

Contenders look to foreign athletes for leadership in Olympic year

Who will be the Edwin Moses of 1980?

Who among the nation's collegiate track and field athletes will emerge from obscurity in this quadrennial year to become an Olympic champion?

No one can answer that, of course, just as no one in 1976 could know that Moses would come out of tiny Morehouse College to win an Olympic gold medal and set a world record in the 400-meter hurdles. Moses hadn't even won in his own NCAA Division III Outdoor Track Championships, falling down and thus failing to qualify for the Division I meet.

This year's National Collegiate Track and Field Championships at Texas will be an important pre-Olympic meet, not only for those hoping to make the U.S. team but also for foreign athletes attending college in the United States. And, as usual, most contenders for the NCAA team title are depending not on some unknown Moses but on proven foreign athletes to lead them.

Even Southern California, which perhaps has never had so many Trojan horses, went out and recruited Joao de Oliveira of Brazil to bolster its bid for a 28th championships title. Oliveira holds the world record of 58-8¼ in the triple jump and has gone 27-5¼ in the long jump, the fourth-best distance in history.

The Trojans should make history this year with what is already being described as the greatest collegiate sprint corps ever. Besides Amateur Athletic Union and World Cup 100-meter champion James Sanford (10.07) and 1978 400-meter champ Billy Mullins (45.03), the Trojans return Kevin Williams (10.27) and Rod Bethany (46.15). They recruited 400-meter men

David Woods has covered the past five NCAA outdoor championships, the past five NCAA cross country meets, the NCAA indoor championships in 1977 and 1979, the Olympic trials in 1976 and the Amateur Athletic Union championships in '78 and '79. Woods began working for the Champaign-Urbana News-Gazette as a University of Illinois freshman in 1971, became full time in 1974 and graduated from Illinois in January 1975. He began by covering high school sports and now covers cross country and track almost exclusively while spending some time on the desk.

Bill Green (45.51) and Ron Williams (45.4), who set national high school and junior college records, respectively. Sanford, with 20.19 speed in the 200, began as a 400 man. His brother, freshman Michael Sanford, brings 21.00 speed and two California prep 200 titles to USC.

To go with Oliveira and the sprinters, USC has middle-distance man David Omwansa of Kenya in the 800 and 1,500 (1:45.9 and 3:39.5), jumper Kenny Hays (26-2¾ in the long jump, 52-9 in the triple jump) and pole vaulter Jerry Mulligan (17-4¾).

USC is not so awesome that others have no chance. Defending champion Texas-El Paso returns 48 of the 64 points it scored in last year's runaway victory and probably deserves to be the pre-meet favorite. Oregon, last year's No. 1 dual-meet team and champion of

the Pacific-10 Conference, might also be a contender but will be hurt by the absence of distance runners Rudy Chapa and Alberto Salazar. Both decided to skip the college track season and train for the Olympics.

Other serious contenders include UCLA, Villanova and Washington State.

Four improved teams from the South—Texas, Texas A&M, Houston and Louisiana State—have the necessary scoring potential to be among the top 10 in the nation.

UTEP's returning scorers are NCAA outdoor champion Jerome Deal in the 100 (10.19), 1978 champion Peter Lemashon in the 800 (1:45.7), James Rotich in the 5,000 (13:42.3), 1978 champ Michael Musyoki and 1979 champ Suleiman Nyambui in the 10,000 (28:03.3 and 28:01.3, respectively) and hammer

throwers Richard Olsen (236-10) and Thommie Sjoholm (219-6).

The Miners also have Commonwealth Games triple jump champ Keith Connor, who was injured most of last season, and shot putter Carlos Scott. Recruits include young Jamaican Bertland Cameron, fourth in the Pan Am 400, and Rhode Island hammer thrower Keith Bateson.

Oregon is strong even without Chapa and Salazar, boasting potential winners in pole vaulter Tom Hintnaus (17-8), shot putter Jeff Stover (65-4) and javelin thrower Reidar Lorentzen (278-1). The Ducks also have steeplechasers Ken Martin and Larry Hurst, 17-foot vaulter Jon Switzer and shot putter Vince Goldsmith. Helping to pick up the slack in the distances is California prep recruit Jeff Nelson, who broke Craig Virgin's national high school record in the two-mile.

UCLA can start with hurdler Greg Foster (13:22), who won the NCAA 200 last year (20:22). Jon Warner (17-6¼) and Anthony Curran (17-3) scored in the pole vault. U.S. Junior champion Eric Brown made the NCAA 100 finals, and Chip Benson triple jumped 53-7¼. The Bruins added junior college record holder Andre Phillips in the 400 hurdles (49:47), prep 800 record holder Jeff West (1:48:2), Junior high jump champ Lee Balkin (7-3¼) and Detroit prep hurdler Marcus Allen.

Villanova will have to run for it, because its point-scoring potential is almost all on the track. Defending champions Don Paige in the 800 and 1,500 (1:45.5, 3:37.4) and Sydney Maree in the 5,000 (13:20.7) are joined by 800 man Anthony Tufariello (1:46.4) and steeplechaser Amos Korir (8:23.2). Prize recruits include two Philadelphians, hurdler Rodney Wilson (13.94) and sprinter Carlton Young (10.39), plus California miler Paul Medvin (4:05.3). Field points could come from javelin thrower Joe Mitrovich (252-1).

Henry Rono didn't have the kind of

year in 1979 he had in 1978 when he set four world records, but he and Kenyan countrymen Samson Kimombwa and Joel Cheruiyot give Washington State the distance strength to make a run for the title. Kimombwa, who held the world 10,000 record until Rono broke it, was redshirted last season. The Cougars also have hammer throwers Paul Buxton (230-7) and Jim Jesernig (216-0) and can be expected to come up with more quality recruits.

Texas could score well before the home crowd, especially if Olympic sprinter Johnny "Lam" Jones returns after competing unattached for a year. The Longhorns have weight men Oskar Jakobsson and Robbie Robinson, javelin throwers Denes Pajtas and Gerald Lyons, 800 man Owen Hamilton, 400 man Ricky Faggett (44.9 relay split) and promising freshman sprinters from the football team

Texas A&M has potential scorers in sprinter Curtis Dickey, the NCAA 100 runner-up in 1978 who was slowed by injury last year; 1979 runners-up Leslie Kerr (400 in 45.51) and Randy Hall (17-6 vaulter), and discus thrower Tim Scott (205-11).

Houston has sprinter Rich Edwards, 400 hurdler Charles Whigham, pole vaulter Brett Dames and prep long jump record holder Carl Lewis.

Willie Turner, ReVey Scott and Efrem Coley give Louisiana State strength in the sprints and relays as it attempts to overtake Southeastern Conference powers Auburn and Tennessee. The Tigers also have 26-foot long jumper Eugene McCain and hurdler Orlando McDaniel.

An event-by-event rundown:

100 METERS—After 1979 champ Deal and runner-up Sanford, top contenders are Dickey (10.11) and Georgia's Mel Lattany (10.16). Also returning are the fourth-, fifth-, sixth- and seventh-place finishers—Houston's Edwards, Tennessee's Mike Miller, Louisiana State's Turner and UCLA's Brown. Back after a year's absence are Texas' Jones (10.23) and Florida State's Mike Roberson (10.11).

200 METERS—Injury struck down early season phenomenon James Mallard of Alabama, who clocked 20.07 last year. It will be difficult for him to win this year even if he's healthy, considering the likes of Sanford (20.19), defending champion Foster (20.20) and Olympian and AAU champion Dwayne Evans (20.22), who was redshirted last year at Arizona State after transferring from Arizona. Others are Lattany, Edwards, Louisiana State's Scott and Coley, East Carolina's Otis Melvin and Kansas' Deon Hogan.

400 METERS—This event suddenly becomes much tougher with the USC trio of Mullins, Green and Ron Williams and UTEP's recruiting of Jamaican Cameron. Taking note should be defending NCAA and World Cupchamp Kasheef Hassan of Oregon State and the Sudan. Hassan's 45.18 made him the first foreign athlete to win this event in 27 years. Returning placers include Texas A&M's Kerr, Florida State's Walter McCoy and Tennessee's Antone Blair. Another rising star is San Diego State sophomore Ed Daniels.

800 METERS—Assuming Paige won't double in an Olympic year, he might bypass the 800. If he does run it, he'll be up against Villanova teammate Tufariello, 1978 champ Lemashon, Prairie View A&M's Evans White (1:45.8), Southern California's Omwansa and 1979 runner-up Jack McIntosh of Western Michigan. Others are California sophomore Mike White, Nebraska's Scott Poehling, Missouri's Scott Clark and Virginia's Greg Canty.

1500 METERS—Paige could be challenged in this by teammate Maree, Omwansa or Nyambui (3:35.8). All three could opt for other races, but that would still leave 1979 runner-up Todd Harbour of Baylor (3:39.0). Other sub-3:40 men include New Mexico's Kipsubai Koskei (3:38.6) and St. John's Ross Donoghue (3:39.8).

STEEPLECHASE-With nine of the top 10 finishers back, including world record holder Rono (8:05.4), this event promises to have as much quality depth as any in the college ranks. Behind Rono are Korir, Richmond's Hillary Tuwei (8:23.7), Arizona's Thom Hunt (8:26.8), Tennessee's Sam James (8:30.3) and Wisconsin's Randy Jackson (8:30.7). Finishing seventh, ninth and 10th were Auburn's John Tuttle, Michigan's Dan Heikkinen and Georgetown's John Gregorek. Gregorek set a U.S. Junior record of 8:33.8. Just now eligible is Arizona's Harrison Koroso (8:33.6), who transferred from New Mexico.

5000 METERS-Barred from running internationally because of his South African citizenship, Maree is sure to take this race more seriously than will Olympic threats Rono (13:08.4) and Nyambui (13:12.3), the two fastest 5,000 men ever. The rest of the outclassed field includes the third-, fourth- and fifth-place finishers from last year-East Tennessee's Adrian Leek, UTEP's Rotich and Wisconsin's Jim Stintzi. Among the many poised for a possible breakthrough are Arkansas' Mark Muggleton, Rice's Mike Novelli, Western Kentucky's Larry Cuzzort, Brigham Young's Doug Padilla, Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo's Jim Schankel, Penn State's Alan Scharsu and Auburn's Tom Graves.

10,000 METERS—Washington State's Rono, Kimombwa and Cheruiyot could meet the duo that gave UTEP its one-two sweep last year—Nyambui and Musyoki. Others are Wyoming's Joseph Nzau and Simon Kilili, Western Kentucky's Dave Murphy, Providence's Dan Dillon and Schankel.

110-METER HIGH HURDLES—After suffering the ignominy of falling down in the two fastest hurdle races ever, Foster will try again. Maryland's Renaldo Nehemiah set a world record of 13.00 on Foster's home track at UCLA in May and ran a wind-aided

12.91 in the NCAA championships a month later. Foster fell each time, but he is the man to beat Nehemiah if anyone can. Joining the chase will be four-time junior college champ Kerry Bethel (13.39), now at Fairleigh Dick-

inson-Teaneck. Also back is West Virginia's Garnet Edwards (13.48), 1979 runner-up Dan Oliver of Ohio State (13.55) and Missouri's Dan Lavitt (13.69).

400-METER INTERMEDIATE

HURDLES—The top five from last year completed their eligibility, so this event has a new look. The top returnee, Karl Williams of Virginia, ran 50.24. The only sub-50-second men are UCLA recruit Phillips and Houston's Whigham. The decision of West Virginia's Edwards to try this event could have an influence.

HIGH JUMP-All six placers return and more than a dozen collegians have jumped 7-3, so World Cup champ Franklin Jacobs of Fairleigh Dickinson-Teaneck will have to be "on" to regain the title he lost last year. He holds the American indoor record of 7-71/4. The two most likely to beat him are 7-5½ jumpers Nat Page of Missouri, the defending champion, and James Frazier of Arizona. A couple of 7-5 jumpers, Gail Olson of Illinois and Mike Winsor of Central Michigan, have had injury problems. Placers last year besides Page, Frazier and Olson were Jeff Woodard of Alabama, indoor champ Jim Pringle of Florida and Mike Lattany of Michigan.

LONG JUMP—Brazilian Oliveira and Houston frosh Lewis are the ones to watch. Oliveira has gone 27-5¹/₄, Lewis 26-8. Another good one is LSU's McCain.

POLE VAULT—Six of the top seven return, including defending champion Paul Pilla (17-10½), who followed in the Arkansas State tradition begun by Earl Bell. Also back is runner-up Hall, third-place Warner, 1978 runner-up Hintnaus and two-time Junior champion Jeff Buckingham of Kansas (17-9). Others are Cal PolySLO's Tim McDonald, USC's Mulligan, UCLA's Curran and San Diego State's Bill Halverson.

SHOT PUT—This is almost certain to be the only event in which a teen-age freshman is favored—Michael Carter of Southern Methodist. His world junior record of 67-9 and his amazing 81-3½ with the 12-pound shot make him far superior to all but Oregon's Stover (65-4). Other 1980 contenders are

Texas' Jakobsson and Robinson, Oregon's Goldsmith, UTEP's Scott and Iowa State's John Scheetz.

DISCUS—The only 200-footers are Texas A&M's Scott (205-11), Oregon State's Tim Fox (202-3) and Jakobsson (201-5). Fox was third in the NCAA last year, but neither of the other two placed. Those near 200 feet include Penn State's Gary Williky, Kentucky's Pat McCulla, Florida's Dock Luckie and SMU's Rob Gray.

JAVELIN THROW—Norwegian Lorentzen of Oregon, despite his failure to place last year, is the class of the field. The second- and third-place finishers are also back—Mike Juskus of Division III Glassboro State (260-2) and Jari Keihas of Brigham Young (257-0). Army's Steve Kreider threw 264-1 and Texas' Pajtas 259-11.

TRIPLE JUMP—Indoor champ Robert Cannon of Indiana (54-84) would be the favorite without the presence of Oliveira. Others include UTEP's Connor, Dave Mobley of Western Kentucky, UCLA's Benson and two-time Junior champion Sanya Owolabi of Kansas.

HAMMER THROW—For the first time in five years, this event will not be won by Scott Neilson, who graduated. The Canadian representing Washington made NCAA history with his four successive victories. Most likely to succeed him is UTEP's Olsen. UTEP and Washington State will duel in this one. UTEP also has Sjoholm, and Washington State has Buxton and Jesernig. Eastern prestige will be upheld by Brown's Tim Bruno, Harvard's Tom Lenz and Dartmouth's Sean O'Keefe.

DECATHLON—Two-time NCAA champion and Pan Am silver medalist Tito Steiner of Brigham Young, the collegiate record holder with 8,125 points, has no peer among collegians. Weber State's Jeff Swanger, California's Dave Steen, St. John's Joe Schneider and Brigham Young's Esa Jokinen were third, fifth, sixth and seventh, respectively, last year.

Teen-agers expected to leave mark

World-class track and field athletes enroll at NCAA institutions every year—except usually they're in their mid-20s and come from a country such as Kenya, Tanzania, Nigeria, Jamaica, Canada, England, Finland or Sweden.

In 1980, however, at least three American teen-agers will enter NCAA track and field competition after having already established themselves as world-class athletes. They are shot putter Michael Carter of Southern Methodist, quarter miler Bill Green of Southern California and long jumper Carl Lewis of Houston.

Carter, from Thomas Jefferson High in Dallas, raised the national high school record in the shot put by nine feet, to an unheard-of 81-3½. He set a world junior record of 67-9 with the 16-pound shot and must be considered a strong medal candidate in the Moscow Olympics—if football doesn't interfere.

The 6-1, 250-pound Carter is modest and reserved. He was recruited by SMU for football, his first love. Track, he has said, is "a good way to fill time between football seasons." Although he once considered concentrating on the shot in this Olympic year, he did report for football at SMU. Coach Ron Meyer calls him "the best freshman defensive lineman I've ever seen."

He will almost certainly be the best freshman shot putter anyone has ever seen. His quickness made him one of the world's best last year, despite the fact that he is considered "weak" (he bench presses 350 pounds; many world-class shot putters press 500).

Green has already won a gold medal in international competition, running the second leg for the winning U.S. 1,600-meter relay team at last summer's World Cup II in Montreal.

Green, from Palo Alto, California, was the state 100-yard dash champion but was disqualified in his specialty, the 440. That disqualification didn't deter him, though, as he went on to finish third in the AAU 400 meters with a prep record of 45.51. He followed that with a series of fast times in Europe,

DISTRICT 1 (EAST)

BOSTON COLLEGE: Eagles' depth will be greatly improved with addition of 20 freshmen. Have high hopes for great indoor performance with abundance of middle distance runners (Mike Mullen, best time of 1:52.9 in 800, and Tom Horton, 2:10.0 in 1,000, 1:51.0 in 800, 3:51.0 in 1,500) and outstanding high jumpers Ignatius MacLellan (6-10), Rob Lanney (6-10). Will be competing in new Big East Conference. 1979 finish: Fourth in Greater Boston championships. Coach: Jack McDonald.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY: Terriers expect to defend three local championships, move

from sixth to third in outdoor IC4As. Won Yankee, New England, Greater Boston championships in '79 and return 26 from that team, including Bob Danville (46.32 in 400, 50.44 in 400-meter hurdles), John Wilson (3:45.1 in 1,500), Jeru Adu (52-3½ in triple jump). Coach: David Hemery.

BROWN: Bruins' success will depend on very talented newcomers. Strength is in weight events with hammer thrower Tim Bruno (NCAA qualifier with 208, outdoor Heptagonal champ), shot putter John Sinnott (54-4½). Mile, two-mile relays should be strong with Maurice Chapman (47.4) and Hal Solomon (47.8). 1979 finish: Seventh in outdoor Heptagonals, eighth in

including one victory over Pan American Games champion Tony Darden, and the World Cup gold medal.

Lewis, of Willingboro, New Jersey, set a prep long jump record of 26-6 before finishing second to World Cup champion Larry Myricks at the AAU meet. Lewis, too, followed that up with more, winning bronze medals in the Pan Am Games at San Juan and the Spartakiade at Moscow. At San Juan, he increased his prep record of 26-8.

Carter, Green and Lewis have demonstrated the consistency of excellence that sets them apart from their fellow freshmen, but at least five other American teens could have an immediate impact:

Lee Balkin, UCLA (Glendale, California). He high jumped 7-3¹/₄ to become the No. 2 prep athlete of all time. He also jumped 7-3 to beat the prep record holder, Gail Olson of Illinois, in the AAU Junior meet.

Vince Draddy, Virginia (New Rochelle, New York). He ran the mile in

4:05.4 and the 1,500 meters in 3:44.6, making him the No. 3 prep athlete behind Jim Ryun and Matt Centrowitz. He also won a dual meet against the Russian Juniors.

Jeff Nelson, Oregon (Burbank, California). He broke Craig Virgin's prep two-mile record with a time of 8:36.3 and finished fourth in the World Junior cross country meet. It was a successful comeback from a junior season plagued by a sore back, aching knee, bronchitis and stress fracture.

Jeff West, UCLA (Los Angeles). After losing to Los Angeles city rival David Mack in the California state meet, he broke the prep 800-meter record with a time of 1:48.2 and later equaled his own record.

Rodney Wilson, Villanova (Philadelphia). He defeated all the college freshmen to win the Junior title in the 110-meter hurdles, and his time of 13.94 over the 42-inch barriers came within .05 of Renaldo Nehemiah's prep record.

indoor. Coach: Doug Terry.

CONNECTICUT: Could be best team Huskies have ever fielded, with great depth and balance throughout. Dave Kent (53.6 in 440 hurdles), Ray James (6.2 in 60) may qualify for nationals; other key is Charles Thompson (48.0 in 400). Will compete in new Big East Conference. 1979 finish: Second in Yankee Conference, fourth in New England championships. Coach: William Kelleher.

DARTMOUTH: Jumping events appear to be strongest for Big Green; depth is needed, especially in sprints, high jump, pole vault. Thirty-one lettermen return, including Sean O'Keefe (205-3 in hammer), distance man Art Switchenko (second in Heptagonals). 1979 finish: Sixth in indoor and outdoor Heptagonals; seventh in IC4A outdoor, fifth in indoor. Coach: Carl Wallin.

HARVARD: Look for distance men John Murphy (3:50.5 in 1,500) and Thad McNulty (3:48.1 in 1,500) to be among Crimson's best hopes for '80 season. Hammer thrower Tom Lenz returns with 280-2 throw, and distance man Reid Eichner is back after a year off. 1979 finish: Third in

Greater Boston championships; fifth in indoor and outdoor Heptagonals. Coach: Bill McCurdy.

HOLY CROSS: NCAA indoor qualifier Paul Corcoran (2:10.3 in the 1,000) returns, may go to the mile this year. Crusaders lack depth and an outstanding front runner in cross country. In outdoor championships, Corcoran and hammer thrower George Durgin (175-0) should lead squad. 1979 finish: 11th in New England championships, Coach: James Kavanagh.

MAINE: Good recruits should help overcome big graduation losses. Black Bears will be strong in sprints, weights, high jump. Bill Pike returns in two-mile after running 10,000 in 30:04.0. 1979 finish: Fifth in Yankee. Coach: Edmund Styrna.

MASSACHUSETTS: Minutemen ran twomile relay in 7:35.8, distance medley relay in 9:53.0 in '79. Twenty-two lettermen return, including high jumper Don Dowden (6-10), Bill Devarney (10.7 in 100), John Kelley (1:50.8 in 800). 1979 finish: Third in Yankee. Coach: Ken O'Brien.

NEW HAMPSHIRE: Wildcats should be

considerably deeper, better overall. Weight man Alex Miller (189 in hammer), distance man Guy Stearns (4:00.0 in 1,500) lead 17 returning lettermen and good group of incoming freshmen. 1979 finish: Fifth in Yankee. Coach: John Copeland.

NORTHEASTERN: Huskies will depend heavily on freshmen in hurdles, where graduation hurt, and on recovery of Steve Schultz, Mike Ferarri. Tom Mortimer returns as New England's top miler (4:04.8). Ron Melkonian returns as New England record holder with 182-9 discus throw. 1979 finish: First in Greater Boston, New England indoor championships, second in both outdoors; fourth in IC4A indoor, eighth in outdoor. Coach: Irwin Cohen.

RHODE ISLAND: Rams should have finest one-two punch in pole vault in New England history with Bill Hartley (16-9, best outdoor mark ever in New England) and Mark Strawderman (16-8%, '79 Yankee Conference outdoor champ). Should be strong in field events with Kent Bolster's 158-11 discus throw (all-time Rhode Island record) and in some middle distances. Record-setting 1,600 relay team (3:15.9) returns intact; returnee Daryl Roberts holds school record in 400 with 49.3. 1979 finish: Fourth in Yankee. Coach: Bill Falk.

VERMONT: Catamounts face a general lack of depth with a few strong individuals. Thirteen lettermen return, including decathlete Charles Claudio (fourth in New England championships with 6,388) and Joseph McClallen (fifth in New England with 10.7 in 100). 1979 finish: First in Vermont championships, sixth in Yankee. Coach: Ed Kusiak.

YALE: Depth remains a problem; but Elis boast several top performers, including sprinter Ken Hill (6:43 in 55), steeplechase ace Martin Osborne, shot putter Tim Spears (53-6½). Total of 18 lettermen return. 1979 finish: 10th in outdoor Heptagonals, ninth in indoor. Coach: Lee Calhoun.

DISTRICT 2 (EAST)

ARMY: Starting first season as head coach, Ron Basil inherits sturrdy outdoor program with return of 28 lettermen. Strength will be in middle distance events with Gary Hopper (best time of 1:51 in 800); sprints are weak area. Steve Kreider returns after tossing javelin 264-2 to win title at Penn Relays, set new school record. Jim Arriola returns in

1,500 with time of 3:48.30. 1979 finish: Third in outdoor, indoor Heptagonals.

Coach: Bobby Lang.

FLORIDA: Continued strength in field events, improvement in running events should take Gators far. High jumper Jim Pringle returns after placing fourth in NCAA meet with 7-21/4 jump; Dock Luckie holds school record in shot (61-5) and discus (197-4). Key sprinter is Floyd Brown (school record holder in 400 with 46.20; runs 200 in 21.2). 1979 finish: Fifth in SEC outdoor and indoor. Coach: John Randolph.

FLORIDA STATE: Seminoles look for top 10-finish in NCAA meet this year. Key returnees are Walter McCoy (45.53 in 400), Mike Roberson (10.0 in 100), Palmer Simmons (46.30 in 400), Ron Nelson (46.16 in 400), Ken Lanier (60-2 in shot put). 1979 finish: First in Metropolitan. Coach: Dick Roberts.

FURMAN: Paladins will have great experience; with return of healthy Brothel Cole (6.2 in 60), could be conference spoiler. Should be able to score more in middle distances, field events. High jump will be strong with return of blind high jumper Jon Orcutt (6-8¾, new school record). 1979 finish: Sixth in Southern indoor, seventh in outdoor. Coach: Stan Narewski.

Tar Heels boast wealth of talent in each event; should make strong bid for high honors at ACC indoor and outdoor. 1979 finish: Second in ACC indoor, fifth in outdoor. Coach: Joe Hilton.

NORTH CAROLINA STATE: Good recruiting year filled gaps in pole vault, high jump, middle distances; but several holes remain. Wolfpack qualified six for '79 NCAA meet, should do even better in '80. Key returnees are Ron Foreman (51.15 in 400 hurdles), Joe Hannah (59-6 in shot), Ed McIntyre (10.6 in 100, 21.10 in 200). 1979 finish: Third in ACC indoor, fourth in outdoor. Coach: Tom Jones.

OLD DOMINION: This will be planning year for Monarchs' new track program under leadership of Ken Gibson, formerly of Kentucky State. Gibson will supervise renovation of Foreman Field, recruit for 1981 and have limited competition with the athletes on campus in '80.

RICHMOND: Spiders' major improvements are in two-mile and 3200-meter relay teams. Ten lettermen return, including Hillary Tuwei (second in NCAA indoor three-mile with 13:27.2, third in steeplechase), Julian Spooner (1:47.6 in 800), Jesse Williams (10.6 in 100), Barnabas Kipkorir (1:49.9 in 800). Coach: Fred Hardy.

SOUTH CAROLINA: Gamecocks return all but four who made big contributions in '79; senior sprinter George Thomas (10.2 in 100) is one of only four seniors on squad dominated by juniors, sophomores. Rolando Adams leads long jumpers (25-8), Tony Rambo the 400 hurdles (50.7). Coach: Charlie Strong.

SOUTH CAROLINA STATE: Bulldogs return strong group from squad that captured fifth straight South Carolina State Invitational, third straight Mid-Eastern Conference championships. Top recruits are quarter miler Ronnie White, 7-0 high jumper Raynell Chambers, sprinter Steve Martin. Fourteen lettermen return, including Alphonso Golden (1:48.0 in 880), Rocky Cunningham (20.7 in 200). Coach: Robert

Johnson.

TENNESSEE: Vols' top performer Sam James (school record holder in 1500 with 3:42.65) is back; Keith Young bolsters middle distance corps with 1:49.54 in 800. Jason Grimes has promise in long jump (15-41/2) as well as sprints; Anthony Blair runs a 46.12 400. 1979 finish: Second in SEC outdoor and indoor. Coach: Stan Huntsman

TENNESSEE TECH: Golden Eagles return two who placed in OVC meet-Mike Davidson in 200, 400 (22.3, 48.6) and Larry Curran (6-101/2 in high jump). 1979 finish: Seventh in OVC outdoor and indoor. Coach: Mike Ledford

TULANE: Green wave looks forward to very competitive season with return of Chauncey Brinn (1:49.0 in 800), Danny Mikulak (52.0 in 400 hurdles), Terry Daffin (236-8 in javelin). Another bright spot is Nathaniel Dorsey, who placed sixth in the Metro Conference as a freshman with 50-6 shot put. Good freshmen will help team be much more competitive this year. 1979 finish: Sixth in Metropolitan. Coach: Leonard Culicchia.

VIRGINIA: Cavaliers expect to challenge Maryland for ACC outdoor crown with their strongest team ever. As many as 10 could qualify for NCAA meet, including Greg Canty (second in NCAA indoor 1,000), Karl Williams (sixth in NCAA outdoor 400 hurdles), Phil Vincenzes (183-4 in discus), Kevin Williams (13.9 in 110 hurdles). 1979 finish: Second in ACC outdoor, fifth in indoor. Coach: Dennis Craddock.

VIRGINIA MILITARY: Bulk of Keydet team returns and is experienced; has won Southern Conference indoor and outdoor for past two years. Should remain class of Virginia and Southern Conference with David Washington (10.4 in 100), Dennis Watts (46.8 in 400) returning. Coach: Wade Williams.

VIRGINIA TECH: Gobblers are very optimistic about coming season because of 12 returning lettermen, including school record holders Ray Ackenbom in 800 with 1:49.06, Mike Burns in 1,500 with 3:45.6, Bob Phillips in pole vault with 16-0 and Paul Sulik in hammer throw with 185, 1979 finish: Third in Metropolitan. Coach: Russ Whitenack.

WESTERN CAROLINA: Catamounts had finest recruiting year ever in an attempt to rebuild sagging fourtunes; are expected to dominate Southern Conference in long and triple jumps and javelin. Top recruit is Anthony James, nation's fifth-best prep long jumper (25-0) in '79. Twelve lettermen return, including Eddie McGill (23-7 in long jump) and Brad Cox (10.8 in 100). 1979 finish: Sixth in Southern outdoor, seventh in indoor. Coach: Paul Jones.

1980 NCAA TRACK AND FIELD

WESTERN KENTUCKY: Hilltoppers return six who qualified for '79 NCAA championships-Larry Cuzzort (5,000), Jim Groves (10,000), Forrest Killebrew (long jump), Dave Mobley (triple jump), Dave Murphy (10,000), Marion Wingo (100, 200, 440 relay). Considerable talent, depth, experience and rich tradition should provide another outstanding season, 1979 finish: First in OVC outdoor, second in indoor, Coach: Del Hessel.

WILLIAM & MARY: Continued strength in the distance events will help Indians, but lack of overall depth with weaknesses in the field events will be a problem. Seventeen lettermen return, including John Hopke in the 800, Jim Shields in the steeplechase (8:44.6) and high jumper Mark Anderson (6-6). Coach: Roy Chernock.

DISTRICT 4 (MIDWEST)

BALL STATE: Assistant Steve Cooksey takes over helm of team that suffered rash of injuries en route to last-place finish in Mid-American Conference in '79. Four second-place finishers from the conference meet return, including Kelley Marsh in the 800 (best time of 1:49.6), Kevin Brown in the 110 hurdles (14.37), Pat Bush in the intermediate hurdles (51.59), Eric McCarrol in the long jump (23-11%).

BOWLING GREEN: Falcons should be stronger with return of solid upperclassmen, fine freshmen. Steve Housley (3:42.5 in 1,500), Pete Murtaugh (10,000) will be two of top distance runners in the MAC; Housley won MAC 1,500 in '79 and is team's high-point man. 1979 finish: Sixth in MAC, Coach: Mel Brodt.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN: Lack of depth in distance, middle distance events will hurt Chippewas; but they have good quality in field events with '76 NCAA high jump runner-up Mike Winsor (7-5), '79 MAC pole vault champ Kurt Geerlings (16-4), '79 MAC discus champ Dave Kielty (164). Mike Ball returns after placing in MAC 400 and 1600 relays, 100- and 200-meter dashes and long jump. 1979 finish: Third in MAC. Coach: Don Sazima.

CINCINNATI: Bearcats will be somewhat

aprint-oriented; weakness will be in field events and weight events. Should have three NCAA qualifiers-Wayne Mason in the 110 hurdles (13.7), Bernie Weber in the steeplechase (8:51.0), Jeff Walker in the 440 (46.4)—and a strong relay team. 1979 finish: Fourth in Metropolitan. Coach: Lansing Holman.

CLEVELAND STATE: With four sub-4:08.0 milers, Vikings should have another great four-mile relay team and one of better distance squads in the country with Don James, Matt Dillon, Ike Hull. Mike Tretiakow will add strength in three events-110 hurdles (14.2), long jump (24-31/4), high jump (6-8). Coach: Dave Burger.

EASTERN MICHIGAN: Hurons return 32 lettermen, including sprinter Russell Bailey (10.5 in 100) and high jumper Tim Doyen (7-0), both of whom missed '79 outdoor season. Must find replacements in the hurdles and on relay teams. Depth will be the key to MAC chances. 1979 finish: Fourth in MAC. Coach: Bob Parks.

EVANSVILLE: Expansion of cross country program will strengthen distances, where Purple Aces have been weak. Filling holes in field events will produce more points, should give more dual-meet wins. Top returnees are Marvin Boswell (143-1½ in discus), Keith Kinnaird (14.7 in 110 hurdles), Davies Bellamy (mile relay team), Ken Riordan (6-6 in high jump), Eric Tisdale (22-8¾ in long jump). 1979 finish: Third in Indiana Collegiate Conference. Coach: Greg Carlson.

ILLINOIS STATE: Redbirds recruited five who were Illinois prep champs, so future is promising. Four school record setters return—Dave Irion (14:01.6 in 5,000), Rusty Bilbruch (166-10 in hammer, 159-10 in discus), Mike Matteson (30:00.7 in 10,000), Vince Davis (7-1 in high jump). 1979 finish: Fifth in Big Ten outdoor, sixth in indoor. Coach: John Coughlan.

INDIANA: Hoosiers should be even tougher than in '79, when they won both indoor and outdoor Big Ten meets. NCAA indoor triple jump champion Robert Cannon (54-81/4) returns and will be joined by NCAA fourthplace pole vaulter Brian Kimball (17-0), plus school record holders Bob Berry (7-3 in high jump) and pole vaulter Lance Fox (17-1). Coach: Sam Bell.

IOWA: Hawkeyes should be very strong in hurdles, middle distances but need work in triple jump. Randy Elliott leads hurdlers, Ed DeLashmutt the middle distances. Veteran Charlie Joes is potential Big Ten champion in the long jump, although he was hampered by injuries much of last season. 1979 finish: Eighth in Big Ten outdoor, ninth in indoor. Coach: F. X. Cretzmeyer.

KENT STATE: Golden Flashes expect to have strong squad and to finish higher than '79's eighth in MAC. Conference shot put champ Gene Divney (59-6) returns, along with distance man Tim Griffith (fourth in conference in 1,500 with 3:50.7), hurdler Bill Dobbertin (fourth in conference in both high and intermediate hurdles). Coach: Orin Richburg.

MARQUETTE: Only two seniors are gone from team that broke 12 school records last year. Team leadership will come from John Rydeski (holds school records of 35.08 in 300, 47.95 in 400, two relays) and Jeff Grant (holds five school records; runs 800 in 1:52.3, 880 in 1:57.8). Coach Jim Allen thinks rebuilding year is over, expects vast improvements.

MIAMI (OHIO): Twenty-four lettermen and two defending champions return from '79 team that captured MAC title. Depth was key to Redskins' winning the championships. Fourteen place winners return in '80, including MAC javelin champ Richard Elkins (228-4), MAC high jump champ Jamie Wight (7-0) and Darrell Sargent (47.19 in 400), who gained all-America status by finishing fourth in 600 meters at NCAA indoor. Coach: Chuck Zody.

MINNESOTA: Strength will once again be in distances races, but lack of sprint power (except for Ike Okolue, 47.4 in the 400) will probably keep Gophers out of Big Ten first division again. Also lack experience in weight and field events. Top returnees are Gerald Metzler (3:43.1 in 1,500), Gordon Weaver (8:45.7 in steeplechase), Joe Nabbefeld (29:49.4 in 10,000). 1979 finish: Eighth in Big Ten indoor, ninth in outdoor. Coach: Roy Griak.

NORTHWESTERN: Wildcats will be strong in middle sprints and distance events but need help in field events, with exception of Steve Simington in triple jump (50-7). Six lettermen return, including Andy Oakley (30:43.8 in 10,000), Jeff Patnaude (10.8 in 100). 1979 finish: 10th in Big Ten outdoor and indoor. Coach: Don Amidei.

NOTRE DAME: Irish lost six quality performers to graduation but should be strong again in middle distance events. Jay Miranda, Chuck Aragon, Pete Burger are all top-notch milers and should ensure strong two-mile relay team; placed fifth in NCAA indoor two-mile relay in '79. Depth is biggest problem, especially in sprints and field events. Coach: Joe Piane.

OHIO: Bobcats had good recruiting year and should be a threat to win MAC championship if freshmen come around. Ten lettermen return, including triple jumper Jerry Hatfield (52-10), Jessie Young (46.4 in

400), 1979 finish: Fifth in MAC. Coach: Larry Clinton.

OHIO STATE: Buckeyes should be serious contender for Big Ten championships, both indoor and outdoor. Will be led by senior all Americas Dan Oliver (holds Big Ten record of 13.5 in 110 hurdles, second in NCAAs) and Steve Crane (3:45.0 in 1,500). Sophomores Kevin Akins and Scott Rider provide extra punch in shot (58-11) and milddle distance, respectively. 1979 finish: Becond in Big Ten indoor, fourth in outdoor, Coach: Frank Zubovich.

PUNDUE: Loss of five consistent performers will be offset by host of returnees, including ace hurdler Ken Cammack, who holds Boilermaker indoor record of 13.8 for 10 meter hurdles. Anchor in weight events will be Jerry Rhodes (172-4½ in discus, 57-5 in shot). Middle distance competitor Ken Sumbry will set the pace in those events with 1:52.27 in 880; he owns or holds six Purdue records. Coach: Dave Hankin. 1979 finish: Seventh in Big Ten Indoor and outdoor.

VALPARAISO: Returning several top performers from '79, Crusaders hope to improve on fifth-place Indiana Collegiate Conference finish. Will be led by high lumpers Brent Bultemeier (school record holder with 6-10¾), Mark Fisher. Nine lettermen return, including Don Currie in the 440 (50.5), Dave Halter in the 880 (1:58.82). Coach: Paul Smith.

western MiCHIGAN: Broncos had young team in '79, were second in MAC and fourth in Central Collegiates. Jack McIntosh returns after placing second in NCAA 800 with 1:46.79. Other keys are Ron Parisi, who was sixth in NCAA javelin in '78 but was injured in '79, and Mike Bishop, Central Collegiate decathlon champ. Coach: Jack lihaw.

WISCONSIN: Badgers hope for improvement and better balance. Have excellent distance depth with Randy Jackson (sixth in NCAA outdoor steeplechase with 8:30.7), Jim Stintzi (second in NCAA indoor two-mile with 8:39.23). Team returns 33 of 50 Big Ten indoor points, 59 of 101 outdoor points. 1979 finish: Third in Big Ten outdoor, fifth in indoor. Coach: Dan McClimon.

wisconsin-milwaukee: Panthers need help in sprints and field events; but distance events are secure with Dan Goldberg, Chris Deakin, Rick Kiedrowski. Depth will be biggest problem, but Dave Pook and George Bezold will anchor middle distances. New head coach F. P. Markel begins first year with Panthers.

DISTRICT 5 (MISSOURI VALLEY)

BRADLEY: Braves return several taiented underclassmen, could surprise in '80. Also returning is former Missouri Valley Conference high jump champ Steve Hadfield (best jump of 6-10). Have much potential in athletes such as Ricky Walz (156-11 in hammer throw), Pat Lawrence (10.8 in 100). 1979 finish: Seventh in MVC outdoor, fifth in indoor. Coach: Jake Schoof.

COLORADO: Buffaloes expect to field another strong team in distance events, led by Mark Spilsbury (13:48.04 in 5,000; has won six Big Eight Conference titles in three seasons) and Terry Johnson (Big Eight steeplechase champ with 8:52.89). Big Eight 400 champ Dean Greenaway (46.04) also returns. Need depth in sprints, field events; are competitive in pole vault with 16-6 vaulters Brian Morrisette, Dennis Fuller. 1979 finish: Fifth in Big Eight outdoor, sixth in indoor. Coach: Dean Brittenham.

DRAKE: Bulldogs recorded best finishes in couple of years in MVC indoor and outdoor meets. Will concentrate on middle distance runners to be competitive on Midwest relays circuit. Chris Mares, Mike Fitzpatrick, Dan Schaller, Bruce Keene, Mike Jorgensen are proficient from 400 through 1,500 meters. High jumper David Sykes (6-10), hurdler Rick Falbo (53.5) also return. 1979 finish: Fourth in MVC outdoor, third in indoor. Coach: Bob Ehrhart.

IOWA STATE: Middle distances, throwing events have been Cyclone strong points for several years; '80 will be no exception, with return of John Scheetz, school record holder in shot put with 61-4¾; Dave Korir (1:47.34 in 800); Zak Korir (1:48.58 in 800); Kevin Kuchel (46.37 in 400). Most improved area will be relays, long sprints; 3200 relay team holds school record with 7:19.8, second-best time in nation. 1979 finish: Seventh in Big Eight outdoor, fifth in indoor. Coach: Bill Bergan.

KANSAS: Jayhawk strengths will be in sprints with Deon Hogan (10.3 in 100, 20.68 in 200) and Lester Mickens (46.14 in 400; holds school record in 600 indoor with 1:09.14) and in jumping events with pole vaulter Jeff Buckingham (17-9), high jumper Steve Rainbolt (7-2), Jay Reardon (7-1 in high jump, 24-10½ in long jump),

Sanya Owolabi (53-6¼ in triple jump). Only major weaknesses are in hurdles, distance events. 1979 finish: First in Big Eight outdoor, second in indoor. Coach: Bob Timmons.

KANSAS STATE: With balance everywhere except possibly in 100 and 200, Wildcats appear to be ready to make move at Big Eight title. School record holder Kevin Sloan (25-6¾ in long jump) returns, as do Vince Parrette (53-1 in triple jump), Tim Davis (3:45.1 in 1,500), Joe Bramlage (251-3 in javelin) and Bill Tanner and Ray Hanf in 400 (46.6 and 46.63, respectively). Latter two missed most of '79 campaign. 1979 finish: Third in Big Eight outdoor, fourth in indoor. Coach: Mike Ross.

MISSOURI: Defending NCAA outdoor champ Nat Page returns in high jump with 7-4½ mark; also runs 110 hurdles in 14.09. Other returning NCAA finishers include Dan Lavitt (fourth in in indoor 60-yard hurdles with 7-29), Page in indoor high jump (fourth with 7-0), Scott Clark (sixth in 800 indoor), Godwin Obasogie (sixth in indoor 60-yard hurdles). Sprint medley relay team holds world record of 3:13.70. 1979 finish: First in Big Eight indoor, second in outdoor. Coach: Bob Teel.

NEBRASKA: With outstanding recruiting year, Cornhuskers could be conference contender. Will be led by return of middle distance star Scott Poehling, holder of seven school records (1:46.92 in 800); pole vaulter Randy Raymond (17-0½); javelin thrower Ken Drwal (240-6); discus thrower Lee Kunz (192-8). Coach Frank Sevigne could face best Nebraska year in long while. 1979 finish: Third in Big Eight indoor, fourth in outdoor.

NEW MEXICO STATE: Aggies hope to increase chances in MVC as a team after concentrating on depth last summer. Seven lettermen return, including Arturo Acevedo (14:40.00 in 5,000), Jerry Lester (236-0 in javelin), Paul Waldie (30:45.00 in 10,000). Key losses were school record holders Roy Nalty in high jump, Dennis Diaz in shot put, discus. 1979 finish: Fifth in MVC outdoor, sixth in indoor. Coach: Art Morgan.

OKLAHOMA: Loss of several Big Eight titlists will hurt Sooners, but experience returns in Jody Jimerson (school record holder in 400 with 46.57), Dyrk Dahl and Larry Sims in middle distances, Greg Seay (school record holder in high jump with 7-1½). With help of some outstanding

freshmen, Sooners expect to be better overall this year. 1979 finish: Sixth in Big Eight outdoor, seventh in indoor. Coach: J. D. Martin.

SOUTHERN ILLINOIS-CARBONDALE: Salukis lost seven of top eight scorers from 79 season; rebuilding year is in store. Hurdler David Lee improved quickly as a sophomore and could be one of best collegians in '80 (13.8). West Texas State could end Salukis' MVC stranglehold. 1979 finish: First in MVC outdoor. Coach: Lew Hartzog.

WEST TEXAS STATE: Strength on the track will help make up for only adequate field events. Buffaloes should have two strong relay teams and contenders in several events, including MVC champs Mark Owinyo (51.7 in 400 hurdles), John Thomas (20.9 in 200), Mike Brown (47.4 in 400). Both relay teams took first in MVC meet. 1979 finish: Second in MVC outdoor, first in indoor. Coach: Bob Kitchens.

WICHITA STATE: Shockers may be loaded in several areas, especially in field events. High jumper Rich Dreiling returns after redshirt year; has jumped 6-11 and holds Shocker indoor record of 6-10. Also returning is MVC and TFA/USA javelin champ Steve Geubelle (247-8). Top newcomers are sprinter Eugene Baker, one of top prep sprinters in nation, and George Collier, one of top 10 5,000 men in high school. 1979 finish: Second in MVC indoor, third in outdoor. Coach: Herm Wilson.

DISTRICT 6 (SOUTHWEST)

ARKANSAS: Added depth (20 freshmen) will make Razorbacks stronger than in past. Mark Muggleton leads in distance with best times of 8:30.80 in two-mile, 3:57 in mile, 3:40.8 in 1,500; holds school record for indoor two-mile. Tony Kastl holds school record in high jump with 6-11½ outdoor, 7-2 indoor; Pat Mitchell returns with 440 school record of 48.10. Razorbacks broke seven school field event records, and all record-holders but one are back. 1979 finish: First in Southwest Conference indoor, sixth in outdoor. Coach: John McDonnell.

ARKANSAS STATE: Coach Guy Kochel's Indians have been listed in top 20 for past five years and should be there again in '80. Headliner among returnees is NCAA pole vault champ Paul Pilla (17-10½), along with a trio of 7-foot high jumpers—Rickey DeWees (two-time Southland Conference champ), Bryan Cook, Greg Schaper—and 17-0 pole vaulter J. W. Korell. Except for

half miler Ronnie Green (Southland champ with 1:50.9) and hurdlers Rickey Maclin (14.0), Ben Frazier (14.2) and Barry Brown (52.8), all running events will have new faces. 1979 finish: Second in Southland.

BAYLOR: Bears expect to improve on fifthplace finish in SWC outdoor. Recruiting centered on hurdlers and distance men to complement Todd Harbour (1:48.3 in 800; second in NCAA 1,500 with 3:39.27). Other possible NCAA qualifiers include Mike Fisher in the 200 and 400 (21.31 and 47.0), K. C. Jones (25-3¼ in long jump), high jumper Charles Pennington (7-0). 1979 finish: Fifth in SWC outdoor, fourth in indoor. Coach: Clyde Hart.

HOUSTON: Cougars expect to field a very improved team, although last year's squad placed two in NCAA championship events and broke several school records. Key returnees are Rich Edwards (fourth in NCAA 100 and 200; holds school records of 10.18 and 20.57), Charles Whigham (49.8 in 400 hurdles). Recruited 26-6½ long jumper Carl Lewis as well. Both 400 and 800 relay teams broke school records with 39.72 and 1:23.1. 1979 finish: Second in SWC indoor, third in outdoor. Coach: Tom Tellez.

HOUSTON BAPTIST: Rebuilding from the ground up, Huskies will comprise one sophomore and 10 freshmen. Should be strong in sprints with Harold Brown (9.7 in 100, 21.6 in 200), in the hurdles with Julius Brosco (14.4 in 110, 39.0 in 400) and James Sacco (14.5, 38.5). Larry Taylor (6-11 in high jump), Kyle Visser (6-8 in high jump, 22-4 in long jump) form top field group. In spite of having no returnees, coach Johnny Morriss thinks he may have strongest team in school history.

LAMAR: All but two lettermen return from team that romped to easy Southland Conference crown last year. Cardinals will be exceptionally strong in sprints with Doug Hinds (46.8 in 400), in hurdles and in relays. Double winner Michael Coleman won conference triple jump (51-0½) and long jump (24-4½) last year and will return. Coach: Sonny Jolly.

McNEESE STATE: Led by David Kohrs, Southland's outstanding track man a year ago, Cowboys should be in thick of conference race this year. Kohrs won league steeplechase (8:53.0) and 1,500 (3:49.2), placed second in 5,000 (14:31.21). Verril Young holds school record in 100 (10.35), 200 (21.39), long jump (25-3¾). Other standouts are triple jumper Edward Lloyd

(51-8½), high jumper Jody Royer (6-11). 1979 finish: Third in Southland. Coach: Bob Hayes.

NORTH TEXAS STATE: Mean Green expects to have some individuals at NCAA championships if good health holds. Four outstanding athletes return in James Barefield (177-3 in discus), Ben Moturi (3:46.0 in 1,500), Brian Rowley (1:50.8 in 800), high jumper Mike Ryan (7-0), all school record holders. Success also depends on return to health by sprinters and distance men. Coach: John McKenzie.

Another star is rapidly improving sprinter Hugh Stanford (10.45 in 100, 21.2 in 200). Jake Ford holds down jumps with 24-4 long jump and 48-41/4 triple jump. Coach: Bob Groseclose.

NORTHWESTERN LOUISIANA STATE: Return of 16 of last year's 18 leading scorers gives Demons something to look forward to; at least three members will be contending for spots in NCAA championships. Intermediate hurdler Vince Williams broke school record with 52.38; Jarrott Handy and Victor Oatis both went over 50 feet in triple jump and over 24-8 in long jump. Coach: Jerry Dyes.

PAN AMERICAN: Outlook is excellent in middle distances and distances, events in which Broncs compete chiefly (don't enter any field events due to limited scholarships). Two school record holders return—Jan Nilsson in the 1,500 with 3:49.07 and Gert Moller with 1:49.67 in the 800 and 51.96 in the 400 hurdles. Both the 3200-meter and distance medley team set school records last year of 7:26.99 and 9:49.56, respectively. Coach: Jimmy Skaines.

RICE: Owls return SWC 800 champ Bruce Gingrich (1:47.6) as well as premier distance men Michael Novelli (13:36.9 in 5,000) and Marty Froelick, both of whom missed conference meet with injuries. Other strengths will be Darrell Mouton (20.69 in 200) and 400 hurdlers Jesse James (51.42) and Rickey Thomas (50.96). 1979 finish: Fourth in SWC outdoor, seventh in indoor. Coach: Steve Straub.

SOUTHERN-BATON ROUGE: Jaguars had excellent recruiting year; with 10 returning lettermen, expect bright season. Top returnees are high jumper Everett Champion (6-10), sprinters Stephen Cox (10.4 in 100, 21.9 in 200) and Adrian Stacia (10.4 in 100,

22.1 in 200). Greg Isaac runs the 400 in 47.0. 1979 finish: Fifth in Southwestern Conference. Coach: Claude Paxton.

SOUTHERN METHODIST: Eight lettermen return, including school record holders Rob Gray (196-0 in discus), Greg McAlister (7-1½ high jumper), Tom Marino (13:55.9 in 5,000). Michael Carter, who broke high school shot record with 81-3½, should challenge for NCAA title as a freshman; four other freshmen have sub-9.4 times in the 100, so that group should propel Mustangs toward the top under new coach Ted McLaughlin. 1979 finish: Seventh in SWC outdoor, six in indoor.

SOUTHWESTERN LOUISIANA: Last year's last-place finish in Southland was lowest ever for coach Bob Cole, but squad remains optimistic. Two school record holders return in sophomores Dana Cope (3:52.8 in 1,500) and Gervy Papion (9:09.8 in steeplechase). Sprinters Jason Charles (10.6 in 100) and Sid Banks (21.5 in 200) also return.

TEXAS: Longhorns return almost all who scored in SWC meet and helped win seventh SWC title in past eight years. Top returnee is Oskar Jakobsson, high-point man in SWC meet with 24 points (first in shot with 62-101/4, first in discus with 201-5

TEXAS A&M: Aggies return 18 lettermen from 11th-place NCAA team. Curits Dickey (10.11) will be prime 100 man, relay runner. Randy Hall returns after finishing second in NCAA pole vault with 17-4. Leslie Kerr finished second in NCAA 400 with 45.51 and is back, as is fourth-place 400 relay team (39.8). 1979 finish: Second in SWC outdoor, third in indoor. Coach: Charles Thomas.

TEXAS-ARLINGTON: Mavericks look for improvement with return of top four performers—Allen Lowes in javelin with 252-7, Gilbert Smith in long jump with 25-6½, Ken Justice in discus with 176-1 and Anthony Gouldsby in 400 with 47.3. Gilbert placed seventh in NCAA long jump, Lowes 14th in javelin. 1979 finish: Fourth in Southland. Coach: Harold Perkins.

TEXAS CHRISTIAN: Horned Frogs will be young with 18 sophomores, five upper-classmen; but most have experience. Long jumper Emanuel Opubor (23-10¾), high jumper Spencer Sunstrum (7-0) should be backbone of field squad. Sophomore David Walker (10.3 in 100, 20.7 in 200) should head the running events. School record of 3:08.1 was set by 1600-meter team; Stuart Spangenburg rturns with school record of 215-5 in javelin. 1979 finish: Eighth in SWC outdoor, indoor. Coach: Guy Thompson.

TEXAS TECH: Strong recruiting year column sould help Red Raiders climb out of SWC cellar. Top two returnees are James Mays (800 in 1:47.14), Dean Crowell (400 hurdles in 52.0), both school record holders. Greg Lautenslager (1,500 in 3:43.0) has had career of ups and downs and will be looking for consistency; both he and Mays qualified for NCAA meet but didn't place. 1979 finish: Ninth in SWC outdoor, eighth in indoor. Coach: Gerald Oglesby.

DISTRICT 7 (ROCKY MOUNTAINS)

AIR FORCE: Greater depth, improved relay teams should mark '80 Falcon team. Top athlete Bret Hyde returns as a junior; won TFA/USA steeplechase in 8:46.02. Thirty

lettermen return, including Don Walters (best time of 47.0 in 400), Gary Myers (1:50.8 in 800), Bobby Wright (10.5 in 100), high jumper Marc Duncan (6-10). Coach: Ernie Cunliffe.

BOISE STATE: Hurdles should be Broncos' strongest event with Gary Little (400 hurdles in 51.34; school and Big Sky Conference record holder) and Sean Cafferty (110 in 14.3). Broncs should be better balanced but not as powerful in sprints. Kenrick Camerud returns to run 400 (47.85). 1979 finish: Third in Big Sky outdoor, fifth in indoor. Coach: Ed Jacoby.

BRIGHAM YOUNG: NCAA decathlon champ Tito Steiner (7,918) will sit out '80 season to prepare for Olympics. Cougars should be stronger in high jump and will have standouts Chris Child in pole vault (16-8), Tapio Kuusela in hammer (206-3), Jari Keihas in javelin (257-0; third in NCAA meet). Will be in good shape in 5,000 with Doug Padilla (13:43.0). 1979 finish: Third in Western Athletic Conference outdoor, second in indoor. Coach: Clarence Robison.

COLORADO STATE: Distance runners again seem to be Ram strength, with Richie Harris in the 1,500 and Jon Sinclair in the 5,000, both of whom finished seventh in NCAA outdoor. Donnie Hill leads sprinters; Randy Rusing will head jumping corps. 1979 finish: Fifth in WAC indoor and outdoor. Coach: Jerry Quiller.

IDAHO: Vandals are favored to win Big Sky indoor and outdoor with three conference champs, 14 lettermen returning. High jumper Bob Peterson won Big Sky with 7-2 but has gone 7-3; Chuck Schmeoger returns in discus as defending conference champ with 169-9 but has thrown 174-5. Steve Saras returns in shot with conference title and 55-9% throw. John Trott runs the 800 in 1:48.71. 1979 finish: Second in Big Sky outdoor, fourth in indoor. Coach: Mike Keller.

IDAHO STATE: Sixth-place Big Sky finish was Bengals' worst in school history, so they expect to improve. Only one letterman is gone, and Bengals had outstanding recruiting year in distances and jumps. Two school record holders return—high jumper Rick Berrett (7-1½) and Felix Diaz in the 800 (1:50.96). 1979 finish: Sixth in Big Sky outdoor, third in indoor.

MONTANA: With return of several Big Sky placers, Grizzlies' outlook is better this year. Triple jumper Bill Johnson (49-2¾) has won the Big Sky the past two years;

NEW MEXICO: Half miler Sammy Kipkurgat returns after redshirt season; his 1:46.3 in 880 was sorely missed. Lobo strengths lie in middle and long distances with Kipsubi Koskie (3:43.9 in 1,500). Hurdler Fatwel Kimaiyo returns in 110 hurdles with 13.7. Severe lack of depth will hurt Lobo chances. 1979 finish: Fourth in WAC outdoor, third in indoor. Coach: Bill Silverberg.

NORTHERN ARIZONA: Big Sky champs return 115 of 139 points after dominating 79 season. Keys will be Art Menchaca in steeplechase (8:36.0 at NCAA meet), Rob Stanley in 5,000 (14:44), Mark Lomeland in 1,500 (3:49.0). Total of 20 lettermen return. 1979 finish: First in Big Sky outdoor, second in indoor. Coach: Leo Haberlack.

SAN DIEGO STATE: Aztec 400 and 1600 relay teams (39.74 and 3:07.24, respectively) return three men, led by David Russell and Ed Daniels. Bill Halverson in pole vault (17-3), Richard Slaney in discus (189), Frank Schiefer in high jump (7-2) will lead field team. Bill St. John returns with 8:45.7 time in steeplechase. Russell was seventh in NCAA 200 with 20.89; Daniels holds Aztec record for 400 with 45.68. Coach: Dick Hill. 1979 finish: Second in WAC.

TEXAS-EL PASO: Miners lose only two of nine who scored for NCAA championship team, so watch out. Returning NCAA stars include Jerome Deal (first in 100 with 10.19), Suleiman Nyambui (first in 10,000 with 28:01.30). Michael Musyoki (second in

10,000 with 28:03.25), Svein Walvik (second in discus with 207-0), Richard Olsen (second in hammer with 218-2), Thommie Sjoholm (third in hammer with 214-1), Hans Almstrom (second in shot with 64-10¾). Coach: Ralph Maughan.

WYOMING: As in past couple of seasons, Cowboys will be very strong in distance events with Joe Nzau (fifth in NCAA 10,000 with 28:20.62), Simon Kilili (10,000 in 28:59.1), James Kamau (10,000 in 30:04.24). Discus thrower Jared Finley will lead with 183-110. Sprints will be a major weakness. 1979 finish: Fourth in WAC indoor, sixth in outdoor. Coach: Ron Richardson.

DISTRICT 8 (PACIFIC COAST)

ARIZONA: Wildcats won't have dual-meet depth of past several years but will have several individual standouts. NCAA finishers Thom Hunt (fourth in steeplechase with 8:26.8) and James Frazier (second in high jump with 7-3½) return to keep team on national level. Returnee Dennis Johnson tied the school 800 record with 1:49.8. Weak spots will be hurdles, throwing events; middle distances, jumping events will be strong. 1979 finish: Fifth in Pacific-10 Conference. Coach: Willie Williams.

ARIZONA STATE: Sun Devils will be looking to return to national limelight after disappointing showings in '78 and '79 NCAA meets. With Dwayne Evans in the 100 and 200 (best times of 10.23, 20.22) and Tony Darden in the 200 and 400 (20.48, 45.14), team should be very competitive in

Outstanding newcomers Greg Marjama (14.1 in 110 hurdles), high jumper Phil Chapman (7-0) join PCAA conference champ Thomas Frazier (1:51.1 in 800), Tony Wells (400 in 47.0), hurdler Tim Chambers (51.8 in 400), decathlete Wayne Gray (7,300). Anteaters placed 15th in NCAA meet. 1979 finish: First in PCAA. Coach: Kevin McNair.

CALIFORNIA-SANTA BARBARA: Gauchos will have depth in distance events, led by Mike LeBold (holds school steeplechase record) and Jim Triplett (broke school record in 5,000 with 14:18.8 and in 10,000 with 30:33.7). Also adding depth will be Chris Hughes, Joe Ebiner, Mark Elwell, Mark Hilton, Ernie Reith. 1979 finish: Sixth in PCAA. Coach: Sam Adams.

NEVADA-RENO: After competing as independent for past 10 years, Wolf Pack enters Big Sky. David Omwansa returns after finishing third in NCAA 800 with 1:46.81, and returnee Jerry Mulligan tied for sixth in pole vault with 17-4%. Challenge to UTEP falls short, giving Miners impressive win

Texas-El Paso, Renaldo Nehemiah and Don Paige all had one thing in common at the 1979 NCAA Outdoor Track Championships in Champaign, Illinois: they were unbeatable.

Before the meet began, much was being made of the foreign issue. Oregon, with only one foreign athlete, was expected to challenge Texas-El Paso's "Foreign Legion," with only one American, for the team title.

But the Miners weren't receptive to challenges, and the Ducks weren't up to mounting one. Reidar Lorentzen, Oregon's only foreign entry, came into the meet with the leading collegiate javelin throw in the country (271-2) but failed to place. Jerome Deal, Texas-El Paso's only American, scored an upset victory in the 100 meters with a time of 10.19.

The Ducks joined the pack, and the Miners breezed to the title with 64 points. They had enough to win after the first day of finals (50) and could easily have scored higher had coach Ted Banks not pulled distance stars Suleiman Nyambui and Michael Musyoki out of the 5,000 meters.

That pair had already done its job, however, in scoring a one-two victory over Oregon's Alberto Salazar in the 10,000 meters. The impressive Nyambui won in a meet record time of 28:01.3, while defending champ Musyoki clocked 28:03.25 for second. Salazar was left to settle for third, despite lowering his personal best by more than 30 seconds and moving to eighth on the all-time U.S. list with a 28:06.12.

Deal won in the 100, with James Sanford of Southern California second and former champion Harvey Glance of Auburn third. Richard Olsen and Thommie Sjoholm were second and third in the hammer for UTEP as Washington's Scott Neilson was becoming only the second four-time NCAA winner in one event. And Hans Almstrom was a surprise second in the shot put as UCLA's Dave Laut successfully defended his title with a throw of 66-11½.

The team race was over.

And if UTEP's foreigners enjoyed putting it to their critics, so did the Miners' American.

"We know that everybody is against

us, and that makes us try harder," Deal said. "I'm on the inside, dealing with the Kenyans, Nigerians and all the others. They are human beings just like everyone else, and I don't know why people are so concerned about it.

"But I know it makes us try harder."
That settled and with even the staunch anti-foreign element forced to marvel at UTEP's excellent showing, the attention turned to the individual battles and the likes of Nehemiah of Maryland and Paige of Villanova.

Both had created a fair amount of interest heading into the meet. Nehemiah was coming off his new world record of 13.0 in the high hurdles, and defending champ and former American record holder Greg Foster of UCLA wanted to win badly—both because he fell and didn't finish the race in which Nehemiah broke the mark and because Foster was a former Illinois prep star competing before family and friends.

Paige, meanwhile, had everyone buzzing because of his impending bid to become the first double winner at 800 and 1,500 meters since Ron Delany of

Villanova in 1958.

Nehemiah delivered handsomely. Wind of 3.45 meters per second ruled out any hopes of a world record, so Nehemiah had to be content with the fastest race of all time, a wind-aided 12.91. Foster again didn't finish the race, hitting the sixth hurdle hard and then knocking over the seventh before stopping short of the eighth.

Éveryone agreed that the wind hurt Foster. "I didn't alter my stride," he said. "The wind just carried me into

the hurdles."

Added Maryland coach Frank Costello, "Foster's size (6-3, 188) hurt him today. He's so big that he has to chop his steps, and the wind made it worse."

But Nehemiah felt he was hurt by the wind, too. "I wasn't that aggressive, because I felt I might fall," he said. "The wind can really throw you off if you're not careful."

Nehemiah said that he had been

more concerned about the wind than about Foster.

"I'm a little more advanced in technique," Nehemiah said. "Particularly when I'm in the air, I can beat Greg back to the ground.

"If Greg ever hits his best, you might see two sub-13 hurdlers; but Greg has to beat me five times now to even

things up."

Paige's challenge did not come from another athlete but from an undertaking that many thought impossible at the NCAA level. Early on, the reason Paige accepted the idea of doubling was the belief that Villanova might be a factor in the team race. And the Wildcats did claim second with 48 points while UCLA was third with 36, Auburn fourth with 30 and Oregon fifth with 28.

But with the team race settled before the final day of competition began, Paige's challenge was strictly personal. The first part was considered almost automatic and it was, as Paige sat on a slow pace and outkicked everyone down the stretch to win the 1,500 in a time of 3:39.20.

The suspense came during the 800, just 40 minutes later, when Paige seemed to be floundering on the back stretch of the second lap and stood fourth coming off the final turn. But again his withering kick served him well, leaving him confortably ahead at the tape in 1:46.18.

"Realistically, I doubted if I could do it," Paige said later. "I've run this double before, and I won both in the IC4A; but I didn't know what would

happen at this level.

"I was hurting so much during the 800 that I just told myself I had nothing to lose. I had conditioned my mind for the pain. I knew I was going to be exhausted. I just told myself, 'It's going to hurt, so let it hurt."

Paige admitted that both races played into his hands tactically.

"If anybody wanted to beat me in the 1,500, he should have gone out a lot

faster," he said. "I just waited as long an possible to kick, and I was still capable of putting it into another gear if I had to.

"After that I thought for sure somebody would go out fast in the 800, but nobody did. That was the only chance I had to win, because I was counting on my kick."

Events such as these overshadowed but did not detract from several other notable events and performances.

There was Henry Rono of Washington State, who easily defended his ateeplechase title in the time of 8:17.92—not up to the caliber of Rono a year ago when he set four world records and won the event at the NCAA meet with an 8:12.39, but not exactly shabby

either. It was better than a second faster than the American record, and Rono undoubtedly could have run faster if he had been pressed.

Although Washington State coach John Chaplin had said prior to the season that he might triple Rono in the steeple, 5,000 and 10,000, the idea never got off the ground, as Rono was slow to work himself into shape after his Herculean season in '78. He never recorded a qualifying time for 10,000; and since the Cougars weren't in the team race, there was no need to double him in the 5,000 meters.

After Nyambui and Musyoki dropped out, the 5,000 was left to defending champ Rudy Chapa of Oregon and talented black South African Sydnev Maree of Villanova.

Although Chapa ran 10 seconds faster than his winning time of the year before (13:35.29), he fell victim to the same situation that ruined teammate Salazar in the 10,000. Chapa was unprepared to force the pace hard enough to nullify Maree's finishing kick, and the 22-year-old sophomore went by on the next-to-last lap and never looked back. His 13:20.63 was both an NCAA meet record and a national record.

There was a total of four successful defending champions in the meet. In addition to Neilson in the hammer. Rono in the steeple and Laut in the shot, James Walker of Auburn blitzed the field in the intermediate hurdles with a 48.68.

Six defending champs couldn't repeat, including Chapa at 5,000, Musvoki at 10,000 and Foster in the highs.

Billy Mullins of Southern Cal did not get the opportunity to defend his title in the 400 because of an injury. The winner was Kasheef Hassan of Oregon State in 45.18. In the 800, defending champ Peter Lemashon was one of the few UTEP disappointments as he placed fifth. In the high jump, Franklin Jacobs of Fairleigh Dickinson-Teaneck went unplaced while 1977 champ Nat Page of Missouri returned to the top with a 7-41/2 leap on his final attempt, nosing past James Frazier of Arizona and Jeff Woodard of Alabama, both of whom jumped 7-3½.

Other winners in the field events include Larry Myricks of Mississippi College in the long jump at 26-71/4: Nate Cooper of Villanova in the triple jump at 56-114, going from third to first on his last attempt; Paul Pilla of Arkansas State in the pole vault at 17-41/4: Tom Sinclair of Washington in the iavelin at 261-3, and Bradley Cooper of Florida State in the discus at 209-9 after throwing a meet record 212-6 in qualifying.

The USC quartet of Kevin Williams, Colin Bradford, Sanford and Mullins gave the defending champ Trojans their only victory in the sprint relay with a 39.35 time. Louisiana State won the mile relay in 3:04.67 with Paul Jordan, Efrem Colev, Revey Scott and Greg Hill.

Tito Steiner of Brigham Young won his second NCAA decathlon crown with 7.918 points. And there was one other winner-the Bruins' fallen Foster, who came back from his disappointment in the highs to capture the 200 meter in 20.22.

"I'm happy I won because it means I'll go home with something," Foster said. "But it didn't make up for what happened in the highs. That event is still first with me. I want to be No. 1 and set the world record."

And that is the level you sometimes must attain to win at the NCAA championships.

Division II Championships

Mustangs' team effort pays off in form of fourth championship title

As such competition has always been and must always be, the 1979 Division II Outdoor Track Championships were really a series of individual celebrations of outstanding and surprising performances. But at Macomb, where Western Illinois hosted the finals for a second straight year, there was also a sense of team; and it was as real as the rain that fell on the final Saturday.

Before the first step was run in the decathlon 100 meters, there was little doubt that Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo would capture its fourth team championship. That the Mustangs had scored only 21 points with just one hour and 50 minutes-or one field and 10 track finals-didn't change that. But few could have anticipated just how well Cal Poly-SLO would perform.

"If we do our best, really our best, I figure we can score 93 points," Cal Poly-SLO coach Steve Miller told a group of Hayward State jumpers shortly after breakfast Saturday morning. Not even Miller-a man of optimism, a setter of lofty goals-expected his team to score 95 points, the second-highest total in college division history. Only Maryland State, with six individual champions in 1963, scored more (98).

Cal Poly-SLO won five events, scored in 13 of the 21 events and received scoring efforts from 14 athletes. The Mustangs set meet records in four of their victories.

"I can't believe it myself," Miller said. "It exceeded my expectations...We wanted to establish this as one of the greatest college division teams of all time."

The victory was particularly satisfying to Miller, a Chicago native in his third year at Cal Poly-SLO, for several reasons: it completed a running sweep for the Mustangs, who scored 42 points to win the 1978 cross country title by 123 points; Miller's father drove down from Chicago to watch one of his son's teams perform for the first time, and Miller is the Mustangs' only coach.

"There are a lot of coaches who would complain about that," Miller said. "But I stagger the day and the workouts. It makes me responsible to

everybody, everybody responsible to me and everybody responsible to everybody else."

Ah, yes, the team. From the moment Jeff Small ran a personal best for third in the steeplechase—Saturday's first running final—there were Mustangs everywhere, always cheering, often dashing across the infield or coming out of the stands to hug a teammate.

"This is a team," said Mike Bush, who didn't wait to recover from anchoring the Mustangs' 440-yard relay victory before he was off to cheer teammate Danny Aldridge to a record in the 1.500.

Bush and his brother Kevin—both members of the second-place mile relay team—lead the team in Bible studies. It has been little more than a year since Miller became a Christian himself. His beliefs are strong, but he does not try to impose them on others. "Coach Miller told us (the Bush brothers) that he felt we were leaders on the team," Mike Bush said, "and that that was a gift God gave us. But everything else was our decision."

Several other Cal Poly-SLO athletes made a similar decision. "It's not only a matter of believing in Christ," Miller said, "but also a matter of believing in themselves and everybody else."

Cal Poly-SLO finished 44 points ahead of Northridge State, which was also second to the Mustangs in the California Collegiate Athletic Association finals. It was the second straight year CCAA members went one-two. Cal Poly-SLO was second to Los Angeles State in the 1978 Division II meet.

The Mustangs were led by Jim Schankel, who swept the 5,000 and

10,000 meters for a second straight year, and Barton Williams, who ran a sizzling third leg in the 440-yard relay victory, won the intermediate hurdles in record time and carried the Mustangs to second in the mile relay with a 45-second anchor leg.

But those two had to share the spotlight with Larry Myricks of Mississippi College, who defended his long jump and 200 titles, giving him five Division II championships (he also won the long jump in 1976)—the most titles ever won by an individual.

Myricks, who set a 200 record in 1978, was beyond the 15-year-old long jump record of 26 feet on all five of his fair jumps and was denied a record only because of an aiding wind. His series was an astonishing 26-8½, foul, 26-3, 26-9¾, 26-7¾ and 26-1. The following week he won the Division I title and two weeks later went a windy 27-2 to capture the Amateur Athletic Union championship.

Schankel, a junior who spent two years in the Air Force, set records in both his victories. Saving himself for the 5,000 the next day, he still forced the pace through much of the 10,000 on Friday, then sprinted past Steve Alvarez of California-Riverside with 160 yards to go and won by 2½ seconds in 29:07.9. Alvarez and third-place finisher Garry Henry of Pembroke State were also under Gordon Minty's 1972 10.000-meter record.

In the 5,000, Schankel led most of the race and broke his own record as he finished more than four seconds ahead of second-place Casey Reinking of Eastern Illinois. Schankel ran 14:12.

Williams' third leg on the 440-yard relay made it easy for Mike Bush to anchor the 40.21 victory as Prairie View A&M, defending champion Adelphi and Southeastern Louisiana finished in that order within .04 of a second of one another. Less than half an hour later, Williams ran a record 49.82 in the intermediates to win by more than half a second and wipe out

the record Sam Turner of Los Angeles State set in 1978. Turner did not run all spring because of an ankle injury.

Williams was a disappointing sixth in the 1978 hurdles race when he ran with a case of walking pneumonia. He demonstrated his good health a third time on the final day of the 1979 meet with his strong mile relay anchor carry.

but he couldn't catch Evans White of Prairie View A&M. The all-junior foursome defended its championship in 3:08.60 after equaling its 1978 record of 3:07.30 in the semifinals.

Other records were set in the shot put, hammer throw, steeplechase, 800 and 1,500 meters.

The biggest surprise was in the steeple as Curt Bacon of South Dakota State ran 8:50.20 in his third steeple ever. Bacon, a senior, was in seventh place with two laps to go and was just trying to finish in the top six so he would win an all-America certificate. "I was getting tired. My mind was wandering," he said. "I went after the guy in front of me, and when I caught him there were four more right there."

Bacon moved from the 1,500 because of teammate Mike Bollman. Bollman, who was second to Aldridge in the 1978 1,500 finals, forced the 1979 pace but couldn't get away from Aldridge. "I felt comfortable the whole way," said Aldridge, who took the lead coming off the final turn and then held off Bob Friedman of Northern Iowa to win in 3:43.90. Aldridge, Friedman and Bollman were all under the record Aldridge set in 1978.

In the 800, Dan Futrell used a similar kick to burst past defending champion White of Prairie View A&M. Futrell ran 1:46.81 and White 1:46.95, both quicker than White's 1978 record of 1:47.21. Futrell could barely speak after the race, which ended three-plus years of frustration.

He had finished second, second and fourth in three previous Division II 800 finals, lost the NCAA indoor title to White and was nipped by White in a special 800 at the 1979 Drake Relays. "I just changed the style of my race," said Futrell, who usually leads. "I decided I was going to play off him the way he plays off me."

Senior Brad Olson of Central Connecticut State improved almost 20 feet from 1978, when he was third, to win the hammer with a record throw of

206-1. Olson was a 47-foot shot putter as a freshman when he first started throwing the hammer.

"The shot is nice," he said, "but it doesn't go very far. If you're great, how far can you throw it? Seventy, 75 feet. In the hammer, if you get a good throw you can pack a lunch and go get it."

Northridge State freshman Joe Staub, who was redshirted last year because of a back injury, put the shot 62-7½ on his first effort for the record and championship. Staub, a smallish 6-0 and 210 pounds, also used his quickness to take second in the discus. Defending champion Brent Geringer of Northern Iowa won the disc with 175-1, nearly 20 feet short of his seasonal best because of a constant rain.

The Saturday afternoon rain also fell on the javelin and triple jump competition. Norman Finke of Northridge State was 20 feet short of his seasonal best in the javelin but still managed 220-10 to edge Jorgen Persson of Los Angeles State by three inches. The triple jump was even closer, as defending champion Doug Garner of Hayward State and teammate John Haynes both hit 51-10½. Garner won because his second-best jump was longer. Hayward State jumpers finished one-two-four-seven.

The pole vault began when it was raining, then finished more than four hours later—well after the mile relay. Kimmo Jokivartio of Los Angeles State and Bob Olsen of Hayward State both cleared 16-4, with Jokivartio winning on the basis of misses. Defending champion Raimo Eskola of Los Angeles State was fifth.

Other champions were Dave Bergstrom of Moorhead State with a personal best of 7-1¼ in the high jump; Steve Brodi of Northridge State with a 10.21 in the 100; Mike Barnes of Illinois-Chicago Circle with 46.30 in the 400; Bob Johnson of Eastern Illinois with 13.81 in the high hurdles, and Floyd Scholz of Central Connecticut State with 7,329 in the decathlon.

Division III Championships

Rain hampers meet performances, dampens spirits and athletes alike

On the first day it rained...

On the second day it rained...

On the third day it rained.

And it was just fortunate for the 750 athletes from 150 colleges in 35 states that they weren't washed down the drains at Baldwin-Wallace College's Finnie Stadium.

The rain never stopped during the sixth annual NCAA Division III Outdoor Track Championships after the two-day decathlon session ended.

It's a good thing it wasn't snow that was falling in the bone-chilling air. Had it been freezing, 4.02 inches of rain would have been converted about to 40 inches of snow.

And as a result of the weather, just one meet record was set. That came in the final event as the rainstorms leveled off to cold drizzle.

Dan Henderson, a smooth-striding junior from Wheaton who was never pressed after the first mile, dominated the field in the 5,000 in 13:55.0. The meet mark of 14:19.32 was set last year

by Dale Kramer of Carleton.

Henderson and the Slippery Rock State track squad were the best of the "Raindrop Kids." Slippery Rock soared from last year's 47th-place finish to the championship this year.

Coach Bill Lennox's squad received 30 of its 48 points from sterling senior sprinter George Crunkleton, a transfer from Edinboro State. He won the 200 meters in 21.05 and the 100 meters in 10.64 and anchored the winning 400-meter relay team, which won in 41.40.

The margin of victory—four points over Glassboro State—came when the latter was disqualified in the trials of the 1,600-meter relay. Despite having the third-fastest overall time, Glassboro State was forced from the finals because of an illegal baton exchange.

Defending champion Occidental of Los Angeles figured again to be a powerhouse but managed only a seventh-place finish.

The team leader board at the end of the 21 events showed Slipperv Rock

State first with 48 points, followed by Glassboro State 44, Hamline 38, Frostburg State 28, Southern-New Orleans 27, North Central 26, Occidental 23, Illinois Benedictine and Wheaton 20 each, Fitchburg State 19 and host Baldwin-Wallace 18½.

Henderson was satisfied with setting the only meet record but admitted later that he was a "little nauseated."

"I pulled ahead at the end of the first mile, and I think I could have done better if I had been pushed," said Henderson. "It was a good conditioner to me, but I've run better when I had competition—like at my 13:52 clocking at the Drake Relays. The past three days weren't exactly ideal for track."

Still, the incredible weather was the story of the meet. Said Silas Hudson of Coe College, winner of the 110-meter high hurdles in 14.27, "It was a good thing they didn't call the meet off, because we had a Tartan surface to run on. We haven't had a good season to

run in yet. I've run in 32-degree weather, but thank goodness I've never run in snow."

Kenny Davis, third leg on Southern's winning 1,600-meter relay team in 3:10.99, said, "I've never run in anything like this. It slows you down, and you can't get any good times. This is a drastic change for us. Our feet are as numb as drumsticks."

Steve Eisterhold of Aquinas couldn't use the weather as an excuse for not making it to the finals.

"This is close to the best weather we've had all season. We've had nine meets this year, and the temperature has been below the 40s in each of them. We figure this weather is an advantage to us. We went to the Ohio Relays and it snowed. We couldn't find good weather all season."

Slippery Rock State coach Lennox wasn't mad about the rain, either.

"We have made great strides since we scored just five points last year," he

said. "Crunkleton was the star of our show.

"I thought we could win the meet if we got 45 to 50 points. I figured we had it wrapped up when we won the 400meter relay. The key was Glassboro State's relay team being disqualified."

Even though he never had seen more rain in his life, Lennox, who has been track coach at Slippery Rock State for 10 years, gladly will accept the role as a wet winning coach.

Before the rains came, Paul Trocki of Keene State scored 7,163 points to end Fisk's three-year domination of the decathlon. Trocki didn't take the lead until the eighth event, the javelin, when he earned 778 points with a throw of 201-4½. His last event, the 1,500-meter run, was his best; he turned in a 4:16.10 to run away from the field.

Trocki, sixth in the decathlon last year, won two events, was second in two, fourth in one and fifth in three.

Still, team winner Slippery Rock State did well in the decathlon as John Papa was second with 7,163 points and Tom Campion fifth with 6,616 points behind winner Trocki.

Hudson of Coe in the 110-meter high

hurdles (14.27) and Mark Severson in the discus throw with a heave of 172-7 were the only champions to defend their titles. Last year Hudson had a clocking of 14.63, and Severson had a heave of 173-8.

Crunkleton, the only double winner in the meet, won both the 100- and 200-meter dashes (10.64 and 21.05). Hiram's Bill Edwards (10.67 in the 100) and Fitchburg's David Farnsworth (21.1) were the closest pursuers.

Alvin Douglas of Southern won the 400-meter dash in 47.0, .2 off the NCAA Division III record. Matthew Childs of Pratt captured the 800-meter run in 1:49.50, .2 over the meet record.

The 1,500-meter run through the downpour was the closest event of the night. The top five finishers were blanketed .87 apart. Kevin Scheuer of Union won in 3:50.03, followed by Mike Palmquist of St. Olaf in 3:50.12, Greg Partamian of Occidental in 3:50.52, Rodney Garland of Brandeis in 3:50.84, Bill Geating of Allegheny in 3:50.87 and Bob Carroll of Fredonia State in 3:51.44.

Paul King of St. Thomas won the 3,000-meter steeplechase in 8:58.20, al-

most 10 seconds over the NCAA Division III record. Dexter Lehman of Tri-State captured the 10,000-meter run in 30:14.97, more than 30 seconds above the meet record.

Ted Carlson of Wheaton jumped from third to first in the 400-meter hurdles with a clocking of 56.81. His time last year was 52.19.

Slipperv Rock State dethroned defending champion Morehouse in the 400-meter relay with the team of James Scott, Donald Johns. Hunter and Crunkleton coming in at 40.94. That is just .23 over Southern's NCAA Division III record of 40.71 set in 1977.

With the quartet of Ken Thibodeau, Delwin Davis, Ken Davis and Douglas. Southern won the 1600-meter relay in 3:10.99, close to the meet mark of 3:10.67 set by Stanislaus State in 1977.

Moving up from second last year to first this year were Kevin Hall of Occidental with a 6-11 in the high jump and Kent Namikas of Pomona-Pitzer with a leap of 49-91/4 in the triple jump.

However, Namikas was unable to defend his long jump title as he finished third behind Rory Johnson of Illinois-Benedictine and John Mascoll of Fisk. Both had winning leaps of 23-7, but Johnson won on fewer misses.

Michael Phillips of Illinois-Benedictine shot up from fourth last year to first this year to win the pole yault with a leap of 15-2, still six inches under the NCAA meet record. Bad footing on the wet track made this event hazardous.

Mike Juskus of Glassboro State lost his javelin crown to Bill Wolfe of Millersville State. Wolfe threw 220-41/2. Juskus 217-11/2. Juskus had a throw of 222-8 last year.

Bruce Sterling of Tufts made a dramatic rise from a three-way tie for sixth in the hammer to a title this year with a throw of 178-6. Sterling had made incredible progress since he threw 152-9 last year. The meet record of 202-0 was set by Edward Healy of Fitchburg State last year.

Bill Dietrick of Nebraska Weslevan won the shot put in 54-10, four feet under the meet record. Severson, the defending champion in this event, finished third with 56-6.



Controversy spices indoor meet; Villanova triumphs by one point

The announcement over the loudspeaker by Jack O'Reilly echoed through Cobo Arena in Detroit like a dream through the mind of a relay anchorman: "Believe it or not, ladies and gentlemen, if Villanova wins this final event, it will take the NCAA Indoor Track Championships by one point."

Running against the invisible clock in the final section, Villanova's mile relay quartet of Keith Brown, Derrick Harbour, Anthony Tufariello and Tim Dale did what was necessary to make the Wildcats 52-51 victors over defending champion Texas-El Paso in one of the wildest meets in history. And one of the most controversial, naturally.

"That announcement should not have been made," said Texas-El Paso coach Ted Banks. "The mental edge given Villanova was immeasurable."

Only a few minutes earlier, Villanova had received additional incentive when Texas-El Paso's two-mile relay team was disqualified in an incident involving the Notre Dame team.

Many observers thought Notre Dame was at fault, but the observers who counted—the judges—ousted the Miners instead.

"Sometimes you feel you're getting cheated, and that's how I feel now," said Banks. "I know down deep we're the best team."

Said Villanova coach Jumbo Elliott, "I don't like to win on a disqualification, but we've lost three championships like that."

To be sure, there was more to Villanova's victory than announcers, red flags and luck. The Wildcats had to overcome a sterling double in the two-mile and mile by UTEP's Suleiman Nyambui on top of a 27-2 Texas-El Paso lead after the first day. They did it with some notable performances of their own, especially those by Don Paige in the 1,000 and Tufariello in the 600 only an hour before his relay leg.

The frenetic finish capped what Maryland's Renaldo Nehemiah had started with the fastest indoor hurdling of his incredibly fast season.

Nehemiah, who set world records four times during the winter, never had run four 60-yard races in two days faster than the meet records 7.08, 6.94, 6.98 and 6.90 that he ran in Detroit. In the final he hit two hurdles, knocking one over.

"It undoubtedly cost me the world record," said Nehemiah, who missed his mark by only .01 of a second.

Nyambui's 8:37.90 two-mile was followed 50 minutes later by a meet record 3:57.90 mile and was the fastest double of its kind in the history of the meet. The Tanzanian joined Jim Ryun and Marty Liquori as the only other runners to accomplish the feat.

Paige's 2:07.30 in the 1,000 tied the meet record.

Although UTEP had compiled its supposedly insurmountable 27-2 lead on the first day and stretched it to 41-2 at one time on the second, it might have been on the first day that the Miners lost the meet.

In the very first event—the 35-pound weight throw—four inches cost Texas-El Paso three points. Washington's Scott Neilson became the first three-time winner of the event with a throw of 71-5½.

UTEP's Richard Olson (65-11½) and Thommie Sjoholm (65-8½) were fourth and fifth until Southern Illinois-Carbondale's Stan Podolski improved more than two feet to 66-0½ and bumped the two Miners down a notch. Had this not happened Friday morning, there would have been little furor on Saturday evening.

Later on Friday, controversy made its first appearance of the meet.

UTEP's Keith Connor, who could take only one leap in the triple jump because of a bruised heel, managed to take the lead at 54-0¾ in the trials. Later, Tennessee's Paul Jordan jumped what was at first announced as 16.46 meters, or 54 feet. As Jordan leaned over the official to see the result,

the official turned the tape over to show the Imperial measurement and apparently lost track of what he was doing. He changed his mark to 16.56, or 54-4, saying he had mistakenly called it 16.46 at first.

At any rate, Jordan eventually placed second behind Indiana's Robert Cannon, who left no doubt with a 54-8¹4 leap in the finals. Connor was third, two points behind second.

Texas-El Paso's third loss by inches occurred on Saturday shortly after Nehemiah beat West Virginia's Garnett Edwards in the hurdles. Edwards' time was 7.09, and his 7.08 in the prelims moved him to No. 5 all-time.

UTEP's Jerome Deal had run 6.16 and 6.19 in 60-yard dash heats; but he was beaten out of the blocks in the final and finished fourth in 6.22, behind Texas A&M's defending champ Curtis Dickey (6.15), Auburn's Harvey Glance (6.17) and Kent State's Terry Carter (6.21).

If Banks didn't have a premonition of evil by now, the disqualification in the two-mile relay was all that was necessary.

With a comfortable 41-28 lead and victory half an hour and three events away, UTEP was running for a place in the two-mile relay. Villanova had no team entered.

On the third leg, Notre Dame's Chuck Aragon was running in front of Texas-El Paso's Jan Boogman. Both men entered a turn, and only Boogman came out; Aragon fell. Texas-El Paso went on to finish second to Nebraska, with Scott Poehling anchoring. But officials ruled that Boogman had bounced Aragon. Many observers felt Aragon had started the jostling with an elbow, although Notre Dame coach Joe Piane vigorously denied it.

The score was still 41-28. Nyambui had completed his 50-minute rest following his two-mile victory and was ready for the mile.

Villanova had two sub-four-minute milers entered-Sydney Maree and

Amos Korir—and Korir took an early lead with Nyambui dead last. He wasn't as dead as he appeared.

With two laps to go, Nyambui sprinted to a big lead and was joyfully waving his arms to the delight of the crowd of 8,200. His last quarter was timed in 55.80 on his way to 3:57.90, breaking Ryun's 12-year-old meet mark of 3:58.60. Maree was second in 4:00.0, and Korir was third in 4:03.80 for 14 points.

The score now was 51-42, setting the stage for O'Reilly's announcement. UTEP had no mile relay team. Just about the time O'Reilly informed the crowd of the situation, Villanova's calculators had figured it out for themselves.

Kansas won the first section of the relay in 3:16.10. Villanova splits of 49.80 by Brown and 49.40 by Harbour gave Tufariello a five-yard lead. Tufariello, who had won the 600 an hour earlier despite a nasty cold, turned in a great 48-second leg before passing to Dale, who closed in 48.4. The 3:15.60 gave the Wildcats a whole half-second to spare for their one-point victory.

Before Tufariello's victory in the 600 in 1:09.50, his best time ever, Villanova was trailing, 41-2.

The two points had come by the skin of Brown's chin, too. He had placed fifth in the 440 on Friday; but if he'd been .01 of a second slower in the preliminaries, he wouldn't have been in the final at all.

Brown's 49.34 tied him with Tennessee's Antone Blair as the eighth-fastest qualifier, necessitating a nine-man final (of three three-man sections). The event was won by Auburn's James Walker in 48.61.

Nyambui's double erased some of the disappointment about the absence of stars Henry Rono of Washington State and Franklin Jacobs of Fairleigh Dickinson-Teaneck. Flu sidelined Rono, track's athlete of the year in 1978. An ankle injury forced high jumper Jacobs into a cast before the meet. Rono had tried the two-mile-mile double in 1978 but placed second and sixth, respectively, while also weakened by flu.

In the absence of defending champion Jacobs, the high jump was won by Florida's Jim Pringle at 7-2¾; only nine of 23 jumpers cleared the opening qualifying height of 7-0.

Rono's absence made Texas-El Paso's Mike Musyoki a favorite in the three-mile run. Musyoki didn't disappoint, with an easy victory in 13:21.70.

Paige tied the 1,000 record set by former Villanova teammate Mark Belger in 1977. Paige was given the choice of running either the 880 or the 1,000, and he chose to defend his 1,000 title "because too many things can go wrong in the 880," he said.

His presence in the 1,000 seemed to load the field in the 880, but no one was a match for Evans White of Prairie View A&M, who won in 1:51.90. Texas-El Paso's Peter Lemashon was second in 1:52.80.

Since the mile and two-mile relays had played key roles in Villanova's fate, it was fitting that the third relay the distance medley—also provided six crucial points for the Wildcat cause.

The 880-440-1,320-mile race was won by Tennessee's Solomon Hunter, Mike Barlow, Richard Hadler and Keith Young in 9:47.10, followed by Brigham Young in 9:48.90. Two-tenths of a second behind and only .4 ahead of fourth-place Eastern Michigan was Villanova's quartet of Mike England, Alfred Graves, John Burns and Dean Childs in 9:49.10.

Harvard's Geoff Stiles won the pole vault at 17-3 after three tries at the opening height of 16-6 and three more attempts at 17-0. Kansas' Jeff Buckingham was second at 17-3. He needed two tries at that height, and Stiles cleared it on his first.

Larry Myricks of Mississippi College, who said he was still trying to regain strength from a broken ankle suffered while warming up for the 1976

Olympic final, won the long jump at 25-10¾. Ohio defending champion Al Ogunfeyimi, weakened by illness, was sixth at 14-6.

In the shot put, Houston's Mark Baughman beat Southern Illinois' John Marks on his fifth throw with a toss of 62-10 to Marks' 62-2½.

Champions who defended their titles were Dickey in the 60, Nehemiah in the hurdles, Paige in the 1,000 and Neilson in the 35-pound weight throw.

American citizens outscored foreign athletes, 347-118. Foreign domination was concentrated in three distance races—mile, two-mile and three-mile—where foreign athletes captured nine of the 18 places, including six of the top nine spots.

This was the final meet in Cobo Arena, the only home of the 15-yearold indoor championships. Next year's meet is scheduled to move a few blocks away to the new Joe Louis Arena.
