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FOREWORD

This is the sixth edition of the High School Track and Field Annual and features the most extensive all-time performers list ever published. We have increased the number of athletes to 100 per event compared to 75 used in the 1957 annual, the last time a complete all-time list was presented.

Also included is a 1960 performers list (30 deep in each event), a review of the 1960 season and a preview of 1961, a 12-deep performances list for 1960, a feature article on the top 10 all-time prep athletes, the all-time best by class marks and the National High School Track and Field records. The latter differs from the National Federation standards in that it recognizes all marks made under legal conditions in sanctioned meets.

No marks have been restricted because of type of meet, competition or whether it was or was not a winning effort. Marks made in AAU or other outside competition have been included as have non-winning marks in all types of competition where it has been assumed that such times (unofficial in most cases) are reasonably accurate. The object of this annual is to record best performances by high school athletes and to give recognition where it is due.

Timing in high school sprint and hurdle races is often questionable. Undoubtedly some of the non-wind times should be on the wind list and we would appreciate any information to that effect. There are factors other than wind that may exclude a mark from the non-wind list or from any list (i. e. rolling start, evidence of short course, etc.).

In the case of prep school boys, there are some who are completing their normal high school education while there are others one or two years beyond the high school level. It was decided to include some marks by prep school boys if they have not received a diploma from previous attendance at a high school; had not attended a combined total of more than four years in a high school or prep school; and had not reached their 20th birthday. Many prep school marks were eliminated because they failed to pass the above specifications.

As there is no national age limit for high school athletes, and regulations vary from state to state, we have included all boys regularly enrolled in high school and who are under 20 years of age. There are several known exceptions, and probably more unknown, from the period of 30 or more years ago when it was more common among 20 year olds to compete in high school.

We wish to thank all those who have helped make this annual as accurate and complete as it is. When giving thanks we can't forget Dick Bank, who edited the first three editions of the Annual and who more than any other person, has brought order, accuracy and completeness to high school track and field statistics. Special thanks also must go to Dave Batchelor, who has compiled the first prep hammer throw list, and Hugh Gardner, who wrote the article on the top 10 athletes and whose backlog of facts on high school track and field was a great assistance in increasing the accuracy of our lists,

We would appreciate learning of any errors and of marks omitted.

1961 PREVIEW

Improvement of track and field performances on the high school level should continue at least for the next two seasons if last year's results are used as a

Many of the 1960 standouts will be back in uniform this year and several will return in 1962. This is not taking into consideration the many new performers who will climb into the headlines in 1961. Depth of great performances featured 1960 com-

Depth of great performances featured 1900 competition rather than the "super" stars who dominated newspaper space the previous few seasons.

Only two individual national prep records were broken and three marks were shattered in the relay events. The 1961 campaign should prove more productive along this line and the trend toward depth should continue.

National prep records were shattered by John Turek, North, Miami, Fla., 13,7 in the high hurdles; Dave Boore, Los Altos, Calif., 9:26.5 in the two mile run; and by relay teams from Andrews, Tex., and Poly of Long Beach, Calif.

Andrews cracked two standards, Larry Shoemaker, Darvis Cromier, Ted Nelson and R. E. Merritt clippin off a 41.5 for the 440, and John Landrum, Merritt, Shoemaker and Nelson doing 3:15, 2 for the mile. A Poly team composed of Willie Martin (440), Billy Simril (220), Kelton Reese (220), and Dave Schinnerer (880) ripped off a 3:29.0 for the sprint medlev baton event.

Harry McCalla, Berkeley, Calif., ran a 9:22.4n two-mile and a two-mile relay team from Arlington Heights, Ft. Worth, Tex., ran 7:52.8, but neither received credit for national records because both efforts took place in non-high school competition. The latter, however, ranks first on the all-time prep list and McCalla's is the second best ever by a prep.

An indication of depth is that 12 boys ran 9.6 or better in the 100, 9 under 21.0 in 220, 10 under 48.3 in 440, 12 under 1:55 in 880, 17 under 4:20 in mile, 11 did 6'6" or better in high jump, 19 were over 23'6" in broad jump, 13 did 13'6" or better in pole vault, 13 more were over 60' in shot put, 15 over 170' in discus, and 21 over 200' in javelin,

National records in most danger next season are the 220, 440, 880, mile and two mile. Relay standards should fall in the 440, two-mile, four-mile and possibly the 880 and mile. There are others in jeopardy, if for no other reason than that there are more than just a handful of standout competitors who are leveling for these marks,

Henry Carr, (Northwestern of Detroit, Mich.) for instance, is just one of a number of fine sprinters back for another year of prep competition. Another bearing the stamp of greatness is Ray Etherly (Albuquerque, N. M.). Bill Cowings (Fowler, Calif.) set the experts on their ear when he ran away with the California sprint crowns last spring.

Any or all of the talented trio are capable of lowering the national prep record (20.5) and could smash the 100-yard standard (9.4). Etherly has run 9.5. Carr has done 9.6, 20.6, 48.3 and broad jumped 23' $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cowings' best clockings are 9.6 and 20.8.

The sprints are loaded with class, but the two headliners may well be Don Webster (Kennett Square, Pa.) in the 440, and Tom Sullivan (St. George, Evanston, Ill.) in the 880 and mile. These two registered eye-popping efforts last year as juniors, and Webster nearly qualified for the final Olympic tryouts with magnificent 400-meter races in the National AAU meet.

Webster clipped off a 46,7 last spring and is a cinch to lower the 46,6 national prep mark set by Dave Mills (Lakewood, O.) in 1958. Needless to say, Webster's 46,7 is an all-time best by a junior.

Sullivan shattered junior class standards in the 880 and mile with great 1:53, 1 and 4:11, 7 efforts. The latter is the third best ever on the prep level, He's definitely a threat to dip under Dale Story's (Orange, Calif.) prep mark of 4:11, 0 and the all-time prep best of 4:08.9 by Archie San Romani (East, Wichita, Kans.) in 1959.

The outlook in the field events is not as rosy where records are concerned. If one can forget Dallas Long, however, shot putters would rate plenty of attention. Two of last year's 60-footers return and as

juniors they surpassed the efforts of the great Long, Dick Hart (Morrisville, Pa.) set a class mark of 63'5" and rated behind Gary Gubner (DeWitt Clinton, New York City) on the national honor roll, Gubner did 65'7". Also past Long's junior best of 61'5" was

Bredell Pritchett (Central, Pontiac, Mich.) at 61'8½".

The shot-put has a rosy future as sophomore and frosh class records were smashed last year by Californians Steve Fite (San Jacinto) 58'4½", and David Beaver (Webb of Claremont) 52'11".

Relay records could be in for a general overhauling. Albuquerque High School's sprint group returns intact. That means the 41.5 national standard set last year by Andrews, Tex., is not long for this world, and if Ed Garvanian's jack-rabbits take more than one crack at the 880 mark, they could better the 1:25, 9 best posted by Jefferson of Los Angeles in 1956.

Hiram Carroll and Ray Etherly ran 41.7 last year, well under the previous best of 42.0. All four return. Bryant and Mendez are juniors and this will be the third year in the national spotlight for Carroll and Etherly.

This same foursome did 1:27.1 in the 880 relay, not close to their potential. The 880 relay is not a common event in New Mexico.

With Ted Nelson returning to Andrews, Tex.; Coach Max Goldsmith's jet-propelled trackmen are threats to retain relay supremacy. In addition to the 41.5, the Texans established a prep standard in the four-man mile with an astonishing 3:15.2. Nelson ran 46.4 on the anchor leg.

Nelson and Carroll rate with the best in the nation in several events. Nelson has clocked 9.7 and 20,5w for the sprints in addition to 47,8 for 400 meters. Carroll has done 9.6w, 21, 2, 48,0 (46,4 relay leg), 14,8, 19.0 and has broad jumped 23'!". Neither Nelson nor Carroll were able to run many open 440s last year because of heavy duty on relay teams and their need in other events for the team cause.

This article would not be complete without the mention of several athletes who registered amazing performances as sophomores in 1960.

Chief among these was 15-year-old Bruce Bess (La Habra, Calif.) whose 1:53,8 and 4:17.5 are sophomore class records for the 880 and mile. The two distance races have a bright future as several other sophs impressed. Included were Bob Delaney (Orange, Calif.) 1:58,0 and 4:24,9, Joseph McMahon (Rice, New York City) 4:25.7, and Keith Dailey (East Bakersfield, Calif.) 4:26.1.

Best soph sprinter and one who could rocket into stardom is Forrest Beaty (Hoover, Glendale, Calif.) with 9.7 and 21.1 bests, but who may wind up in the 440. Texas has a promising hurdler in John Roderick (Highland Park, Dallas) 14.2w and 19.1w.

100 -- The national record could fall here, although chances of such a feat are greater for the 220. Ray Etherly, Henry Carr and Bill Cowings are the top returnees. Another who must be considered is R. L. Lasater (Big Spring, Tex.), who had a wind-aided 9.3 last spring. Any of a number of other proven top sprinters could overshadow those already mentioned. They include Bill Mackey (East Bakersfield, Calif.), Hiram Carroll (Albuquerque, N. M.), Darrell Newman (Selma, Calif.), Tim Russell (Lakewood, Calif.), Ted Nelson (Andrews, Tex.) and junior Forrest Beaty (Hoover, Glendale, Calif.), all of whom ran 9.7. Two others ran 9.6 with wind--Lowell Ackers (Washington, Glendale, Ariz.) as a soph, and Billy Foster (Sunset, Dallas, Tex.).

220 -- One of many loaded events. The national record is 20.5, but it is not expected to last since Carr should improve on his 20.6. There is so much class in this event that Carr could improve on his best and not be able to claim a record. Cowings and Etherly are threats in this event and so are Don Webster (Kennett Square, Pa.), who has done 20.9, and Nelson, who did 20.5 last spring with wind. Also to be considered are Leon Vaughn (Compton, Calif.) and Beaty, both of whom did 21.1. Lasater is another with great promise. In fact, there are those who believe he would be better here than in 100 if he set his mind to running the furlong.

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odds are against Dave Mills' 46.6 prep record lasting through another season. Webster ran 46.7 as a junior but should he falter, there are two Californians and at least one Texan with designs on the prep mark. Ulis Williams (Compton), California state king, ran 47.2, and Ray Saddler (Castlemont, Oakland) was next at 47.6. Should Nelson of Andrews, Tex., run more open 440s, he should be able to dip under the record since he's been credited with a 46.4 relay leg. In the same category is Carroll of Albuquerque, N. M. Others with previous fast clockings are Hawaiian Holland (East Bakersfield, Calif.) 48.2, and Carr, 48.3.

880 -- Two of the best two-lappers may concentrate on the mile, but that shouldn't stop at least one of them from bettering Tom Carroll's national mark of 1:50.6. Most likely to lower the record is Tom Sullivan (St. George, Evanston, Ill.) who established a new junior class mark of 1:53, 1 last spring. "Silky" is unbeaten at the distance and is a good bet to dip under 1:50 although he may save his best efforts for the mile. Two others who figure strongly are Ed Duchini (Power Memorial, New York City) and Bruce Bess (La Habra, Calif.). Both did 1:53.8 last year. Bess' is a sophomore class best, but like Sullivan, he may concentrate on the mile. Four other returnees in the 1:55 bracket are Jim McGrath (Clayton Valley, Concord, Calif.) 1:55.1, John Camien (Sewanhaka, Floral Park, N. Y.) 1:55.1, Paul Turnquist (North Hollywood, Calif.) 1:55.3, and Chris Johnson (Dominguez, Compton, Calif.) 1:55.5.

Mile -- Fearing that it might be considered overly optimistic to predict the first 4-minute mile by a prep, we'll just predict Sullivan will better the alltime prep best of 4:08.9 by Archie San Romani (East, Wichita, Kans.) in 1959. Sullivan ran 4:11.7 as a junior, and he's really never given the mile much thought. He plans to this year. There is little chance Dale Story's national mark will last another season and San Romani's 4:08.9 may not even be second, or third best when 1961 is history. There are three other sub 4:20 performers returning, two of them from the same area of California, where they will run many races against each other. They are soph class record holder Bess at 4:17.5 and Mike Thornton (Torrance) 4:15.5. Best of the batch may be Fred Dellinger (Springfield, Ore.) 4:18.5, who is in a state that encourages distance running. Not to be overlooked is Rocky Soderberg (Garinger, Charlotte,

N. C.) who has done 4:21.0. High Hurdles -- A trio of 14.1 hurdlers will take up the slack left by the greatest field of high barriermen in prep annals. One of the returnees is Tony Conte (St. Petersburg, Fla.) who chased John Turek (North, Miami, Fla.) to a new national prep mark of 13, 7 last spring. A loss here also includes Mel Ren-fro (Jefferson, Portland, Ore.), cover boy for this An-nual and the High School "Athlete of the Year", who did 13.8 in this event in both his junior and senior seasons. The other pair of 14.1 holdovers are Roy Hicks (Coles, Corpus Christi, Tex.) and Dave Bailey (Cleveland, Los Angeles, Calif.). Hicks is also a fine high jumper, his $6'7\frac{1}{2}''$ being the best in the nation last year. Two others who could steal all the thunder are Bennie Whitfield (Castlemont, Oakland, Calif.) who has done 14.3, or John Roderick (Highland Park, Dallas, Tex.) 14.2w and 14.4 as a sophomore. Another boy destined to be heard from is Jim Schibanoff (Bound Brook, N. J.) who should improve on his 14.4.

Low Hurdles -- Bill Mackey (East Bakersfield, Calif,) is the only sub-19, 0 runner in the 1961 ranks, but there are many who will offer the Californian stiff opposition for season honors and perhaps threaten the national standard. Whitfield is as good here as in the highs and figures to improve on his 19.0 of last year, and one can't sell short Roderick (19.1w). Then there is the ever-present Carroll from Albuquerque who did 19.0 in his first season of hurdling. Gary Nance (Mayfair, Lakewood, Calif.) has a wind-aided 19.1 to his credit.

High Jump -- This event boasts considerable class, including the boy who registered the highest leap of the 1960 season. That would be Roy Hicks (Coles, Corpus Christi, Tex.) who stepped over the bar at 6'7½". He also is a premier high hurdler.

Others with good previous marks include James Stewart (Santa Paula, Calif.,) 6°5¼", and four in 6°5" bracket-Bill Carter (Lowell, San Francisco), Lewis Hoyt (San Marino, Calif.), Bob Lambert (Lake Washington, Kirkland, Wash.), and Bernard Adams (Fremont, Los Angeles). One of the most promising is Dick Jones (Bakersfield, Calif.), who did 6°4¾" as a soph. This event traditionally produces outstanding new talent, particularly in the Los Angeles area, and there is no evidence it will be different this year.

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Broad Jump -- The fact that only four of last year's top 30 non-wind aided jumpers are returning would indicate a down year for long jumpers. Such should not be the case. New stars develop overnight and we can expect about the same number of 24-footers (there were four in '60) and many more close to that figure. Best of last year's returnees are Vern King (San Diego, Calif.), a junior who did 23'10\frac{1}{4}" with wind, 23'6" without, and Steve Jacobson (Seaholm, Birmingham, Mich.) who did 23'7\frac{1}{2}". Billy Foster (Sunset, Dallas, Tex.) 23'9" and Henry Carr (Northwestern, Detroit, Mich.) 23'41" are better known for their sprinting and don't figure to concentrate on anything but the dashes. Others who figure strongly in this event are Jerry Williams (Brawley, Calif.) 23'94" with wind; Nolan McFarland (Lincoln, San Diego, Calif.) 23'43" with wind; John Moore (Riis, Los Angeles, Calif.) 23'1"; Hiram Carroll (Albuquerque, N. M.) 23'1", and Jim Cheatham (Menlo-Atherton, Atherton, Calif.) 23'.

Pole Vault -- All but one of the top returnees are Californians and the list includes a 14-footer who cleared the height for his school's Class B team. Mike Graves (El Cajon, Calif.) moves up to the varsity with hopes of bettering his 1960 efforts. It may be asking too much for him to approach Jim Brewer's 15' mark, but then we've been told to not sell the boy short. A non-Californian of whom much should be heard is Dennis Peacocke (West Seattle, Wash.) 13' 6\frac{1}{4}''. Two other proven vaulters are Larry Miller (Jefferson, Los Angeles) 13'4\frac{1}{2}'', and Millard Pete (Dorsey, Los Angeles) 13'3\frac{1}{2}''.

Shot Put -- It might be too much to expect Dallas Long's 69'3" to be surpassed, but two competitors who bettered the great North Phoenix athlete's 61'5" junior class mark are leveling for 70'. They are Dick Hart (Morrisville, Pa.) 63'28' and Bredell Pritchett (Central, Pontiac, Mich.) 61'83''. Hart also did 51'½'' with the 16-pound shot, Others who figure to be well past the 60' level are Larry Richards (Poly, Riverside, Calif.) 59'74'', Jock McLaughlin (Lake Washington, Kirkland, Wash.) 59'44'', Jim Green (Monrovia, Calif.) 55'9½'' and Steve Fite (San Jacinto, Calif.) 58'42'' and Steve Fite (San Jacinto, Calif.) 54'43''. The latter is an all-time best for a 10th grader.

Discus -- With five returnees over the 170' mark and a sophomore at 169'1", this event is headed for a tremendous season. The 194'5" national mark may be safe for another year, but it might be worth while to check on the antics of Gary Schwartz (Wessington Springs, S. D.) who did 169'1" as a 10th grader. Bob Morris (Glendale, Ariz.), 176'10", is rated a great prospect, and so is Don Schmidt (King City, Calif.) at 175'2". Not far behind are Dennis Brown (Central, St. Joseph, Mo.) 172'4", John Bakkensen (Grant, Portland, Ore.) 170'82", and John Anders (Moline, Ill.) 170'5½". Not to be overlooked is Dave Davies (Hudson's Bay, Vancouver, Wash.) at 169'21". Fifteen boys surpassed 170' last year, but none got over 180'. Look for at least five, and perhaps not all will come from the above mentioned, to get past 180' this sea-

Javelin -- A record high of 21 spear throwers surpassed 200 feet in 1960, which amounts to the best mass javelin throwing in prep history. Of those 21, four return for more competition, assuring the event considerable class at the top but a need for the development of more depth. Of those who will compete this year, Trevor Sarles (Shoreline, Seattle, Wash,) has posted the best mark, 207'9½". Other top men include Jerry Hinkle (Exeter Academy, Exeter, N. H.) 204'7" who threw 202'7" the year previous as a soph, Ray Guntulis (Bulkeley, Hartford, Conn.) 201'9", and Cal Bowser (Butler, Pa.) 200'11½". Exeter Academy has two other fine throwers to keep Hinkle hopping, in Gary Wilson (194'4") and Peter Lamb (194'1").

THE TEN GREATEST

By Hugh Gardner

An attempt to make a listing of the 10 greatest high school tracksters of American history first brings Olympic Champions to mind.

The three prep athletes who won Olympic races

Ted Meredith (Mercersburg Academy, Pa.). He was the 1912 Olympic 800 meter champ in the worldrecord time of 1:51.9 and continued on to 880 yards in 1:52.5, another world mark. He also ran in the 400 and took fourth place with a 49, 2. In addition, he ran on the world record 1600-meter relay team.

Lee Barnes (Hollywood, Calif.) was the 1924 Olympic pole vault winner at 12'111'. He alone, of the three winners, probably would not have been so successful today. However, he was just about as close to the world record of his day with his top performance of 13'2" as was Jim Brewer (North Phoenix, Ariz.) who in 1957 had a 15-foot top mark.

Bob Mathias (Tulare, Calif.) surprised in 1948 with a decathlon title by scoring 7139 points. The 1952 revised scoring table cut the score to 6386. He also was a fine high hurdler, and is among the discus greats. He tallied 6456 (revised) in the 1948 National AAU decathlon.

Another name should be added, although he actually finished fourth. Corny Johnson (Los Angeles, Calif.) cleared $6'5\frac{5}{8}"$ in the high jump, the same as the first three, but lost in the jump-off for the med-

Second place in the 1952 Olympic decathlon went to Milt Campbell (Plainfield, N. J.) with his 6975 points. It must be remembered, too, Milt was an alltime great in both dashes and both hurdles. As a senior in 1953, his score at the National AAU meet was up to 7238, compared with the 7054 for the same meet in his junior season.

The only other Olympic placewinner was Frank Wykoff (Glendale, Calif.) with his fourth place in the 100 meters in 1928. He also ran leadoff leg on the world-record 400-meter relay.

Another who participated in the Olympics was Howard Drew (Springfield, Mass.), who pulled a tendon in winning a 1912 semifinal and was unable to run in the final. He also won the National AAU 100 yards in 1912 and 1913 with respective clockings of 10,0 and 10.4. He won the 220 in 1913 at 22.8. Frank Hussey (Stuyvesant, New York City) was leadoff man in the 400-meter relay at the 1924 Olympic Games. Billy Brown (Baker, La.) was eliminated in the 1936 Olympic trial round of the hop-step-jump with his $47'1\frac{1}{4}''$ only a shade beyond the 47'1'' by similarly-eliminated Sid Bowman (Hammond, La.) eight years ear-lier. Brown also took the National AAU titles of 1936 and 1937 with respective leaps of 49'2" and 49'74".

Drew, Wykoff, Johnson, Brown and Campbell were only juniors at the time of their Olympic participation. Next to consider are those besides Meredith who

achieved world-record performances, whether or not

they were adopted.

Archie Harris (Ocean City, N. J.) came up with a 175'8" college discus mark in 1937 which was disallowed because of improper meet registration. Ironically, it took him four more seasons to officially get that record, and it was nearly a foot short of the ear-lier endeavor. Al Robinson (Mercersburg Academy) tied the world 100 yards mark in 1913 with a 9.6, and was below the furlong standard with 20.8. Hussey tied the world 9.6 standard in 1923, and Wykoff in 1928 ran 9.5 to better it. The only one to get an official national interscholastic record in the 100 was Jesse Owens (East Tech, Cleveland, O.) in the finale of the National Interscholastic Championships in 1933. His 9.4 was never acknowledged by the AAU or IAAF.

Another to tie a world record, but not get credit for it, was Frank Sloman (San Francisco Poly) in 1915. Three watches disagreed on his "48, 2" clocking which was officially adopted as a national interscholastic record. The readings really were 47.6, 47.8, 48.2, and rules then were the same as now on disputed timings, but they took the slowest time. He ran a 47.0 in the National AAU Junior division on a wind-aided straightaway run, was second to Meredith's wind-assisted 47.0 the next day in the Senior when Meredith

came from fifth in the last 100 yards to defeat him. A week earlier, Sloman posted another wind-aided time, 47.6 on the same track in the Far Western AAU. Contrary to official recordings, a man who was there once wrote indignantly that the "48, 2" was not on a straightaway as recorded for so many years, but on a full lap which started in the middle of the home stretch. It was a three-man special race try for a national record. There was no wind for that one.

Dallas Long (North Phoenix, Ariz.) became the third-greatest shot putter of history in his senior year, 1958, doing 61'1" at Compton, Calif., with the 16-pounder. With the same implement, he also had tosses of 60'5" in the National AAU, 60'21" in Athens during his European tour, 59'112" at the California Relays, 59'8" against Hungary, 58'4\frac{3}{4}" against Poland, a 58'4" exhibition during the Occidental Relays in California, 58'33" against Russia, and 58'2" in New York City. With the high school 12-pounder, he had complete domination of the event, with a best of 69'3'', and others of 67'2'', $66'11\frac{1}{4}''$, $66'1\frac{1}{2}''$, and 66'1'', which nobody before or since has equaled.

Charley Dumas (Centennial, Compton, Calif.) bloomed in 1955 high jumping to tie as the sixth greatest of history. On May 14th at Fresno, he tied the world's greatest high jumper, Ernie Shelton, at 6'10". On June 3rd, he went only 6'6' at Compton, losing to Shelton. A week later found him at 6'104" but losing to Shelton by an inch. In the National AAU, he and Shelton cleared 6'10", and after Ernie missed his first try at 6'11", Dumas passed the height to wait for a world-record crack at 7 feet. He missed those attempts, but the shaken Shelton never was the same again. Dumas' best in interscholastic competition was 6'91", along with other clearances of 6'87", 6'8", 6'

Wykoff ran 20.9 in the 1928 California state meet, but it was officially decided several days later that no schoolboy could run that fast. So, they added onetenth second to the time and still wouldn't give him the meet record. Frank then confounded his critics by doing metric 10.6 and 20.8 clockings in the Southwest Tryouts for the Olympics. As a convincer for the unbelievers, he won the final tryouts on Harvard's slow track with his fourth consecutive 10.6 of the

Johnson was in a three-way tie for the 1932 National AAU title at $6'6\frac{5}{8}$ ", and won it in 1933 at 6'7". Rules of those days didn't permit the head to precede the body, that being called an illegal dive.

Another teenager who gave his elders some headaches was the fabulous Jesse Owens. In his junior season, 1932, he first came into prominence with a wind-aided 10.3 metric century in an Olympic tryout meet. As a senior, he came out of the Ohio state schoolboy championships with marks of 9.6, 20.8, and $24'3\frac{3}{4}"$ in the broad jump. He'd gone $24'11\frac{3}{4}"$ in his city meet. At Chicago, he did 9.4, 20.7, $24'9\frac{1}{2}$ ". In the National AAU he won both the junior and senior broad-jump crowns with respective performances of 24'2" and 24'6 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", although he was soundly whipped in both divisions of the 100 meters. Jesse was third in the seniors, behind Ralph Metcalfe's 10.5, and his other conqueror, Jimmy Johnson, took him again in the juniors with a 10.4.

Joe Batiste (Tucson, Ariz.) was a 14.1 winner over the metric highs in the 1939 National AAU. It didn't matter to him which height hurdle was used. He did 14.0 over the high-school barriers in the same

Vern Blenkiron (Compton, Calif.) still is so highly regarded by Maxwell Stiles of the Los Angeles Mirror-News he must be included. He ran an estimated 10.3 for 110 yards while finishing second to the astonishing 10.2 by Charley Paddock in 1921. With fifth-second watches then in vogue, his estimate automatically went to 10.4. It is possible he did 9.6 at the 100-yard point, and he again showed such speed when losing by 18 inches to another of Paddock's many 9.6's in the National AAU.

The most dominant modern, in the schoolboy ranks, was Coach Vern Wolfe's first North Phoenix ace, Jim Brewer, who still holds practically every schoolboy vault record by class in school and by age. His top clearance was 15' in 1957, and an attempt to list all of his bests is similar to the situation Cornelius "Dutch" Warmerdam created during his years of being the first 15-foot vaulter. Brewer had five marks of 14'6" or better.

Eddie Southern (Sunset, Dallas, Tex.) amazed by running 47.4 in the trials of the state meet in 1955. His coach immediately had his watch permanently sealed at that figure. The next day found Southern doing 47.2 in the final. He was also a 14.1 and 19.0 hurdler, along with 53.4 for the 440-yard barriers. He also had a wind-assisted 14.0.

John Thomas (Randge Tech, Cambridge, Mass.) had an indoor high jump of $6'7\frac{5}{8}"$, and outdoors had 6'81" during the regular season of 1958. He followed this with a 6'8" in the National AAU. On a Japanese tour, he cleared $6'10\frac{1}{4}$ " on Aug. 27th, $6'9\frac{7}{6}$ " on Aug. 30th, $6'9\frac{7}{8}$ " on Sept. 10th, and his top mark of $6'10\frac{7}{8}$ " came on Sept. 14th.

The greatest schoolboy half-miler since Meredith was Tom Carroll (Fordham Prep, New York City), whose 1:50, 6 of 1957 never was accepted by the national federation. He also did 1:51.6 in the Eastern Interscholastics, 1:52, 2 in winning a National AAU trial heat, 1:52.4 in losing the Metropolitan AAU, and 1:53. 2 in the National AAU final. Overseas, he had a nonwinning metric 1:53. 3 and his best mark of all, a losing 1:49, 2 metric run at Cologne, Germany.

In 1959 Rex Cawley (Farmington, Mich.) became the only person in history to score in all three National AAU hurdle runs. In high school competition, he had a wind-aided 13.6 and 18.3, bona-fide 13.9 and 18.9. In top competition later in the year, he wound

up with a metric 13.9 and 23.0, along with a 51.5 for the 440 yard hurdles.

National AAU junior and senior champions for an event were Phil Stiles (Culver, Ind., Military Academy) in the 1913 broad jump with leaps of 22'7" and 22', and Ron Frazier (Van Nuys, Calif.) over the 200meter lows of 1945 with clockings of 23, 2 and 24, 0. Others to win senior crowns were Charley Parker (Jefferson, San Antonio, Tex.) with 200 meters in 21.3 in 1944, Tom Campbell (University, Chicago) at 880 yards with 1:56.8 in 1918.

Because of his Olympic showing and his world records, James E. "Ted" Meredith should be named as the greatest high school boy of all. It was 42 years before his 880 time was broken, three more before only one boy (Carroll) ran well below it. He also had 48.8 and 49.2 in high school quarters, plus a metric 48.8 in an Olympic Games trial round. He had a 1:55.0 interscholastic 880 mark officially listed for many years, in addition to metric runs of 1:53.8 and

PREP ODDITIES

Schools with two shot-putters over 50 feet are no longer considered a rarity, but when one comes up with at least four over that figure for four straight years it must come under the heading of news. Riverside (Calif.) Poly has had at least four for the past four years and came up with five last year, three of whom will be back this spring. Most unusual is that Riverside had two sets of brothers who did over 50 feet last spring. Larry Richards led the parade at $59'7\frac{1}{4}"$ and brother Leonard did $51'6\frac{1}{2}"$. Chuck Fields did 52'5" and brother Sid 51'4". The fifth boy was Dean Stringham at 50'5". Both Richards boys and Stringham return for another year. The coach is Bert Marshall.

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Central of Pontiac, Mich., had the finest trio of shot putters ever assembled at one school. Bredell Pritchett, a junior, did 61'83" with Jerry Rush having a best of 59'72", and Charles Brown, 56'9". Coachis Dean Wilson.

David Baugh may yet wind up a famous football player like his dad, the great Sammy Baugh, but thus far Dave has impressed in track. As a sophomore he ran a 1:58,9 half-mile for Rotan, Tex., High.

Neighboring high schools Palo Alto and Los Altos in California are the only schools boasting more than one boy who have run under 4:20,0 in mile. Each has two. George Linn ran 4:18.3 in 1959 and Mike Leh-'ner 4:19, 2 last year for Palo Alto. Los Altos had two under 4:20 last year, Robin Ruble 4:12.8 and Dave Boore 4:17.0.

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When Moline High School won the Illinois state crown last spring, it was the first time in 25 years the title went to a non-Chicago school.

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Four broad jumpers exceeded 23 feet in the Missouri State championships last spring. Only two were

able to jump over that distance in the previous 30 vears.

Beaumont High School of St. Louis won the Missouri state cross country, plus indoor and outdoor track crowns, the first time one school has won all three in the same school year.

---0---

First California prep to run under 4:20 was Dale Story of Orange in 1959. Since then 15 others have accomplished the trick, more than any other state. Oregon is next with four.

---0---

Los Angeles City schools are restricted to the number of meets in which they may compete outside their own system, and the rule has cost many fine teams from taking cracks at various relay records. Most prominent in that category last year was Jordan with four sub-10.0 sprinters--Hubie Watson 9.5, Johnny Peters 9.6, Ronnie Charles 9.8, Johnny Sampson 9.9. They might have run a record 440. Charles and Simpson will be juniors this spring.

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
Exeter Academy in Exeter, N. H., had a great triple punch in the javelin throw last year and all will return in 1961. Against arch-rival Andover Academy of Andover, Mass., Jerry Hinkle won the event at $203'7\frac{1}{2}$ ", Gary Wilson threw 194'4" and Peter Lamp 194'1". Hinkle had season best of 204'7". Their coach is Ralph Lovshin, who developed one of the best balanced dual meet teams in the East.

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Vern Wolfe is no longer the coach at North Phoenix High School in Arizona but he left behind one of the most promising pole vault prospects in prep history. Dean Lehman pole vaulted 13 feet last spring as a freshman and Wolfe claims the boy barely missed at 13'6½", a quarter of an inch better than Jim Brewer did as a freshman.

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
