100-yard dash in 9.4 and captured the 220-yard dash in 20.7, thus accounting for almost half of Occidental's 44 third-place points.

Not far behind Stonitsch and Smith was Clyde McPherson, an Adelphi (N.Y.) sophomore sprinter. He set an NCAA record in the regular 440-yard dash and came back an hour later to run a sensational 440 anchor leg in leading his team to a mile relay mark.

McPherson ran the regular 440 dash in 46.2, to break the old mark of 46.7 set in 1965 by Jim Kemp of Kentucky State. After his rest, Clyde came back with an outstanding 45.9 leg and Adelphi posted a 3:08.9 time in the mile relay.

Other members of the quartet included Clyde's younger brother, Bill McPherson, along with Dennis Walker and Kit Pratt. Morgan State of Maryland also bettered the old mark of 3:10.7 made by Kentucky State in 1966. The Marvlanders were timed in 3:10.0 while McNeese (La.) State equalled the old mark in finishing third.

LED BY ANCHORMAN LARRY BLACK, North Carolina Central dethroned Cal Poly as 440 relay champion and tied the College Division mark. The North Carolinians—Ken Thompson, Jim Stewart, Floyd Williams and Black—clocked 40.4, the time set by the Mustangs in 1968. Cal Poly had won the last three years but was forced to settle for fourth.

Bill Lamberson of Southwest Missouri State won the discus at 170 feet, with defending champ Clint Brown of Occidental the runnerup.

George Jerome of Southern Connecticut State moved from fourth place in 1969 to capture the hammer throw at 175-11.

Other individual champions included Willie Kouvolu. Eastern Michigan in the javelin with a toss of 238 feet; Byron Spradlin of Cal-Davis with 9:01.7 in the 3,000 meter steeplechase; Joe Wevurski of C. W. Post with a toss of 54-9 in shot put; Eastern Michigan's Bill Tipton in 120 high hurdles at 13.9; Dennis Savage of Westmont, Calif., with 4:07.0 in the mile run; South Dakota State's Larry Frank at 16 feet in the pole vault; Richard Weaver of PMC (Pa.) with 51.8 in the intermediate hurdles and Joe Silva of Western Illinois with a long jump of 25-8.

PRIOR TO THE START of the regular NCAA meet the College Division held its first decathlon on Thursday and Friday. The winner was Steve Gough of Seattle Pacific College.

The 6-3 senior and pre-meet favorite finished the 10-event spectacle with 7,269 points. Don Albritton of Northeast Missouri State checked in a distant second with 6,688 points.







NATIONAL COLLEGIATE INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Kansans' Field Strength Retains Title By 1½ Points Over Villanova Runners

Like the farmer, Kansas was outstanding in the field—so outstanding that Villanova's classy runners could not catch up and the Jayhawks won for the second straight year in the sixth annual National Collegiate Indoor Championships before packed houses in Detroit's Cobo Hall.

Buoyed by a second consecutive sweep of the shot put and a welcome two points in the weight throw on Friday, the Jayhawks got unexpected points in the pole vault and some unbelievable help from Howell Michael IV on Saturday to squeeze past Villanova by a point and a half, 27½ to 26. In winning its third NCAA indoor title, coach Bob Timmons' team amassed 20½ points in the field—more, quipped Villanova's Jumbo Elliott, than his Wildcats have scored in the field in the six-year history of this meet, sponsored by the Detroit News.

William & Mary's Michael upset Villanova's Marty Liquori in the mile to seal the Wildcats' doom, and a record two-mile relay effort by Kansas put icing on the Jayhawks' cake.

Almost overshadowed by the team-points race was a 5.9 clocking by Michigan State's Herb Washington, tying the world and American 60-yard dash records and breaking the NCAA standard by a tenth of a second.

OTHER NCAA MARKS TO FALL were in the shot put, two-mile relay, and 60-yard high hurdles. But individual performances this weekend took a back seat to the ballyhooed battle between favorites Villanova and Kansas, a battle ultimately decided by inches and reflected by the score.


The odds are against a team placing 1-2-3 in any event in national competition. But a trio of burly behemoths from Kansas had done it in the

shot put in 1969, as the Jayhawks won their second national indoor title. This time around, Karl Salb, Steve Wilhelm and Doug Knop beat overwhelming odds by leading the field again in the same order.

SALB'S WINNING heave was 67-2½—5¼ inches better than his record set in '69. Wilhelm tossed 64-7½ and Knop 61-1½. Knop was a senior, the other two juniors who'll probably haunt the opposition again in '71.

with two from Bill Penny for his fourth-place finish in the 35-pound weight throw gave Kansas a 15 to 0 lead over Villanova before Larry James, the Wildcats' Mighty Burner, won the 440-yard dash for the third consecutive year, this time in 48.3.

A second-place finish by Villanova's Andy O'Reilly in the half mile closed the Wildcats' gap to 15 to 10 after the first day of competition. The half mile was won by Wisconsin's Mark Winzenried, a junior, in 1:51.7.

Ed Nosal of Harvard won the weight throw with a toss of 63-6½, giving the team a half dozen points toward the 15 which landed the Ivy Leaguers in third place for the meet.

The closest finish of Friday's competition was in the longest race, the two-mile run, when Pitt's Jerry Richey and Southern Illinois' Alan Robinson sprinted to the wire in 8:39.2 although Richey was declared the winner. The finish relegated Villanova's Dick Buerkle to third.

BILL LIGHTSEY OF KENTUCKY, a transfer from Vincennes, Ind., Junior College, improved by more than a foot to win the long jump at 25-2¼ in a competition which saw the NCAA outdoor champ, Jerry Proctor of Redlands, fail to place. Miami's sophomore, Milan Tiff, devastated the triple jump field. His leap of 51-11 was 17¼ inches better than the runnerup.

Tom Hill of Arkansas State got Saturday's session off to a quick start by running the 60-yard high hurdles in an NCAA-record 6.9 seconds.

Michigan State's Washington followed with his 5.9, defeating an excellent 60-yard dash field including former NCAA champ Jim Green of Kentucky (2nd in 6.0), Missouri's Mel Gray (3rd in 6.1) and Oklahoma State's Earl Harris (4th in 6.2). Harris had run a 5.9 earlier in the year. Washington, a sophomore, became the 11th to break the 6-second barrier.

KANSAS HAD TWO MEN IN THE POLE VAULT and when the Jayhawks' Bill Hatcher cleared 16 feet for the first time in his life, things began to look gloomy for Villanova. Things got worse.

Manhattan surprised by winning the distance medley relay in 9:49.2 and Missouri edged Villanova, two-time defending champion, for second. Kansas then put together the fastest two-mile relay ever on an 11-lap track, a 7:25.7, and six more points went up for the midwesterners.

Villanova was not down yet, however, because its ace Liquori, the country's best miler, had yet to run. But unknown to nearly everyone, the junior had suffered a muscle strain during Friday's qualifying.

Liquori, showing no signs of limping, trailed the field in the final for nearly half the race before making a move that was simply too little and too late to catch William & Mary's Michael, who won in 4:03.1. Liquori was a half second and two points behind. He refused to alibi or tell anyone about his injury, saying only that Michael, also a junior, had run a better race. Kansas' Doug Smith picked up a point for fifth in the race.

ALMOST SIMULTANEOUSLY, Kansas Jan Johnson clinched second in the pole vault. His leap of 16-6 tied Maryland's Buddy Williamson, who won on fewer misses. And Hatcher tied Brigham Young's Alti Alarotu for fourth, giving Kansas those vital one and a half points.

Villanova was defeated and even its winning mile relay effort anchored by James was not enough. James, who had also run a leg of the distance medley relay, ran an excellent 47.6 as the Wildcats clocked a 3:15.3.

Three other Saturday events had no effect on the team championship. Notre Dame's Rick Wohlhunter survived the "slow heat" of the 600-yard

Another defending champion fell in the high jump when Florida's Ron Jourdan failed to place, as Brigham Young's Ken Lundmark won at 7 feet. Harvard's Keith Colburn won the 1,000-yard run in 2:09.9.
