## NEW TRENDS IN AGE GROUP TRACK - by Dr. Harmon Brown

For those who are charged with the responsibility (or volunteer for the responsibility) of organizing and administering age group programs, it is necessary for them to be aware of the many new developments in the field.

The remarks below by Dr. Harmon Brown, who heads the National Girls Age Group Track & Field program for the AAU, were made upon completion of the National AAU convention in October, where a number of important rule changes were made or discussed. His comments may apply equally as well to boys and girls age group programs.

\* \* \* \*

It is apparent that track and field is growing at an accelerating rate, with the greatest explosion taking place at the Age Group level. Not only is the quantity increasing, but the quality of the performances continues to improve, as evidenced by the yearly statistical tabulations. Further, there is a more mature attitude toward track being shown by many of the 12 and 13 year old "veterans" of the sport, as they grow and develop in the program. They have begun to acquire a sounder basis in track and their training programs permit them to look forward to continued development and long range goals in track.

The over-all program of events seems to be well rounded and to offer enough variety of appeal to children with different interests and aptitudes in track. However, experimentation continues, and a number of trends appear to be taking shape. I would like to point out a few of these trends and to offer some comments and cautions.

1. Early specialization. We live in a society which emphasizes specialized technology, with specialty education beginning at an earlier age. Track and field seems to be no exception to this trend. However, I feel that it is a mistake to channel a beginner into one or two events on the basis of empirical judgements such as "you look like you ought to be a...." or "I want to go out for....". The novice should be introduced to a wide variety of skills, events, and techniques, and exposed to a broad training program.

I believe there should be more low-pressure, small meets, as opposed to marathon invitational affairs, and that Age Group athletes should be trained for and expected to compete in a variety of events at these meets. Only after exposure to a rounded program should she and the coach decide upon selected events on the basis of his or her interest and aptitudes.

2. Birth year concept of age classification. A number of coaches, statisticians, and others interested in track have suggested age group athletes be placed in age groupings according to their year of birth, as is done in Canada and Europe. Hence, all girls or boys born in 1959 would compete in the 12-13 age group in 1972. This would mean that an athlete born December 30, 1959 would compete against 12, 13, and some 14 year olds for the entire 1972 season, despite being a young 12 year old all that time - a distinct psychological disadvantage. While the "birth year" concept makes things much easier for the statisticians, I think that if this idea is to be adopted the age cut-off date should be placed closer to the start of the usual track season, perhaps March 1 or April 1. If this is to be considered seriously, as many are urging, it must be coordinated with the other age group track programs - Junior Olympics, Long Distance, Youth Games, etc. so that a common date can be selected for legislative approval next year.

Your thoughts and action on any of these "new trends" is urgently invited.

## From the Mail Box

In the Pacific AAU Assn. we seem very short of boys in the 14-15 age group - so short that meet directors must feel what's the use of wasting the time!

In our area, a youngster must turn 5 before December 1 before he is allowed to start school, so therefore by the time these boys get to high school their age grouping is just starting to go into the 14-15 age group.

So during cross country season the competition is very light until after the high school season is over and in spring track you are just beginning to get a few boys turning age into 14. This means less than 12½ to 25% of the boys are eligible for the AAU program.

Are other areas having this same feeling of uselessness for the 14 year olds?

In observing the age group scene the past four years, I have witnessed many marvelous performances and enjoyed perhaps the most economical sport available. The endless hours of volunteer coaching as well as fund raising by many people is certainly to be commended.

At the same time I am perplexed by the maneuvering sometimes associated with teams. Coaches and parents human characteristics tend to demand "winners" and forget the great value of continued running whether or not records are broken and titles won. Perhaps an award should be given annually to the club that has the most youngsters continuing to run after 2, 3, 4 seasons. Too many drop out partly due to the too-long season that never ends and partly due to the insistence on winning. Could it be we take our efforts too seriously at times?

Regarding the question of whether men can or should coach girls, it would appear that what is needed most is maturity - not the right sex or race or any other single factor.

# GIRLS and BOYS Age Group

## NATIONAL RRCA X-COUNTRY REPORT - by Steven Sutton

The editors thank Steve (our all-around man in New York) and RRCA officials for their cooperation in providing this report & photos on outside pages.

With the rain pouring down on the Bronx, a record 1282 athletes made their way to Van Cortlandt Park on November 7 to compete in the Second Annual Road Runners Club Age Group Cross Country National Championships.

Although the poor weather reduced each field in size, a total of 20 states were represented. With the 1 p.m. starting time came the first of days ten  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile races and also the day's first look at the sun. The rain had now subsided, but the wind remained biting and gusty with the temperatures in the 30's.

The crowds began to form a funnel at the start for the charge of the first race, for 6 and 7 year old boys. As the field broke, Robert Ryerson (Laurel, Md) led the pack through the flats and hills to win in 10:34.8 as he and runner-up Craig Hill (Oxon Hill, Md) broke Mike McKinney's meet record of 10:48. Chris O'Shea (Wantagh, L.I.) and Ronald Geisler (Bronx, NY) followed in that order.

Gene Mirkin (Washington, DC) beat the field in the 8 & 9 boys division with a time of 9:57.2. Gene, who improved a minute from last year's competition finished ahead of teammate Chris Sherwin and Timothy O'Toole (Valley Stream, L.I.), with favorite Mike McKinney (Westbridge, Va) sixth.

Gene's younger sister Jan Mirkin battled Kim Galagher (Ambler, Pa) for the Girls 6-7 title. Kim outdistanced her rival in 11:26.6 as both, plus third placer Emma Leale of Valley Stream, easily broke Kim Campbell's (Washington, DC) meet record of 11:50. The latter, however, breezed to victory over teammate Robin Powell in the 8-9 division with respective times of 10:25.8 and 10:29.9.

The Campbell family also came up a winner in the Girls 10-11 division as Donna Campbell tried unsuccessfully to break her older sister Robin's meet record of 9:18. Her 9:34.4 time outran Nancy Frank (Valley Stream) and Marian Opalewsky (Saginaw, Mich). Donna and Nancy also finished 1-2 in the RRCA Mile Championships in June.

Robin Campbell could not complete a sweep for the family as she finished third at 9:13.8 in the 12-13 division behind AAU mile champ Robin Perry (Ambler, Pa) who won in 8:57.2 and second placer Julie Shea (Raleigh, NC) 9:09.4. All three crushed Allison Hoskin's meet record of 9:41.0.

5:00.3 miler Kevin Knox, who traveled to New York from Wasco, Calif. led all the way in the boys 10-11 race to beat last year's winner Vincent Hogan (Flushing, NY) who finished third this year. Billy McClay (Oxon Hill, Md) was second as the first five finishers broke Hogan's meet record of 9:33. Knox recorded 8:57.2.

In an extremely close race Thomas Stringfellow (DC) outkicked Edison, NJ's Richard Park by two seconds in the boys 12-13 race. Park's Hoover Jr H.S. teammate Bob Van Sickle was third and all three broke the meet record of Hoover's Richard Buckstad.

As the oldest boys, 14-15, approached the starting line the question was who would cross the finish line first, Richard Buckstad or Nashville, Tennessee's 4:48.3 - 10:11.0 miler/two miler Jon Slaughter. The conditions of the day and the course were anything but perfect, but the previous nine races had produced six meet records - all by substantial margins. With this in mind, the crowd anticipated a fast race.

And fast it was. The  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile mark saw Buckstad and Slaughter enter the hilly section shoulder to shoulder. As the runners emerged from the hills, Buckstad appeared first. Slaughter was next to appear, followed by Tony

Sinisi of West New York, NJ. Buckstad maintained his lead as the wind down the straightaway blew him home. His time of 7:54 was phenomenal. Slaughter and Sinisi in the next two places smashed Mark Zmuda's meet record of 8:22.8 and the first two broke the course record of 8:12.


The concluding race saw Ambler, Pa's Lisa Vernon break Judy Kidd's year old record of 9:33 with a time of 9:14.2. Also bettering the record while finishing 2nd through 4th were: Diane Andrade (East Setauket, NY), Doreen Ennis (Nutley, NJ) and Debbie Beck (Ambler, Pa).

With the last race concluded and all the results already tabulated the cold, red-nosed crowd gathered to view the presentation of the awards by meet director Barry Geisler to the first three finishers in each division. All other finishers had received their awards upon completion of their race, but now they applauded the athletes who had beaten them and the weather.

The 1971 races were over and Van Cortlandt Park began to empty. The meet was conducted very professionally, as meet directors Geisler, Kurt Steiner and Gabe Mirkin as well as all the officials and coaches did a fantastic job. With two races always going on at the same time, every finisher had his place and time recorded. Used to other types of officiating in track, I was quite impressed.

Two weeks later, many of the girls in the meet described above ventured to Ohio for the National AAU Girls Cross-Country Championships. A brief description of this event follows. In depth results and background will be contained in our next issue.

Marks to be included in STARTING LINE's Final Outdoor Ranking for 1971 must meet the following requirements:

1. Marks must be made on standard outdoor facilities (surveyed track, reasonably legal throwing rings, toe boards, etc.)
2. There must be at least 3 timed or measured competitors in the event and the event must be part of a regularly scheduled meet (hastily improvised record attempts are not acceptable).
3. In the sprints, hurdles, long jump and triple jump wind assistance should be reported (wind gauge readings remove doubt; wind estimate may help prevent disqualifying mark).
4. The weight of shot, discus, hammer and javelin must be reported (some indication that implements have been properly checked for weight and dimensions will remove doubts).
5. In the hurdles; number of hurdles, hurdle height and distance between hurdles should be noted as well as distance of race.

NOTE: Performances listed below dotted line indicate that marks were made under unacceptable or very questionable conditions. In all cases, more details would be greatly appreciated.

### NATIONAL AAU GIRLS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Rain and 34 degree temperatures didn't stop the Duke City Dashers, Will's Spikettes, the Oregon Track Club and girls from the west coast from winning the major team and individual honors at the eighth annual National AAU Girls Cross-Country Championships. The meet, held on rolling hills of a golf course in Euclid, Ohio on November 27, attracted a total of 796 runners in all divisions.

Duke City Dashers of Albuquerque, New Mexico, scored an unprecedented sweep of the team titles in the 9 & Under, 10-11, and 12-13 divisions. Will's Spikettes from Sacramento, California, outclassed the opposition team-wise and individually in the 14-17 age group, maintaining their record of having won at least one team title (5 Women's, 3 Girls) every year these championships have been held, starting in 1964!

Not to be outdone, 16-year old Debbie Roth led her Oregon TC team to their first Women's title, defeating among others, the defending champion Wolverines TC of Michigan and the Doris Brown-led Falcon Track Club. # TECHNIQUE & TRAINING

## ENDURANCE TRAINING FOR HURDLERS - by Jim Santos

Those athletes who wish to excel in any track & field event are picking up the distance runners habit of starting their preparation in the so-called "off season". A gradual build-up to the peak of the season is now accepted as the surest way to make the most of your ability.

In the article below, Jim Santos tells how you can prepare to be a good hurdler, starting now. Jim, presently coaching at California State, Hayward has coached national calibre hurdlers of both sexes, young and veteran and was a top flight hurdler himself.

Endurance training for hurdlers is often so misconceived that hurdlers never reach their maximum potential in developing as hurdlers. In the middle distance runs, on up through the distance events, training is on such a sound basis through interval training, Fartlek, and over-distance training, that a distance runner is greatly exposed to development in endurance training. Good sprinters and quarter-milers also have a sound background in endurance work through interval training and over-distance runs which also enable them to develop a good background for their endurance training.

But for hurdlers, the greatest amount of time spent during the training season is in the development of hurdling technique. For years we have spent more time working with hurdlers in developing technique, that we have simply neglected his development in endurance, thus cheating him from truly developing as a complete hurdler. How often have we found our hurdlers running strong for five or six hurdles, to then see them over-striding, losing speed, and struggling over the last few remaining barriers? Have you ever noticed where hurdlers start knocking the hurdles down? Not in the first three or four flights, but in the latter stages of the race from flights six or seven.

In the low hurdles it is even more apparent that we are completely neglecting the endurance training program for our athletes. The last sixty yards for some hurdlers is so difficult to negotiate that it forces them to add strides to their sprinting action, forces them to alternate legs, and generally is their weakest point of the race. With youngsters who are not strong, this short race often presents a mental block to them because they feel that it is "too long" for them to keep their speed.

I feel there are four major problems which keep the hurdler from developing into a complete hurdler:

1. Over emphasis on speed work during the early training season;
2. Failure to run over-distance workouts during the preseason training period;
3. Too much time devoted to technique work during the entire training season;
4. Failure to stress endurance training as a factor to successful hurdling.


High hurdlers often neglect to work on endurance, with the thinking that theirs is a short sprint race. They are correct in assuming this; however, in this event the technique and speed must be constant throughout the entire race with little variation.

A general hard day workout during the competitive season might include the following segments: warm-up, block starts, sprints over 3 to 4 hurdles, 10 X 110 yd. sprints.

However, I feel that a general hard day workout during the competitive season might include the following pattern:

1. 30 to 40 minute warmup;
2. Technique work over the hurdle for speed;
3. 5 X 440 at good speed, with a walk rest interval;
4. 5 X 330 at good speed, with a walk rest interval;
5. 5 X 75 at full sprint, rest 30 seconds between;
6. Overdistance run for 3 to 4 miles easy.

Following is our basic development program for hurdlers during the school year which is based on: (1) endurance development, (2) technique, and (3) speed. We follow this program in order during the training season for hurdlers. We have this program broken down into four major phases of development:



### Phase I Training Period

1. Easy cross-country running, mixed with over-distance repeat work at distances from 440 to 660 yards. Repeats should be run at very slow pace (72.0+ 440).
2. Use of a weight training program is suggested during this time, lifting for over-all body strength.

### Phase II Training Period

1. Development of hurdling technique.
2. Use of interval training for endurance development.
3. Over-distance runs of 3 to 4 miles.

### Phase III Training Period

1. Technique work with hurdles. Emphasis on speed over hurdles and sprinting in between hurdles. Work on hurdles using entire distances.
2. Interval training with distances from 55 to 440 yds.
3. Speed work for sprinting techniques and speed.
4. Over distance runs from 4 to 5 miles.

### Phase IV Training Period

1. Reduce training periods in time length.
2. Short sprints.
3. Short runs over 4 to 5 hurdles.
4. Block work
5. Easy distance runs for relaxation 2 to 3 miles.
