

SoCal Diary

☐ May 20.

There were championship meets at every institutional level this past weekend, beginning with the preps. The LA City CIF Section was holding their semi-finals as all top athletes advanced safely. The CIF Southern Section held their divisional championship and, for awhile, it looked like 4-A boy's favorite Hawthorne was in trouble when superstar Henry Thomas had an emergency appendectomy two days before the meet and was ruled out for the season. However, Sean Kelly, who was involved in scoring 28 points and the rest of Thomas' teammates picked up the slack and Hawthorne rolled to a 69-44 win over Simi Valley. In the rest of the boy's competition, Ganesha took the 3-A Division 36-29 over Duarte, while Centennial just nipped Temple City 45-44 in 2-A. In the 1-A meet, Marshall Fundamental got by Cabrillo 53-48 despite an ironman performance by Cabrillo's George Porter, which included a national record-setting time of 35.57 in the 300 intermediates. In the girls' meets, first in the 4-A division, Muir got by Hawthorne 90-80 in a battle of two super-powers. In that competition, Hawthorne set a Southern Section record in the 400 relay of 45.36. Not to be outdone, Muir came back in the 1600 relay to break the national record with a time of 3:37.69. In the 3-A, it was Pomona over Newport Harbor 45-37, and in 2-A it was Arroyo Grande over Valencia 60-53, while the 1-A championship went to Santa Ynez 57-38 over St.

In the Community College State Championships Taft, as expected, ran away from the men's field with a 144-86-44 win over Long Beach CC and Glendale. In the women's meet, it was El Camino defeating last year's champ Mt. SAC 101-70, as SoCal, as usual, dominated their NorCal counterparts. In the men's competition, SoCal outscored NorCai 452-168. As a side note on this meet, all of the results were computerized in an effort to speed them up. However, according to coaches in attendance, this only slowed them down to about half speed. In addition, the men's score was computed incorrectly. The meet concluded with Mt. SAC shown as the 3rd place team and, accordingly, Mt. SAC went home with the 3rd place trophy. The correct score, however, showed Glendale to be the 3rd place team and the trophy had to be switched. So much for computers in track. Another side note to this meet-it seems that State Champ Taft will be switched from SoCal to NorCal in the fall of 1986. That move suits Taft coach Doug Wells just fine. Doug says that, while all of the SoCal schools will be breaking each other up in the SoCal Championships, he will be able to take his Taft team intact through the

relatively weak NorCal Championships and come up with a big team score in the State Meet.

In the Pac-10 Meet, there was no surprise as Washington State was an easy 149-94-77 winner over Cal and UCLA. Big marks here included a 10.10 100 meters by USC's Darwin Cook and a 283-8 javelin throw by Oregon's Dean Crouser.

The other big meet of the day was at the Pepsi Invitational at UCLA. The big news there was Carl Lewis' attempt at a WR in the long jump. Carl could manage "only" a 28-9 effort. However, that jump actually was 29-9 from the point where he took off. Kevin Atkins shot put of 70-6 and a javelin duel between Bob Roggy 300-10 and Tom Petranoff 297-11 highlighted the rest of the men's competition. On the distaff side, Jarmila Kratochvilova's 400-800 double in 49.89 and 2:00.72 were the highlights of the day as far as the fans were concerned.

The prep tracksters entered into the next -to-last meet of the year over the weekend which translated into the City Championships for the LA City CIF Section and a qualifying meet for the Southern Section. In the City meet, Belmont's Roman Gomez scored an unprecedented 800-1600-3200 triple and the Sentinels needed every point as they just got by Gardena and Kennedy 44-43-42. In the girl's division, it was Choo Choo Knighten and her Locke teammates all the way with an easy 76-35 win over Fremont. In the Southern Section meet, it looked like Hawthorne's boys, even without Henry Thomas, are the team to beat for State honors. In the girl's division, Muir seems to have the edge over Hawthorne in what will probably be a 2-team battle for State. If both blow up, look for Locke and Choo Choo Knighten to pick up all the

In 4-year college action, first at the division III Nationals—Oxy's men were a surprise 4th place finisher thanks to Malcolm Hardy's win in the 100 in 10.68 and a first place finish in the 400 relay in 41.09. The Bengals had 46 points to winner Lincoln's (PA) 61. In the women's division, the Oxy gals were 6th with 36½ points to winner Cortland State's 62.

At the NAIA Championships, Azusa Pacific, behind superstars Christian Okoye and Innocent Egbunike, successfully defended their men's title with a 94-76 win over Wayland Baptist, while the A-P women were 6th with 31 points behind first place Prairie View's 109.

At the Division II nationals held at CS Los Angeles, Abilene Christian, looking more like a Division I school than Division II, literally destroyed the men's field with a 171-68 win over East Texas State. This, despite the fact they dropped the stick in the 400 relay. In fact, on paper, A-C would beat any Division I school in a dual meet with the exception of Washington State. In the women's meet, again it was Abilene over defending champ CPSLO 106-103, as A-C needed only a 3rd in the 1600 relay to clinch the meet and got a 2nd.

Up at the Bruce Jenner meet, the big race there was in the women's 100 where Valerie

In another note on the H.S. Southern Section qualifying meet, Capistrano Valley's Brian Blutreich set an all-time California prep record of 69-6½ in the shot, breaking the mark of 69-3½ set by Newport Harbor's Jim Neidhart. The L.A. Times indicated that Neidhart is now a professional wrestler known as The Anvil. Neidhart being a professional wrestler is not surprising, con-

sidering how he ended his shot put career at UCLA. According to Bruin team members, while at a meet up North, Neidhart was staying in an apartment complex. It seems a couple of hecklers on the floor below Neidhart's kept yelling up remarks about Neidhart's size through a window. Finally, Neidhart tied some sheets together, lowered himself down to the hecklers apartment with shot in hand and proceeded to destroy the apartment by putting the shot at everything in sight. I don't now who had to pick up the tab for the damage, but that incident reportedly ended Jim Neidhart's collegiate throwing career and possibly began one in wrestling.

June 3.

The preps brought their season to an end Saturday at Sacramento with their California State Championship. At that one, Hawthorne's boys overcame yet another setback to win the title with a 29-26½-25 win over Bakersfield and Simi Valley. Sean Kelly, who looked like he had a lock on the 800, finished out of the money. However, with Michael Marsh taking the 200, and Michael Graham 2nd in the intermediates, a final win in the 1600 relay was enough to push Coach Kye Courtney's thinclads to their 3rd consecutive State title.

In the girl's division, it was a rerun of the

Southern Section 4-A Championships as Muir used a 1-2 finish in the 100 hurdles to help propel them by Hawthorne, which had an unprecedented 1-3-4 finish in the 200, by a 55-46 count, despite the fact that the Mustangs dropped the stick in the 400 relay.

Big mark-of-the-day definitely had to be a 45.7 400 by Marina's Chip Rish, who beat favored Danny Everett of Fairfax.

At the NCAA Division I Championships, no real susprise in the men's competition as Arkansas, lead by Mike Conley's jump double, beat runner-up Washington State 61-46. Oregon used its distance strength to pull out a 52-46-45 win over Florida State, LSU, Arizona and UCLA. The Bruins lost their chance to win it in the long jump when superstar Jackie Joyner, who was doped for no worse than 2nd, DNQ by 1/4 of an inch. Another decision which had a lot of Bruin fans second-guessing Coach Bob Kersee, was to pull Jackie Joyner out of the heptathlon where she was an almost automatic winner good for 10 points in favor of the individual events and the two Bruin relay teams. There will always be the feeling by Bruin fans that Jackie could have taken the heptathlon without compromising her chances in the individual events, similar to her effort two years ago when she lead UCLA to the national title.

A few weeks ago I commented on the fact

that UC Irvine was a non-scoring team in their PCAA Championships. It seems that UCI had used some ineligible athletes the prior season, so being a non-scoring team this year was part of their probation. I guess that was the reason head coach Kevin McNair left UCI for private business.

There is a rumor floating around SoCal track circles that a college team whose motto is "We Are Family" has had some serious domestic relation problems this season and is planning some action based on alienation of affections against some rival institutions.

Another rumor that has just surfaced is that a number of top U.S. athletes will purposely miss the TAC Championships. The reason being given is money. However, it's not money from the TAC Meet which is the issue. It seems that the place winners from the TAC Meet would form the U.S. National Team which would compete in a multitude of meets during the summer. However, many of the U.S. dual meets would conflict with the big money meets in Europe. Thus, in order to avoid the negative PR associated with dropping from the U.S. team to compete in other meets, the athletes will allege injuries so that they can avoid competing in the TAC Meet, and thus cannot possibly be put on the U.S. team.





Medical Notes for Runners

Plantar Warts

any runners, especially in the summer, become the victims of plantar warts. Plantar means bottom, and a wart is a viral infection of the skin. Actually, a benign tumor like growth occurs on the bottom of the foot, and this is called a plantar wart. Warts hurt when there is side to side pressure. This pinching pressure presses the nerves and small capillaries in the wart. Normally, calluses hurt more with direct up and down pressure. Thus, you can distinguish between a wart and a callus by the type of pain with the type of pressure you apply.

Warts usually have a well circumscribed rim around them, and there is dark discoloration, pin point in size, within the wart. This is because of the small blood vessels in the wart. Calluses, on the other hand, have thick skin, which may have skin lines running through them. Thus, you can tell the difference. Warts usually hurt a lot more than calluses. One can have, however, a wart within a callus.

Why do we get warts?

Warts are caused by a virus. The virus enters the skin, usually due to some minor trauma. Thus, you may scrape your foot going barefooted by the swimming pool or step on a sharp object.

Can warts spread?
Yes, of course they can spread. A virus is a micro-organism that can spread. Thus, one person with warts can potentially give warts to other people. Usually there is a reason why you get warts, and it might be due to the Ph of your skin or your particular body chemistry.

What are the treatments for warts?

I like to treat warts conservatively. I trim them down until there is bleeding of the capillary bed and then apply an acid solution. My patients then are given an acid solution to take home with them, and they can treat the warts at home until they go away. High doses of Vitamin A, 25,000 units per day, are helpful. Vitamin A decreases hyperkeratosis, which means excessive skin and also has a tendency to inhibit the warts. Soaking your feet in a half cup of vinegar in a pan of water is helpful for warts, as well as for athlete's feet or other

chronic foot problems. It tends to dry out the foot and change the Ph.

What if conservative treatment fails?

Then you may need to have surgical debridement of the wart or a freezing of the wart. At times, we will numb up the area around the wart and then scoop the wart out with a curette and put a coagulating solution on the base of the wart. I also have utilized various forms of microelectrical surgery on the warts, and laser surgery, at times, is helpful.

What about mosaic warts?

Mosaic warts occur when there are a lot of warts on the bottom of the foot and usually there is one central wart, which is the chief cause of the problem and then several smaller seed warts. The central wart is called the mother wart; and, usually, if you treat this wart, the other warts will just go away.

Can you scare warts away?

Yes, as a matter of fact, there is a psychological component to warts. Everyone is familiar with the story of Tom Sawyer, who says that the way to get rid of warts is to go out on the evening of a full moon and kill a frog and put frog blood on the wart. The wart will then go away.

I once had a patient who had a wart on the bottom of his foot that no treatment was taking care of and he had much difficulty walking. I told him that we would remove the wart with x-ray. I unplugged the x-ray machine, but turned the machine on. The patient was so scared that the x-ray was going to cause real damage that he was sweating during the treatment. The timer on the x-ray machine went on for about a minute, but the machine was actually turned off. About two weeks later, the wart was gone.

Are there really psychological reasons for most diseases and problems?

Yes there are. I find that almost every injury or disease entity has a psychological component to it. For that reason, we now have the services of a psychologist in our office, who works with people who have sports injuries, as well as chronic medical problems of the lower extremity. holder and NCAA champion...For being non-scholarship school, Cal State Hayward women's track team has been remarkably consistent in their high finishes at the NCAA II Championships 6th in 82, 3rd in 83, 4th in 84, and now 5th in 85, and all this after winning the AIAW III title in 1981... Cal State Northridge, short on numbers but long on heart, completed another successful track season as both men and women squads finished in the top ten at the NCAA II National Championships. Athlete's Kitchen

Counting Carbohydrates

n your mark...get set... START counting those carbohydrates! As an active person, you should eat a carbohydrate-rich diet every day-both during training as well as before competitions. These carbohydrates fuel your muscles with glycogen, the muscle sugar you rely upon during rigorous workouts. Carbs help you perform energetically, when you're exercising hard day after day, week after week. Without a doubt, carbohydrates are an important, but pleasurable, concern for athletes.

One question that runners frequently ask me, a sports nutritionist, is "How many carbohydrates are enough to saturate my muscles with glycogen?" They don't want to overeat and gain weight. Yet, on the other hand, they don't want to undereat and have half-fueled muscles. I recommend "counting carbohydrates" as one way to tell if you're eating the right amount. According to Dr. David Costill, exercise physiologist, a trained athlete can store about four grams of carbohydrates per pound of muscle tissue. Thereby, a lean 150-pound man could need perhaps 300 grams of carbohydrates; a lean 125-pound woman about 230 grams. These numbers are based on the assumption that your muscles are totally glycogendepleted to start. Hence, they allow a reasonable margin of


To roughly estimate your carbohydrate needs and

target intake, you can simply divide your weight in half-since about half of your weight is muscle tissue; the remainder being bone and fat-and multiply that number by four (ie. four grams of carbohydrate per pound of muscle tissue). This answer should correspond with the current dietary recommendations for an intake that's 50-60% carbohydrate...the high carbohydrate/low fat plan that's optimal for both active and health-conscious people.

Using this number, you'll now be ready to meet the carbo-loading challenge! Thanks to the nutritional labelling on bread, pasta. soup, cereal and other packaged foods, you can easily determine the number of grams of carbohydrates in many foods. For example, a 1/4 cup serving of Grapenuts has 23 grams of carbohydrate. If your daily target is 300 grams, you could attempt to eat 41/4 cups of Grapenuts to meet your goal...or you could eat from a variety of other high carb foods. For unlabelled foods such as bananas. potatoes, muffins, etc., you can either find the equivalent in packaged form (le. Duncan Hines muffin mix box gives an indication of the amount of carbs there might be in a bran muffin) or else buy a handy guidebook for carbohydratecounters, such as Barbara Kraus' "Carbohydrates and Calories" or the small "diet guides" that are often available at grocery store checkout counters.

By keeping a daily tally of the carbohydrates you eat. you'll know when you've had enough to fuel your muscles. You'll also know that if you opt to "carbo-load" on the ever-popular-but-high-in-fat chocolate chip cookies, ice cream or M&M's, you'll simultaneously be eating gluttonous amounts of fat calories. For example, a pint of Haagen Dazs has only 100 grams of carbohydrate...but 'costs" 1200 total calories. You could meet your 300 gram carbohydrate-quota by eating three pints of ice cream, but somehow a pound of pasta with 330 grams at 1600 calories seems not only a more healthful but also a less fattening alternative.

If you "overload" by eating excessive calories when you're carbo-loading, you'll simply increase your body-fat stores...especially if you overeat fats. According to a report on the causes of obesity (American Journal of Clinical Nutrition, May 1985), people who overeat on fatty foods gain weight with relative ease compared to when they overeat carbohydrates. The metabolic conversion from dietary fats into body fat costs only 3% of the ingested calories, whereas the conversion from carbohydrates into body fat costs 23. Now that's incentive to choose those "carbs" wise-

∠York, Elmhurst, Illinois

May 7. Elmhurst, Illinois-The York 4x800 team of Neal McNally (1:57.9), Bob Berger (1:54.1), Paul Taira (1:53.1), and Jim White (1:49.7) set a new national high school record of 7:34.8.

Intrinsically, it is the third fastest ever. Jackson, Cambria Heights, New York and Boys, Brooklyn, New York ran 7:35.6 for yards in 1966, which converts to 7:33.0 for meters.

May 10-11. Austin-Roy Martin (Roosevelt, Dallas) set a national high school record of 20.13 in the 200 meters with an aiding wind of 1.7mps. The old record of 20.22 was set by Dwayne Evans (South Mountain, Phoenix, AZ) at Eugene, Oregon on June 22, 1976.

The Roosevelt, Dallas 4x100m team of Crenshaw, Foster, Rod Martin and Roy Martin equalled the 15-year-old national high school record of 40.2 in the 4x110y set by the Lincoln, Dallas team of John Delley, Joe Pouncy, Rufus Shaw, and Gene Pouncy at Austin on May 9, 1970. Lincoln's time is equal to 40.0 for meters.

May 23. San Diego State University. While other sections in the state were probably brushing up on last minute techniques or practicing those last couple of handoffs, the San Diego Section joined the modern era of State Meet qualifying by holding their section finals on the all-weather facility of San Diego State. Held for the last 7 years on the brick track at Mt. Carmel, the SDCIF was finally able to reach an agreement with SDSU that would place both prelims and finals on the University's track. With a Thursday afternoon schedule arrived at (to work around school graduation and lack of lights on the facility) area coaches and university officials were rewarded for their persistence and patience by one of the finest finals in section history. Fast times on the track and good marks in the field were the pattern of the day as local preps shattered 6 all-time section records and set 8 meet records.

Shining the brightest on this day of achievement were Lesley Noll of Mt. Morse for the boys. For Gayden, he was counting his luck on being there and making it through each race, At the end of his leg on the 1600 relay on Saturday's prelims, Gayden took a fall which caused severe swelling to the knee which had been operated on last track season. Still showing signs of the swelling Thursday, David ran the 3rd legs on both of the winn ing Morse relays (42.34 and 3:15.77) in addition to coming from off the pace to win

For Mt. Carmel's Noll, the CIF Champlonships marked a total return to a form that had made her the section 400 cham-pion as a sophomore. In a classic race with junior Darcy Arreola of Grossmont, Laura Chapel of University City, Robin Eager of Vista; Noll powered off the last turn to win in a State leading and section record of 2:08.00. Arreola was 2nd in 2:09.06, Chapel 3rd in 2:09.17, and Eager (who did not qualify for Sacramento) 4th in 2:12.03. Not finished yet, Noll came back 50 minutes later to win the 400 in another section record of 55.82, and then returned again to come from 10 meters off and anchor Mt. Carmel's 1600 relay to a meet record 3:54,31.

As is often the case in meets such as this, solid media favorites are joined by new young faces on the victory stand One of the brightest new faces belonged to that of Lincoln sophomore Michelle Outlaw. Outlaw grabbed the spotlight early with an easy victory in the 100LH (14.43 into a 2.2 mps wind), picked up points with a 4th in the long jump (17-3%), anchored a 5th place 400 relay (49.66), and came back to capture the 300LH in 45.16.

Based off of last year's number two spot in the State Meet in the 200 (21.45), El Camino's Darron Norris seemed destined to be one of the best sprinters in California behind Henry Thomas of Hawthorne. But it hasn't quite turned out that way. Norris gained some weight for football (he's headed for Texas) and, coupled with a late season case of chicken pox, he is not quite the 200 sprinter he was last year. While he won his 3rd straight section 100 crown at 10.89, he lost his 200 title to Mt. Miguel junior Ron Young, Young, who was 3rd in the long jump (22-21/4), and 2nd in the 100 (10.93), proved that the 3rd time is a charm in the 200 as he bested Norris 21.72 to 22.05.

Another Miguel athlete who is picking up attention is sophomore Jackie Anderson in the jumps. Her 39-1114 in the TJ was a meet and section record and put her in a prime spot for Sacramento honors. She shared the jumping spotlight with junior Kim Huey of Santa Fe Christian. Huey won the LJ in 18-10-1/4 and finished in the runner-up spot in the TJ with a 37-314.

San Dieguito's Travis Knox and St. Augustine's Jay Taylor have been trading off hurdle wins all of 1985 and the finals

were no exception as Knox won the 110 HH in 14.40 to Taylor's 14.47. Taylor then came back to run a meet and section record of 37.20 as he bested Oceanside's Terry Herron (38.05) and Knox (38.20).
The girl's sprints were all Morse Tigers.

Senior April Freow was the winner in the 100 (12.24), and was edged by fellow Tiger Kim Mathews in the 200 (25.57 for

Mathews, 25.67 for Freew). These two teamed up with Sharon Lacy and Yolanda Fitch, who both scored in either the 100 or 400, and dominated the field with a quick

47.87 in the 400 relay.
Falibrook's Sean Hickey and Mt.
Carmel's Scott Johnston again renewed their pole vault competition that in recent weeks had shown both of them top 15'. This time it was Hickey who came out on top with a new section and meet record of 15-3. Johnston was second at 15'. Only two weeks before in their league finals, they had broken the section record when both cleared 15-1.

Mt. Carmel also had another good athlete exhibiting his talent in senior long Jumper Jim Chapon, Chapon went over 23-5 for the 13th time this season as his 23-6 was an easy winner. The boy's triple jump was tighter as Oceanside senior Dwayne Jeffers (45-5%) bested Crawford junior Paul Franklin (45-5) and Hoover's

Kevin Williams (45-14).
Southwest's Tracy Crawford is one of the best in the State in the girl's discus and she continued to improve with a PR of 141-11 in her victory over fellow junior Kartsi Leppaluoto of Madison (137-1). Leppaluoto however, came back to best Grawford in the shot (42-11/4 to 42-1) with a new section and meet record. With both these athletes being back next year, these young ladies should continue to push each other to better marks.

Southern Section Championships

On the weekends of May 18th and 25th the Southern Section gathered at Mt.SAC for its annual Divisional and Master's (State Qualifying) Meets. The Section is divided up into 4A, 3A, 2A, and 1A to determine team and individual championships for the school size divisions on the first weekend, and the top eight marks qualify on to the Master's competition. A super three national records came from the two weekends of action, with extraor dinary relay groups of young ladies from Muir (Pasadena) and Hawthorne and long hurdler George Porter (Cabrillo, Lompoc) joining the elite group of Southern Cal preps who have broken a National Record (both Federation and All-Time bests). Brian Blutreich (Capistrano Valley) continued his fine weight year with an All-Time California best Shot Put (to go along with his Discus California record from earlier this campaign). Henry Thomas (Hawthorne) was not along for the end of the season, as the Golden State's All Time top sprinter was out with an appendectomy the Thursday before the divisional meet. The Divisional Meet and some problems, with the move from Cer ritos this year and most of the Mt. SAC staff up at Modesto for their JC State Meet. Two Women's 100m races were run at 110 meters (and then rerun at the right distance), and all the Men's Highs races were run from a Shuttle hurdle take-off line, making them 109 meters. Those 32 athletes (which entailed some pretty good travel time for some from this spread out section) reran the event the following Wednesday.

Both Muir and Hawthorne have speed to burn on the Women's side (and their Men's squads have a dose tool. All season long they have battled in the individual and relay events, and that action

continued here, with Records and seasonal bests galore. At the end of a long Divisional Meet, with the team title between the two still on the line in the 4A division, the two groups went to the line in the 4 x 400m relay. Muir has won each of the times the two teams have battled over this distance this year, and today was to be no exception. Lana Cantrell (55.6) put Muir Into the lead, and fine middle legs by Nikky Caddell (55.9) and Carrie Franklin (55.0) kept them there. Anchor runner Linetta Wilson is as determined a young lady as any who has ever strapped on a pair of spikes and she rocketed the anchor leg in 52.2 to bring her team in at 3:37.69 to edge in ahead of Kennedy (Granada Hills) and their 3:37.71 from 1981 with the Howards. Hawthorne raced a fine 3:41.21 (the 2nd best in the nation this year). The next weekend over the 400m distance, where Hawthorne has won all the close duels, the Cougars planned to make amends in the record category. A super run by Dede Wheeler (12.1), Kim Grant (11.1), Deanna Amy (11.1), and Tami Stiles (10.7) brought Hawthorne in ahead of Muir at 45.11, lowering Berkeley's 45.13 National Record from 1981. Muir was close, with their 45.23 the #3 All-Time U.S. Prep performance ever.

George Porter (Cabrillo, Lompoc) raced a super 35.57 in the Divisional Meet, technically establishing an auto-timed national record. Esperanza's Keith Pontiflet took another division in an Orange County 36.74 record. Porter's 35.57 would have undoubtedly taken down the 35.3 from Arthur Blake (Florida) had he not tip ped the last hurdle. In the Master's Meet Porter again came out charging, and screaming through 200m over the sticks at 22.8 he sailed on in at 35.32, lowering anything ever run by a prep. Michael Graham (Hawthorne) recorded a find 36.67 in second.

Brian Blutreich used a fine lead-in by announcer Dave Hurlbert on his fourth throw in the Masters Meet in the Shot and plunked the iron ball out to 69-61/2, shattering any Golden State best mark in the event

The Hawthorne-Muir rivalry spills over into individual events also, with the Women's sprints and hurdles basically dual meets between the two schools. Carrie Franklin (Muir) showed super acceleration in the Divisional 4A 100m during the middle of the race to edge Tami Stiles (Hawthorne) 11.48-11.53 (wind aiding 3.4 mps), with Dede Wheeler (11.58) and Kim Grant (11.62) trailing closely. In the Masters 100m the script was the same, as Franklin picked up a legal nation-leading 11.61 in winning over Stiles (11.70). Franklin took the 4A Hurdles in 13.65 (wind 1.65) over teammaters Lana Cantrell (13.91) and Nikky Caddell (14.05) with LaShawn McBride (LB Poly) sandwiched in at third in 13.99. In the Masters it blew a bit more (2.8) and Franklin blasted a 13.49 over Cantrell's 13.81. Linetta Wilson switched to the 300m LH in one of the final dual meets, and here, in her 5th race ever cruised a 41.87 nation-leading mark. Again, teammates were close as Cantrell ran 42.58 and Caddell 43.64 as Muir moved to a 4A team title. Tami Stiles and Hawthorne owned the 200m, as the Millikan transfer raced a 23.37w (2.5) Divisional win and 23.56 (1.6) Masters win over teammates Kim Grant (24.08) and Dede Wheeler (24.43). Wilson took the 4A 400m at 54.35, and the Masters race was a classic. Linetta got out fast, 25.1 at 200m, 38.5 at 300m, then quick-finishing Janeen Vickers (Pomona) and Princess Bennett (Compton) began to close. Wilson struggled the final 100m in 15.2 to win at 54.81 over the 53.83 of Vickers and 53.86 of Bennett. A real fine in the sprints was Madette Smith (Quartz Hills), who raced 23.98w in the 3A 200m, 55.73 in the 400m, and proved to be quite a Long Jumper.

the absence of Henry Thomas the Men's sprints were thrown kind of wide open. Hawthorne's Michael Marsh had exploded to a 21.2 in his League Meet

(behind Thomas's 20.4) and continued to improve at 200m. In the Divisional Michael edged a top group in the 4A race at 20.82 (1.5 wind). Chip Rish (Marina) was 2nd at 21.01, Compton's Anthony Ford 3rd at 21.18, and Oxnard's Lawrence Burkley 4th at 21.32. Terry Johnson (Katella, Anaheim) took the 3A race at 21.26w (2.6). In the Masters Marsh showed good acceleration around the turn and used the maximum allowable wind (2.0 mps) to edge in ahead at 20.96 of the 21.09 of Burkley and 21.26 of Ford. Burkley won the big 100's, taking the 4A at 10.45w (2.4) with a strong finish, and narrowly catching Ford at the finish in the Masters at 10.62-10.63. Rish looked good in dominating the locals at 400m, cruising a well-paced (11.6-11.6-11.7-12.1 100m splits) 47.05 4A win over Sean Kelly (Hawthorne) 47.85, then racing 47.12 (11.2-11.3-11.9-12.7) in the Masters.

After all the craziness that went with the 109 Meter High Hurdles in the Divisional (where it looked like only one athlete was affected by coming up to the first hurdle too quickly), Damon Thomas (Pasadena) raced a super 13.95 (wind 1.1) to edge Katella's Terry Johnson (14.00) in the Masters.

The lack of Thomas certainly opened up the Men's Relays. Muir had the fastest Divisional 400m race at 41.53 with Hawthorne holding on to a spot in the masters with a 42.29. In that race Compton's Anthony Ford blew by Muir's Richard Bell on the anchor to win at 41.39-41.51, with Mike Marsh bringing Hawthorne in 3rd at 41.69. Hawthorne has quarter-milers to burn, and Mike Graham's 47.6 third leg opened up the 1600m relay in the Masters for Sean Kelly's 47.3 and a 3:12.73 win. Centennial raced a fine 3:13.81 for 2nd and Long Beach Poly 3:14.35 for third. Kelly cruised through 800m wins, cranking a 1:50.94 4A Divisional win, then running slow enough through the quarter (54.0) for company and dragging a group to good times in the Masters behind his 1:51.08 yawner. Ganesha's Vince Thompson was closest at 1:52.84.

Mild surprises marked the Long Jumps. Victor Valley's Robert Clamalet opened at 24-11/2 w in the Masters Meet to win that competition over Pasadena's Cleo Bates (23-61/4w). Madette Smith (Quartz Hill) put all her jumps in the Masters competition out over 18-5 with a 19-81/4 w best to take Rosalyn Mitchell (Diamond Bar) 19-7w. Yleana Carrasco (Anaheim) sailed over 5-10 to have the top mark in both the Divisional and Masters High Jumps. Eric Wheelwright (Edison, Huntington Beach) had the top Divisional leap for the guys at 6-10, with Hawthorne's John Medford (yes they have people besides sprinters) tak-ing the Masters at 6-10. Marcus Hooks (Lakewood) opened early with a 49-11 % in the Masters Triple Jump to take Tim Williams (Rubidoux, Riverside) 49-51/4. Muir's Terrance Williams had the top Divisional mark at 49-1034, with Tim 2nd there 49-71/4. James Browne (California, Whittier) improved out to 49-41/4 w in taking the 3A level jump over Greg Harper (Santa Fe, SF Springs) 49-11/4. Consistent Jamie Kirven (Woodbridge, Irvine) leaped 38-51/w on her first Triple Jump in the Masters to take Kim Taylor (Valencia Masters to take Kim laylor (valencia 38-3½w) and Debbie Orr (Ocean View, Huntington Beach) 38-1½. All-World Volleyballer Elaina Oden (Irvine) con-tinued her Shot Put mastery over locals with a 44-7 % Divisional and 43-3 % final toss Masters victory. Brandi Gall (Rowland) improved to 43-3 in the Masters for 2nd, while Heidi Adams was 2nd in the 4A competition at 43-634. Simil's Ed Gagnon won the Masters Vault at 15-1 over the 14-8 of Manuel Ballard.

The Women's 800 in the Masters Meet was kind of wierd, as a fall near the finish resulted in a re-run after the meet was over. Two girls who ended up on the ground the first time qualified into the



The weather couldn't have been better for racing, and the racing couldn't have been better either, as 1984 Olympians Paul Davies-Hale of England and Anne Audain of New Zealand sped to victory in a field of nearly 40,000 runners, joggers and walkers in the ninth annual Lifac Bloomsday Run.

With skies clear and temperatures in the low forties, 1983 Bloomsday champion Jon Sinclair led an impressive pack through the two miles in 8:42, followed closely by Marcos Barreto of Mexico and Kenyans Sammy Ngatia, Simeon Kigen, Sosthenes Bitok and 1984 Bloomsday champion Ibrahim Hussein.

Meanwhile Davies-Hale, who has competed well on the roads in the U.S. but without a major victory, cruised farther back in the pack, Hussein moved into the lead shortly after, bringing the crowd through three miles in 13:35, but was soon overtaken by Garry Bjorklund of Boulder, CO. After passing four miles in 18:19 a dozen runners were still in contention, but as the group began to ascend "Doomsday Hill", Kigen and Musyoki broke away.

"We were shoulder to shoulder," said Kigen later, "But Musyoki was pushing the pace. When we were going up the hill, I was really sweeting." I was really sweating.

By the top of the half-mile grade it was down to a four man race, with Kigen and Musyoki followed closely by Davies-Hale Kenyan Joseph Nzau. Those four continued to work the pace over the next two miles of the 12 kilometer course, when first Nzau and then Musyoki dropped off the pace, leaving Kigen and Davies-Hale to battle it out. As the two approached the finish, Davies-Hale surged around the Kenyan and sprinted to a 34:27 victory, one second ahead of Kigen and five seconds better than the course record. Kigen was followed by Musyoki and Nzau, who recorded identical times of 34:32, and Rex Wilson and John Bowden of New Zealand.

The women's race was less dramatic but no less impressive, as three-time Bloomsday champion Anne Audain proved she has fully recovered from a leg injury that required a two-month lay-off last winter. Running in her first road race in the U.S. since returning from New Zealand, Audain was out quickly, ran aggressively, and was never challenged as she set a new course record of 39:20, over forty seconds ahead of runner-up Sue French-Lee of Canada.

"This was a Kiwi kind of course, really," said Audain, referring to the hilly Bloomsday route. Audain's time was nine seconds ahead of her 1983 Bloomsday mark, set on a slightly longer course.

Audain and Davies-Hale won \$7,000 each for their victories, part of a total open purse of \$50,000. In the Masters category, Paddy Murphy of Ireland and Gabriele Andersen of Switzerland won \$1,000 each, park of \$4,500 in Masters


