

Title Train Could Be El Paso Bound If It Isn't Stalled In Pacific-8 Again

It was the second day of the 1972 National Collegiate track and field championships and Wayne Vandenburg was holding court in front of a shed at the southeast corner of the University of Oregon track.

"We're in good shape," smiled Vandy. "Just where we want to be."

Since Vandenburg's University of Texas at El Paso team had suffered several major disappointments on that day and its title chances seemed to be buried under an avalanche of UCLA blue, the heat-withered press corps promptly filed his remarks under whistling in the graveyard or sunstroke heads and resigned themselves to watching Southern California's futile attempts to catch UCLA.

Vandenburg's thoughts may have been one year ahead of everyone else's, however. UTEP finished a comfortable third at Eugene, well behind the champion Bruins, but only four points back of USC and 13 ahead of fourth-place Oregon.

IT WAS UTEP'S HIGHEST FINISH YET in the NCAAs and Vandenburg accomplished it with a surprisingly young and hardly healthy team. Maturity and sound hamstrings—mixed with Vandenburg's usual super recruiting—could bring the Miners to the top in 1973, although Vandenburg's departure from the UTEP job in November lends mystery to the situation.

Cone from the UTEP roster are 23 points scored in last year's meet, most of it in the form of Fred DeBernardi, who won both the shot and discuss titles. Also missing will be Harrington Jackson, the 1971 100 champion, and Ron Rondeau, who finished fifth in the 1972 intermediate hurdles.

Salve for those losses has to start with sophomore Steve Williams, who headlines a sensational sprint stable. Williams, who somehow found his way from New York City to the Mexican border, was brilliant in the early portions of 1972 with times of 9.3, 20.6 and 45.2 before pulling a hamstring.

Portland Oregonian sports writer Leo Davis is one of the most widely-respected men in his field on the West Coast.

Davis came to the Oregonian in 1962, starting with the prep sports beat.

Later assignments included baseball and hockey before he was moved over to the college front.

The 1968 Olympic Trials at Lake Tahoe marked the beginning of Davis' association with track and field. He covered the Games in Mexico City that year, and reported on the happenings in Munich in the summer of 1972.

BACKING HIM UP will be two more sophomores, Errol Stewart, third in the 100 at Eugene, and Harold Williams, a 200-meter finalist whose times (9.3, 20.6, 46.5) dim only in comparison with those of Steve Williams.

Despite the loss of DeBernardi, the Miners remain strong in the field events. Sophomore Hans Hoglund finished third in the NCAA indoor meet and his 64-1 effort was worth fifth place at Eugene. Pole vaulter Bill Curnow cleared 17-1½ as a sophomore and finished third in the nationals. Added to that are hammer throwers Peter Farmer and Pryor Nunn (third and seventh at Eugene) and finalist Trevor Hall in the triple jump (52-3½).

Most of those people are talent Vandenburg picked up in the last two years and this season's crop of recruits may be the strongest yet. In the sprints are three Trinidad Olympians—Charles Joseph, Rudy Reid and Arthur Cooper—and Texas high school champion Wardell Gilbreath, who has a best of 21.0 in the 220. Middle distance strength has been added in junior college miler Paul Pearson (4:01.4) and freshmen Gordon Oliver (4:08.7), Hollie Walton (4:08.2), Mike Cason and Bernard Ford (1:52.7).

IN THE FIELD EVENTS, UTEP HAS ADDED freshman shot putters Frank West and Tom Corrigan and jumpers Arnold Gromes (24-10, 49-1¼), Dennis DeLoach (6-10½) and Elroy Williams (6-9½). If that group of newcomers develop like the last two, the Miners may be on the throne in June.

If UTEP's hopes rest on potential, UCLA's are constructed on facts: (1) the Bruins have won two straight championships; (2) the Pacific-8, of which UCLA is a member, has won 11 of the last 12 team titles; and (3) the Bruins return 41 points from the '72 meet and three Olympians.

"Potentially, if every athlete stays healthy and performs up to my expectations, this could be the strongest team we've ever had at UCLA," predicts Bruin coach Jim Bush.

And with reason. Olympic bronze medalist Dwight Stones returns in the high jump (7-3) and Rick Fletcher (7-1¼) and Jim Arnold add depth. Also back are pole vaulter Francois Tracanelli (17-8½), a member of the French Olympic team, and long jumper Finn Bendixen (26-3), who competed for Norway in the Munich games.

OTHER RETURNING POINTS FROM THE NCAA MEET include Harry Freeman (54-6½) and Milan Tiff (53-3) in the triple jump, quartemiler Benny Brown (45.7), hurdler Charles Rich (13.5), discus man Del Gordon (183-2), decathlete Rory Kotinek and half of the mile relay team.

Add to the Bruin strength three outstanding junior college transfers and five blue chip freshmen and Bush can join a short list of two other men who have won three straight national titles.

Those other two, of course, are Dean Cromwell and Jess Mortensen, major reasons why Southern Cal has won or shared 25 of the 51 team championships. Present coach Vern Wolfe has not done badly for the Trojans, winning or sharing four of the last ten titles, but Wolfe's team this year appears a trifle too thin to challenge UTEP or UCLA.

THERE IS STILL PLENTY OF TALENT AT TROY, however, beginning with sensational sophomore Randy Williams, Olympic gold medalist in the long jump (27-4½). Also on hand are senior Jerry Wilson, NCAA high hurdles champ (13.4) and Jamaica's Don Quarrie (9.2, 19.8m), co-holder of the world record in the 200 meters.

Other standouts returning include high jumper Dean Owens (6-9¾), national finalist Earl Richardson (46.5) in the 440, Swedish decathlete Bo Sterner (7648 points) and pole vaulter Robert Pullard (17-0). Top newcomers are high jumper Jerry Culp (7-1½), dashmen Greg Jones (9.5, 21.1, 47.2) and Claude Brown (47.4), javelin thrower Bruce Dow (247-11), hurdler Ed Washington (13.8) and triple jumper Tom Cochee.

The only other team which would seem to have a chance to challenge for the team title is perennially-strong Oregon, 1972's fourth-place finisher and champion four times since 1962.

Leading the Duck charge is Steve Prefontaine, fourth place finisher in the 5,000 meters at Munich and the man with the chance to become the first four-time winner of any NCAA event. Other probable points returning for the Ducks come in the relays. All four members of the second place mile combo return along with all parts of the sixth place sprint relay.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS FOR BILL BOWERMAN'S DUCKS include sprinters Al Hearvey (9.5, 20.9) and John Mays (9.2w), javelin throwers Bob Daniel (251-3) and Russ Francis (241-7) and discus man Mac Wilkins (195-11). Heading the list of Oregon recruits will be Craig Brigham, the national high school decathlon record holder. Brigham has scored 7,523 points in the decathlon as well as pole vaulting 16-4, high jumping 6-8 and throwing the discus 183-2. His high school teammate, Jeff Carter, a 236-7 javelin thrower, is also headed for Oregon.

Those appear to be the only four teams with any hope of winning the team title, with Southern Cal a good possibility and Oregon a longshot at best, but 12 individual champions are scheduled to return in '73, most of them for teams with no title dreams.

WEST COAST—The power-packed Pacific-8 is loaded with talent as usual, but it's hard to pick the best of the rest after UCLA, USC and Oregon. Washington, sixth-place finisher at Eugene, suffered heavy losses, but does welcome back Gary Quitslund (2nd in javelin, 261-4), junior Rick Albright (4:04.6) and sophomore Jeff Taylor (17-0 indoors). Top newcomers include redshirt Tom Gregerson (238-4) and frosh Rod Ewaliko (238-5), Greg Gibson (1:51.0) and Mike Carr (9.4w).

WASHINGTON STATE HAS GOOD DUAL MEET STRENGTH in sprinters Dave Rorem (9.5) and Ghana Emmanuel Achah (9.6), freshman half miler Dale Scott (1:48.5) and high jumpers Bob Niehl and John Liddle (6-11½). Oregon State's top performer will be high jumper Tom Woods (7-3½), NCAA champion and record-holder as a freshman. Miler Hailu Ebba (3:59.3) and steeplechaser Leonard Hill and shot man Spike Walker (62-1) are the best of the others, but help is coming in the form of newcomers Jose Amaya (8:54.0) and Jim Miller (193-10hs).

Halfmiler Rick Brown (1:45.4m) and Pacific-8 champ Bruce Kennedy (249-10), as well as high school record holder Scott Overton (204-5 in the discus) help things at California.

FRESNO STATE COULD CONTEND for the Pacific Coast Athletic Association crown and boasts Roger George, fourth place finisher in the decathlon (7,515 points) and 60-foot shotputter Mike Giroux. San Jose State landed top freshman prospects in miler Mark Schilling (4:05.4) and shotputter Ron Semkiw (70-1¾hs and 59-6½). San Diego State has a new coach in Dick Hill and the defending PCAA 880 champ Jay Larkin (1:49.2).

ROCKY MOUNTAINS—Arizona State finished a surprising third in last year's WAC meet and with USC, UCLA and UTEP on the schedule, probably won't have an outstanding dual meet record. But the Sun Devils recruited well, including Philip Chewning (9.4), Carl McCullough (9.4, 20.8, 25-5) and Charles Wells (9.5, 21.2). Returning will be Maurice Peoples (45.3), Steve Holden (25-1) and Wayne Bradley (7-0).

Colorado State welcomes back national finalist Chris Adsit in the hurdles (50.6, 50.3m), discus man Marshall Smith, whose 190-3 is the best ever

for a college freshman, and all members of a 3:10.9 mile relay team. Kerry Elders (6-11½) is the top new recruit.

Brigham Young will have its usual contingent of foreign competitors this year, including javelin ace Raimo Pihl (260-0), Zdravko Pecar (189-0) in the discus, high jumper Aaro Alarotu (7-1), Jauko Kokonen in the intermediate hurdles, decathlete Christer Lythell and quartemiler Lars Stubendorff (47.0). They and returnees Paul Cummings (4:03) and distance runner Richard Reid, who scored in the national meet last year, will make the Cougars stronger in 1973.

SOUTHWEST—Rice lost the Southwest Conference title to Texas last year, but the Owls were still the best big meet team, scoring more points in the national championships than the rest of the SWC put together.

THE SAME SHOULD BE TRUE THIS YEAR with two-time NCAA champion Dave Roberts, an 18-foot pole vaulter. Rice also boasts Ken Stadel (191-0), runnerup in the discus at Eugene; three-time SWC intermediate champion Mike Cronholm (50.2) and three-miler Paul Geis. Newcomers include sprinter Jim Bob Franks (9.6, 21.2) and hurdler Mike Fulgham (13.7).

Texas loses only three seniors, but is not yet of national contender caliber despite the presence of Randy Lightfoot (13.6), Robert Primeaux (50-9), William Oates (7-1½) and Alan Thomas (189-1). Southern Methodist can field the sprinting Pouncy twins, Gene (9.4) and Joe (20.9), plus senior Bernard Austin (9.3) and newcomer Rufus Shaw (9.4) to go along with Sam Walker (66-0) in the shot.

OLYMPIAN TOM HILL IS GONE FROM ARKANSAS STATE, but still there is halfmiler John Scurto (1:50.9) and pole vaulter Barney Hess (16-6½).

MISSOURI VALLEY—Kansas has won six straight Big Eight titles and should be favored again this year with the return of talent like Barry Schur (7-3), Sam Colson (272-5), Delario Robinson (13.5w), Mark Lutz (20.7) and intermediate hurdler Bob Bornkessel. New faces will include Terry Porter (16-11½), Jim Euell (1:49.3) and Doug Todd (25-3).

Missouri can boast jumper Larry Gray (50-10½, 24-4½), high jumper Gene Hansbrough (7-0) and miler Charles McMullen (4:03.3). Kansas State could challenge Kansas with the likes of weightman Tom Brosius (62-0, 184-10), pole vaulter Don Marrs (16-6½), javelin thrower Bob Obree (251-0) and sprinter Dean Williams (9.3).

GONE IS THE SPRINT SPEED AT COLORADO, but back are Kingsley Adams (25-8), vaulter Mike Wedman (17-1½) and Charlie Bennett (9.5, 20.9) to go with prep discus standout Whitney Paul (195-11 hs). South African John Halberstadt, NCAA 10,000-meter record holder, returns to Oklahoma State and he has done the mile in 4:01.1 and the three in 13:17. Other Cowboys to watch include sprinter Dennis Schultz (9.3, 45.9), halfmiler Mike Manke (1:50.3) and junior college transfer George Stevens (255-5).

MIDWEST—Larry Burton, 200-meter champion and fourth-place finisher at Munich, heads Purdue's sprint corps and the Boilermakers also claim long jumper Jeff Bolin (26-2½), triple jumper Jerome Belin and three-fourths of the NCAA's third place sprint relay team. Michigan State should make a good defense of its Big Ten title with likes of miler Ken Popejoy (3:59.7), sprinter Marshall Dill (9.4, 20.7) and Bob Cassleman in the intermediates (49.9m).

The Badgers of Wisconsin can call on pole vaulter Gordon Crail (16-1) and triple jumper Patrick Onyango (52-0) along with new Kenyan sprinter Tarig Mughal. Jamaican Olympian Godfrey Murray (13.5w) in the hurdles

is one of Michigan's best. Indiana may be a conference contender with the likes of Glen Love (9.5) and Dennis Adama (7-1). Big Ten champion Jeff Linta returns to vault for Ohio State and Illinois can boast of a top 880 duo in Ron Phillips (1:48.2) and Rob Mango (1:48.4).

James Amerison of Lincoln, the second place finisher in the NCAA 100 (10.1m) is back, as is Larance Jones at Northeast Missouri, who chased John Smith home in the 400 at Eugene. Javelin champ Rick Dowswell (265-11) will return to Ohio University. Bowling Green could repeat as Mid-American Conference champ with Olympic gold medalist and world record holder Dave Wottle. Western Michigan lost the MAC title for only the second time since 1958, but the Broncos return distance runner Gary Harris, hurdler Homes Gaines and steeplechaser Steve Stintzi (8:57.1). Distance star Gordon Minty (28:51.4 in 10,000 meters) and quartemiler Stan Vinson (46.4m) lead the returnees at Eastern Michigan.

SOUTHERN ILLINOIS GRADUATED IVORY CROCKETT, but the Salukis can still rely on all four members of the fourth-place mile relay team, miler David Hill (4:01.9) and jumpers Bill Hancock (25-0, 6-11), Mike Bernard (7-1), and Jim Harris (52-8½). Hammer champion in 1971 and runnerup last year, Frenchman Jacques Accambray (227-1) returns at Kent State, along with sprinters Lenny Turner (9.3) and Olympian Gerald Tinker, a gold medalist on the sprint relay at Munich. JC transfer Bill Mason (9.3) is a top newcomer for the Golden Flashes.

EAST—There is no single power in the East, but talented individuals abound. Adelphi's Rick Hardware finished second in the 200 meters, Villanova's John Hartnett was third in the 5,000, Pittsburgh's Bill Rea finished third in the long jump and Ron Evans of Connecticut claimed the decathlon title with his 7,571 point total.

OTHER TOP ATHLETES INCLUDE HARVARD'S Kevin Benjamin (49-9¾), Penn State distance man Charlie Maguire and Fordham's Marcel Philippe (1:46.0m), he of the wandering citizenship. Top team in the East could be Penn, which returns NCAA champion Bruce Collins (13.9, 49.1m) in the intermediates, along with Bob Childs (8:46.7 steeplechase) and Fred Samara (7,699 decathlon).

SOUTH—Two Olympians and two all-Americans head the list of returnees at Tennessee. Doug Brown finished third in the steeplechase and then qualified in the Trials (8:31.8) while Trevor James (9.4, 20.7) represented Trinidad in Munich. The all-Americans include 800-meter champion Willie Thomas (1:47.2) and 1971 440 place winner Darwin Bond (9.5, 20.8, 45.9). Other Vol talent includes Danny Martin (245-11), Charles Geter (25-8), Greer Radcliff (25-4) and freshman Marck Branch (6-10½) and Nelson Walker (9.5).

OLYMPIAN JAN JOHNSON, WHO CLEARED 18 FEET in the Trials, is the top returnee at Alabama, along with soph Henry Orum (25-6) and a 40.3 sprint relay team. Junior triple jumper Andy Bilmanis (50-5½) is the best at Maryland. North Carolina welcomes back Tony Waldrop, the third place finisher in the 800, Trinidad Olympian Lennox Stewart and Reggie McAfee, second in the indoor 880 last year.

Sprinter Milton Reid (9.5, 21.3) is back for his sophomore year at South Carolina. Kentucky has a bundle of school record holders like Charles Buckman in the intermediates and Richard Kissman in the 880. Florida returns pole vaulter Mike Cotton (17-0), high jumper Chuck Duff (7-0) and quartemiler Beaufort Brown.

Consistent Bruins Repeat Title Feat Amid Upsets, Controversy, Confusion

In a meet where upset, controversy and confusion ruled, UCLA's magnificent Bruins went merrily on their methodical way.

To open the 51st National Collegiate track championships, the Bruins fumbled the baton in the 440-yard relay for the fourth year in a row.

To close the three-day festival at the University of Oregon's ancient Hayward Field, the Bruins won the mile relay for the fourth year in a row, and blitzed a field of reputed challengers to capture their second straight team championship.

With three individual champions—Warren Edmonson in the 100 meters, James Butts in the triple jump and defending champion John Smith in the 400 meters—UCLA rang up 82 points, 33 points more than Southern Cal's 49 and 37 more than third place Texas-El Paso's 45.

It was, in fact, the largest point total since USC scored 86 in 1967.

THE VICTORY ALSO MARKED THE REVERSAL of an earlier UCLA defeat when the Bruins' freeway rivals from Southern Cal dominated the Pacific-8 Conference meet a month before.

"We wanted to win the NCAA and prove the Bruins rule Los Angeles," said UCLA coach Jim Bush, who in eight years at Westwood has won three national titles (1966-71-72) and four Pac-8 championships.

While 28,500 of Eugene, Oregon's famous track nuts turned out for the competition, it was Hayward Field which took a roasting.

First, the NCAA rules committee discovered that the steeplechase water jump pit was too shallow.

And then the staggered lane starts were improperly marked, causing USC

to run 22 yards too far in the qualifying round of the mile relay. Other teams in the outside lanes ran almost as far.

BECAUSE OF THE ERROR, all the mile relay teams ran again the next day in identical heats, and places were awarded on the basis of time. The Bruins won their section in 3:05.3 for first and the host University of Oregon won the second section in 3:06.4 for second.

The discrepancies at the meet obviously were

a warning worth heeding by this city which has appropriately labeled itself the track and field capital of the world.

For less than a month later, Eugene and Hayward Field staged the immensely successful United States Olympic track and field trials when over 140,000 fans thrilled to ten days of competition.

The 51st NCAA meet, while kind to the defending team champion, was harsh on the individual heroes on the 1971 meet in Seattle.

Only three of nine defending individual champions eligible to compete in the meet repeated—Oregon's Steve Prefontaine in the 5,000 meters for his third consecutive title, UCLA's John Smith for his second straight 400 meters win, and Rice pole vaulter Dave Roberts.

MEET WEEK OPENED RATHER SHOCKINGLY when little North Carolina Central, an early team favorite, withdrew its entire delegation when the NCAA ruled its Kenyan runners, Robert Ouku and Julius Sang, ineligible.

That withdrawal included defending 200 meters champion Larry Black. And then Southern University's Rod Milburn, the high hurdles champ, elected to compete elsewhere and 10,000-meter champion Garry Bjorklund of Minnesota, beset with injuries, failed to meet the qualifying standard.

Four others tried, but failed. UTEP sprinter Harrington Jackson ran sixth in the 100 meters; Bouncy Moore of Oregon scratched because of an injury in the long jump; Washington's Cary Feldmann didn't qualify for the finals in the javelin; and Kent State's Jacques Accambray saw his hammer throw title and meet record fall to teammate Al Schoterman.

THE SPIRITED BATTLE FOR THE TEAM TITLE revolved around the sprints, with UCLA, USC and UTEP all hopeful of leading up there. None of the three did, but UCLA came closest.

UTEP was out before it got started when the Miners lost both their freshman sensations, Steve Williams, who pulled up lame in the 400 meters, and Harold Williams, who was disqualified in the 100 meters for two false starts. And then Jackson was only sixth in the 100 final.

The meet's real turning point came about in that 100-meter final, when USC's Don Quarrie, the co-world record holder at 200 meters, pulled up and UCLA's Edmonson sped to victory.

The Bruins actually trailed USC 28-22 after the second day of competition, but turned the meet into a rout the final day with a one-three-four finish by James Butts (53-2 1/4), Harry Freeman (52-10 1/4) and Milan Tiff (52-9 1/4) in the triple jump; a one-three finish in the 400 meters by Smith (44.5) and freshman Benny Brown (45.3); and third in the high jump by freshman Dwight Stones (7-2) and the mile relay victory.

IN ADDITION, JEAN-PIERRE CORVAL WAS AWARDED THIRD in the 400-meter hurdles when Bob Cassleman of Michigan State, Jim Bolding of Oklahoma State, and Chris Adsit of Colorado State were disqualified.

Another controversy surrounded Quarrie following his failure to get more than two steps out of the blocks in the 100 meters. He said he was injured.

A number of coaches, however, filed a protest contending that he had not made an honest effort to compete in the race and that he should be excluded from further competition.

The protest was disallowed, but the matter proved moot when Quarrie scratched Saturday from the 440 relay final and 200 meter semifinals.

USC coach Vern Wolfe inserted Edesel Garrison into the lineup, reshuffled the order slightly, and came up a winner. The quartet of freshman Randy Williams, who had earlier won the long jump (wind-aided 26-8 1/4),

Garrison, Leon Brown and Willie Deckard won in 39.4, easily handling Purdue (40-1), challenging on a great anchor by sophomore Larry Burton.

Perhaps it was Burton who was symbolic of the meet: a fresh, new star on America's track horizon.

Burton, a muscular football player who had never—that's right, never—run in a track meet before January, 1972, streaked by Rich Hardware of Adelphi and Mark Lutz of Kansas, who tied for second, to win the 200 meters title in a wind-aided 20.5.

And there were other new faces:

Like Oregon State freshman Tom Woods, who had failed to place in the Pac-8 conference meet, soaring 7-3 1/4 for a record in the high jump.

OR LIKE TENNESSEE SOPHOMORE WILLIE THOMAS, who blasted down the straightaway to win the 800-meter final in 1:47.1.

Or Jerry Wilson of USC, a surprising 13.4 victor over Thomas Hill of Arkansas State in the 110-meter high hurdles.

Or Bruce Collins, the silky-smooth sophomore from Pennsylvania who entered with a best of 50.8, blitzing a good 400-meter hurdle field in 49.1.

And there were those who figured to score and did:

Like UTEP's powerful Fred DeBernardi, who after two years of finishing second in the discus, defeated the entire field in 1972 without taking off his sweats. His best throw was 196-5 and it completed a double: he had earlier won the shot put with a mark of 66-6 1/2.

BOWLING GREEN'S DAVE WOTTE, WHO A MONTH LATER was to equal the world 800 meters record on the same track, en route to an eventual gold medal at 800 at Munich, overpowered a good 1,500 meters field in 3:39.7, and South Africa's 5-6 John Halberstadt, on loan to Oklahoma State, set a meet record in winning the 10,000 meters in 28:50.3.

It was a fine track meet. The proper prelude to an Olympiad.





Eastern Michigan Swan Song Is Tops At Record-Happy Ashland 'Happening'

The 1972 National College Division track and field championships at Ashland College was more than just a gigantic exhibition of 611 athletes from 115 colleges and universities. It was a happening.

Athletes of all colors, shapes and sizes converged on the small Ohio city May 25-27 and truly and Olympic spirit in an Olympic year evolved.

The school's rooming houses and cafeterias all had SRO business. Rock music blared everywhere. And, most importantly, the performances were better than ever as athletes were competing in a major chapter of their lives' dreams of completing in the upcoming Olympic games at Munich.

The record books of the NCAA were never so savagely attacked as they were in this meet as 14 new marks were set.

EASTERN MICHIGAN DOMINATED THE COMPETITION as coach Bob Parks' Hurons staged a brilliant show in their College Division swan song. Starting in September, 1972, the Hurons stepped up to University Division stature.

Norfolk State finished a distant second to Eastern Michigan, 49 points to 93. Northeast Missouri was third with 46 points.

Kentucky State, which won the 1971 title in amazing fashion with only five runners, managed only a 19th-place tie with ten points in 1972.

Steve Riddick of Norfolk State was the fastest of all the whooshwonders present in the meet's fastest race, the 100-meter dash.

He broke the meet record and had the best time in the world in 1972 to that date by blazing to a 10.0 time in the semifinals. It broke the mark of 10.3 by Cecil Turner of Cal Poly, in 1968. A total of 15 times in the 100 bettered the previous meet record.

Once the vice-president of a large advertising agency in Cleveland, Dennis Lustig decided to "chuck it" for his first love, sports.

He took a tremendous pay cut to become "phone boy" in the Plain Dealer sports department.

Lustig has since worked his way up to Ohio College sports editor, and is the conductor of two of the Plain Dealer's leading columns, "Sound Off" and "Whatever Happened To."

Until he started covering track three years ago, Lustig didn't like it. But he admittedly was bitten by the track bug, and hasn't recovered. Records show he is single at 28.



Riddick came back Saturday to nip Dave Gilliard of Cal Poly-Pomona in the finals as both ran 10.1.

RIDDICK'S TEAMMATE, Bill Cuffee, broke the record in the 200-meter dash, winning in 20.6.

In the 400-meter dash, Larance Jones of Northeast Missouri won in 45.8 to dethrone defending champion Steve Jordon of Kentucky State.

Eugene Weiss of Montclair State beat defending champ and favorite Jay Fabian of Ashland in

the 800-meter run. Weiss was timed in 1:48.3, while Fabian clocked 1:48.7.

In an uninspiring race clockwise, Garry Bentley of South Dakota State plodded to a 3:50 victory in the 1,500-meter run. He finished one-half second ahead of Fred LaPlante of Eastern Michigan.

Gordon Minty, Eastern Michigan's nonpareil distance runner, a 24-year-old sophomore from London, England, successfully defended his two titles by winning the 5,000 and 10,000 meter runs in record times.

He captured the 5,000 in 14:23.5 and the 10,000 in 29:29.6, snapping marks held by Grant Colehour of Eastern Kentucky, set in 1968. Dick Bowerman of Wabash was runnerup to Minty in both events.

Mike Bettiga of Humboldt State didn't miss Rod Milburn, the defending high hurdles champ who skipped the competition. He broke the meet mark with a 13.8 in the 110-meter high hurdles finals.

THE RECORD OF 13.9 HAD BEEN ESTABLISHED earlier in the meet by Rod Jackson of Eastern Illinois in the semifinals. He finished second, behind Bettiga, in the finals.

It was not all for naught for Jackson as he won the 400-meter intermediate hurdles in 51.2, ahead of Eastern Michigan's Bill Cartwright. The 1971 winner, Melvin Bassett of North Carolina Central, did not compete.

Ray White of Wabash won the steeplechase in a yawning 9:04.6.

The College Division championships at Ashland was a meet of super speed, but not super jumping.

Steve Buso of Oswego State won the high jump with a leap of 6-9¾. Don Albritton of Northeast Missouri, Kurt Nielsen of Nebraska Wesleyan and Garrade Pettus of Eastern Michigan all tied for second at 6-7¾.

DON BARFIELD OF UC RIVERSIDE, long jump runnerup in 1971, won the event at Ashland with a 25-4¼ leap. Tom Ceredine of Northeast Missouri, the man who beat Barfield at Sacramento, managed only sixth place.

Ceredine did find happiness at Ashland as he won the triple jump by springing 50-4½. He had been a runnerup in 1971 in this event.

Dave Hamer of Cal Poly lived up to his billing as favorite in the pole vault as he won with a record-setting vault of 16-8.

In the weight events, Steve Lauriano, Jr., of Cal Poly-Pomona beat defending champion Mike McCread of Northern Iowa in the shot put, 55-6 to 55-5¼. San Fernando Valley's Sylvester Marshall won the discus in 173-9, six feet better than Art McCollum of Hayward State.

Jim Feeney paced the throwers with a record hurl of 243-4 in the javelin. It broke the four-year mark of 239-8 by Darol Wintle of Weber State.

Frank Bredice of Southern Connecticut won his second straight hammer throwing championship and his 205-2 firing set a record in the process.

ALBRITTON, WHO FINISHED THIRD IN THE POLE VAULT and second in the high jump, won honors as the best all-around athlete, scoring 6999 points to capture the decathlon. Eastern Michigan's Ron DeVries was second.

The best events at track meets usually are the relays, and the 440 and mile relays at Ashland were no exceptions.

The blazing 440-yard quartet of Norfolk State, comprised of Cuffee, Riddick, Zack Rodger and Condie Pugh set a record in the semifinals of 39.4, winning the finals in 39.8 with Eastern Illinois second.

The most controversial finish occurred in the mile relay. After a 30-minute delay, judges decided Eastern Michigan and Adelphi had ended in a dead heat. Both were timed in 3:09.7.

The College Division championships truly were . . . a happening.

Pacific Coast Club Outscores Rivals To Gain Second Straight USTFF Title

The Pacific Coast Track Club successfully defended their team title in the Tenth Annual United States Track and Field Federation men's championships, May 26-27 at Cessna Stadium in Wichita, Kansas.

The Los Angeles-based team collected 80 points, finishing well ahead of the Chicago Track Club, second with 42 points.

The 1972 meet showcased talent which was to perform later in the summer at the Olympic Games in Munich. Among the U. S. Olympic team members who participated were Preston Carrington, Jan Johnson, Brian Oldfield, Jim Ryun, Ken Swenson and George Woods.

The two-day championship meet attracted over 15,000 spectators and 800 athletes, the most successful USTFF meet to date.

The meet's only double winner was Ben Vaughan of the Georgia Tech Track Club, who won the 100-yard dash in 9.5 and the 220 in 20.7. Meet records were established in the discus by Brian Oldfield; in the intermediate hurdles by Efram Gibson; in the shot put by George Woods; and in the steeplechase by Randy Smith.





NATIONAL COLLEGIATE INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Last-Gasp Spartan Rally Falls Short As One Point Preserves Trojan Title

The University of Southern California's Trojans came to conquer, but wound up a staggering champion saved by the bell in the National Collegiate Athletic Association's 1972 indoor track and field meet at Detroit's gleaming Cobo Hall.

Some 15 strong, its largest entry in the eight-year history of the University of Michigan and Detroit News-sponsored event, Southern Cal started fast in the opening March 10 session and then hung on desperately in the following day's big windup to win the team crown by a single point.

The Trojans wound up with 19 points, only one point ahead of Big Ten champion Michigan State and surprising Bowling Green, who deadlocked for second spot with 18. Defending champion Villanova, striving for its third NCAA indoor crown, failed to win a single event on the 17-event program and placed fourth with 13 points.

SOUTHERN CAL'S SECOND NCAA TRIUMPH—the Trojans took the 1967 meet with 26 points—turned out to be preserved by a paltry three points in the first final of the 10-event closing program, the 60-yard high hurdles.

In the preceding night's opening session, the Trojans got off like gangbusters. Henry Hines retained his long jump title with a respectable 25-10. Husky Doug Lane, a senior from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, gave USC an upset triumph in the shot put with a toss of 64-3½. And When Henry Jackson took a strong second in the triple jump closing the first day's competition, the Trojans had piled up 16 points.

Jackson finished less than an inch behind triple jump winner Barry McClure of Middle Tennessee, one of four meet record breakers who all happened to be field event stars.

McClure spring-legged to 52-10½, shading the record of 52-9¾ set the previous year by Cal Poly's Mohinder Gill. Trojan Jackson was a slide-rule second with 52-9½.


BOWLING GREEN WAS USC's closest pursuer after the opening night competition, quickly piling up 12 points on back-to-back victories by Dave Wottle in the 880 and national steeplechase champion Sid Sink in the two-mile run.

Jerry Liska, a former varsity football and basketball player at Marquette, has worked for the Associated Press since 1941. He became the Chicago sports editor for the A.P. in 1956.

Sink's 8:36.5 clocking was the best two-mile performance since 1967. However, Southern Cal was destined to sweat it out in the final day of competition after heavily-favored Edesel Garrison overly-loafed in his 440 trial heat and world record-sharing 200-meter ace, Don Quarrie, also failed to qualify for the 60-yard dash.

Thus, the Trojans had a potential of six to 12 points go down the drain with Garrison's failure in the 440, won by lightly-reckoned Larance Jones of Northeast Missouri and Quarrie's flop in the 60 sprint captured by football star Herb Washington of Michigan State. Compounding the Trojan woe was Willie Deckard's no-count sixth place finish in the 60 dash final.

JONES HAD TO EXPLODE PAST NEBRASKA'S GARTH CASE to win the 440, with each clocked in 48.3. By way of comparison, Garrison earlier in the 1972 indoor campaign sped to a 45.7 in Houston's Astrodome. He won his 440 heat at Detroit, but failed to keep his eye on the clock, which brushed him out of the finals with a field he probably could have handled breezing.

Said Jones of Garrison, his hero since high school days, "He came to Detroit as the real, expected-to-win favorite, and I was really surprised when he failed to qualify. The last time I ran against Edesel was back in high school in 1968, when he went 46.9 and I went 47.3."

While Quarrie's failure to qualify in the 60-yard dash with a 6.4 heat clocking was not too surprising for the Jamaican swiftie who needs a while to get up a head of steam, it was that second event on the closing day program which launched Michigan State's title bid.

The flying Washington, who seemingly whipped runnerup Ed Hammonds of Memphis State by more than their identical 6.1 indicated, moved the Spartans into the scoring column for the first time with six points.

AT THAT POINT, SOUTHERN CAL HAD COLLECTED all the points they were to tally, with the fourth place by Lance Babb and fifth by Jerry Wilson in the high hurdles producing three vital points in Saturday's first final.

Bowling Green then threw a scare into the Trojans with newly-crowned 880 champion Wottle and two-mile titlist Sink pulling out a brisk triumph in the distance medley for six more points for a total of 18, leaving the Ohio school the only team scoring three firsts in the meet.

Wottle, after taking the baton from Sink on his three-quarter mile leg, turned loose another torrid finish in his mile anchor leg for a 4:02.5 clocking and a Bowling Green victory in 9:49.5. That snatched the distance medley crown from Kansas State, finishing second with 9:50.3 and only a few weeks later destined to race to an outdoor world record of 9:31.8.

So, now with seven more events to be completed, Southern Cal stood 19 and Bowling Green 18, both in an obvious holding pattern, with Michigan State running fourth with six, behind third-place Villanova.

NEXT UP, THE 600-YARD RUN went to another unheralded athlete, Dale Gibson of Mississippi State, with a comparatively slow 1:13.3. But Bob Cassleman grabbed third and Michigan State got three more points.

Then Michigan State captured its second individual title on the fine mile run triumph by another Big Ten champion, Ken Popejoy, in 4:02.9.

That gave the Spartans 15 points going into the meet's final running event, the mile relay. The Michigan State quartet, with No. 2 man Marshall Dill, a schoolboy sprint sensation, running a 48.1 440 leg, had the partisan crowd roaring with a 3:17.5 clocking in the first of two final sections. But the Spartan effort proved only good for third, behind Adelphi's winning 3:15.8 and Nebraska's runnerup 3:17.0.

Thus Michigan State's last-day charge ended just one point shy of giving the Big Ten at least a share of a national indoor title which has been won by Kansas three times, Southern Cal and Villanova twice and Missouri once since the highly-successful meet was launched in 1965.

A consistently solid gate attraction promoted by the Detroit News, the 1972 meet lured a two-day total of 18,820 to Cobo Arena, including a one-day record crowd of 9,867 at the March 11 closing session.

IN A WAY, IT WAS A "NO-NAME" MEET, at least as a prelude to the summer campaigning for the 1972 Munich Olympics and by comparison with the 1968 meet which tuned up such stars as Jim Ryun, Marty Liquori, Larry James, Dick Fosbury and Bob Beamon for the Mexico City Olympiad.

One of the 1972 meet's four record-breakers was a Frenchman, Kent State's Jacques Accambray, the national hammerthrow champion, who smashed the 35-pound weight throw mark by almost three feet with a toss of 71-3 $\frac{1}{4}$. The former record of 68-10 $\frac{1}{4}$ was set in 1971 by Accambray's Kent State colleague, Al Schoterman, who this time was runnerup with 69-5 $\frac{3}{4}$, also bettering his own meet mark.

Besides McClure with his triple jump record, the meet also produced new records in the pole vault and the high jump, events in which defending champions were unseated.

THE POLE VAULT WENT TO JAN JOHNSON OF ALABAMA, although defending champion Scott Wallick of Miami of Ohio and Mike Wedman of Colorado also cleared 17-1 $\frac{1}{4}$, but tied for second on more misses. The old record was 17- $\frac{1}{4}$, set in 1967 by Southern Cal's Bob Seagren.

In the high jump, Chris Dunn of Colgate and world record holder Pat Matzdorf of Wisconsin, defending champion, both sailed over 7-2 $\frac{3}{4}$ to surpass Matzdorf's record 7-2. Dunn got first on fewer misses.
