1962 HIGH SCHOOL TRACK & FIELD ANNUAL

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FOREWARD

This is the seventh edition of the High School Track and Field Annual and contains two new features--a combination performers and performances list for the 1961 outdoor season and the first indoor section (covering the 1960-61 season).

The 1961 list includes the 12 best performances in each event plus the top 30 performers. Other features are an all-time U.S. list (25 deep in each event), a review of the 1961 season and preview of 1962, the all-time best by class marks and National High School Track and Field Records. The latter differs from the National Federation standards in that it recognizes all marks made under legal conditions in sanctioned meets.

No marks have been restricted because of type of meet, competition or whether it was or was not a winning effort. Marks made in AAU or other outside competition have been included as have non-winning marks in all types of competition where it has been assumed that such times (unofficial in most cases) are reasonably accurate. The object of this annual is to record best performances by high school athletes and to give recognition where it is due.

Timing in high school sprint and hurdle races is often questionable. Undoubtedly some of the non-wind times should be on the wind list and we would appreciate any information to that effect. There are factors other than wind that may exclude a mark from the non-wind list or from any list (i.e. rolling start, evidence of short course, etc.)

In the case of prep school boys, there are some who are completing their normal high school education while others are one or two years beyond the high school level. It was decided to include some marks by prep school boys if they have not received a diploma from previous attendance at a high school; had not attended a combined total of more than four years in a high school or prep school; and had not reached their 20th birthday. Many prep school marks were eliminated because they failed to pass the above specifications.

As there is no national age limit for high school athletes, and regulations vary from state to state, we have included all boys regularly enrolled in high school and who are under 20 years of age. There are several known exceptions, and probably more unknown, from the period of 30 or more years ago when it was more common among 20 year olds to compete in high school.

We wish to thank all those who have helped make this annual as accurate and complete as it is. When giving thanks we can't forget Dick Bank, who edited the first three editions of the Annual and who more than any other person has brought order, accuracy and completeness to high school track and field statistics.

We would appreciate learning of any errors and of marks omitted.

ON THE COVER: Tom Sullivan, St. George, Evanston, Ill., and Ulis Williams, Compton, Calif., are the 1961 high school track and field athletes of the year. Sullivan tied the national high school 880 mark of 1:50.6 and also ran the mile in 4:03.5n, best ever by a prep. Williams set a national high school 440 record of 46.1 and represented the United States in international meets after placing second in the National AAU 440.

The biggest mistake one can make this season is to discount the possibility of the 1962 crop of prep track and field stars equalling or surpassing the great performances of 1961.

Replacing the likes of our co-athletes of the year Ullis Williams and Tom Sullivan, plus countless other stars, is a difficult enough task without comparing them to the coming crop before the season has even started. We advise one and all to wait—many are going to be surprised.

Don't bet against Bruce Bess cracking Sullivan's fantastic marks of 1:50.6 and 4:03.5; against Forrest Beaty equalling his controversial 20.2; against Bob Stoecker cracking the discus mark with a throw past 200 feet; against Bob McKeever jumping 25'6"; or against Richard Jones surpassing the national prep high jump mark with a 7 foot leap.

Look for new prep standards in the 880, mile, two mile, discus, broad jump and high jump and not necessarily by those we've mentioned. Relay marks most in danger are the sprint and distance medley with Bess making La Habra, Calif., the prime candidate to crack each one.

We've mentioned only five of the headliners who are returning. Competition will be so fierce that the five mentioned may not even be among the leaders at season's end. With so many more athletes competing there are many more who are setting higher standards and making the sacrifices to achieve those goals. With this in mind it should not be surprising to see 1962 emerge as the best ever on the high school level.

We were termed overly optimistic in anticipating record efforts in the 220, 440, 880, mile and two mile last year, in addition to relay marks in the 440, two and four miles. All but two relay marks and the 220 (if one discounts Beaty's 20.2) were smashed and they were offset by unpredicted records in the low hurdles and sprint (440-220-220-880) and eight-man mile relays.

Many labeled absurd our warning of Sullivan's threatening the four-minute mark in the mile. Sullivan ran an all-time prep best of 4:03.5, but because it was against a non-high school field in the Compton Invitational, he did not get credit for a national record.

Williams and Sullivan featured the many record shattering efforts with world-class performances. Williams not only smashed the prep 440 record with a 46.1, but placed second to Olympic champ Otis Davis in the National AAU and won the 400-meter dash in the dual meet against Russia in Moscow.

In addition to his 46.1, the Compton Comet clocked 46.3 twice, 46.4, 46.9, 47.3 four times and was never beaten by a prep at the distance in two years.

Also under Dave Mills' old 46.6 mark were Don Webster of Kennett Square, Pa., and Ted Nelson, Andrews, Tex., who both did 46.5.

Sullivan (St. George, Evanston, Ill.) was king of the distance runners. In addition to the all-time 4:03.5 topper, he tied the National record of 1:50.6 set by Tommy Carroll of New York City's Fordham Prep in 1957. While on his way to the 4:03.5, he was caught in 3:48.0 at the 1500-meter mark to surpass 3:52.9 all-timer by Wichita East's Archie San Romani Jr. in 1959.

Another whose record was discounted because of open competition was Roy Hicks, Solomon Coles of Corpus Christi, Tex., who did 6'10" in the high jump. Hicks cleared the height in the Little Regional at Corpus Christi, but the presence of Australian Colin Ridgway of Lamar Tech College prevented Hicks from claiming the record. In addition to his high jumping, Hicks also was a top high hurdler.

Besides Williams and Sullivan, records were credited to:

Bill Mackey, East Bakersfield, Calif., 18.4 in 180-yard low hurdles bettering 18.5 by Charlie Tidwell of Independence, Kans., 1955.

Morgan Groth, Alhambra of Martinez, Calif., 4:10.0 mile to shatter 4:11.0 by Dale Story, Orange, Calif., in 1959.

Danny Murphy, Mira Costa of Manhattan Beach, Calif., 9:25.5 two-mile to smash the 9:26.5 standard of Dave Boore, Los Altos, Calif., in 1960.

Mickey Matthews (1:57.0), Don Kiewit (2:01.6), Arvil Plippen (1:57.4) and Chuck Klevit (1:54.2) of Tascosa High School in Amarillo, Tex., who clocked 7:50.2 for two-mile relay mark, cracking 7:53.7 by St. Francis of Brooklyn, N.Y., in

1957.

John Brady (51.4), Dave Haught (22.1), Derald Logue (21.7) and Bruce Bess (1:52.2) of La Habra, Calif., who did 3:27.4 in distance medley to shatter 3:29.0 of Poly of Long Beach, Calif., in 1960.

Tony Thomas (22.1), Don Owens (21.4), James Tucker (21.7), Art Toliver (22.1), Don Meadows (21.9), Gonzelo Cureton (21.8), Larry Todd (21.2) and Cleve Tyler (21.2) of Centennial in Compton, Calif., who ran eight-man mile relay in 2:54.1. Old mark 2:54.6 by Manual Arts of Los Angeles, Calif., in 1957.

Centennial, with a team composed of Tyler, Owens, Cureton and Todd, also did 1:26.1 in the four-man 880, just off the record of 1:25.9 by Jefferson of Los Angeles, Calif., in 1956.

Beaty's much-publicized 20.2 was acclaimed as a new record by the National Federation but is still pending approval by the National High School Records board.

Athletes who had the frustrating experience of cracking national marks only to have them bettered by someone already mentioned include:

Webster and Nelson, both 46.5 in 440.

John Camien, Sewanhaka of Floral Park, N.Y., 4:10.1 in mile in running behind Groth in Golden West Invitational.

Jack Selman (51.3), Larry Borden (22.3), Mel Schleuter (22.6) and Bob Delaney (1:51.7) of Orange, Calif., who ran 3:27.9 behind La Habra in sprint medley relay at Mt. San Antonio Relays.

Stan Ramage (2:03.9), Bill Anderson (1:54.4), Don Brown (1:56.2) and Bob Blanchard (1:56.2) of Hoover in Glendale, Calif., 7:50.7, and Bob Cooper (2:00.3), Chuck Snevik (2:01.3), Norm Cooper (1:56.2) and Jim McGrath (1:55.8) of Clayton Valley in Concord, Calif., 7:53.6 for two-mile relay. Most frustrating part of Hoover's effort was that it ran without services of Wayne Wilson, a 1:57.0 runner who became ill just before race.

Another all-time best was posted by Tom Tuite, Serra of San Mateo, who clocked 9:51.8 in the seldom run 3000-meter steeplechase. He's the first prep to crack 10 minutes.

No report would be complete without mention of many others who contributed to a fine season.

Ray Etherly, a great competitor from Albuquerque, N.M., and Henry Carr of Northwestern High in Detroit, Mich., capped great three-year careers. Both had 9.5 bests in the century and Carr a 20.6 and Etherly 20.7 in the furlong. Carr had wind-aided bests of 9.4 and 20.0. Etherly won both sprints impressively in the Golden West Invitational, but Carr didn't run because of an ailing leg.

Half-milers had a big year with New Yorkers Marty Ferko of Holy Cross (1:51.5), Ed Duchini of Power Memorial (1:51.8n) and Camien (1:52.6) ranking behind Sullivan.

No one challenged Dallas Long's great shot put record (69'3½") but the year produced an outstanding field headed by Californians Don Castle, Cubberley of Palo Alto (65'7½") and Bill Pace of El Rancho in Pico-Rivera (65'2½") and 53'6" with the 16-pounder). The amazing thing about their efforts was that both weighed less than 200 pounds.

The best discus field in history was headed by Carl Pellegrini of Jesuit High in Dallas, Tex., whose 189'5½" ranks second to record holder Carl Johnstone's 194'5". Stoecker of Los Altos, Calif., bettered the junior class record by more than 10 feet with a toss of 188'6½" and he could hit the 200-foot mark this coming year.

Four others threw over 180 feet and 22 more over 170 feet.

Seventeen javelin throwers were over 200 feet but the most amazing was a 209'10" toss by sophomore Bill Norman, 6'6" and 250-pounder from Orange, N.J.

The jump events also enjoyed great years with Hicks' 6'10" leap the highlight in the high jump. Jones, of Bakersfield, Calif., had the second best mark ever for a junior with his 6'8½".

No Jim Brewer's were uncovered in the pole vault crop but the five over 14-feet were the most ever to get over that height in one season. Warren Brattlof of Galena Park, Tex., was consistently over 14-feet, but he was beaten in his only head-to-head duel with four of the five top vaulter who competed in the Golden West Invitational. Brian Sternberg, Shoreline of Seattle, Wash., did 14'3½" to win the Golden West title

although Brattlof's 14'5½" was the season best and second behind Brewer's record of 15 feet.

Gale Sayers, Central of Omaha, Neb., headed the broad jumpers with his 24'10½" best during a season which saw eight get over the 24-foot mark.

Following is an event-by-event analysis featuring the known stars who will return to high school competition this spring.

SPRINTS---Depending on his recovery from football injuries, Forrest Beatty of Glendale Hoover is the big headliner here off his fine season as a junior in which he won both California sprint titles. His best clockings were 9.6 and the controversial 20.2. He may run more 440s this year and should go in low 47s if pressed. Other top returnees include Theo Cox, Zion-Benton (Zion, Ill.) 9.6w, 9.7 and 21.3; Jack Middlebrooks, Abilene (Tex.) 9.7 and 21.0; Derald Logue, La Habra (Calif.) 21.1; Arthur Brownlee, Jefferson of Los Angeles (Calif.) 9.7, Bob Brinkworth, Burbank (Calif.), Rick Stebbins, Fremont of Los Angeles (Calif.), and William Cook, Manual Arts of Los Angeles (Calif.) should rate with best if they can escape injury. Mel Posey, Lane of New York City is a strong possibility for stardom in the East and Larry Sapp, Bonita of La Verne (Calif.) may develop into one of best in the West.

Jerry Krumeich, Essex Catholic, Newark (N.J.), could be nation's best in sprints and 440. He's a top competitor whom many believe capable of 9.4, 20.4, and low 47s.

440---This event will not reach sizzling proportions of 1961 but there is enough returning to indicate a better-than-average crop of one-lappers. Bob Campbell, Anacostia (Washington D.C.) 48.2, Dick Gentry, Pleasant Hill (Calif.) 48.3, soph-class record holder Tim Johnson, Trade of Boston (Mass.) 48.5, and Charles White, Worthing of Houston (Tex.) 48.5, loom as the best of the returnees. Charlie Hurts, Castlemont of Oakland, (Calif.) 49.0, boasts great promise and a trio of Californians who impressed as sophs should be heard from this spring. They are Leon Horne, Grant of Sacramento, 49.0; George Alford, Long Beach Poly, 49.4 who also ranks as an outstanding sprint prospect, and Jim Duran of Cupertino at 49.5.

880---A number of proven competitors makes this one of the strongest events. Bob Delaney, Orange (Calif.) heads the list off his best of 1:53.4 (1:51.7r) but he'll have plenty of competition from runners right in his own area. Others who make event one of best include Bruce Bess, La Habra (Calif.) 1:53.8 as a soph and 1:54.4 last season (1:52.1 r); Wes Johnson, San Fernando (Calif.) 1:53.9n; Tony Bareford, Torrance (Calif.) 1:54.0n; Chuck Crawley, Tascosa of Amarillo (Tex.) 1:54.9; Harry Hamilton, Hackensack, (N.J.) 1:54.9n; Bob Blanchard, Hoover of Glendale (Calif.) 1:55.0n, and Jon (Son of Gregory) Peck of Harvard in North Hollywood (Calif.) 1:55.2n.

MILE---Bruce Bess will shoot for four minutes in an effort to surpass Sullivan's all-time best of 4:03.5. California state champ had best of 4:14.8 in '61--probably have done better had not his big races been "tactical" affairs. Pressing Bess for honors will be fine prospects including Jim Weinert, Highland Park (Ill.) 4:16.2; Jim Peeso, Santa Fe of Santa Fe Springs, (Calif.) 4:18.0n; Richard Romo, Tech of San Antonio (Tex.) 4:18.2; Dick Bright, Wilson of Middletown (Conn.) 4:18.5 as a soph; John Donner, Catalina of Tucson (Ariz.) 4:18.8, and Dick Sharkey, Redford of Detroit (Mich.) 4:20.2 but who is best as longer distances. He should run well under 9:20 in two-mile for new prep record.

HURDLES---Classy low hurdlers will be developed but class of high timber performers may not be better than last year when it took a sharp drop from the great crop of 1960. Fred Brocker, Austin, (Tex.) 14.3 appears

best of high barrier returnees with Ken Coniglio, Bishop Loughlin of Bishop Loughlin of Brooklyn (NY) 14.3 giving the East strong representation. Roy Woodton, Union (N.J.) is another top candidate. Bob Sawyer, Carlmont of Belmont (Calif.), surprise placer in the California State meet, and Greg Ford, Clayton Valley of Concord (Calif.) who did 14.7 over 42-inch barriers as a 10th grader, have unquestioned promise. Soph class record holder Alvin Mann, Edison of Fresno (Calif.) heads the low barrier field off his 18.9 best which he did three times--all without wind. Cleve Brown, Monrovia (Calif.) 19.1, is another top returnee.

HIGH JUMP---Richard Jones, second ranking prep in the nation last year, heads a talented field returning in this event. Jones, Bakersfield (Calif.) did 6'8½" in winning his state crown and is always tough in big meets. He's a threat for national mark. Other top-notchers include Curtis Crum, Castlemont of Oakland (Calif.) 6'7"; Len Smith, Edgewood (N.J.) 6'6" indoors; James Stewart, Santa Paul (Calif.) 6'6½" but who disappeared from sight after clearing height early in year; Melvin Reed, Booker R. Washington of Dallas (Tex.) 6'5" as a soph, and Bob Lee, Wheatley of Houston (Tex.) 6'5". Also watch for Del Benjamin, La Salle Academy of New York, whose 6'3½" last spring set an all-time record.

POLE VAULT---It will be difficult to top last year's great field which found five over 14 feet, but there are plenty of good ones back to give the event considerable class plus a newcomer destined to become the best ever prep for the event. Mike Lindsay, Santa Ana (Calif.) 13'8½" has unquestioned promise in this event and Tom Barrington, Lima (Ohio) 13'4" and Dean Lehman, North Phoenix (Ariz.) 13'5½" as a soph loom as potential 14-footers. Claude LaBarre, did 13'4" for Garden Grove (Calif.) last year as a soph. The individual destined to crack Jim Brewer's prep mark of 15 feet is John Silva, Enterprise of Redding (Calif.) who did 13'1½" during early fall workouts. Silva is a 14-year-old 9th grader.

DISCUS---The first 200 foot toss is a likely possibility with junior class record holder Bob Stoeker, Los Altos, (Calif.) 188'6½", and Jon Cole, Glendale, (Ariz.) 178'6½", real threats for the magic figure. Stoeker suffered knee injury, playing football, but if he doesn't reach 200, Cole may be able to do it. Others giving the platter tossing event the most class ever include Al Pemberton, Ridgefield (Wash.) 173'6"; Gary Schwartz, Wessington Springs (S.D.) 173'1"; Tyler Wilkins, Mountain View (Calif.) 172'7"; Randy Schneider, Los Altos (Calif.) 171'6", and Harold Huggins, Glendale, (Ariz.) 170'2". At least one from this group should crack the 194'5" national mark set in 1959 by Karl Johnstone, North Phoenix (Ariz.).

SHOT PUT---Only one 60-footer returns, but the best of the lot may well be a 270-pound junior from Chanute (Kans.). Mammoth Russell Anderson did 58'-10½" for a soph class record in 1961 and he should improve considerably. Ed Speed, Grossmont (Calif.) 61'6½", is the best of the returnees with Steve Fite, San Jacinto (Calif.) 59'5" right behind. Fite formerly held the soph class mark at 58'4½". Others who should surpass 60 feet with ease include Andy Merutka, Palatine (Ill.) 59'5½"; Larry Maggard, Turlock (Calif.) 59'4½"; Randy Schneider, Los Altos (California) 58'3½", and his teammate Bob Stoeker, who has done 58'2".

JAVELIN---Two sophomores from New Jersey including class record holder Bill Norman, Orange, (N.J.) at 209'10" and Dick May from Haddon Heights (207'2½") head the list of returning stars in the spear throwing event. Norman is the most promising javelin man of all time. At 6'6" and 250-pounds, he should be able to throw the javelin out of sight by the time he's a senior. Edgar Bennett, Hanover Park (N.J.) 200'2" gives the event another outstanding sophomore. The pair from New Jersey are the only returnees from last year's top 30.

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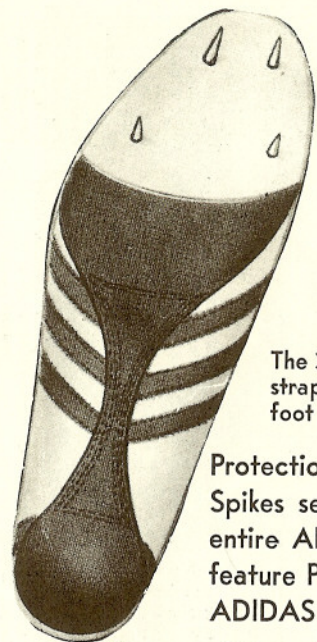

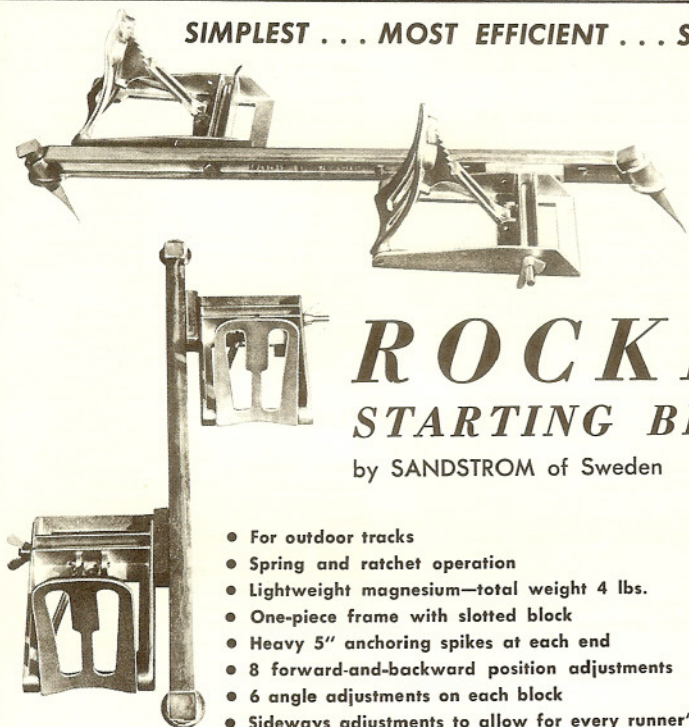

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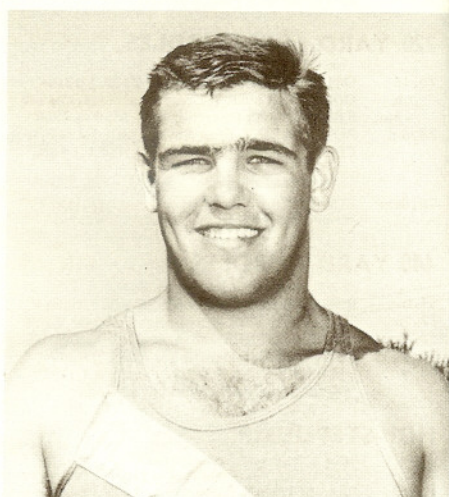

Although the fast time raised controversy because Beatty had not other marks that approached it and some persons thought the wind gauge reading had been computed wrong, nothing could be found illegal about the race. There were two wind gauges and both read under the allowable 4.473 mph.

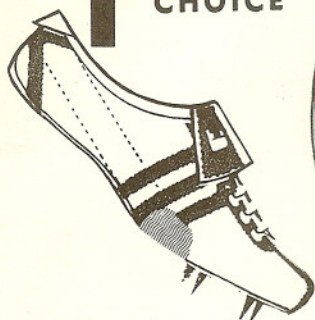

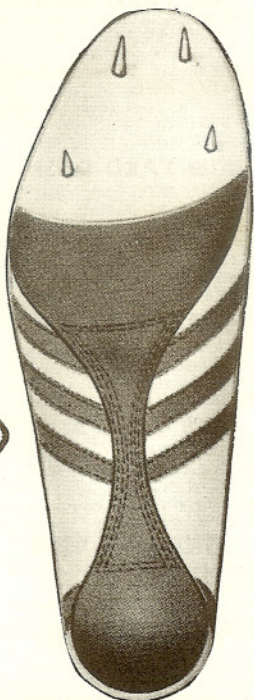

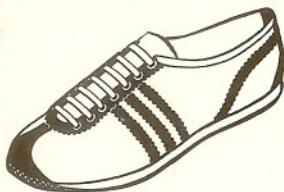


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
