

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FOREWORD

In this eighth edition of the High School Track and Field Annual very little has been changed from the 1962 edition. The same as last year the 1962 list includes the 12 best performances in each event plus the top 30 performers. The review of the 1962 season and the preview of 1963 also remains the same. The only change was the reduction in the all-time list from 25 deep to 20 deep. Space requirements deemed such a change necessary. The National High School Track and Field Records again differ from those of the National Federation since the annual recognizes all marks legally made in sanctioned meets. The indoor season of 1961-62 also is listed.

No marks have been restricted because of type of meet, competition or whether it was or was not a winning effort. Marks made in AAU or other outside competitions have been included, as have non-winning marks in all types of competition where it has been assumed that such times (generally unofficial) are reasonably accurate. The object of this annual is to record the best performances by high school athletes and to give recognition where it is due. Performances made during the summer months up to September also are included. Some people say you should not count these marks because the athlete already has graduated from high school but we would like to point out that many state meets are held after an athlete has been graduated or the school closed down. There are also post-season interscholastic meets in which performances -- and the meets -- are entirely legitimate.

Timing in high school sprint and hurdle races is often questionable. Some of the non-wind times undoubtedly should be on the wind-aided lists, and we would appreciate any information to that effect. Other factors may exclude a mark from the non-wind lists or from any chart (i.e. rolling start, short course, etc.).

Some prep school boys are completing their normal high school education while others are one or two years beyond that level. It was decided to include marks made by boys who have not received a diploma from previous attendance at a high school, and has not exceeded four years in a high school or prep school or reached their 20th birthday.

Because there is no national uniform age limit for scholastic competition, such regulations vary from state to state. However, we have included all boys regularly enrolled who were under 20 years old. There are a few known exceptions on our all-time charts, probably more unknown, from the period 30 or more years ago when it was commonplace for 20 year olds to compete in high school.

We wish to thank all those who have helped make this annual as accurate and complete as it is. When giving thanks, we can't forget the founding of it by Dick Bank, who edited the first three editions and, more than any other person, brought order with accuracy and completeness to high school track and field statistics. Don Nash, who co-edited the last four editions, maintained those standards until his retirement from the project.

Any information regarding errors or omissions would be appreciated.

ON THE COVER: Forrest Beatty, Hoover, Glendale, Calif., 1962 high school track and field athlete of the year. Beatty holds the national high school 220 record at 20.2 and holds a share of the national high school 100-yard dash record at 9.4. He also has run the 440 in 47.3. He is now attending the University of California at Berkeley.

There has been no letdown on the assaults on records by the nation's high school track and field competitors and none appears in sight.

Nine national records (seven individual and two relays) fell in 1962 and it is well within the realm of possibility that at least that many more will go by the wayside this spring. Many close to the prep scene claim it is a probability.

Familiar names like athlete-of-the-year Forrest Beatty, Eugene Tetreault, Tom Hester, Ed Moody, Bob Stoecker, Bruce Bess, Dick Jones, Doug Brown, Dave Deubner, Richard Romo, Dick May, Bob McKeever and many more are gone, but there is plenty left over from 1962 to get the new season off to a fast start. Mix in those who have yet to be heard from and another banner campaign is in the works.

One might assume the returning headliner would be Dennis Carr (Lowell, La Habra, Calif.) who as a junior ran a 4:08.7 mile for a national standard. Carr is a good one, but he's just one of a number of truly great athletes returning to the prep ranks.

Carr cannot rest on his laurels --- fact is many suspect at least two will run faster than Carr. Some observers think Carr will crack his own mark, but that Wendell Cox (Hillsboro, Ore.) and Lou Scott (Eastern, Detroit, Mich.) will run faster. Cox clocked 4:17.6 last season and Scott 4:13.2.

If Cox doesn't do it in the mile he's a cinch in the two-mile where he holds the junior class standard at 9:21.6. He also boasts an exhibition 9:19.1 and a 1:55.0 for the 880.

Carr's backers contend he'll improve enough to better Tommy Sullivan's all-time prep best of 4:03.5. Their reasoning is the 4:08.7 has given Carr the confidence he lacked while always trailing his sidekick Bruce Bess. This assumption may prove correct since Carr has run the half in 1:54.6 and the 440 in 49.4 during the summer.

The distance runs offer quality and quantity, the best and most ever, but it is only part of the overall picture that is all one of anxiety and optimism.

For instance, the weight events, where the shot put and javelin have more than ever to offer. Five shotputters who were over 60 feet return and four javelin throwers who have thrown 217 feet or better.

Randy Matson (Pampa, Tex.) should without question become the best weight doubler of all time. Many think he's already proven that rank.

Perhaps the best athlete of the bunch, one who should most certainly rank with the great all-around competitors of all time, is Tommie Smith (Lemoore, Calif.), a triple winner in all but two meets he entered as a junior. One of these was the state meet in which he placed second in the broad jump (24'2") and fourth in the 440 (48.4). He also had a 9.5w in a trial heat but went unplaced in the finals.

Smith's three firsts and anchor leg on the relay gave his school of 400 students the Central Section title and it was his efforts here (9.7, 48.4 and 23'9") that qualified him for the state finals.

He ran the 440 in 47.5 in his first-ever try and also did 24'2" without much work in the broad jump. These two events now seem to be his strongest, but he also has a legitimate 9.6 century and 21.3 furlong. A big, strong boy, Tommie probably would threaten Ulis Williams' 440 record of 46.1 if he were to concentrate on the event.

Another Californian in same category is Leon Horne (Grant of Sacramento), a crack hurdler, quarter-miler and a broad jumper. He has bests of 14.1 (14.0w), 47.7 and 23'7".

The few names we've mentioned thus far are enough to put the national mile, two-mile, shot put and discus records in danger of falling. We also put the javelin and high jump in the same category with four boys shooting for the spear mark and at least two in the high jump.

Bill Norman (Orange, N.J.) 222', Ed Bennett (Hawthorne Park, N.J.) 210'3", Delman McNabb (Lake Charles, La.) 217'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and Bob Grove (Roosevelt, Portland, Ore.) 217', and threats in the javelin to collar the 225'6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " set by Glenn Winningham (Grants Pass, Ore.) in 1959.

Bob Channel (McLane, Fresno, Calif.) is a good bet to up his 6'8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " best over the national standard of 6'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " shared by Walt Mangham (New Castle, Pa.) 1956

and Dick Jones (Bakersfield, Calif.) last year. If Channel doesn't, Del Benjamin (La Salle Academy, New York City) should. He did 6'7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " as a sophomore.

A look at the marks produced in each class can best explain the optimism we hold for this country's future in track and field. We see no end to the talent our high schools are developing in highly competitive programs.

Six seniors set national marks in 1962, but their loss will hardly be felt. Carr's 4:08.7 was a national and junior class record, one of six class marks set by five competitors. Four sophomore class standards were shattered and five freshmen accounted for six new records in that class.

Add to this the many who were right behind and you get a bright picture of the good but sometimes unappreciated fortune of the collegiate coaches who have all this reservoir of talent from which to draw.

Although not credited with a national record, this report would be incomplete without mentioning Dave Deubner (North Eugene, Ore.) who put together the best distance clockings ever by a prep. His 9:15.9 is the best ever by a high schooler in the two-mile, he ran the mile in 4:11.2 and the 880 in 1:53.6 the latter part of a double in which he ran a 4:14.3 mile.

One of the highlights of the campaign was the pole vaulting of Jim Farrell (Edison, Tulsa, Okla.) whose 14'7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " effort is the second best in prep history. The prep really took advantage of the "glass" era as 10 catapulted over the once magic height of 14 feet. Three of them represented the same school. Bob Richardson 14'3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", Doug Swartz 14'2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and Dave Hickson 14'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " represented Ganesh High School in Pomona.

Two of the most consistent performers were Bob McKeever (Fremont, Los Angeles) who bettered 24 feet in nine out of 12 meets, and record holding low hurdler Hester was under 19.0 in all but three of 20-plus races.

National records in 1962 were set by:

Forrest Beatty (Hoover, Glendale, Calif.) tied 100-yard dash mark at 9.4 and also did 20.4 for 220 and 47.3 in 440. Set 220 standard the previous year with a 20.2.

Dennis Carr (Lowell, La Habra, Calif.) electrified crowd in California state finals with a 4:08.7, under 4:10 of Morgan Groth (Alhambra, Martinez, Calif.) in 1961.

Ed Moody (McClymonds, Oakland, Calif.) bettered 180-yard low hurdle standard with an 18.3 effort under year-old mark of 18.4 by Billy Mackey (East Bakersfield, Calif.).

Tom Hester (San Bernardino, Calif.) also broke low barrier record with 18.3 clocking and also ran 22.7 for 220-yard event in National AAU meet for all-time prep standard in that race.

Doug Brown (Red Lodge, Mont.) ran 9:16.2 in two-mile run to better 9:25.5 by Danny Murphy (Mira Costa, Manhattan Beach, Calif.) in 1961.

Bob Stoecker (Los Altos, Calif.) didn't hit 200 feet in competition but his 195'4" bettered old mark of 194'5" by Karl Johnstone (North Phoenix, Ariz.) in 1959.

Richard Jones (Bakersfield, Calif.) equaled high jump record of 6'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " first set by Walt Mangham (New Castle, Pa.) in 1956.

Two relay marks fell by the wayside:

Roosevelt, Dayton, O., (Lee Calhoun 1:56.5, Charles Reed 1:59.8, Al Payne 1:55.5, Warren Hand 1:58.1) clocked 7:49.9 for two-miles as compared to 7:50.2 in 1961 by Tascosa, Amarillo, Tex. (Mickey Matthews, Don Klevit, Arvil Flippin, Chuck Frawley).

Hillsdale, San Mateo, Calif. (Larry Winward 4:25.9, Marcel Hetu 4:30.9, Jack Leydig 4:27.5, Ralph Likens 4:25.6) for four-mile record of 17:49.9. Old mark, 17:51.8 by Palo Alto, Calif. (Rick Brady, Mike Lehner, Mike Chilton, George Linn) in 1959.

Two of the national records, the two-mile and high jump, failed to surpass senior class or all-time marks. Deubner ran 9:15.9 in eight-lapper but against non-prep competition, and John Thomas (Rindge Tech, Cambridge, Mass.) still holds the high jump best with the 6'10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " leap he registered in 1958.

Carr's 4:08.7 headed the junior class record wreckers. Others were Wendell Cox (Hillsboro, Ore.) 9:21.6 in two-mile; Randy Matson (Pampa, Tex.) 64'7" in shot put; Bill Norman (Orange, N.J.) 222' in javelin and Jerry Williams (Berkeley, Calif.) equaled 100-yard dash mark of 9.5.

New sophomore class standard bearers are Blenden Johnson (Washington, Dallas, Tex.) 47.9 in 440; Dave Wilborn (Albany, Ore.) 9:41.5m in two-mile; Del Benjamin (LaSalle Academy in New York City) 6'7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in high jump, and Marvin Motley (Poly. Long Beach, Calif.) 24'6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in broad jump.

Claiming frosh class marks are Mike Ryan (Wilkox, Santa Clara, Calif.) 4:25.6n in mile; Bob Campbell (Central, Vestal, N.Y.) 6'4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in high jump; Bob Hawke (Butte, Mont.) 53'9 $\frac{3}{4}$ " and 173'2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in discus; Bill Buxman (Wilson, Portland, Ore.) 18'2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in javelin, and John Lengers (Ossining, N.Y.) 9:58.3n in two-mile.

SPRINTS -- The Midwest may come up with best crop since Jesse Owens era but it will be difficult to equal last year's field when considering times. Aquine Jackson (Boys Tech of Milwaukee, Wisc.) should have a great junior season after posting 9.6 as a 10th grader. If weather breaks right, Bernie Rivers (Washington, East Chicago, Ind.) will give the Midwest another fine dashman. He ran 9.6 and 21.0. All-American Don Parkhurst (Lee, Baytown, Tex.) returns to give Texas one of the best in the 100. He had a windy 9.4 plus a legitimate 9.6 in '62. California won't be left without good talent as long as Tommie Smith (Lemoore) 9.5w and 9.6 is around, but he'll be better in the 440 and broad jump. Other topplers include Jerry Williams (Berkeley) 9.5 and 21.1 in midseason before falling victim to the scholastic axe in '62; George Alford (Poly, Long Beach) 9.5 and 21.2 but better in the 440; and Freddy Banks (Jefferson of Los Angeles) 21.1w and 21.3 and third place finisher in state meet as a 10th grader.

440 -- Ulis Williams' record of 46.1 probably is safe, but the field of one-lappers is good. Tommie Smith (Lemoore, Calif.) heads the list of returnees off his best of 47.5, but two boys with the same last name are highly regarded in their sections of the country. Tim Johnson (Rindge Tech., Cambridge) set a sophomore class record of 48.5 in 1961 then switched to the 220 to clock 20.7 last spring. While Tim was doing 20.7, Blenden Johnson (Washington, Dallas, Tex.) cracked Tim's soph class record with a sizzling 47.9. Both are expected to fare best in the 440 this spring. Three Californians who figure with the best are Leon Horne (Grant, Sacramento) 47.7, George Alford (Long Beach Poly) 48.4 and John McGowan (Centennial of Compton) 48.3n.

880 -- This appears to be one of weaker events but with a surplus of outstanding milers around many will switch to give two-lap event strength. Dennis Carr (Lowell, La Habra, Calif.) ranks as fastest returnee off an all-comers meet 1:54.6 during the summer. Wendell Cox (Hillsboro, Ore.) outstanding at any distance above the 440, posted a 1:55.0 in the Oregon state meet and he'll probably double this season. Close behind are George Hunt (Alton, Ill.) 1:55.1, James Warner (Fox Lane, Mt. Kisco, N.Y.) 1:55.7 and Bige Wray (Harrison, Ark.), the latter a prize prospect off his 1:55.9 as a 10th grader.

MILE -- Strongest of all events with six sub 4:20 milers returning with several more who were close to it along with fine soph and frosh talent from '62. Headliner is Dennis Carr (Lowell, La Habra, Calif.) whose 4:08.7 set a national record in his state meet. Carr, however, will have to improve to stay ahead of Lou Scott (Eastern, Detroit, Mich.). Scott ran 4:13.2 as a junior and Midwest observers see fantastic performances by this boy this spring. Perhaps the best of the bunch will be Wendell Cox (Hillsboro, Ore.) who ran 4:17.6 in 1962 along with his 1:55.0 half and 9:21.6 two-mile for a junior class record. If not the three mentioned, watch for the two Connecticut Yankees, Dick Bright (Wilson of Middletown) at 4:17.3 and Ed Coleman (Plainville) 4:18.6n. Another with great promise is George Rios (Sunset, Hayward, Calif.) a 4:19.3 who lost only once in his first year of track. Other outstanding runners include Tracy Smith (Arcadia, Calif.) 4:20.9, Jim Gilbert (Glenville, Cleveland, Ohio) 4:21.5, Ralph Likens (Hillsdale, San Mateo, Calif.) 4:23.1n, Dave Roberts (Albany, Calif.) 4:23.3n and Bill Delaney (Orange, Calif.) 4:23.4 as juniors, and Dave Wilborn (Albany, Ore.) 4:21.8, Dave Patrick (Kenwood, Baltimore, Md.) 4:22.6, Jeff Eckert (Worthington, Ohio) 4:23.6, Charles Dahlgren (East, Nashville, Tenn.) 4:24.5, Stan Conner (La Habra, Calif.) 4:24.7 and Bob Camien (Sewanah, Floral Park, N.Y.) 4:25.0 as sophomores.

HURDLES -- The highs appear to have the edge over the lows in the matter of top returnees, but it is not uncommon to see a sprinter take up the lows and develop into an outstanding competitor in that event. Word from New Jersey claims a great future for Ted Pisciotta (High-

land Park) in the highs off a '62 best of 14.1 (many times) and his building of strength and speed by competition in other events. Watch also for John Freeman (East Orange, N.J.) 14.2, Jerry Saffell (LaPorte, Ind.) 14.2, Leon Horne (Grant, Sacramento, Calif.) 14.1w, Greg Ford (Clayton Valley, Concord, Calif.) 14.2 and Ray McDonald (Caldwell, Ida.) 14.3. A hunch says Alvin Mann (Edison, Fresno, Calif.) will live up to the promise he showed two years ago when he set a soph class mark of 18.9 in the lows. He did 18.8w last spring but his potential is for much better and if he stays free of injuries he could threaten 18.3 national mark.

HIGH JUMP -- Another bumper crop looms in this event headed by Bob Channel (McLane, Fresno, Calif.) who would not surprise if he became the first prep to clear 7 feet. He did 6'8 $\frac{1}{4}$ " last year and is remarkably consistent. Soph class record holder Del Benjamin (La Salle Academy, New York City) 6'7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " and Leroy White (DePorres, Cincinnati, Ohio) 6'6" are other top returnees. Kansas has a bright prospect in Steve Straight (Shawnee Mission North) 6'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and so does Georgia in Charles Mason (Northside of Atlanta) 6'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". California has two more dandies in Max Lowe (Awalt of Mountain View) 6'5" as a soph and Al Winfield (Hillsdale, San Mateo) 6'5". Star of the future is Bob Campbell (Central, Vestal, N.Y.) 6'4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " for a frosh class mark.

BROAD JUMP -- California boasts another great batch of long jumpers including four who surpassed 24' in 1961. The leader is Marvin Motley (Long Beach Poly) who set a soph class standard at 24'6 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", but more consistent performers are state champion James Kennedy (San Diego, Lincoln) 24'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ', Tommie Smith (Lemoore) 24'2" and Willie Crawford (Fremont of Los Angeles) 24'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ as a 10th grader. Other top Californians include Leon Horne (Grant of Sacramento) 23'7", Joe McKelvy (Richmond) 23'9 $\frac{1}{4}$ w, Craig Vaughn (Muir of Pasadena) 23'7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " as a soph and Virginian Stan Robinson (Boston-Hoffman, Arlington) 23'6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " as a ninth grader.

POLE VAULT -- Many 14-footers have left the scene, but one returns along with a Californian who has cleared that height unofficially on many occasions. Dave Jefferies (Abilene, Tex.) cleared 14'4" to win his state crown as a junior and he's given a chance to scale 15' this spring. California claims several top prospects including Marc Savage (Claremont) who has done 13'9" in competition and 14'1" unofficially. Other good vaulters include Pete Slapar (Pittsburgh, Calif.) 13'8", John Hergenrether (Arcadia, Calif.) 13'6 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", Dick Barkley (Palo Alto) 13'6", Norris Weis (LaPorte, Tex.) 13'6" and Florida contributes a prize prospect in John Morton (Edison of Miami) who did 13'5" as a 10th grader.

SHOT PUT -- The best junior of all time heads a list of five who bettered 60' last year. Any of the five and possibly all of them may threaten Dallas Long's national mark of 69'3". Headliner, however, is huge (6'6" and 230 pounds) Randy Matson (Pampa, Tex.) at 64'7". Ready to take over in case Matson falters are Bruce Wilhelm (Fremont, Sunnyvale, Calif.) 62'2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", Toby Bely (Westbury, Houston, Tex.) 61'11 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", Matt Nazaruk (Molloy, Jamaica, N.Y.) 60'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and Russ Anderson (Chanute, Kans.) 60'3" who set a soph class record in '61 at 58'10 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

DISCUS -- Randy Matson (Pampa, Tex.) threat to surpass national mark of 195'4" set last year by Bob Stoeker. Matson threw 186'6" last spring and coupled with his 64'7" in shot established himself as the best weight doubler in prep history. New Jersey has an outstanding prospect in Bob Hoffman (Westfield) at 176'4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and right behind is the amazing Bob Hawke (Butte, Mont.) who set a frosh class marks of 173'2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and 53'9 $\frac{3}{4}$ " in the weights.

JAVELIN -- Glenn Winningham's national standard is near cinch to fall with four of the 1962 standouts battling for top honors. Bill Norman (Orange, N.J.) returns with the best mark at 222', but the most consistent thrower is Delman McNabb (Lake Charles, La.) who boasts a best of 217'9 $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Ed Bennett (Hanover Park, N.J.) has done 219'3" and he and Norman could push each other to some good efforts. Best of the bunch could be Bob Grove (Roosevelt, Portland, Ore.) who does his best in big meets. He uncorked a toss of 217' in the Oregon state meet in '62. Stan Emerick (West Valley, Yakima, Wash.) did 208'7". Others near the 200' mark include Nick Spadafino (Snyder, Jersey City, N.Y.) 199'10", soph Wayne Doneken (Highland Park, N.J.) 199'4", Hayward Gloson (Scotch Plains-Fanwood, N.J.) 199'2" and Richard Dull (Biglerville, Pa.) 198'6". Gil Toomer (Edgewood Regional, Atco, N.J.), will try to improve on his best of 200'6".




