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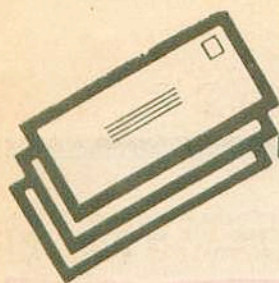

PUSH FOR RULE CHANGE

After trying for several years to get a rule change in track and field in the Southern Section CIF, without much success, I thought I would try the "Mailbox Section" of your

magazine for added support. In the Southern Section of the state CIF athletic federation an athlete is permitted to run in 9 dual or triangular meets and 4 invitational track meets. I proposed a rule change so that an athlete would be permitted *any* 13 contests. A look at the "Blue Book of Rules" will verify that track and field is the only sport using an antiquated system. League meets would automatically count as one of the 13. This rule would provide more competition to teams with premier individuals or relay teams and afford more of an opportunity to get on to decent tracks in an attempt to improve overall times and distances. It would also help us run down some of those Texas times. Over the past 7 years I figured that we would have averaged 7 dual meets and 6 invitationals. This is not much of a change but at least we would have the added flexibility for our programs. I have talked to hundreds of coaches and only one was against the change for personal reasons. Last year this rule change was approved by the Southern Section Commissioner's Track Coaches Advisory Committee, and is again in the legislative process at the CIF office.

Perhaps your readers feel as I do. I know that I am right on this issue but what I need is some added punch and support from you and your readers to help make this rule change a reality.

Another fine volume in the popular "Contemporary" series, prepared by editor Jess

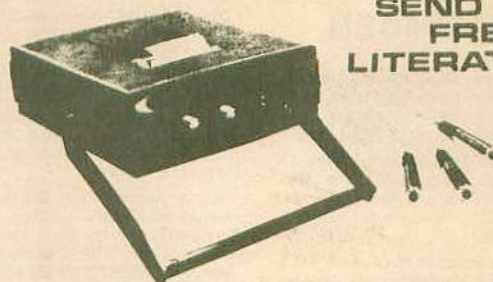

SoCal Diary

October 2.

It was the Prep Invitionals taking the spotlight the past week-end with the Kenny Staub Invitational the main event. At that one, CIF individual favorite Jesus Gutierrez outran Glendale's Danny Palma 15:10 to 15:27 to capture individual honors in the boys race. Team wise Hawthorne showed it is just as tough in X-Country as it is in track as its boys team beat perennial CIF power Newbury Park 88-111 for Div. I honors while La Canada was a 67-82 winner over Temple City in Div. II. In girls Div. I, CIF power Palos Verdes just did edge a rugged Edison 7, 48-49.

In the Bell-Jeff Invitational, it was Atascadero, Simi Valley, Loyola, and Paraclete winning boys divisions, while Westlake and Morro Bay were the girls winners.

Down at the Costa Mesa Invitational, it was Mater Dei, Villa Park, and Rancho Alamitos taking boys honors, while Tustin, University and Norco captured the girls divisions.

In 4-year college action, the Aztec Invitational was where it was all happening. In the mens race, UCLA's Ron Roberts was the individual winner in 30:19, but Arizona went 2-3-4 en route to a runaway 29-75-102 victory over Cal Poly Pomona and the Bruins. In the womens competition, it was CPSLO destroying the field as usual with a 24-100 margin over runner-up Northern Arizona.

In Road Racing, Pat Porter of Alamosa Colorado set an apparent world record of 27:41 in the L.A. Coliseum 10K good for a \$10,000.00 first prize. However, when the course was officially measured, it turned out to be more than 100 yards short, which eliminated the record.

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October 9.

Saturday was loaded with Prep Invitionals lead by the Palos Verdes Invitational where Arroyo High and host Palos Verdes were boys and girls winners respectively. Individually PV's Katie O'Hara broke Tanya Fischer's course record of 12:59 with a 12:53 clocking.

At the Fountain Valley Invitational, it was Mater Dei, Corona Del Mar, and the Sherman Indians winning boys divisions, while El Toro, Newport Harbor and Westminster did likewise for the girls.

Up at Hancock, Santa Barbara, Righetti, and McFarland captured boys honors with Santa Barbara and Louisville girls champs.

Down the coast at Dos Pueblos, the host school in the boys division and Cabrillo in the girls division were sweepstakes winners.

At the Buena Park Invitational, Villa Park, El Modena and Magnolia won divisional boys races while Millikan, Irvine and Maranatha were the winning girls teams.

In Community College action at the Hancock Invitational, it was Ray Kring's host team with an awesome 1-2-3-4 finish en route to a 26-85 win over Santa Barbara in the mens race, however coach Steve Bushey saw his SBCC female thinclads take a 89-117 win over Cuesta.

In 4-year College action, at the Stanford Invitational, UCLA, lead by Ron Robert's 6th place finish got by BYU 70-92 in mens action while Div. I power Stanford went 1-2-3-4 to top Div. I power CPSLO 19-47 in the womens race. Based on some comparative scores, Stanford rates stronger than any other Div. I women's team.

October 16.

Again starting with the Preps; first at the Orange County Championships where Mater Dei, Corona Del Mar, Villa Park, and El Toro were all boys winners, while girls teams from Tustin, Edison, Foothill, and Newport Harbor likewise were victorious.

At the San Gabriel Invitational run Mt. SAC, it was Rowland High sweeping both girls and boys divisions over La Puente and Bishop Amat respectively.

In Community College action down at the SoCal Invitational at Mira Costa, a controversy arose over the men's team champion, which is determined by combining the times of each team's 7 runners who run in 7 different races. In one of the races, a Long Beach CC harrier who was leading the race took a wrong turn and inadvertently cut 2 minutes off the course. Meet director Noel Montruccio gave the LBCC runner the first place trophy, but also gave the LBCC team a DQ for the short cut. LBCC mentor Ron Allice argued vehemently that his Viking harriers would have won the team title without the shortcut, but to no avail. Thus, Grossmont was declared the mens winner.

In 4-year action, at the Biola Invitational, UC Riverside outran runner-up CS Long Beach 29-57 with Pt. Loma also a winner in Div. II mens action. In womens competition,

it was USIU 51-68 over Fresno State despite a runaway individual win by FSU's Renee Wyckoff.

At the Cal Poly Pomona Invitational, Northern Arizona went 1-2-3-4 en route to a 16-70 win over UC Irvine in the mens race, while in the womens competition, it was also Northern Arizona over UCI 22-38.

At the California Invitational, the Stanford Cardinals outran the host UCB Bears 48-60 in mens varsity competition, while Wisconsin was a 28-52 winner over UCLA on the distaff side.

October 24.

There was a light Prep Invitational schedule over the week-end as most leagues were winding down their dual meet schedule. In the Invitionals taking place, first at the Yucaipa Invitational, Indio, Colton, Orange, and Covina High were victorious in boys races, while Indio, Bishop Amat, Yucaipa, and 29 Palms had victorious girls teams.

At the Ventura County Championships, it was Newbury Park ahead of Buena in the boys run while Buena outran Westlake in the girls race.

In Community College action, the Mt. Sac Invitational, which has more of a big meet atmosphere than the State Meet saw the top teams from all over the State and Arizona run the picturesque Mt. Sac course.

In the mens races, El Camino put on an awesome display of front line strength with a 2-3-6-9-12 finish to easily outdistance Glendale, CA and Pima, AZ 32-80 in a rugged Div. I field. In Div. II, Saddleback was a surprise 84-85-91 winner over NorCal power West Valley, and SoCal power Grossmont which I understand was without their two top runners. In Div. III, Hancock looked astonishing with 1-2-4 finish and the top two individual times of the day, however Central Arizona had 7 men inside Hancock's 5th to edge out Ray Krings gang 38-41. Based on this meet, it appears both El Camino and Hancock are odds-on favorites for SoCal and State titles.

In the women's competition, Phoenix outdistanced Mt. Sac 62-84 in Div. I, while Golden West was an easy winner in Div. II. At this point, it looks like Mt. Sac, and Santa Barbara as favorites for SoCal and State titles.

In 4-year College action at the Cal Poly Pomona Invitational, Pt. Loma surprised UC Irvine and CPP 33-52-64 in the mens competition, while UCI was a runaway winner over USC and UC Riverside 16-65-78 in the womens race.

October 31.

Virtually all high schools in SoCal plus a few outsiders were at Mt. SAC for their annual feast of X-Country. Jesuit High of Sacramento and nearby Tustin High were boys and girls team sweepstakes winners, while Jesus Gutierrez of Pasadena and Mooney of Vacaville were individual overall titlist.

In the SCIAC men's championships at Redlands, Oxy regained the title from Pomona-Pitzer with a dual meet like 28-41 score.

At the CCAA Championships, Cal Poly Pomona was an easy 24-47-64 winner over UC Riverside and Cal Poly SLO.

At the PCAA Championships, a big sur-

prise here as John Tansley's CS Long Beach 49ers stunned traditional powers UC Irvine and Fresno State 39-50-96 with UNLV 3rd with 80 points.

In the WCAC there was no surprise as the Stanford Cardinals took 4 of the first 5 places while coasting to a 32-58 win over runner-up UCLA.

In the PAC-10, it was Arizona in a close 38-44 win over Oregon with an injury riddled UCLA team 3rd at 74.

A few rumors have been circulating lately and this is what they sound like. It seems a coach that invested quite a bit of his resources to obtain two athletes may have to write the investment off as a loss as there now appears to be an eligibility question because of the athletes allegedly pocketing money from participation in the Grand Prix circuit. The coach has reportedly told his assistant to discontinue coaching the athletes until the matter can be resolved.

There has been a rumor going around for some time, and to an extent has been confirmed by a recent article in the L.A. Times, that the rise to power by Pomona-Pitzer in the academically oriented SCIAC Conference is almost totally because of the fact that Pitzer's academic standards, which do not meet those of the other member schools, allows in many athletes whose potential for graduation is questionable. The other half of the combination Pomona College, has apparently retained its tough Liberal Arts standards. Both schools are part of the group of 5 Claremont colleges.

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Medical Notes for Runners

Contralateral Injury

Contralateral means the other side. The significance of the other side is that, oftentimes, when I see athletes, the injury that they have takes place on the other side of where they had their first injury. Their first injury may have been a minor injury, such as a twisted knee, twisted ankle, or strain in the foot. They continue running and put more stress on the contralateral or other side and end up with a severe injury. The severe injury occurs secondary to increased impact stress and increased load.

When I study athletes with injuries, I find that they tend to touch down more lightly on the injured side and spend less time with the injured foot on the ground. In contrast to this, they come down heavier on the opposite or contralateral foot and spend more time on the ground. Thus, there is more chance of injury. The injured runners tend to land toward the ball of the injured foot so that the foot can leave the ground sooner, and on the heel of the uninjured foot. If they have a minor injury on the right side and continue running this way, they will surely develop a severe injury on the opposite left side. Thus, contralateral injury can suggest that there is a history of injury somewhere else on the opposite side; at least, this should be investigated. Repeated injuries on the same side, however, may be indicative of a structural or biomechanical problem in that side or a limb length discrepancy.

There is a rule that I have in many of my books called, "Once an injury, always an in-

jury." This rule tends to stand true throughout time. It means, quite simply, that you must fully rehabilitate from any injury. Within two weeks of having serious knee injury, up to forty percent of the strength of the quadriceps is lost. This means that this joint is no longer able to protect itself. The same is true for other joints in the body. Once muscles lose their strength, they lose the ability to produce, as well as absorb, energy. Thus, more energy goes to the bones and joints, and there is more chance for injury.

If you are having injuries, think about all those old injuries that you have had and get checked out properly to make sure that you have full strength and flexibility in your whole lower extremity. One good way to rehabilitate yourself is to ride a bike or swim, utilizing fins. Fins tend to increase the power and flexibility of your legs. I find that working out in a swimming pool with fins, once or twice a week, helps my running. I find that biking, likewise, is helpful.

Let me give you an example of a contralateral injury. A twenty-four year old college runner came to my office complaining of severe pain in the left leg, about three inches above the inner ankle bone. He had had this pain for the past four days. There was a secondary complaint of a nagging injury underneath the knee cap in the right knee. This patient had recently changed to a lighter, more flexible, pair of shoes and had increased mileage. Upon examination, it was seen that the original injury was that



of a runner's knee, secondary to excessive pronation and improper shoes. The presenting complaint was secondary to increased stress on the left foot; and, indeed, a stress fracture was present. This was not seen on original x-rays, but a bone scan was ordered since college competition was anticipated. The bone scan showed increased uptake of radioactive dye, and a stress fracture was diagnosed. The athlete was rehabilitated on both sides with swimming and biking and finally returned to competition.

If you have injuries, think about all your old injuries and rehabilitate fully.

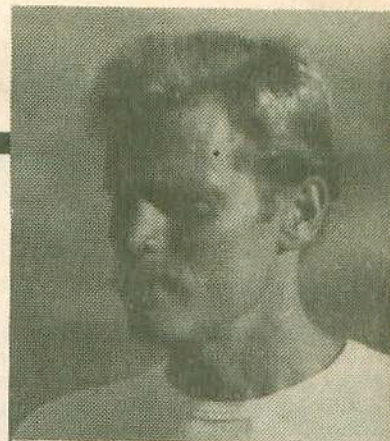
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Ironman Insights

Triathlon Fever



In May of this year I graduated from law school. After 4 years of undergraduate work, 2 years of graduate studies in Sport and American History, and 3 years of intense legal training, I was about to embark upon a career that could be intellectually stimulating and financially rewarding. The latter is important in order to pay off an accumulation of 3 years of sizable loans.

But something has taken hold of me these last 2 years. It's grip became firm at the end of my second year of law school when I turned down an offer as a research assistant for a former U.S. Supreme Court Justice in order to train more while still in school. Now it is November and I have placed my legal career on a voluntary "hold" while I seek out an existence as a professional triathlete, i.e., a "triathlon junkie". My law school friends tell me I must take the bar now while the mountains of legal material gems are still fresh on my mind. I respond that my heart is not in "the law" but in triathlons. They respond that I've been stricken with a sickness—triathlon fever.

Make no mistake, there are tens of thousands of triathletes stricken with triathlon fever. Very few forsake careers. But it would be impossible for me to compete at the level I desire and, at the same time, launch into a law career. I want to try to make a living as a triathlete.

Why do I temporarily forsake a legal career in favor of a triathlon career? After some reflection I do believe that there are at least 3 "rational" reasons: First is the op-

portunity to travel worldwide at little or no expense. Second, I see the opportunity to shape a rapidly growing sport. Third, I enjoy the lifestyle more than any other I've experienced.

TRAVEL: Prior to this year my domestic travels had taken me as far east as Chicago. This year I competed in triathlons on the East Coast and had the opportunity to see more of the country. My trip to the quaint and peaceful community of Oxford, Maryland was really an enriching experience.

Prior to this year my foreign travel consisted of three trips south of the border into Baja. This year I've already had the opportunity to visit the French Riviera, I leave next week for a race in Rio de Janeiro, and I've received an invitation to conduct a series of clinics in West Germany in February. The sport is rapidly spreading worldwide and the opportunity for American triathletes to travel is expanding with the sport. Next year there are triathlons scheduled in Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Mainland China, South America, and numerous European countries. My triathlete friends in West Germany tell me the East Germans and Soviets are "secretly" training triathletes. Hopefully these countries will soon stage their inaugural triathlons.

SHAPING THE SPORT: I truly enjoy conducting or being a part of triathlon clinics. It gives me the opportunity to disseminate information about the sport and share knowledge gained through my 3 years in the sport. At the same time those attending the

seminars invariably teach me new things. There are so many variables, nuances, and unknowns that the more information that is exchanged about triathlons the more our knowledge of the sport will grow.

Perhaps the greatest way in which I feel that I'm able to help shape the sport is through my involvement with the newly formed Association of Professional Triathletes (APT). Our primary purpose is to provide for the welfare of the growing number of professional triathletes and protect their interests in triathlon competitions worldwide.

The APT has put together a Super Series of six races for next season in which we hope will have a minimum of \$50,000 in prize money per race. CBS has agreed to cover our first event on January 8 on the island of Kauai. And we hope to have the Super Series schedule firmed up by the first of the year. Bill Leach, Kathleen McCartney, Kurt Madden, Jody Durst and myself make up the Executive Committee. Larry King, of World Professional Tennis fame, is acting as our executive director.

DO WHAT I ENJOY MOST: My involvement in the legal world led me to believe that far too few people really enjoy their chosen profession. If I were so wealthy I didn't have to work, I believe I would be doing what I am doing. If I were currently working as an attorney I don't believe I could say that.

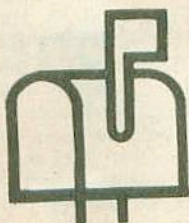
I can honestly say that right now there is nothing I'd rather do than train and compete as a triathlete, participate in triathlon clinics, and write for various publications. I am currently doing what I enjoy most. If I were independently wealthy only a few things would change: First, my wife would insist I trade in our '72 Toyota Corolla for a new BMW 318i. Second, I would buy the house we're now renting. And finally, I would spend far less time hustling sponsorship.

In short, my decision to pursue an athletic career is not without rationale. Hopefully I'll look back 10 years from now and acknowledge that it was an intelligent decision.

Mt. SAC Invitational

Walnut, Oct. 28-29th.

On Friday, October 28th, and Saturday 29th, the Preps once again took over the Mt. SAC Cross-Country facility for competition involving seventy one races and some 6000 athletes. As usual the level of competition was super, with the Meet providing its usual showcase of California's talent statewide. The competition was divided into Division I (10th-12th enrollment 1099 or less-Friday), Division II (1100-1599-Saturday), and Division III (1600 plus-Saturday), with individual and team sweepstakes races along the way to bring top squads and individuals together. Cool weather held both days to make for good racing conditions.

Headlining the Meet was a titanic individual Sweepstakes race for the Men on Saturday. Jesus Gutierrez (Pasadena), Jim Ortiz (Barstow), and Calvin Gaziano (Castro Valley), all have two mile track pr's around 9:00, and Gutierrez and Gaziano were undefeated thus far in their half of the State. Ted Goodlake (Fallbrook, San Diego) did most of the pace work through a 4:41 mostly flat first mile before the pack hit the challenging switchback loop. It was during the up-and-down of this challenging section that makes up most of the second mile that Gutierrez and Ortiz edged away from their northern challenger. As the Southern Cal duo crested the final Reservoir Hill Ortiz edged away to perhaps a ten yard lead on the downhill section. With a bit over a quarter mile left on the flat on into the chute Gutierrez edged up to Ortiz, and in the final 330 yards moved away to a 14:49-14:53 triumph. Gutierrez' mark helps him as the third fastest All-Time on the course (with the 5th fastest run ever), with Ortiz now fourth All-Time on the course. Gaziano, a junior, recorded an excellent 15:01 (equal number twelve All-Time, and tied for the best ever non-Southern Section athlete's performance at Mt. SAC). This race had to be among the best ever in-season prep competitions ever, as 17th place was 15:50 (worth about 15:00 on a flat course).

The Men's Team Sweepstakes had the same intersectional nature. Most of the Southern Section's top squads were present, led by the 2A top-ranked Arroyo of El Monte squad. An eager Arroyo group took the pace out the first mile, led by Mike Perez. The Monte Vista (San Diego) duo of Martin Sandoval and Ari Schauder moved to the front during the second mile, and a

Jesuit (Sacramento) group eased up through the pack as the race wore on. The San Diego stars edged away to a fine 1-2 sweep, and the Sacramentoans continued to move up during the third mile to their eventual team win with 70 points (79:48). Arroyo was 2nd at 95 (80:24), and Monte Vista used its up-front power for third at 104 (79:57). With the Soph twins of Mark (3rd-15:43) and Eric (7th-15:47) Mastalir, and with anyone else of quality returning the next year or two on the Jesuit squad it would seem capable of going after the 78:08 Mt. SAC team time record of Helix San Diego 78:08 from 1977.

The Young Women's Team Sweepstakes featured the individual duel between Joni Mooney (Vacaville) and Chantal Plante (Arroyo Grande). The duo was separated by a second at the Stanford Invitational, but the Mt. SAC hills seemed much more to the liking of the powerful San Francisco Bay area star, as Mooney powered away up a steep grade just prior to two miles during a 17:58-18:21 victory over Plante. Mooney becomes only the second non-Southern Section athlete under 18:00 (and the 11th All-Time) with her run. San Gabriel's Sylvia Mosqueda paced a good 18:13 in winning Saturday's Individual Sweepstakes race. Tustin continued to roll over everyone, clocking 95:20 with 64 points to take the Team Sweeps (number eight All-Time team clocking here). El Dorado (Placentia) clocked 96:57 in an individual Sweeps win fueled by super frosh runners Julie Cooper (19:08) and Beth Rospajla (19:10) behind senior Marcia Escobosa (18:54).

Top performers in Friday's Smaller Schools action was El Camino (Ocean-side) at 82:13 and a Team Sweepstakes victory with 70 points. The Wildcats' John Groulx at 15:44 equalled the time of Adolfo Garcia (Escondido) for Friday's top individual clocking. San Marito (103:12) scored a Women's Team Sweepstakes win on Friday, with Cheryl Oslinker (South Hills, Covina) at 19:01 edging Carol Doody (Webb, Claremont) 19:02 for that day's quickest Women's clocking.

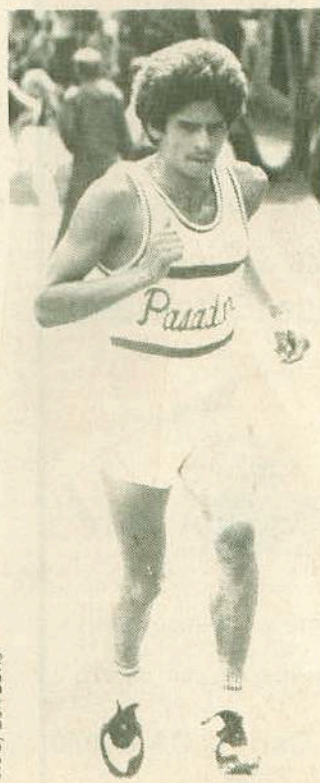

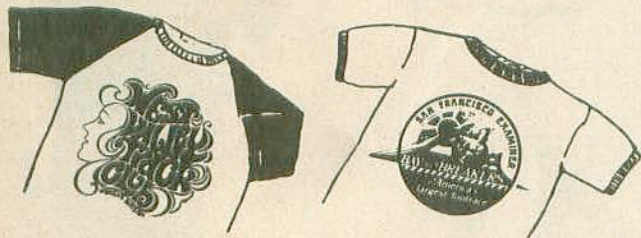

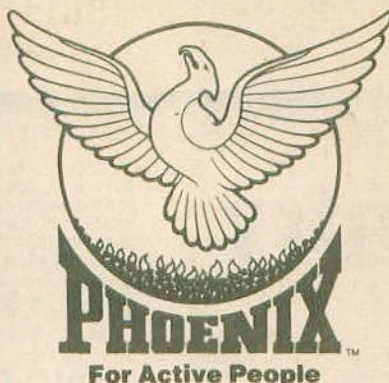

Most everyone made the transition from the North American Tectonic Plate to the Pacific Tectonic Plate without faltering, even though the latter is moving northwest several inches per century.

Why this race doesn't attract thousands of runners is a mystery.

An Interview with Dave Scott

2.4 Mile Swim, 112 Mile Cycle, 26.2 Run.

Dave Scott, a week after his 3rd Ironman Victory, summarized his 9:05:56 effort as one of "supreme concentration". And judging from his appearance as he ran the final 100 meters of the marathon, it was obvious that only the single minded intensity of a champion kept him going. With just 10 meters to go he weakly raised his hand to acknowledge the screaming crowd that pressed along both sides of the finish chute. As he did so, his eyes rolled up and his head fell back suddenly; a startled expression crossed his face as if even he was surprised at the apparent frailty of his body.

Scott had driven himself into such a narrow trance-like state that his nervous system couldn't tolerate any new range of motion. That single, simple effort of raising his arm almost totally disrupted the tenuous control he struggled to maintain over his body. He quickly dropped his arm and trotted the remaining distance without expression.

There was no sign of relief as he crossed the line, just a vacant look of exhaustion.

The final 8 miles of the run had, in Scott's words, "been pulled out of his fingernails". And I believe him. I saw all the top men and women finish, and without exception, Scott had pushed the hardest. He had to 2nd place finisher Scott Tinley, 6 1/2 minutes down in 43rd place after the swim had passed Scott near the end of the bike leg and started the run with a 30 second lead. By mile 1 Scott regained the lead and, even though it was very early for a marathon, continued to push hard in an effort to break contact and discourage Tinley. By mile 18 he had established a lead of 3 minutes, 50 seconds. It was a gutsy and aggressive move that provided just enough margin to eventually hold off the stronger looking Tinley.

Over the final 6 miles Tinley gained back over 3 minutes to finish a scant 37 seconds behind Scott. In contrast to the almost limp Scott, Tinley charged powerfully into the finish chute with teeth clinched in grim determination.

Both men ran a superb race: consider the fact that Mark Allen was 15 minutes back in 3rd place and Marc Thompson in 4th was 43 minutes behind Scott. In short: Scott and Tinley ran away with it.

An interesting note on the bike ride. With about 30 miles remaining in the cycling leg Scott picked up one of the infamous carpet tacks. After knocking it off with his glove he noticed a gradual softening of the tire. Rather than risk a 3 to 4 minute tire change he gambled and kept on riding. The tire continued to deflate but it did get him to the bike-run transition. A short time after Scott dismounted the tire was completely flat.

A week after the race I questioned Dave about his background, the '83 racing season, and his future.

In high school Dave played football, basketball, swim, and made All-American in water polo. He continued swimming and water polo at UC Davis

and graduated with a Phys. Ed. degree with an emphasis in physiology in 1976.

After 3 Ironman Victories he is acknowledged as "The Man" by his fellow competitors. However, he had a disappointing '83 short-course season which prompted rumors of burnout, fatigue, etc. After Hawaii of course, they were immediately replaced with "knowledgeable" explanations that he had trained through the short tri in preparation for Hawaii.

Dave's explanation is that because of some unrelated problems he did not maintain a consistent training program. Also, giving credence to some rumors, he did find it difficult to get mentally "up" for the short races. But rather than discourage him, Scott said his lackluster

season, coupled with a 27th place finish in the USTF Nationals at Bass Lake, served to motivate him to win the big one.

As a result of his less than ideal training and subpar season, Dave felt that he was not as physically and mentally prepared as he had been for Hawaii '82 when he blasted the field by 20 minutes with the fastest split in each leg. "I was not in optimum physical shape going into the race, but I felt emotionally and mentally ready to press myself to the limit." He knew that only if everything clicked could he win again.

Regarding Scott's future, he sees no physical limitations for several years but is a little hesitant regarding his desire to maintain the mental intensity and dedication necessary for world class competition. He intends to lecture internationally, become involved in triathlon team coaching, and pursue his interest in biomechanical and physiological research.

In addition to training, Scott is a fitness consultant who designs individual training, tactical, and nutritional programs for triathletes. (Speaking of nutrition: yes, he really does wash his cottage cheese). With so much devoted to training, he enjoys the mental stimulation of consulting and intends to expand his programs.

Although this article is based on my observation of and interview with Dave Scott, it is impossible not to pay tribute to the Puntous Twins, Sylviane and Patricia. I honestly believe that they herald a new era of excellence in women's triathlons. Sylviane won in 10:43:34 smashing last years record by 20 1/2 minutes while Patricia, delayed by about six minutes repairing a "lack flat", finished second in 10:49:25, also breaking last years record.

While the early swim and bike leaders, Jennifer Hinshaw and Jackie Shaw faded in the run, the Twins ran with technical smoothness and strength that clearly set them apart from 99% of the athletes, men and women.

Sounds like hyperbole? Get this: Sylviane and Patricia split 3:22:28 and 3:22:35 in the marathon, a time that was

bettered by only 8 men in the world's most elite Triathlon field. The only woman who can race with the Twins is Linda Buchanan, the 1983 Nice Triathlon winner. (The Twins did not race in Nice.) But if Buchanan continues to skip Hawaii as she did this year, Sylviane and Patricia are destined to dominate for years to come.

As for the men's race next year I look for Scott to win his 4th Ironman. His technical and intelligent approach to diet, training, and competition; his extraordinary powers of concentration; and most important on race day, his superior desire to win all mark Dave Scott as "The Man" to watch in '84.

Leukemia Soc.- Coronado Bridge 10K

San Diego, Oct. 28.

This race was designated by TAC as a national championship; a men's national championship, this is. It used to be that all the hot shoes would show up for something like this, but in this day of big bucks, prize money, appearance money, under and over the table money, the top runners just don't show any more.

Unless there's money.

Well, there isn't going to be any at a TAC championship, so you can kiss your field goodbye.

But, wait a minute! What do you mean? You call Thom Hunt, Harrison Koroso, Mark Nenow, Allan Scharu, Rick Musgrave and Jim Ryun a bunch of no-names? Why, that's a great field!

Yeah, it would be except for two things. Number one, even with a lineup like that, that's only about 10% of what should have been there. Number two, none of these guys were really ready to run. Not that they didn't give it all they had, but look what they were up against: Nenow ran over 100 miles in the 7 days prior to the race; he trained through it, rather than key on it, Hunt-recovering from injury. Musgrave-several tough races recently, not really ready. Ryun-a legend, even in his time, but this isn't his time. Not that a 33:21 is jogging, but you don't win national championships with it. And so on. Some of the guys were there only because their sponsor asked them to show the colors.

So, to his surprise, Steve McCormack, former UCLA, found himself in control by 4 miles. And got himself a nice win. He also got a nice plaque and a \$60 gift certificate. Compare that with the \$20,000 Mike Musyoki picked up a couple of weeks later in the Pro-Comfort 10K. Also compare the fields in the two races. (Ed. note: The Pro-Comfort 10K will appear in the next issue of CTRN).

Nevertheless, it was an interesting race. Starting at the Coronado end of the

Coronado bridge and ending in Balboa Park, the race was almost all uphill. The only down was coming off the bridge, with its spectacular view of San Diego's big bay. The leaders took it pretty easy going up the bridge at the start. As they crested and headed down, Johnny Halberstadt broke away and got out about 25 yards. No one was especially worried, as they related later because some guys just run very fast downhill, and there wasn't going to be much of that in this race. Sure enough, after leaving the bridge, the lead pack began to reel Halberstadt in and a little past 2 miles, he was part of the pack again. The 2 mile split was about 9:30. No one ever heard a one mile time. We don't even know if there was one, but near as anyone could tell, it was a tick or two over 5 minutes. Slow, but don't forget the bridge: a long uphill.

By 11 minutes the lead pack was down

to 9, and the more prominent among them were Steve Bishop, who had a 2 step lead, Nenow, Hunt, Scharu, McCormack and a lone black whom no one could identify. No one on the press truck, that is. The runners knew it was Harrison Koroso of Kenya, now living in Tucson. We all figured it was some guy jumping up front to get on TV. The sponsors were taping the race. By 3 miles we began to wonder. He was hanging right up in front and looking no worse than anyone else.

Three miles was reached in 14:13 and Hunt was no longer in sight. The pack was down to 5 and included Koroso, Bishop, McCormack, Tom Smith and Nenow, running almost in a line abreast. At 16:30 McCormack took the lead but only briefly. Smith made a move, which also turned out to be brief. The course was all uphill now, and except for a short stretch at the finish, would pretty much stay that way, with only an occasional respite.

At 17:20, McCormack was back in the lead. He wasn't surging or even making a break. The others were just not keeping up. McCormack said, later, he hadn't come to win. He just wanted to hang with the leaders as long as he could and finish as close as he could. Well, now he was the leader. At 5 miles, the press truck stopped so we could get a look at some of the rest of the field. At that time Koroso and Bishop were running side by side in second place. As they went by the truck, one of the reporters, totally frustrated over not knowing who this guy fighting for second was, leaned over the side and called out, "Hey! What's your name?" Obviously, it wasn't our day as Steve Bishop turned his head back towards us and called out, "Bishop!"

Thanks, Steve.

So, McCormack did it. Came home in 29:58. Koroso got second, outlasting Bishop by 4 seconds in 30:11. AW's Tom Smith was 4th and Nenow was 5th with 30:28 clocking.

Patti Hurl, a pretty good local, was the first female, running her second 10K of the weekend. Her time was only 38:37, but all things considered, the course, he race the previous day, it wasn't bad. There wasn't anything any better, in an case. There was one almost as good though, and that was Ellen Turkel who took second. Hurl said that Turkel is very good hill runner and she knew she was being pushed by Turkel up the final hill to the park. But, she held on for 9 second win. This wasn't a women's championship, so there wasn't any dept at all to the women's field. In fact, Hurl and Turkel were the only ones to break 4 minutes. No one else was even close. That's unusual for San Diego, but most of the better runners had raced the day before.

A rather ugly dispute developed over the team standings. It appeared the Athletics West won the team championship, but Maccabi Union claimed the were by virtue of having the first finishers. That plus their next 2 finishers gave them the lowest total time. Not said AW. McCormack doesn't run for you Who says?

We says.

And, I says, says McCormack. In fact, neither does Koroso. McCormack runs for adidas and Koroso runs for Converse West. But, and here's where things really get gooeey, McCormack has once been registered with Maccabi, although he reregistered later with adidas he never officially disassociated himself from Maccabi. And, Maccabi entered him in the race on their team. So, according Ken Bernard, head of the San Diego area TAC, McCormack's divorce isn't final. A protested, and apparently, despite misgivings on TAC's part, the protest was disallowed. AW may protest to the National office.

Actually, it would hardly pay. Tea Champion in a turnout like this doesn't really mean much. In fact, doesn't mean diddly. I mean, like, no one was there. Sure, 10 years from now, someone looking through the records might be impressed, but for anyone who was there or wasn't there, for that matter, deal! McCormack was really stoked

about his personal win at first, but after awhile reality set in. He'll take it, but he knows it's not quite as good as it looks. Too bad it had to end that way, because it really was a nice event. There were close to 7,000 entrants. They had so many race day entrants that the start was postponed 15 minutes, something almost unheard of in San Diego because of their unusually stringent controls over such things as course control and start times.

One lesson that must have been driven home, however, was that TAC will have to do something to guarantee more competition in their national championships. Prize money is one obvious answer. Now that trust accounts are legal and flourishing, AND pioneered by TAC in the first place, maybe it's time for TAC to take advantage of the very loophole they created.

Santa Monica, Nov. 6.

On a day when there were six sanctioned races on the TAC schedule in the L.A. area, it didn't figure that any of them would draw enough people to claim all the medals. Jon Douglas did okay, though. They had a little over 1600 finishers, which is very respectable on a day when you're the only game in town.

As usual, this run draws heavily from its area: Santa Monica and the west side of L.A. Also, as usual, the Santa Monica Track Club picked up more than its share of the awards. But, right up in the front, from about the first mile on, there was a strange face. Not more than 3 people in the county knew who it was, and two of them were his relatives. His name was Jerzy Kowohl and he is the record holder in the 10,000 meters, on the track in Poland.

Poland?

What's he doing here? And in the Jon Douglas 10K, of all places? Well, it seems that he came to the USA to run the New York Marathon. At 30 km. he dropped out with an injury, apparently in his thigh. So, being as he was over here, he decided to come out to California and visit his brother, who lives in L.A., and whom he hadn't seen in 5 years. And, while he was here, he figured he might as well try to make up for the bad luck in the Big Apple.

He sure did. By 2 miles, he was all alone, and though a customary ferocious final surge by Santa Monica's Bob Macias narrowed the gap somewhat, Kowohl had it all to himself, and finished in 29:40, over a minute ahead of, and out of sight of, Macias. To be fair about all this, Kowohl caught Macias on the mend from a leg injury of his own. Still, give the guy credit: He won it fair and square.

Sheila Ralston, who used to do her running for nearby UCLA, got out pretty quickly and lead the whole way to be the first female. Pat Story never saw Ralston until about the 5K, because of the crowd around her, and she thought that she was in the lead. When she saw Ralston, it was too late. She went for it, but Ralston proved too strong on the downhill second half. At the mile, Story was only 5

seconds behind Ralston, but completely unaware of her, she settled into what she felt was a pretty good cruising speed. Ralston didn't know who was behind her or how close, but kept her mind on hanging with some of the men who were just ahead of her. Toward the end, she let herself ease in. As she put it, "I didn't kill myself at the end." She finished in 35:03. Story in 35:32. Michelle Hopper was 3rd. Time was 36:54.

Looking at the men again, Macias finished in 30:42, followed by teammate Rich Hornish in 31:09. In all, SMTCC took 6 out of the first 10 places. Well, why not? It's their home turf. They run every day on most of the course.

One item of note was the T-Shirts. They were about as nice as you'll ever see. The runners were given a bright crimson T-shirt with what looked like a hand painted (it wasn't, but it looked like it) running shoe in white and black. Very striking. But not quite as much as the ones the race officials and staff got. Theirs was the same thing except the color was bright green. Gee, they were nice!

'83 Half Marathon Rankings

These rankings represent interim 1983 rankings for the half marathon, based on race results received by October 9, 1983. So far for 1983, we have received results for 25,603 finishers from 25 races. This compares to last year's total of 38,909 from 53 races. We have not received official results from the Super Summer (Tacoma, WA) and New Bedford (MA) races nor from the quite recent Philadelphia Distance Classic or Dayton (OH) River Corridor Classic. We have only partial results from Coronado (CA) and America's Finest City (San Diego, CA).

The National Running Data Center is an independent, non-profit organization devoted to the collection, analysis, publication and dissemination of long distance running information. The NRDC processes all applications for US road records. Records approved by the NRDC are then submitted to the RRCA and TAC for official recognition. The NRDC is supported by donations from individuals, clubs, race organizations, companies and the national governing bodies.

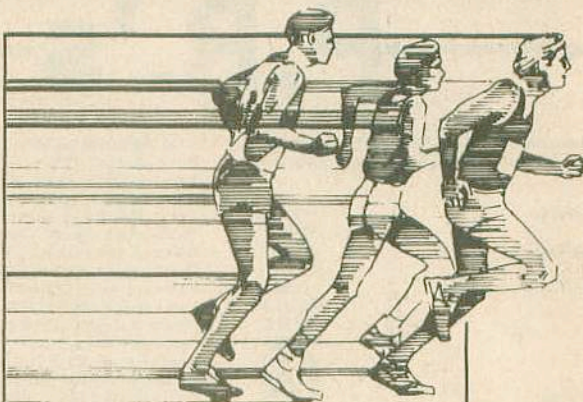
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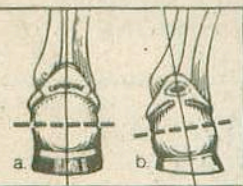
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
