

This is the third edition of the High School Track & Field Annual, every effort having been made by the author to make it the finest yet. Best performance lists have been increased from 50 to 60 per event, relay lists have been expanded as have miscellaneous event compilations. Nearly a dozen marks have been uncovered that were not previously known to the author.

Addition of 10 marks per event has broadened the coverage but has not included too many performances of other than the past few seasons. Standards have risen so sharply in many events over the past three years that many events are made up almost exclusively of athletes of the 1954-57 era. It is unfortunate that those standouts of the pre-war years cannot be recognized by the stopwatch and tape must be the final judge in the compilation of this annual.

Having uncovered almost a dozen marks that I did not know of in 1957, it becomes quite evident that some have been overlooked. However, every attempt has been made to include all marks that qualify for this publication. Likewise, much time has been spent in checking the validity of performances. Many have been rejected as the result of this check.

No mark has been restricted because of type of meet, competition or whether it was or was not a winning effort. The National Interscholastic Federation will not accept marks for its honor roll that do not meet the same specifications as those accepted as national records. That means they must be made in recognized meets including four or more schools, with conditions legal as to aiding wind, level ground in field events, etc. Despite this the National Interscholastic Federation has overlooked literally dozens of marks over the years that qualify for its lists. In addition wind-blown marks have been listed as legitimate and even completely erroneous performances have somehow received the stamp of validity. One miler was credited with a time over 10 seconds under his best while a shot putter was credited with a put better than five feet beyond his top competitive effort. This body refused to accept non-winning performances, even though officially timed. However, non-winning marks frequently creep into their lists. Though the federation will not accept dual meet performances as records today, they did so in the case of the pole vault in 1938.

The point of this is to say that I have attempted to record best performances by high school boys regardless of when or where they were made. In many track-conscious states dual and triangular meets make up a big percentage of the schedule. In certain areas these meets are better officiated than some state meets. In many parts of the country weather is very often poor for the "big" meets. The 1956 Indiana and New Jersey State meets were held in virtual downpours. It is not felt that performances made in earlier meets of lesser importance should be excluded and the athlete penalized simply because he was the victim of obstinate and illogical officials.

Marks made in AAU or other outside competition have been included as have non-winning marks in all types of competition where it has been assumed that such times (unofficial in most cases) are reasonably accurate. The object of this publication is to record best performances by high school boys and give recognition where it is due.

Timing in high school sprint and hurdle races, especially the former, are oft-times questionable. Undoubtedly some of the non-wind list should be on the wind list. Every attempt has been made to sift them into their proper spots.

Performances have been included by boys enrolled in high school who were ineligible to compete in interscholastic athletics under the rules of their state athletic associations. It is felt that since there is no national age limit it would be unfair to penalize a boy who, though ineligible to compete in his own state, would be permitted to compete in other states. Milt Campbell of Plainfield, N.J., in the 1953 season, falls into this category. All boys who are regularly enrolled in high school under the age of 20 are eligible for inclusion. Two boys who had reached their 20th birthdays have been included for different reasons. Sid Bowman of Hammond, La., was 20 in his senior year, 1928, as his State Association and many others of that era had more flexible rules it was felt that he should be included as he was in good standing as the rules dictated. The Indiana State High School Athletic Association ruled Leo Williams of Muncie Central to be 20 in 1936, though Williams claimed to be 19 and there was no official birth record to substantiate either. For that reason I have seen fit to list him. Quite probably many listed in this annual were 20 while in high school though this information is not available to the author.

In the case of prep school boys some of them are completing their normal high school education while others are one or two years beyond the high school level. It was decided to include some marks by prep school boys if: they had not received a diploma from previous attendance at a high school; had not attended a combined total of more than four years in a high school and prep school; and had not reached their 20th birthday. Many prep school boys were eliminated on the above specifications.

I would like to thank all the Track Coaches, Athletic Directors, State High School Executive Officers, High School Sports Editors, Metropolitan High School Writers, the athletes themselves and many others who were kind enough to answer my letters of inquiry. In particular I would like to thank Hugh Gardner of Indianapolis and M/SGT. Robert Gilmore of March AFB, Calif., who have contributed many of the marks included here that otherwise would have been unknown to the author.

I will appreciate it if any interested track fan will bring my attention to the errors in performance, meet, site, date, spelling or of omission that I have made. I shall be happy to award a complimentary copy of the book for any bona fide correction or addition.

Evolution of Records

Below is listed the progression of Official National Interscholastic Records. Information has been gathered from the National Federation files, NCAA and Federation Guides. It is believed that this is the first such evolution table compiled.

The National Federation began recognizing records in 1925. None of the marks recognized at that time had been officially submitted. Most of them were taken from the AAU Handbook (which began listing them in 1904) even though none of the marks had been checked out for validity. It merely comprised a list of best marks.

In 1935, the Federation succeeded in knocking the high hurdles from 42 inches to 39, and the low hurdles from 220 yards to 200 (with the distance between hurdles cut to a pointless 18 yards). However, it was not until 1938 that the Federation got around to accepting records in the new low hurdle event, and it was still another year before the new high hurdle record got into the books. The lightweight discus made its debut in 1939 and it was given record recognition a year later.

Little by little erroneous records were weeded out. Deserving performances were submitted years late. This accounts for certain records appearing out of chronological order. Too, many perfectly valid marks over the 1925-1935 period were never submitted. Others were submitted but were never accepted for no apparent reason. The author has checked the Federation files in Chicago and knows this to be a fact. The majority of these marks appear in these lists so no effort has been made to list them here. Therefore, the following compilation does not pretend to be a progression of best performances by high school boys. It is merely a table of those performances that did receive official acceptance, even though some did not meet stipulated specifications.
