#### MEET VALLEY ATHLETE

McKINLEY MOSLEY: Freshman, Bakersfield College. Born April 8, 1953, at Fresho, California. 5'11", 155 pounds.
BEST TIMES: 120 yard high hurdles—13.8 (71); 180 yard low hurdles—18.5 (71); 440 yard intermediate hurdles—55.3 (72); 440 yard dash—49.4 (72).
TRAINING: once a day, 5 to 6 days a week, 12 months a year. Coached by Bob Covey (Art Dalzell in high school).

Running in his first college track meet, the hot Fresno City-Bakersfield dual, McKinley produced two new meet records: 14.4 in the highs(breaking Jerry Wilson's 14.5 mark) and 55.3 in his first attempt at the intermediates. If these early season marks are any indication of things to come, Bakersfield can look forward to some mighty exciting hurdling performances from Mr. Mosley.

At Bakersfield High School he was Valley Champion in both the highs and the lows and his 13.8 in the highs now ranks second on the Valley All Time list, behind Jerry Wilson's 13.7. Other high school honors include: Sam Lynn Award, Tyack Award, Harry Coffee Award, and the outstanding athlete of the month award.

McKinley's favorite event is the 120 highs and he always runs to win. As for what to expect from him he says, "My goal this year is to win the State Meet. In the future it is to compete in the Olympics." He hopes to continue competing for at least three years and maybe more, "Because I enjoy competing and the people, plus it helps me through school."

After finishing up at Bakersfield College McKinley would like to complete his education and elgibility in San Diego, "Because of the weather and it's not too far from home." He hopes to major in correctional work.

before each workout two laps and 8-10 110's to warm up.

Monday: lots of stretching, light hurdle work, work out with 440 men.

Tuesday: lots of stretching, hard hurdle work and some 220's (6 in 30-33).

Wednesday: Stretching, light hurdles, hard running workout (22's).

Thursday: warm-up, track meeting.
Friday: track meet or just warm-up.

# MOTIVATION

For years track and field coaches have been asking what makes the difference between the average athlete and the super athlete. Within the last few years more and more coaches are agreeing that technical foundations and natural ability, although important, are not as decisive in determining championship performance as is motivation. Athletic achievement at a high level in all events has three vital and interlocking parts: (1) natural ability, (2) Knowledge of fundamentals and mechanics of a particular event, and (3) the work and effort put forth. The latter is by far the most important of the three.

More recently several successful coaches, Payton Jordan at Stanford, Vern Wolf at USC, and retired Bud Winter of San Jose State, "have commonly expressed the realization that we are fast approaching the peak of perfection with regard to track and field technical skill. They are also in agreement that the next important break through will occur when we are able to comprehend the motivational factors that contribute to track success and failure."

In addition to recognizing the importance of motivation in track and field I feel that we are only scratching the surface in terms of information on application to track and field. Much of the track literature of the 70's will concern itself with the subject of motivation. Motivation and Coaching Psychology by Fred Wilt; Modern Coaching Psychology by Curtis Gaylord; Problem Athletes and How to Handle Them by Bruce Ogilvie and Thomas Tutko are good examples of the type of recent writings in the area of track and field.

If motivation is so important for maximum track performance, where do we begin to become successful motivaters? Drs. Ogilvie and Tutko have concluded that the most prominent characteristic of the highly successful coach is "stick-to-it-tive-ness" willingness to apply oneself over the long haul, stay with the job until completed, and be motivated with the disire to be on top.

It appears that to motivate others we must look to ourselves objectively, observe our habits and methods, and attempt to see ourselves as our athletes see us. This in itself is a difficult task, but without an accurate evaluation of ourselves it will be hard to motivate honestly. We often forget the trust a young man has in us. If we are to be effective motivaters we must look at ourselves and realize that although we are not all Jordans, Bowermans, or Wrights, we can be successful by making sure we are sincere and honest in all dealings with our athletes. It is a responsibility to realize that an athlete responds to you as an individual and when you call upon him for that extra effort, that dig-in one more time, he will do so only to the extent of his trust in you. If we have taken a good look at ourselves; if we are as dedicated as our most dedicated man, then we can motivate him to reach his own capacities and beyond. We can expect him to give no less than his very best.

Performances that we will be privileged to see in the 70°s will come from athletes who have been motivated beyond technical and physical abilities, by coaches who have given the same themselves. How can we motivate track men? Effective motivation in the 70°s will come by way of coaches who are examples of what they are asking of their athletes.

Because motivation tends to lose its effectiveness in direct proportion to its frequency of application, we must look for a wide variety of effective methods and ideas that help motivate track athletes. Some good suggestions include: special track section in school library, bulletin boards, frequently available track facilities, postal competitions, interclass meets, pentathlons-decathlons, variety of awards, films, variety in workouts, record boards, individual attention, visiting big meets, track clubs, press books, and on and on. The coach is only limited in his variety of motivating techniques by his imagination.

#### WASCO WILDKAT T. C.

The Wildkats turned in some excellent performances at the Reedley Kings River Run and the Ivanhoe Road Race, but are now switching gears somewhat in preparation for track. One of those now preparing for the new track season is Terry Frye, featured in <u>Wildkat</u> <u>Profile</u> this month and pictured on the cover.

Terry is 12 years old, 4\*8" tall and weighs 75 pounds. She has been running since she was 9 years old and is coached by Brad Tomasini. Her training schedule presently consists of six day a week workouts starting December 1st and continuing through the month of June. Early season training is made up of overdistance work and strength training exercises. Interval work and speed running is not started until the middle of February.

When Terry was 9 years old she recc ded a 12.6 seconds 100 yard dash time which still officially ranks as the fastest time for this distance ever recorded for this age group. As an 11 year old last season she ran an 11.9 seconds 100 yard dash in the Junior Olympics finals which ranked number one in the nation.

#### FRESNO ELANS T. C.

Representing the Elans at the United States Indoor Women's Track and Field Championships is shot putter Iva Wright. Iva, a 17 year-old senior at Edison High School, is the 1971 Junior Olympic shot put champion and the 1971 National AAU Girl's discus champion and shot put runnerup. He best marks are 46'5" in the shot (8 pounds-13 ounces) and 152'1" in the discuss. The indoor meet will be held at Columbia University in New Yo. and Iva will be going for the girl's national record of 48'8".

#### MEET VALLEY COACH

Ed Savage of Selma High School: It's a tough job being a head coach even after years of experience, but it's even tougher being a head coach after only one year of assistant coaching. But Coach Ed Savage, now in his third year as head coach of Selma High, has produced two consecutive East Sequoia League 440 champions(70-71), a 57'8" junior shot putter, and a 4:35 freshman miler.

Ed was born in Antioch, California, and attended Antioch High School. While there he won honors as the 1961 league 660 champ, athlete-of-the-week--1961, was a member of the 1962 league cross country champions, and sportsman of the year in 1962. He went on to Fresno State College where he was the 5000 meter cross country record holder and placed third in the small college regional 880 with a time of 1:53.8.

Coach Savage came to Selma High in 68. where he became the assistant coach under former F.S.C. 440 star and current record holder, Bill Knocke. In 1969 he took over the reigns when Coach Knocke moved on to the Univ. of Indiana. Among the outstanding athletes he's worked with are: Mike Elder--1:56.8, 49.3; Nelson Schwamb--49.8; Steve Carlock--57'8" shot put; freshman miler Carlos Bermundez--4:35; and all around athlete Sythell Thompson. The greatest thrill he's experienced during his years as head coach was when his underrated mile-relay team captured the 1971 league title, defeating such powerhouses as Lemoore and Reedley.

To Coach Savage his team is like one big family, each person receives the same amount of help and consideration, whether he's a sub-50 quarter miler or a 5:00 minute plus miler. "We can't all be winners, and it's tough to lose, but those that do and learn, will yet go on to be winners."

Selma High may not have a championship team in 72, but they have a great deal of e most important element of success: "desire," and with Coach Savage "desire" comes naturally. from CLIFF CLARK - outstanding middle distance runner, as well as coach at Merced High School.

How about this theory: A runner runs twice on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and once every other day of the week, i.e. 10 work-outs each week. If he averages 6 miles per workout of distance and ends each run with 15X110 yd. accelerations. he will do 60 miles a week plus 150X110 or 75X220, etc. With that, add a race mile in 4:20 or an 880 in 2:00, he adds 4X440 @65 or 4X220 @30 each week. Why, then, would a high school runner need to go through a work-out on the track, day in and day out? Therein is the cause of many youngsters burning out in high school - this obsession with the idea that speed can only come on a  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile track. My theiry for high school boys is that the track is there for their classmates who are not interested enough to come out for the 6:30 AM work-outs to come watch a race.

from SKIP HOUK - AAU 50 Mile champion and outstanding long distance runner. I'm moving back to Reno for some high altitude and mountain training for the Olympic Trials. I've accepted a job there with a good advancement which I just o couldn't turn down. It sure has been enjoyable living down here - except for the smog - and I've met a lot of nice friendly people, especially thru running. I hope to return sometime in the future to compete and visit. Right now I'm going into hibernation in Reno and will train for one race - the Trials. I will have to devote a lot of time to my new job so Boston is out this year. I will start training heavy again in May.

Because of the caliber of the two teams the quality of the competition was outstanding as 12 records were either broken or tied. The score may have been somewhat closer had Fresno's "one-man-gang" Maxie Parks not pulled up with a muscle strain during the opening event, the 440 relay. Probably the most outstanding performances came from Eddie Granillo(4:13.7 and 9:13.8), McKinley Mosley(14.4 and 55.3), and Kerry Elders(6'82"). The Bakersfield-Fresno dual is gaining the reputation of best early season annual dual meet in the state. In 1970, the Renegades handed Fresno its only loss before they finished second to Merritt at the State Finals. Last year, FCC handed BC its only loss, and the Renegades went on to win the Metro, So. California, and State titles. Both teams appear headed in the same direction again in 1972.
