WEST VALLEY'S NEW MEMBERS

We have a sprinter of top caliber who is just about to enter the Senior category. His name is Ed Smoot (39) and he is presently living at 18830 Casablanca in Saratoga. At present we don't have Ed's best track times except in the 440 where he has done:53.0, and he was 39 at the time! Ed is sure to represent West Valley in the sprints at the National Senior Championships in a year if he continues to run like this.

Our newest high school runner is Chuck Mork of Washington High in Fremont. Chuck is only a junior and already owns some pretty fantastic track times. On January 24 he ran a very good early season 4:19.6 in the

mile while qualifying for the Athens Indoor Meet at the Oakland Coliseum. In the process of qualifying, he edged out Campolindo's stellar Tom Hale who was also timed in 4:19.6. Chuck also owns a two mile best of 9:22.0 which he ran in an All-Comers meet late in 1969. The Washington ace also runs well in cross country as he finished second to Hale in the NCS finals this year over a three mile course in 14:17. Although only a novice at road racing, Chuck shows good potential as he ran 55th in last May's Bay to Breakers race. He puts his goals high as he hopes to run a sub-4:15 mile and sub-9:00 two mile by the end of track season this year. Chuck's address is 38359 Alta Drive, Fremont (Phone: 797-7799).

West Valley's most recent addition, although not eligible to run for the club until May, is ex-Olympic Club runner, Chris Miller. Before he ran for SFOC, Chris ran for the Oregon TC and Athens AC. Chris's best track times are as follows: 51.7, 1:53.6, 4:05.3, 8:48.7, 13:43.4, 28:53.8, 29:50.4 (10,000m), 50:31.7 (10 mi.), 11 mi., 1110 yds. (1 hour), 9:00.2 (steeplechase). His best road and cross country races include a 2nd place finish recently over 20 km. in 1:04:10, a 19:12.8 in the NAIA Dist. #2 race in 1966 (4 miles), and a 2:22:09.4 in the Spanish Natl. Marathon in 1967. Chris now lives at 659 Kendall Ave., Palo Alto, 94306, (Phone: 328-1236). He is 26.

He has contacted the meet director at the San Diego Indoor (Feb. 20) to try and get bids for Mejia and Miller in the three mile. We are waiting to hear from them. Bill Mackey also has a good chance to run in the Senior mile at the same meet.

Willie Cronin has returned from a month long vacation in his native Ireland and brought back a nice case of the flu bug that is sweeping Europe. However, he is now over it and is beginning to train hard again. While in Ireland, Willie ran in the Kerry County Novice Cross Country Championships (his home county) and finished a good second place, only about 120 yards behind the winner over a four mile course. The weather was a frigid 28 degrees at race time and this hampered him somewhat. The course was rolling and the winning time was 22:05 (his time is not available).

Alvaro Mejia was unable to compete in the S.F. Examiner All American Games on January 3 because of a pinched nerve in his neck. He had trained over 100 miles a week for the two weeks preceding the race but woke up the morning before the meet and was hardly able to turn his head. He went to the Cow Palace anyway in hopes that the trainer could help him a little. But finally Al decided he would not run at all since he did not want to run a sub-par race. About 4 days later he was able to train again and is now in top shape.

At the time this paper goes to the presses, West Valley has six representatives in the Athens Indoor Meet on February 6. A team consisting of the four Mackey brothers: Jim, John, Bob and Bill will compete in the Two of our high school Senior Relay. runners also qualified in the mile run. They are Chuck Mork and Eddie Silva. Mork led all qualifiers with a 4:19.6 and Silva finished fifth in 4:26.8. For a complete list of high school mile qualifiers, see the race results in this issue. Marcel is currently in the process of trying to get invitations for Mejia and Miller.

Jim Bowles is recovering from a knee operation and is now planning on the 100 miler in March. Just for the heck of it, Jim, Paul Reese, and Peter Mattei and anyone else who really cares to, are going to try 100 miles (all at once) on the 14th of March. This is not in conjunction with the three day run. If anyone else is interested, contact Jim Bowles, Box 286, CMR, Mather AFB, Sacramento. Jim plans to go to New York on February 9 for about 20 days and hopes to compete at least once, but it all depends on how his knee is progressing.

Chris Miller, West Valley's newest member, ran a very good two mile on the track on Jan. 10 at an all-comers race in Redding. His time was 8:53.7, third best ever for him. He covered his last mile in about 4:20;

Starting next month, the Newsletter will run a story on two West Valley members each month. This will be a sort of "know your club" column. We will throw everyone's name into a hat and randomly draw two names at the beginning of each month. We will then contact these members and ask them to supply certain information about themselves. March will feature our editors: Jack Leydig and Marcel Hetu.

West Valley is selling small dog repellant sprayers at \$2.00 apiece to help build up the club treasury. These are similar to the type that mailmen carry and are very effective against dogs and people. They are very small and weigh much less than an ounce. They are pressurized and will spray a fine mist over a wide area. I have used mine two or three times and found them to be quite effective. They are probably good for about 15 "attacks". I ran with one in the Petaluma marathon and it saved me a lot of trouble with one dog at about 15 miles. These will be available at most road races beginning in mid-February and can be purchased from most West Valley runners.

In the current Track & Field News (January 1970), two West Valley runners made the top 15 for best marathoners in 1969. However, Martins Ande did not actually make the list because he is not an American. He would have placed 6th behind Ken Moore, Ron Daws, Jay Dirksen, Bob Deines, and Chuck Smead with his 2:24:02 at the Palos Verdes Marathon. Jack Leydig just missed being mentioned (only the top 13 were listed) and would have placed 14th among Americans with his 2:28:52 at Culver City last year (not including Ande).

Again, we are interested in getting a list of everyone in the Northern or Southern California area who is interested in going to the Boston Marathon in April. If we can get enough runners together then perhaps we can get a charter flight and cut down on expenses. If anyone has any ideas or suggestions on this, we would appreciate hearing from you as soon as possible. We received some charter information (preliminary only) from one of our readers recently (Ric Geimer). The rough figure is about \$250 per person, roundtrip, for groups of 10 or more people. This is a discount of approximately \$60 from the normal coach fare of \$310 (both figures include tax). In addition to the fare discount, United Airlines will offer special bag tags for all luggage to ensure that it all travels together, special boarding for the group, and will make hotel reservations if desired. We will have a lot more information in the next issue. Let us hear from you.

Marcel Hetu is contacting The Southern California Striders and Pacific Coast Club, as well as a few good colleges in an attempt to get a four mile relay in the West Coast Relays on May 9. If there is enough interest in getting the event, then there is a good possibility that it will be run. West Valley now has numerous good milers (sub-4:10) in Mejia, Hetu, Miller, Likens, and Leydig is getting close. We are hoping to send a team this year if the event is held. Chances appear good since Pacific Coast Club would have a possible shot at the world record with the likes of Lawson, Mason, Scott and company.

Please send us material and race results so that we can keep up the quality of our Newsletter. Articles on training, diet, weight lifting, etc. are welcome and we will try and print at least one interesting article each month. RACE WALKING RESULTS

Results of Stow Lake 15 kilo race walk held at Golden Gate Park on Jan. 25, 10 am. The course consisted of 8 mile loops (actually more than 8) with 364 ft. tacked on the end of each loop. First went to Tom Dooley in 69:51.2. He was followed closely by Bill Ranney in 72:24.7. Third and fourth places went to high school runners Jerry Lansing (87:22) and Jerry Heinwright (88:14). In a special distance, Miss Jackie Dooley (14) race walked 59:26 over 5 miles. She ranks high in the U.S.

Several PA-AAU running events were entered by walkers recently. In the Petaluma marathon, Tom Dooley finished a pre-arranged 25 miles in 3:38 (approx.) while Bill Ranney, a few minutes behind, continued to record a 3:58:06 for the full distance. In the PA 32 miler on Jan. 4, Bill Ranney walked to a 4:51:13 and a 19th place finish (22 finished), passing 50 km. in 4:43. Fifteen year old Jerry Lansing recently walked a track one mile in 7:33:

(November 29): In the open 10.3 mile race at the Colfax Cross Country Carnival, Marin's Don Makela ran away from the field and won easily by almost two minutes over the University of Nevada's Jim Bissonnette and Pat Busbee, running attached. Busbee won the open division and Makela took the college division and overall best time. In the over-40 division, Ross Smith took top honors, followed by Alex Koenig and Peter Mattei. Smith's winning time was 65:04. First three finishers (40-50) were Peter Mattei (31st in 3:06:47), Ralph Paffenbarger (36th in 3:12:01), and Bob Biancalana (56th in 3:27:55). First 3 finishers over 50 were Paul Reese (32nd in 3:07:39), Tom Tripodes (61st in 3:29:35), and Jack Kirk (113th in 4:23:35). CHRIS MILLER WINS EIGHTH CONSECUTIVE MIDNIGHT RUN

(January 1): In what must be close to a record for consecutive wins in the same race, The Olympic Club's Chris Miller, in his last race for that club, ran away from a strong field to win his eighth New Year's Eve Midnight Run in a row. He missed his own course record of 30:53.2 for the 10,000 meter course near Foothill College but came close with a 31:03.6. The Striders were led by San Carlos High School ace, Randy Lawson, who was the first high school finisher and 12th overall. Only one thing remains a mystery to the editors and to West Valley. Who is Ward Crary and who does he run for? In the Los Altos paper's results of the race, he was listed as finishing 10th place for West Valley TC. 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(January 3): West Valley had two representatives in the Examiner Games that were held at the Cow Palace on an 11 laps to the mile board track, the Senior Mile, veteran Bill Mackey raced to a 6th place finish against a tough field to a personal indoor record of 4:52.2. Bill Fitzgerald of the LA Senior Track Club outsprinted Santa Monica's Pete Mundle in an exciting dash off the last curve to win handily, 4:35.2 to 4:35.7. Marin Acts up and coming Senior ace Peter Wood slipped into third place with a good 4:40.6 to lead Northern California entrants. Gene Haynes of the AAU Officials took 4th in 4:43.2 while the San Francisco Olympic Club's Don Pickett came in with a 4:50.4 for fifth place. West Valley's Jim Howell anchored Foothill's mile medley relay but was unable to move up on the leaders after he took the baton in last place. Alvaro Mejia was scheduled to run in the open two mile but was forced to scratch because of a pinched nerve in his neck. The race was won by UTEP's and Australia's Kerry Pearce in a good 8:39.4. He was followed in by Oregon's frosh ace Steve Prefontaine (8:46.8) and the Pacific Coast Club's George Scott (8:56.2). Only other sub-9:00 finisher was Stanford's Greg Brock at 8:59.4.

The high school two mile race was a runaway from the very beginning as Campolindo's Tom Hale broke loose from Chuck Mork (Washington of Fremont) in the early stages. Passing the mile in a very quick 4:29, he slowed to a final clocking of 9:19.2, but still enough for a 20 second victory over Mork and Bob McCarty (St. Francis) as both were timed in 9:39.8. DELGADO WINS PA-AAU 20 KM. TITLE -- MARIN NIPS WEST VALLEY BY SIX

(January 18): In what proved to be a very fast race, Richard Delgado ran away from Chris Miller over the last 3 miles to win the Pacific AAU 20 kilometer championships in a course record of 1:03:29, breaking Miller's 1:04:53 (last year's race). In fact, the first three runners dipped under the record as fast closing Steve Dean took the third spot from Sweden's Peter Frederikson (vacationing in California until May). The team battle proved to be just as heated as Marin edged out West Valley and the Redwood City Striders (37-43-57). First high school runner across the line was West Valley's and Watsonville High's Eddie Silva who took 8th in a fine 1:08:04. Sequoia's and the Strider's Jose Cortez was close behind in 1:08:21. The first senior runner to complete the race was West Valley's Bill Mackey who had just raced a 4:46 indoor mile the night before in Los Angeles! His time was 1:17:20, good enough for 45th place. Other team scores: Napa Valley Road Runners - 116, and Alum Rock Running Association - 118. To get an idea of just how popular road racing is becoming and just how times are improving, get this. Last year only 8 broke 1:10 on this course; this year twice that many did. Sixteen were under 1:15 last time and 39 did it this year! Registering perhaps the greatest improvement was Jose Cortez (19th at 1:15:22 last year to 9th at 1:08:21 in 1970, an improvement of 7 minutes in one year!) Watch out for Cortez in the near future. He is sure to set a lot of records. See the following page for the top 40.




