

# FORUM

## THERE IS MORE TO COACHING THEN MEETS THE EYE

This article was submitted by MELVIN DOUGLASS, coach of the Jamaica Track Club in New York.

Mr. Douglass, a Doctorate of Education candidate in Curriculum and Teaching at Columbia University, discusses the important aspects of the psychological, sociological and academic development of young athletes.

As an educator I felt a particular need to take issue with a subject that is very dear to me, young people.

I feel it is important that coaches of young athletes have certain concerns that take precedence over all others, and that is the athlete's personal development. The areas we must concern ourselves with, in regard to the young athlete, are: the psychological development of the athlete, the sociological development of the athlete, the academic development of the athlete, and the athletic development of the athlete.

The psychological development of the athlete is most important. A coach should be aware of the athlete's state of mind, before a practice session and before a meet.

It can be said that positive thinking has aided the body to accomplish almost superhuman feats; therefore, what the athlete thinks about himself and his opponents, may be the factor needed to determine the outcome of the competition.

The psychological importance of bringing the athlete through the ranks and files of competition, and not trying to produce a superstar overnight, will prove to be a step in the right direction towards building the athlete's feeling of self-confidence.

The sociological development of the athlete may be attained by the practicing of the familiar trite - It's not important whether you win or lose, It's how you play the game.

If coaches would change the emphasis from winning to personal achievement, the athlete would have no difficulty with upholding the ethics of amateur sports. To often, because of the lack of tutelage by the coaches, the young athlete experiences a high degree of unnecessary frustration and anxiety.

The coaches must remember that amateur sports should be a healthy learning experience for the young athlete, and not something to make him or her apprehensive, fearful or uneasy.

The athlete must be free from agitation and excitement, so that he may enjoy the sport he is participating in. This free state of mind will enable the athlete to approach his fellow athletes with a sportsmanship manner.

The academic development of the athlete should be paramount on the list of priorities by the coaches.

A well known track coach on the East coast said: "I get elated over the girls excellent grades more than I do when the girls break a record or win a race. I feel running in competition will last only for a short time, and the athlete must look forward to future plans."

If coaches permit the athlete to place athletics in front of scholarship, they (the coaches) are serving as an accomplice to a crime, and that crime being the possible ruin of that individual's life.

The last, but not the least, concern of coaches ought to be the athletic development of the athlete. I have seen, as many of you have seen, young athletes who have not been taught the basic skills of their events.

It is crucial that running is taught correctly, since it is the basic skill needed for hurdling, long jumping, high jumping, etc... The athlete can bring injury to himself and to others if his legs are sagging and if the runner's arms are flinging wildly in the air.

These actions will soon give the impression to observers that little time and effort, on the part of the athlete and the coach, has been spent in preparation for the participant's event. We, as coaches, must remember that serious body injury can occur when an athlete has not developed basic skills.

In conclusion, I would like to state that coaches are educators, and being educators we must concern ourselves with the total development of the athlete.

The areas of concern, that I mentioned, in which coaches can better aid the athlete, is by no way in itself conclusive, but I believe it is a step in a positive direction for the coaches and the athlete.

Also include heat or qualifying round marks (if better than final mark) and birthdates on top athletes would be helpful for best performance lists.

#### News

General interest items (in contrast to news merely of your team or of one individual) are more useful. We want material on both boys and girls (such as schedules of upcoming events, new teams or programs, background info on area, athletes, etc.), especially from areas which haven't gotten much space before.

# NATIONAL AAU BOYS AGE GROUP TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS

ALBUQUERQUE, NM - July 15-17, 1977

This year's Boys Age Group National Championships was certainly most successful in terms of attendance and performances.

A record number of 1200 athletes representing 135 clubs from 26 States were present at the University of New Mexico at Albuquerque.

The competition was intense in most events as 42 new meet records were established in the four divisions.

Among the multiple event winners were OKEY EGU (short sprints and jump) and CRAIG HOOKER (distance races), both boys from California in the Bantam division; Florida's FRED CARLEY (all distance events), WAYNE NICHOLS from Louisiana (short sprint and vault) and JIM BANICH of Colorado (master of the weight events) in the Junior division;

For future National Championships, including the one coming up in 1978, it has been suggested that it was time to follow a more normal and official procedure of selecting a site for such a meet.

Instead of awarding the championship to an individual club (which makes it very tough on the club), it should be awarded to an AAU Association. The responsibility to stage the meet would then be shared by the Age Group clubs of that Association.



# NATIONAL AAU JUNIOR WOMEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

UCLA - Drake Stadium  
WESTWOOD, CA - June 14, 1977

Taking advantage of unusually moderate weather ( $75^{\circ}$ ) and ignoring the dearth of spectators, US Junior Women once again raised their standards in most events.

Particularly outstanding were the distance races, where high school phenoms were forced to world class Junior times by strong overall fields. High School developed athletes won six of the fourteen individual titles.

KIM ROBINSON's double in the sprints and six record breaking performances highlighted this meet.

Robinson, who competes for the Los Angeles Mercurettes, won the 100 in 11.50, an electronically-timed meet record that bettered the 11.4 hand-timed mark registered by Chandra Cheesborough in 1975. Fifty minutes later, Robinson came back to capture the 200, becoming the meet's only double winner. Her team, the Mercurettes, took team honors.

HELENE CONNELL of Jackson, NJ, competing for the Atlantic Coast Club, set a meet record in the discus for the second day in a row in the finals, with a winning toss of 159-4. In the previous day's qualifying rounds, the 17-year old had broken Teri Sabol's 1974 meet standard with a 155-7 effort.

## DECATHLON & PENTATHLON NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

YAKIMA, WA - July 2-4, 1977

Cashmere's (WA) KEITH COLLINS said afterwards that he never doubted that he would win it and his record point total of 7,178 in the Senior Boys division of the National Junior Olympics Decathlon and Pentathlon Championships reflected his overpowering confidence.

Collins was the class of a senior boys' decathlon at Yakima's Zaepfel Stadium that included a whopping 15 competitors over the magic 6,000 mark.

Keith finished ahead of TIM SIM of Halsey, OR, and Yakima's own SCOTT WELLS while defending champion TERRY SCOTT (Ocean Shores, WA), hobbled by a recurrent leg cramp, finished a distant 16th with 6,053 points.

"Oh yeah, I thought I would win," said Collins, who plans to play basketball as a frosh for Central Washington State this fall. "Things were a little shaky after the pole vault when Sim was coming close to catching me, and then he came a little closer in the javelin. But after that, I knew I'd be able to hold on."

In the Intermediate division, Walla Walla's KRAIG KLICKER smashed the national record of 5,642 set in 1975 by John Holloway by scoring 5722 points. Second was DAVID DAUGHERTY of Raleigh, NC, recording an excellent 5621.

BEVERLY FULLER from tiny Miltonvale, KS, easily won the Senior Pentathlon event with 3,564 while JACKIE JOYNER of East St. Louis, IL, earned high honors in the Intermediate (14-15) Pentathlon with 3,613 points.

When the 17-year old Fuller arrived with her father, they were well ahead of schedule. In fact, everything went perfectly - especially when she arrived at the Zaepfel Stadium track. You see, the track in Fuller's tiny Miltonvale, KS, (population 600) is an odd-shaped cinder course that is over 100 yards too short. And until her father pitched in, the school didn't own a hurdle. The rundown track and the equally unimpressive high school, built in 1919, probably blend right in with the rest of tiny Miltonvale.

No matter where Miss Fuller is from, she did very well. With just one event left, she led the Senior Pentathlon by over 70 points. Since she just turned 17, Beverly still has another year of Junior Olympics left.

# GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL TRACK

It's state meet time for your reporter & the results are that national recordbooks are going to have to be rewritten all over the place. With three or four sets of national records in existence the claims are hot and heavy. We will try to identify best ever high school marks as we report them, but don't be surprised if your "national record" isn't even close.

One of the earliest, and fastest, state meets was the FLORIDA 4A and 3A championship on May 8, and the story was Chandra Cheesborough of Jacksonville Ribault. The 1976 Olympian led her team to a tie with Clearwater as she blasted to 10.3 and 23.3 marks and won the long jump at 19'11". Chandra didn't have the spotlight to herself, however, as Laverne Palmer(Ft. Lauderdale Dillard) won the 110yH with a 13.8 clocking in the 3A division, and Cheryl Fisher(Satellite Beach) heaved the 8# shot 47'0 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Betty Jo Springs(Bradenton Bayshore) copped the 3A 880-mile-2Mile(2:14.5/5:04.9/11:17.8). Despite Palmer's efforts (she also ran on the winning 440 and 880 relay teams--48.0/1:40.5--and was third in the long jump), Rockledge edged Dillard by  $\frac{1}{2}$  point.

Digby's 38 points were not enough to top Sunset High's Wierson sisters. Sophomore Teri took the 110yH in 14.70 and edged frosh sister Marchi in the 880, 2:13.43 to 2:13.79. Both girls also ran on Sunset's winning Mile Relay(3:59.74). One of the real stories in the AAA meet, however, was South Eugene's Kate Conant. Never before under five minutes in the mile, Kate outkicked Sunset's Eryn Forbes to "claim" a national record of 4:48.94 (see what I mean about those records folks?). Forbes, who was injured in the stretch duel, clocked 4:51.5. Conant came back to win the two mile in 10:43.4.

# POSTAL SIX-MINUTE RUN CONTEST

## Results of the 1976-77 Annual Competition

The sixth Annual Six Minute Run Postal School Contest for the 1977/78 school year will begin when school commences in September.

Rules will remain the same, with the entry deadline May 1, 1978. Special awards will go to schools who submit at least one team entry prior to December 31, 1977.

Specific rules are listed below:

1. SCHOOLS ELIGIBLE are any public or private school in the United States (graded or ungraded schools). Note: Foreign entries will be accepted and listed for comparison purposes. They will not, however, be counted in the official year-end tabulation.

2. RUNNERS ELIGIBLE for a team must be in current attendance at a single school (AAU registered runners are eligible). In Elementary Boys Division, runners must be in the sixth grade or below and must have been born after 1964. Runners in Intermediate Boys or Intermediate/Elementary Girls Divisions must be in the eighth grade or below and must have been born after 1962.

3. A TEAM consists of any five runners at the school, who run as far as possible within a single timed six-minute period on any regulation quarter-mile (or 400m) or 220 yard track - indoor or outdoor.

4. TIMING (of the six minutes) may be done with any acceptable watch with a sweep second hand.

5. MEASUREMENT of the distance covered is figured to the furthest 110 yard segment for each runner. A runner must complete 110 yards before the six-minute period expires in order to get credit for covering that distance. In case of team ties, the team with the youngest total age will get the higher place.

6. SCORING is done by taking the total distance covered by the first five runners on the team in the 6-minute span.

7. COMPETITION may be intra-mural (one school only, running by themselves) or inter-scholastic (two or more schools competing against each other). Different divisions may run separately or combined into one race. A school may submit an entry for more than one team in a division, and may enter any and all divisions. Schools may enter the same team any number of times (have several different races at different times, e.g.). However, all members of a team submitted as an entry must have run at the same time.

8. ENTRIES must be received by STARTING LINE Magazine, PO Box 878, Reseda, CA 91335, no later than May 15, 1978. Write for entry blanks or submit the following information:

(a) name of school, with address, (b) site of competition - name of field and city, (c) date of competition, (d) first and last names of the scoring athletes, plus grade in school and birthdate of each runner, (e) distance covered by each runner, to the furthest quarter-lap...e.g. 4½ laps, 3½ laps, 3 laps, etc..., (f) the name and position of two verifying adults (one of which should be an employee of the school).


