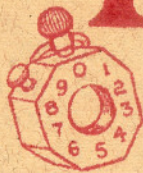

### SO THEY TELL US

TN JOE GALLI, Australia: Dean Thackeray (Olympic marathoner) wife Toni (Melbourne born) and 9 months old son, arrived in Melbourne. Dean, a Bachelor of Music from Boston U hopes to obtain a position as music teacher, but will also study physical education. He plans to train under Percy Cerutti.

"Herb Elliott is cramming Latin which he needs to master to enter Cambridge University late in 1960, if he gets the Shell scholarship. It takes a lot of his time and training is difficult. He is to wed May 2 in Perth and he and Anne will live in Melbourne. Herb leaves for the U.S. Feb. 4 to accept an award as athlete of the year. He plans to honor his race engagements, but we cannot expect much in the way of times. Will race a mile at Brisbane Jan 26, 880 Jan. 31 in the Victorian championships; in a four-mile relay with Lincoln, Thomas and one other on Feb. 1; and the NSW mile on Feb. 14, two days after his return. He does not feel too happy about racing. I think he will miss the Australian titles in Hobart Feb. 28 and March 2. He probably will do first year of science at Melbourne university this year. Lincoln is to be married week of Jan. 12, so maybe he won't be too fast this summer. Perhaps we must wait until 1960 to see our stars in peak form again.

"Laurie Elliott, 18, is working in Melbourne, and training at Portsea weekends. The senior Elliotts will be here in a day or two to live. There is a big team of youngsters down at Portsea now that Cerutti is back. They are coming from all over Australia."

TN TOM SNODGRASS, Little Rock, Ark.: "Since my recent return to Arkansas I have an observation to make. Segregation notwithstanding, the biggest factor holding track and field behind in the sunny south is football. I had forgotten just how consuming the southern football atmosphere is. It monopolizes the sports pages 12 months of the year. The ultimate for a high school athlete is to be a college football star. Prestige earned on the gridiron can put money in his pocket as a business man in future years. The majority of potential sprinters and weightmen never take our beloved sport seriously for it interferes with spring training and off-season clinics. I hope to do my small part in remedying the situation now that I am back on the scene."

TN CORDNER NELSON: "Fritz and Bim, the tiny tot distance runners, have continued to improve, both in running performances and in health. Their father has started construction of a 220 yard grass track, but until its completion next spring the only distances we can go by are the 108 yard laps of their present grass track. Four laps make approximately 432 yards (a well established distance--see the 1957 AAU). Fritz, a week after his ninth birthday, ran 4 laps in 66.8. Bim, a month before his 8th birthday, ran 68.1. As yet I see nothing outlandish in their aim of being four flat milers in high school."

TN HUGH GARDNER, Santa Monica, Calif. "I think your idea of a new records organization for schoolboys a great one. It's about time the preps got a break and had a set of records that would be fair to everyone, and recognize everyone who is deserving."

GLENN HARDIN

When Yuriy Lituyev of Russia ran 50.4 for a world record in the 400 meter hurdles in 1953 he broke the oldest of all the 49 standard IAAF records in the books at that time--the sensational 50.6 clocking made by Glenn Foster "Slats" Hardin of Greenwood, Mississippi, on July 26, 1934 at Stockholm. Hardin's great world record had lasted 19 years.

Hardin was another of those track and field "pioneers" who broke through a "barrier". He was the first man in history to beat 51 seconds for the 400 meter hurdles. Although he managed to go under 51 seconds only once, he did break 52 on six occasions, and that at a time when no one except Hardin had ever beaten 52 seconds officially in winning a 400 meter hurdle race. Indeed, so great was Hardin that since his world record performance almost 25 years ago, only six men have ever exceeded his time.

At Greenwood High School Hardin was a quarter-miler who also ran the 880, lows and high jumped. In 1930 Hardin's time of 50.0 for the 440 was second only to Ivan Fuqua's 49.7 as the year's best schoolboy mark. Hardin and Fuqua, of Brazil, Indiana, later became great rivals over the 440 route in college, Fuqua at Indiana and Hardin competing for Louisiana St.

As a freshman at LSU Hardin made the 132 US Olympic team and finished second in the finals of the 400 meter hurdles at Los Angeles behind Robert Tisdall of Ireland. Tisdall's time of 51.8 was not accepted as a world record because he had knocked over the 10th hurdle. Hardin's second place time earned him a new Olympic record of 52.0 which also tied F. Morgan Taylor's world record made in 1928. Hardin's actual time was 51.9 but the IAAF accepted the time as 52.0.

In 1933 Glenn scored a double in the NCAA, beating Fuqua in a 47.1 440, for a new meet record. The Bayou timber topper also won the 220 lows in a world record-breaking 22.9, but the mark was never recognized. Fuqua went on to win the 400m in the AAU but Slats concentrated on the 400m hurdles and won in 52.2. Hardin had finished first in this event at the AAU meet in 1932 but had been disqualified for running out of his lane.

Hardin, a handsome, well-built (6'2", 165 pounds) runner, made his indoor debut at the 1934 AAU meet, finishing third in the 600m behind Milton Sandler and Bernie McCafferty.

Outdoors, Hardin lost a 440 race to Fuqua in a dual meet but won the lows in 24.0. Slats rounded into form later in the year and returned a sizzling 46.8 to win the Southeastern Conference 440. It was the year's fastest. At the NCAA he retained his 440 title, again beating Fuqua, and establishing a championship record of 47.0. He completed his second title double in two years by taking the 220 lows in 22.7, tying Jack Keller's NCAA mark. Hardin's time was never submitted to the IAAF as a world record because Amos Alonzo Stagg, referee, said the electric timing device had caught Hardin in 23.16 seconds.

In Milwaukee at the AAU, Hardin breezed past Edgar Ablowich to retain his 400m hurdle title with a new world record of 51.8. This broke his time of the 1932 Olympics.

With this impressive record behind him, the beautiful striding Baton Rouge flyer joined the AAU team which toured Europe. His teammates were some of the greatest athletes in history and included Ben Eastman, Bill Bonthron, Bob Kane, Eulace Peacock, Percy Beard, Jack Torrance and Cornelius Johnson. The tour started with a three-day meet at Stockholm and Slats set a new track record of 47.8 for 400m. The following day he won the 300m in 33.7. On the third day (July 26) Hardin ran his incredible 50.6 world record. It wasn't even a race as Hardin won by 40 yards, becoming the first man in history to better 51 seconds.

On August 6 at Oslo he teamed with Peacock, Kane and Eastman to create a world record of 1:53.3 for the 1000m sprint medley relay. Later, Jack Torrance, his great LSU teammate, smashed all shot records with a mighty 57'1" and Eastman ran the fastest 500m on record (1:02). Hardin twice smashed his old record, 51.4 at Malmoe and again at Paris.

In 1935 Hardin again attempted to run indoors and again failed to win, losing twice. Slats met defeat twice at the NCAA in 1935, finishing third in the 440 (won by Jimmy LuValle of UCLA) and losing the lows to Jesse Owens. At the Princeton Invitational he was beaten in the 440 by Syracuse's Eddie O'Brien.

Not having lost a 400 hurdle race since his defeat in the 1932 Games, Hardin made the Olympics his goal. He opened with a new Southern AAU record of 52.9m, won at Princeton in 52.3m, and set an American record in the AAU with 51.6m. Slats won the Olympic trials in 51.4, pressed by Joe Patterson of the Naval Academy (51.6). Drawing the outside lane in the Olympic finals, Glenn trailed Patterson to the final straight but finished strongly to win in 52.4. It was the end of his great track career and marked a four year stretch without a defeat in his favorite event.
