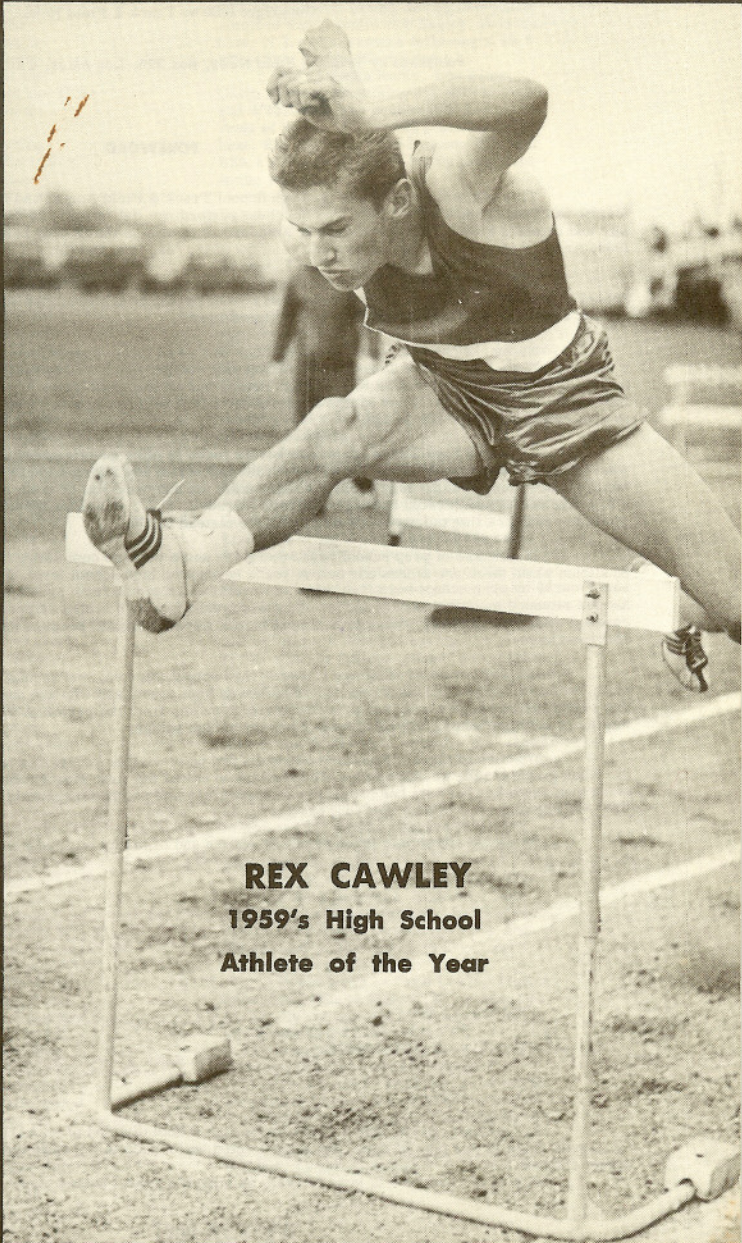

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FOREWORD

This is the fifth edition of the High School Track & Field Annual and for the second straight year the format has been changed somewhat. The 1959 best performers list is again 25 deep, but in this edition the meet, site and date are given for all performers. An added attraction is the 12 deep best performances list for 1959. Another addition is a best performers list for 1948, '49, '50, and '51.

Also included are the all-time best performers list, all-time best by class, and the National High School Track & Field records. The latter differs from the National Federation standards in that it recognizes all marks made under legal conditions in sanctioned meets.

No marks have been restricted because of type of meet, competition or whether it was or was not a winning effort. Marks made in AAU or other outside competition have been included as have non-winning marks in all types of competition where it has been assumed that such times (unofficial in most cases) are reasonably accurate. The object of this annual is to record best performances by high school athletes and to give recognition where it is due.

Timing in high school sprint and hurdle races is often questionable. Undoubtedly some of the non-wind times should be on the wind list and we would appreciate any information to that effect. There are factors other than wind that may exclude a mark from the non-wind list or from any list. Last season, a 9.3 credited to John Mostyn of Bergen Catholic, Oradell, N.J., was taken off the list because of overwhelming evidence that the race was only 95 yards instead of 100.

In the case of prep school boys, there are some who are completing their normal high school education while there are others one or two years beyond the high school level. It was decided to include some marks by prep school boys if they had not received a diploma from previous attendance at a high school; had not attended a combined total of more than four years in a high school or prep school; and had not reached their 20th birthday. Many prep school marks were eliminated because they failed to pass the above specifications.

As there is no national age limit for high school athletes, and regulations vary from state to state, we have included all boys regularly enrolled in high school and who are under 20 years of age. There are several known exceptions, and probably more unknown, from the period of 30 or more years ago when it was more common among 20 year olds to compete in high school.

We wish to thank all those who have helped us make this annual as accurate and complete as it is. When giving thanks we can't forget Dick Bank, who edited the first three editions of the Annual and who more than any other person, has brought order, accuracy and completeness to high school track and field statistics.

We would appreciate learning of any errors and of marks omitted.

1960 PREVIEW

The often-repeated phrase "preps are better than ever" is likely to hold true during the coming track and field campaign.

All-time marks should fall in the hurdles and could be surpassed in the sprints. Two of last year's bright sophomores figure to head the 440 field and improvement is expected in the shot put following the expected slump last spring. Continued improvement is anticipated in a loaded javelin field.

Three of the standouts returning are low-hurdler and sprinter Pat Mitchell of Columbus, Tex. (transfer from Gainesville, Tex.), high hurdler Mel Renfro of Jefferson in Portland, Ore., and Hubie Watson, sprinter from Jordan in Los Angeles, Calif.

Mitchell, coached by his father, zipped the 180-yard lows in 18.1 with a wind and 18.4 without a wind, the latter equalling the all-time best set in 1957 by Jesse Bradford of Shafter, Calif. Mitchell also had wind clockings of 21.4 and 20.5 in the sprints and 9.7 and 21.0 without any wind assistance.

Renfro finished six inches behind Steve Pauly of Beaverton, Ore., when the latter set the national record of 13.8 and both were credited with the same time. Renfro also is a capable low hurdler, having done 19.2 around a turn.

Watson could easily develop into the best sprinter in prep history. He won the California 100-yard dash crowns in his sophomore and junior years and startled the track world by copping the 100 at the Compton Invitational meet against a fast field in 9.6 last June. His all-time bests are 9.5 and 20.8.

An item which makes the prep track picture more rosy is the crop of returning juniors who performed so well as sophomores last spring.

Albuquerque, N.M., High School offers two great juniors. One is Hiram Carroll who clipped off a 48.6 for the 440, an all-time best for a sophomore. Another top boy is Ray Etherly who clocked 9.4 with the help of an 8-mile an hour wind and 9.7 without.

Ted Nelson of Andrews, Tex., is another with a promising future. He ran a 9.6 century with a wind and a 48.9 440 last year. He also anchored Andrews' great mile relay team to a 3:16.4 clocking with a 47.6 leg. The 3:16.4, a non-winning effort behind the University of Houston, is tops on the all-time list.

Detroit emerged with a good group of cinder performers in 1959 and two of the better ones were sophomores Henry Carr of Southwestern and Terry Moore of Redford.

Carr ran 21.0 in the 220 and had a 20.8 clocking with the wind. He won both sprints in the city championships and is regarded as a coming great. Moore cracked the national soph standard in the mile with a 4:23.6, well under the previous best of 4:25.7.

Here is a rundown of each event:
Sprints -- Pretty well covered with

Watson, Mitchell, Etherly and Carr the top returnees.

440 -- Real promising for the future with Carroll and Nelson having two years ahead of them. Junior Bob Bagley, Atlantic City, N.J., also returns following a 48.6 effort late in the 1959 season.

880 -- Robin Ruble, Los Altos, Calif., a very promising boy with a 1:54.9 and 4:23.3 distance double as a junior. Bill Pratt of Wenatchee, Wash., has a 1:55.9 best. Bill Rawson, Lake Forest, Ill., did 1:55.1 last season and is highly thought of in the Midwest.

Mile -- Californians Dennis Davidson of McClatchy in Sacramento and Dave Boore of Los Altos have eyes on the 4:11.0 mark established by Dale Story of Orange, Calif., last year. Davidson did 4:22.6n and Boore 4:23.0 last year. Both must contend with Palo Alto's Mike Chilton, who had bests of 1:56.4 and 4:22.4n before illness struck in '59.

Hurdles -- Renfro and Herm Johnson, Plainfield, N.J., are clearly the standouts in the highs and Mitchell in the lows. New standards are likely in both events with Johnson also a sub-14.0 possibility over the 42-inch barriers.

Shot Put -- Gary Gubner (61'3"), DeWitt Clinton of New York City, and Frank Mazza (60'8"), of Long Branch, N.J., top a field that should be better than last year's. Gubner's effort is second only to Dallas Long's 61'5" as a junior and Mazza came fast at the tailend of the '59 campaign.

Discus -- Not too many of the top tossers return, but a good year is expected nevertheless. Doug Schoenewetter, of Fremont in Sunnyvale, Calif., whirled the prep disc 173'2½" to rank 10th last spring. He also did 150'9" with the college weight to rate third.

Javelin -- Preps have made rapid progress in this event and the trend should continue with six of last spring's top 15 returning. Heading the field is Ed Red, Lafayette, La., with a best of 214'4½". Jerry Hinkle, Exeter Academy in Exeter, N.H., and Dave Miller, Lancaster, Pa., threw 202'7" and 198'2½", respectively, as sophomores in '59. Also returning are Joe Cage (204'8"), Neville of Monroe, La., and Bob Barkas (203'7½"), Hanover Park, N.J. Cage holds the all-time soph mark of 206'3".

High Jump -- Three Californians head the field here with Modesto's Ted Watkins expected to improve on his 6'6½" effort. Tiny Terry Llewellyn (6'6"), San Mateo, and Archie Green (6'5"), from Oakland give the event more class.

Broad Jump -- Fred Lewis, Tech of Springfield, Mass., did 23'8" to rank 15th in '59. He's a definite 24-foot possibility along with Don Richmond (23'4"), Jefferson of Los Angeles, who displayed rapid improvement towards the end of the season.

Pole Vault -- Only one of the top 15 returns. However, it took 13'6" or better to make the top 15 in 1959. The leading returnee is Bob Maimbourg, Garden Grove, Calif., who did 13'10" and has his sights on 14'6" or better in 1960.

1959 REVIEW

Rex Cawley and Archie San Romani Jr., were the fair haired boys of the 1959 prep track world in a season which saw all-time standards fall in more events than in any other campaign.

Cawley, who hails from Farmington, Mich., accounted for new marks in the 110-

meter hurdles (13.9), 220-yard lows (23.0nmt) 440-yard hurdles (51.5) and 400-meter hurdles (51.3n). San Romani, the feather-footed runner from East High in Wichita, Kansas, ran the mile in 4:08.9n, also an all-time best.

Records also fell in the regular prep

high hurdles, the discus and javelin throws, and the sprint medley, mile and four-mile relays. In addition, Pat Mitchell, Gainesville, Texas, equalled the 18.4 low hurdles mark set by Jesse Bradford of Shafter, Calif., three years ago.

Cawley climaxed his season by placing in all three hurdle events at the National AAU championships in Boulder, Colo., a feat never before accomplished by any athlete. He also was the only prep to qualify for a trip to Europe. Cawley was clocked in 13.9 for the 110-meter hurdles in Oslo, Norway.

San Romani capped a great season by running 4:08.9 at the Compton Invitational meet. He beat little Dale Story of Orange, Calif., who had run 4:11.0 the previous week. San Romani earlier clocked 4:10.0 after running 1:56.6 for the half mile in the Missouri Valley AAU championships. His double was the best ever on the prep level.

Accounting for the other prep records were Steve Pauly, Beaverton, Ore., 13.8 for the high hurdles; Karl Johnstone, North Phoenix, Ariz., 194'5" for the prep discus; and Glenn Winingham, Grants Pass, Ore., 225'6½" for the javelin.

Relay marks went to Bellflower, Calif., 3:30.7 in the sprint medley; Andrews, Texas, 3:16.4n in the mile relay; and Palo Alto, Calif., 17:51.8 in the four-mile relay.

Others who cracked all-time bests but who happened to come along in the wrong year were Mel Renfro, Jefferson, Portland, Ore., who ran 13.8 while chasing Pauly to a new high hurdles mark; Story, whose 4:11.0 is the best ever in a high school race; Bob Middleton, Harding, Marion, Ohio, who threw the prep discus 184'6"; and Long Beach Poly., Calif., which ran 3:31.1n in the sprint medley relay.

The previous record holders were George Hearn, Lower Merion, Ardmore,

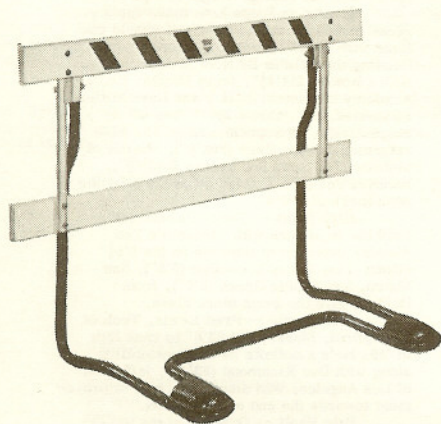
Pa., 13.9 in the high hurdles; Dyrrol Burleson, Cottage Grove, Ore., 4:13.2 in the mile; and Al Oerter, Sewanhaka, Floral Park, N.Y., 184'2½" in the discus. Jan Sikorsky, Ramsay, Mt. Pleasant, Pa., held the old javelin record with a heave of 222'10½".

The mile crop was easily the best in history as 13 competitors bettered 4:20.0, six of them in one race. That was in the California State championships where Story posted his 4:11.0. Following Story were Jack Hudson, El Cajon, 4:16.7; George Linn, Palo Alto, 4:18.3; Steve Matthews, Hollywood, 4:19.2; Bill Yaley, Serra, San Mateo, 4:19.2; and Jim Pedersen, Arcadia, 4:19.4. Juniors Dennis Davidson, McClatchy, Sacramento, 4:22.6; and Dave Boore, Los Altos, 4:23.3; were seventh and eighth.

Story, only 5'8" and 130 pounds, clipped off a 9:28.2 for two miles and also was clocked in 1:53.1 for the 880 during a relay race.

Four pole vaulters went over 14 feet with John Cramer, Mt. Vernon, Wash., taking over second place on the all-time list with a 14'3" effort. John Rose, Hoover, Glendale, Calif., did 14'1"; Jerry Armon, West, Phoenix, Ariz., did 14'¾"; and Dallas Buchanan, San Marino, Calif., cleared 14 feet even.

Rivaling Cawley for all-around honors was Dixon Farmer of Miramonte H. S. in Orinda, Calif. Farmer, a top decathlon prospect, won the California state low hurdles crown for the second straight year and also copped the 440. His best times were 19.1 and 48.2. He ran 400 meters in 47.3 at the National AAU meet. He has also run the 880 in 1:57.1 and broad jumped 23'4½". In non-prep events, Farmer ran the 220-yard lows in 23.1n, the 400-meter hurdles in 52.4n and the 440-yard hurdles in 53.3.

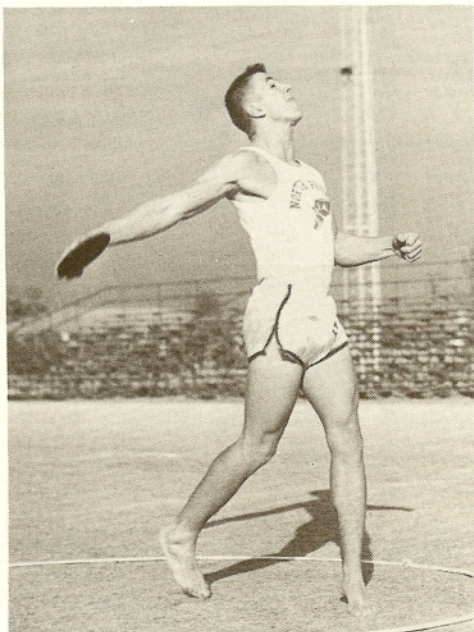
