





#### Results

Include first and last name of at least the first three competitors in each event, along with hometown or team affiliation, time or distance of each competitor listed, type of track (dirt or all-weather), wind conditions (the more specific the better), height of hurdles, weight of implements (shot, discus, etc.). Also include heat or qualifying round marks (if better than final mark) and birthdates on top athletes would be helpful for best performance lists.

#### News

General interest items (in contrast to news merely of your team or of one individual) are more useful. We want material on both **boys** and girls (such as schedules of upcoming events, new teams or programs, background info on area, athletes, etc.), especially from areas which haven't gotten much space before.

(Photo at Left) 13 year-old LAURA CRAVEN of Columbus, Ohio, won the Girls Age Group X-Country Championships (12-13 Division) demolishing the competition by over one-half minute, including highly talented Victoria Cook of Northridge, CA.

A few weeks earlier Laura had achieved a similar feat in New York, at the RRCA Cross Country Nationals, outclassing established young distance star Kim Gallagher of Ambler, PA. Craven also won the Kettering Invitational and last summer was the USTFF 12-13 Age Group National Champion in the 1500 meters in a solo 4:32.8

(Photo at Right) 13 year-old FRED CARLEY of Niceville, Florida, had himself some season. Very few titles escaped him and was untouchable in most distance events.

First he won the RRCA X-Country Nationals, the only 14 year-old to ever break 8:00 on the tough 1.5 mile Van Cortland Park course. A few weeks later, he traveled to Bloomington, Indiana, taking the 12-13 title over local distance Ace Paul Vandersteen, who inflicted Carley with his only defeat at the National JO Cross Country Championships at Longview, Washington.

Fred's track season was equally impressive. He was a remarkable triple winner at the Boys Age Group Nationals at Albuquerque, taking all distance events. He also took home the Gold at the Florida Relays, the Atlanta Classic, the Region III JO, etc.. In the process he became the new all-time Best performer/Age-13 in the mile (4:30.3) and 2-mile (9:41.1) pushing the already outstanding performances of the great Frank and Charles Assumma off the record books.

#### From the Publisher

We have been informed by choked and saddened friends of the sudden and tragic death of 18 year-old KEVIN KNOX in a recent car accident.

For the growing number of young Age groupers, the name Kevin Knox may not be a familiar one. But to those who have been involved with this sport for awhile, Kevin was remembered as one of the most talented young athlete to ever participate in Age Group Track.

He was for some years "Mr. Age Group" and has been known to have been the spark which gave this sport national recognition, and in the process the impetuous it needed to grow into the level it now exists.

Back in 1968, when distance running for young athletes was considered dangerous and the 9-Under division had nothing longer than a 440, Kevin was proving otherwise by running races as long and longer than 2-mile in times unheard of in these days.

For years he held all Age records from the 220 to the 2-mile and his marks astonished everyone. Can you imagine of witnessing an 8 year-old running a 5:45 in the mile ten years ago! How about a 2:39 in the 880 at the same age. His father, Dale, trained him carefully and well and wherever Kevin went all eyes were focused on him. He was a phenomena and everyone stood amazed.

It would take a lot of space to enumerate all the great performances and titles that Kevin earned in his short career. It goes without saying that few honors escaped him.

A few years ago, "Sports Illustrated", a magazine that deals only with big time national & international sports stories, gave Kevin a big two-page write up that brought Age Group Track to a national audience. Surely a unique Award for such a young athlete

We have been privileged to have known Kevin for many years, and feel most distraught by this tragedy. To his deeply grieved parents, whom we know well, we can only send our most heartfelt expression of sympathy in this difficult time.

We will always remember KEVIN KNOX of Wasco, California, as a fine and laughing youngster, an outstanding and talented athlete as well as a true pioneer of Boys Age Group Track to whom the Movement owes a lasting gratitude.

This year the Junior AAU is even more important than usual because of the large number of international junior meets scheduled (definitely or tentatively) for the summer. Presumably, all members of the USA Junior teams will be selected on the basis of the results of the AAU Junior Championships. Among the international junior meets scheduled:

\*\* Major changes in AAU Junior and Age Group rules for female track athletes are in effect for 1978. The National Junior Championships this year will be limited to women 14 through 17 as of the first of the year (athletes born 1960 or later). In other words the competitor may not turn 19 at any time during the year. This should help minimize the needless confusion and senseless cruelty of the last several years in the selection of international junior women's teams.

In addition, a new event for Midget (10-11) girls is the pentathlon, consisting of 50 yard hurdles, 6 pound shot, high jump, long jump and 400 meter dash. This replaces the triathlon as the official multi-event for this group.

# **BOYS DIVISIONAL HIGHLIGHTS**

Compiled by MARK ZUCKER

In the following pages, we are presenting the 1977 Yearin-Review - a look back at the highlights and best performers of the past season.

The athletes have been grouped by division, according to the system in use in AAU and Junior Olympic competition. As an example, the Midget Division (also refered to as the 10-11 division) will include boys born in 1965 and 66.

We have put together an "All-American" Selection in four Age Groups. After assessing a variety of factors, this selection would have been our choice in the make-up of Age Group Divisional Teams.

In our selection, we took in consideration a number of factors, especially the following ones:

\*\* Consistency of performances - athletes who fared well throughout the year and participated in the important meets had preference over those who had only one good mark to show. \*\* The level of the performance, especially in head-to-head national class competition.

\*\* Data - only athletes whose background was known to the compiler were included in this report; birthdate, hometown and other pertinent factors were a must.

We were highly influenced in our selection by the performances recorded in meets we considered prestigious and national in scope, such as the AAU Boys Nationals, the East Coast Classic, the big Invitational events and the highly competitive Junior Olympic meets (Missouri Valley, Pacific, Midwestern, North Carolina, Central California, etc...)

We hope that you will find this Review interesting and we invite your comments and observations.

#### JUNIOR WOMEN RANKING & FINAL LIST

The seventh annual STARTING LINE ranking of the top ten Junior Women in the United States is the usual effort by the compiler of the accompanying U.S. Best Performance Lists to rate the top athletes in each event on the basis of the entire 1977 outdoor season. The rankings are merely the subjective opinions of one person to indicate the relative value of the series of performances, as far as they are known, of each athlete throughout the year.

Unfortunately the record of outstanding performances is less complete, though hopefully more accurate, than in some previous years, mostly due to fewer sources of information and less time allotted by the compiler in searching out information. For example, such great marks as a 4:52 mile, a 2:09 half-mile and a 19'4" long jump, all by age groupers, as well as a 169' discus throw by the nations best junior hurler, have been reported in verbal or piecemeal fashion. In some cases these marks, and others, have proved to be falacious, but more often than not those associated with the meets have not cared enough to compile the results.

Unlike most compilers, who will accept most any kind of unsubstantiated or patently "phony" performances (downhill pits, short tracks, light implements, solo efforts, misprints, etc.), the following listings have been compiled with an effort, though admittedly far from perfect, to separate legitimate from illegal and highly questionable marks. The addenda at the end of each regular list includes the later marks, indentified by the following symbols:

C = competition unnaceptable (fewer than three competitors)

c = competition unknown or questionable

F = facilities known to be illegal (pits, track, hurdles)

f = facilities questionable or unknown

i = implements of unknown weight or not checked

m = measurements questionable (field events)

t = timing questionable or out of sequence

W = wind-aided events (wind exceeds 2.0 meters per second)

w = wind unknown or questionable

u = unconfirmed performance (more complete results needed)

In all cases, more complete information (with substantiating meet results) would be appreciated.

The top ten girls were ranked on the fasis of three factors: (1) performance in the most important meets of the year...National AAU Junior & Senior Championships as well as the USA vs. Canada & Japan Junior Meet all at Westwood, USA vs. USSR Juniors at Richmond, USTFF Age Group Championships at Wilberforce, National Junior Olympics at Lincoln and a scattering of major open and high school state meets, (2) consistency throughout the year, as determined by the series of times or distances in the event considered, and (3) best mark in the event for the year, as reflected in the Best Performers List for 1977, which follows each ranking.

Any errors of omission, commission or judgement are the responsibility of the compiler, who wishes to encourage the submission of detailed results of significant meets by anyone (official or otherwise). #### 100 Meter/100 Yard Dash

1-CHANDRA CHEESEBOROUGH (ranked 9th in 1974, 2nd in 75, 1st in 76) was clearly the top junior again, recording a series of 10.3/10.5 high school marks in Florida and placing third in the AAU Senior 100m. Though the "century" is probably not her best event, Chandra ranks among the top three all-time juniors. 2-VAL BOYER, though fast in previous years, made a big break-through competitively in 1977, finishing a strong runner-up in the AAU Juniors, then winning the whole thing vs. the USSR at Richmond, edging 3-KIM ROBINSON, who had beaten her at UCLA. 4-RHONDA BRADY, was behind Val & Kim at UCLA, also reached the semis in Senior AAU and had five times of 11.6m or better.


5-BRENDA WINSTON (5th in 76) repeated her ranking on the basis of fourth spot in the AAU Juniors and four clockings of 11.5m or better, the exact same number of sub-11.6m times and one AAU Junior place higher than 6-ROBBIN COLEMAN, Texas school champ. 7-KATHEY CRAWFORD (2nd in 76), was hampered by injury, but managed to grab seventh spot in the AAU Seniors (though dropping out of the Juniors) and recording 11.6m or better at least four times, and running agaist the Soviet senior team in Europe. 8-JENNIE GORHAM, defeated all forms of Intermediate (14-15) competition from coast to coast, as well as annexing the National Junior Olympic title. 9-JEANETTE BOLDEN and 10-DEANDRA CARNEY took turns beating each other. Jeanette was superior in early season, winning the California high school meet from club teammates Robinson & Carney, then edging Carney for sixth place in the AAU Juniors. Deandra turned the tables by finishing second (to Bolden's fourth) vs. Canada/Japan. Jeanette had at least seven times of 11.6m or better.

For a change, <u>all</u> the best sprinters in the nation met in one place at the same time (though Cheeseborough and Gorham were not in the Junior meet at UCLA). The only possible additions to the ranking list above were NJO placers Carrman Rivers and Deborah Edwards, and maybe age-grouper Michelle Glover.

#### 200 Meter/ 220 Yard Dash

1-CHANDRA CHEESEBOROUGH (1st ranked in 1975 & 76) is certainly the fastest, and best, US Junior ever in the furlong. In 1977 she ran 23.4m or quicker five times, took third in the AAU Senior, two seconds and a third in International Senior meets, as well as running under 23.0m (or electronic equivalent) for the eleventh time in her young career! In a class by herself.

2-GWEN SMITH (9th in 75, 2nd in 76) gets the runner-up spot again, due to her continually fast times - she ran under 24.0m four times last year (at least eleven times in the last two seasons) - and her sixth place finish in the AAU Nationals. 3-KIM ROBINSON completed a double sprint championship in the AAU Junior, then trounced the field in the USSR Junior Dual, recording at least four sub-24.2m clockings. 4-GWEN LOUD had at least five clockings in the same range and was runner-up to her club teammate in the AAU Junior. 5-VAL BOYER (ranked 10th in 1975, 8th in 76) showed improvement in this event also, by reaching the finals (4th & 8th places) in both the AAU Juniors and Seniors, registering three 24.0m times or better.

6-BRENDA WINSTON, beat Boyer in early season, finished a spot behind in the AAU Junior meet, bettered 24.2m five times and ended the season with a splendid victory vs. Canada/Japan. 7-DEANN GUTOWSKI was slower on the clock than all other ranked, but showed her class by gathering the third place in the AAU Juniors and runner-up spot against the USSR at Richmond. 8-JENNIE GORHAM (10th in 76) was National Junior Olympic champ here also, as well as trouncing good competition in the west and midwest, including 9-LORI GREEN, the NJO runner-up and perennial Gorham nemesis, as well as 10-WANDA HOOKER, Tennessee high school champ and National JO third placer.

Robbin Coleman and Carrman Rivers could just as well have been ranked on basis of good times and close proximity to those above in major competition. Overall, there are only a few each year who seem capable of running very fast (about 24.0) consistently...or even once in a while.

#### 440 Yard Dash

1-JENNIE GORHAM (ranked 4th in 1976) refused to be beaten in this event, not to mention most others, powering her way to significant wins at Westwood (twice), Wilberforce, Fort Meade and Lincoln to take AAU, USTFF and JO National titles while clocking no less than twelve times under 54.5m! 2-EDNA BROWN burst upon the scene take the runner-up slot in the AAU Junior, top position vs. the USSR at Richmond, plus a win at Wilberforce, in between hurdling engagements. 3-KIM THOMAS (3rd in 76) took the Senior route in Westwood, placing 4th and qualifying for the senior tour to Italy and USSR, five times running 54.5m or better. 4-ROBIN CAMPBELL (5th in 73, 6th in 74, 1st in 75) gains her fourth ranking on the basis of her third spot in the AAU Junior meet, though limiting her competition. Robin graduates as one of the all-time junior greats, having recorded no less than 19 times under 54.0m (!) racing worldwide.

5-MARIAN FRANKLIN ran often enough in big competition to take fourth in the AAU Junior and runner-up to Brown at Richmond. 6-VALERIE BRISCO, California high school champ, garnered sixth in the AAU Junior, one place ahead of 7-SHARON ACKER, who reversed the order later at Westwood in first & second spots vs. Canada/Japan juniors. Sharon had seven times under 56.5m, Val recorded four under 54.8m. 8-KIM WHITEHEAD and 9-ARLISE EMER-SON places both in the AAU Junior and National Junior Olympic meets. Kim going eighth and fifth, with eight sub-55.9m times,

while Arlise was ninth then third, respectively, running ten times under 56.5m. 10-SANDRA FARMER, another young eastern hurdler and another product of the rapidly improving New York City programs, had fast times and reached the semi at Westwood.

It was difficult to leave out high schoolers Merry Johnson and Sherrie Golden from Texas as well as Pamela Moore of Wisconsin, whose opportunities were limited. The talent in the one lap event, experienced or otherwise, continues to be exciting.

#### 800 Meter/880Yard Run

1-JOHANNA FORMAN (8th ranked in 1974, 3rd in 75, 4th in 76) ran consistently, as usual, with five races under 2:06.4m, placing in both AAU Nationals, touring with the Senior International team and finishing a close runner-up to 2-ROBIN CAMP-BELL in a speedy international 800 at Kingston, Jamaica. The latter (3rd in 73, 2nd in 74, 2nd in 75) ran seldom in this event as usual, but ran well, especially at Kingston. Robin has gathered more rankings, ten in all events, than any other athlete since SL began in 1971...she's the Irina Szewinska of USA Junior Women. 3-ANN REGAN (6th in 76) continued her forward strides by gathering third in the AAU Junior and runnerup vs. the USSR juniors after winning an exciting California high school championship, ahead of 4-LINDA GOEN. The latter, running many other races in prep competition, beat Regan and everyone else in the AAU Juniors, was runner-up vs. Canada/ Japan, and fourth at Richmond. Linda has six races under 2:09.0m, compared to Regan's five, in her first major year.

5-ROBIN BLAINE (5th in 75, 8th in 76) and fellow New Yorker 6-ROSEMARIE GIAMPALMO finished fifth and seventh, respectively, in the AAU Junior plus third and fourth vs. Canada/Japan. Robin was under 2:09.5m three times, while Rose was second at Lincoln and third at Wilberforce in her first full of halfmiling. 7-SANDY BEACH, who began winning unofficial national distance titles as a nine-and-under, won the National Junior Olympic Championship officially against a tough field. 8-JILL HAWORTH ran often and everywhere, as a semi-finalist at Westwood, a 14-15 winner at Wilberforce, second at Fort Meade, and fifth at Lincoln, running 2:11.1m or better five times. 9-KA-THY VETTER, cleaned up the Texas school competition, then finshed third at Lincoln. 10-TAMI ESSINGTON was under 2:10.9m, or equivalent, thrice and won the USTFF 16-17, after whipping good Illinois high school girls.

Tania Wells, Joetta Clark and Lynn Jennings also ran to near rankings. They were just a few of many who making things exciting in the half-mile. Even the slow-developing high schoolers, like Goen and Vetter, are beginning to push the top ones.

#### 1500 Meter/ONE Mile Run

1-LYNN JENNI GS (3rd ranked in 76) has the knack of reaching a a peak at just the right time, having won the AM Junior and reaching the Senior final, she fi ished a good second at Richmond. 2-MARGARET GROOS (2nd in 75 & 76) repeats the runner-up slot again on the basis of second in the AAU Junior, fourth at Richmond, winning the Tennessee high school meet against good competition and running under 4:47 miles at least thrice. 3-TANIA WELLS (6th in 76) pushed Groos in high school and in the AAU Junior, won at Wilberforce (14-15), was second vs. Canada/ Japan and had at least seven miles under 4:56.6. 4-DARLEE BECKFORD, had fewer chances in big races than her clubmate Jennings, but she beat Wells at Lincoln and ran fast enough.

5-JULIE SHEA (10th in 74, 9th in 75, 1st in 76) as well as 6-LINDA GOEN and 7-KATE CONANT were impressive winners in their high school state meets, but concentrated on other events in national competition. 8-ANNE HENDERSON, 9-AILEEN O'CONNOR (7th in 76) and 10-STACY CRYSTAL filled the fifth-seventh places, respectively, in the Junior AAU, with strong performances. Anne also won at Wilberforce, while Aileen was second (14-15) and ran under 4:33m three times.

Many others like Jill maworth and Deanna Coleman are right on the tail of those ranked. Particularly pleasing is the strong competitition in high schools in places like Oregon (seven milers under 5:00), New England and Tennessee.

#### 3000 Meter/ TWO Mile Run

1-JILIE SHEA (8th in 75, 3rd in 76) got her act together with three races under 9:20m, a solid fifth the the AAU Senior followed by a successful European senior tour. 2-SUSAN SCHAEFER, New York high school champ, surprised by winning the AAU Junior and running under 10:40 for two mile (or equivalent) three times. 3-AILEE: O'CONNOR (1st in 76) dropped her top rating, but actually ran faster, winning at Wilberforce (14-15) and finished just behind Schaefer and Shea in the AAU Nationals.

Others could have been ranked in just about any order: 4-VICKI BRAN and 5-KATE CONANT finished in those places at the AAU Jr. meet. 6-BETTY SPRINGS (4tn in 76) and 7-IRENE GRIFFITH (5th in 76) were high school phenoms who filled the top two spots in the National JO. 8-MARGARET GROOS and fellow Tennessean 9-PHYLLIS HINES were sixth and eighth, respectively, in the AAU Junior, though Phyllis actually won the second (unseeded) flight. 10-ROXANNE BIER (8th in 76) won the hottest high school race of the year, the California state meet.

This was a diffucult to rank event since the top performers rank in major competition so seldom. Ohioan Carrie Craven or Californian Kathy Adams could have been ranked as well. Kathy was second in her high school state meet, in which it took under 10:47 for two miles just to place

#### 100 meter Hurdles 30 Inch - 33 Inch

1-RHONDA BRADY (ranked 3rd in 1974, 1st in 75 & 76) graduates as the most honored and consistently fastest US junior hurdler of all time. She repeated her top ranking for the third time by virtue of winning the NAAU Junior and vs. USSR juniors, not to mention running under 13.70 four times. 2-LORI DINELLO (4th in 76) was easily next best with three 33" races under 13.80. runner-up in the AAU Junior, a near finalist in the Senior and third vs. USSR juniors. 3-KRIS COSTELLO was far slower by the clock (four times under 14.70) in the "highs", but got fourth in the AAU Junior and Canada/Japan Junior meet, plus reaching the AAU Senior semis. 4-PATSI WALKER had at least four 33" races under 14.65, in pentathlons and otherwise, but had a 7th place finish at the Junior AAU.

5-JULIE SMITHERS, superior New Jersey high school all-arounder, was a winner at the USTFF Age Group at 33" hurdles. 6-LAVERNE PALMER was National JO champ in the lows, with at least four races at 14.1 or better. 7-KIM TURNER was runner-up at Lincoln and had three 14.0 or better low hurdles, plus winning the "highs" in the 14-15 race at Wilberforce. 8-"CANDY" YOUNG suffered a mishap at Lincoln, but ran super-fast times at 30" hurdles and beat good competition. 9-LISA GOURDINE was a finalist at Westwood (eighth in JNAAU) and runner-up vs. Canada/ Japan, with five 33" races under 14.80s. 10-TAMMY ETIENNE (8th in 76) a superior low hurdler, took third at Lincoln.

The 33" hurdles are suffering from lack of depth, though there are dozens of fast hurdlers in the low barriers. Outside of Dinello, high places at junior nationals will be up for grabs.







#### **400 Meter Hurdles**

1-SANDRA FARMER, tremendous 14 year-old prospect, swept all junior competition in the NAAU and elsewhere, running under 62 seconds at least four times. 2-NANCY ROBINSON (7th ranked in 75) returned to this event successfully, running under 61.0 at least four times, finishing third in the Jr AAU, then winning the first National JO title in the event. 3-TERESA WIERSON (1st ranked in 76) suffers from lack of competition in the pacific northwest, but was runner-up to Farmer at Westwood and had an equal number of races under 62s. 4-EDNA BROWN, superior quarter-miler, tried this event with great success as a novice, winning at Wilberforce and running under 60.0 once.

5-SONYA HENDERSON, 15, another great newcomer from the east, was first at Wilberforce (14-15), fifth at Westwood and had at least five races under 63 seconds. 6-MICHELLE HAWTHORNE was a place behind Henderson in the AAU Junior, with an equal number of sub-63.0 races, then ran runner-up at the National JO. 7-DAWN WOODRUFF was consistent in the 63 second range, plus taking third at Wilberforce and Lincoln. 8-LOIS DAVIS, 9-PENNY FALES (3rd in 76) and 10-SYLVIA FLOYD are three more northeasterners who ran consistently in the 61.5-63.5 range and proved themselves in major competition.

With the addition of this event to Junior Olympic competition, there is the beginning of depth. One drawback is the postponement of acceptance of 400 hurdles in regular international competition. Only the eastern states are beginning to go at the event with real fervor so far...seven of those ranked above are from that geographical area.

### Long Jump

1-KAREN EIMORE (9th ranked in 73, 2nd in 74, 3rd in 75, 1st in 76) hereby becomes the first, and only, athlete to achieve a ranking in the same event for five consecutive years. A steady performer as usual, Karen was runner-up in the AAU Junior, but won the USSR Junior Dual her best jump of the year. 2-GWEN LOUD topped Elmore at the AAU Junior, slumped to fourth at Richmond and had at least five meets over 19-5. 3-SANDRA MYERS, Kansas high school champ, had at least four meets over the mark, was third in the USTFF Senior and won the National Junior Olympic title. 4-ROXANNE KEATING (5th in 75, 7th in 76) continued her classy jumping for the sixth year with no less than eight meets over 19-2, fourth and eleventh places at the AAU Junior and Senior, plus runner-up spots in the National JO and Canada/Japan Junior meet.

5-BRENDA JOHNSON was just ahead of Keating at the AAU Junior and fifth vs. Canada/Japan. 6-PATSI WALKER (6th in 76) was over 18-10 at least six times, with a fifth in the AAU Junior. 7-PATRICIA JOHNSON, Illinois high school champ, finished sixth in the AAU Junior. 8-LISA GOURDINE (6th in 76) beat a good California high school field and was seventh in the Junior AAU. 9-CHANDRA CHEESEBOROUGH didn't jump outside of her Florida high school meets, where she won the state meet with nearly the best junior mark in the country. 10-ROBIN JACKSON, though just an age grouper, was as consistent just under 19 feet as any of her "elderly" colleagues.

#### **High Jump**

1-SHARON BURRILL, Colorado high school champ, cleared six feet at least three times, tied for third in the AAU Junior, then beat the USSR Juniors and was runner-up vs. Canada/Japan to assume the mantle previously worn by Joni Huntley and Paula Girven. 2-ANNE GILLILAND (5th in 75, 2nd in 76) again grabs the runner-up spot on the basis of the second place finishes at Westwood and Richmond, beating Burrill in the former. 3-SALLY LAYMAN, former age-group phenom, emerged as a consistent national class jumper, equalled Burrill in the AAU Junior, was fifth vs. Canada/Japan and leaped over 5-9 at least four times. 4-TONYA ALSTON, a great pentathlon prospect, was over 5-8 five times and, though only third in the California high school state meet and just ninth in the AAU Junior, emerged triumphant in the National JO.

5-JUDY POLLION, another pentathlete, jumped very high on occasion, won at the USTFF Age Group and took fifth at the National JO, after jumping poorly at UCLA. 6-COLEEN RIENSTRA, a Nevadan who had limited opportunities, showed her class by beating Alston once, jumping 5-8 or better thrice, and finishing fourth at Lincoln. 7-JOAN BROCKHAUS, a South Dakotan, also with limited chances, and 8-ELIZABETH KOLARIK filled the second and third spots at the National JO, jumping 5-8 along with Rienstra and Pollion. 9-DEBRA WILLIAMS tied for fifth in the AAU Junior, jumping the same height at Burrill and Layman. 10-PATSI WALKER (8th in 76) was her usual versatile self in high school, AAU pentathlons and open meets, but found time to tie for seventh in the AAU Juniors.

High school champs Lisa Plummer (Illinois), Kari Gosswiller (California) and Julie Crosgrove (Washington), among others, might have been better than some above. The depth in this event is still increasing at all levels (age group, school, etc.).

#### **Shot Put**

1-SUSIE RAY, showed that best ever age grouper could adjust immediately to heavier implements by shoving the eight pound bulb over 45-6 at least ten times, over 47-0 four meets and garnering fourth in the AAU Juniors...the highest placing true junior woman. 2-KELLY CURRAN (2nd in 76) was a place behind Susie in the AAU Junior, fourth at Richmond and won the Canada /Japan Junior meet, with at least five meets over 45-0. 3-KERRY ZWART (3rd in 76) was also over 45 feet five times and was a place behind Curran in the both the AAU Junior and Canada/Japan in between pentathlon engagements. 4-JANICE STUCKY (5th in 76) and 5-JACKIE HENRY filled the top two spots in the competitive National JO competition. Jan was over 44 feet in three major meets, while Jackie exceeded 45-5 three times.

6-CHERYL FISHER of Florida, 7-NANCY JENKINS from Ohio, 8-JULIE GOHMAN out of Minnesota, 9-ELEANOR MAJORS of Indiana and 10-WENDY WHITLEY, a Penrsylvanian, all dominated their state high school meets with very creditable distances.

Other high schoolers such as Sharon Lotmore (Florida), Natalie Polk (Texas), Carrie Albano (Washington), Peri Jude Radecic (Pennsylvania), Michelle Betham (California) and Helene Connell (New Jersey) might have been ranked as well. Since many of these return as juniors, and the high school depth is increasing constantly, the shot put event gives promise of producing some fifty footers in the not too distant future...if the national and local program don't continue to provide roadblocks to progress.

#### **Javelin Throw**

1-JACKIE NELSON (ranked 4th in 1976) was fourth in AAU Junior, third vs. USSR juniors and had at least four meets over 140.
2-DEBBIE DIBB (9th in 76) was just ahead of Nelson in the AAU Juniors, just behind at Richmond and had somewhat lesser marks.
3-LISA van BENTHEM (3rd in 74 & 76, 7th in 75) was at her best in smaller meets, but placed fifth in the AAU Junior and third vs. Canada/Japan. 4-CHARM BISHOP (6th in 76) had at least five meets over 144 and beat the top ones on occasion, but missed the bigger meets. 5-LORELEI van BENTHEM was sixth in the AAU Junior and fifth vs. Canada/Japan.

6-KRISTY HALL and 7-KERRY SERVAS were divisional best performers in strong Oregon high competition with distances in the middle to high 130's. 8-RAEDEAN RONA (10th in 76) was only seventh in the AAU Junior, but won the first National Junior Olympic Championship with moderate distances. 9-JUDY MADEA was third at Lincoln with a distance far below her New Jersey high school marks. Same may be said for Lincoln runner-up 10-HELEN LATHROP, Pennsylvania high schooler.

#### **Discus Throw**

1-HELENE CONNELL (ranked 1st in 1976) threw 147 feet in her poorest meet of the year! Otherwise all she did was break every existing US junior and interscholastic mark in the book, win the National AAU Junior title, reach the finals (seventh) in the Seniors, place second vs. USSR juniors and generally establish herself as the number one American junior of alltime, with seven meets over 161'. 2-CHRISTI PYIE (2nd in 75, 3rd in 76) who would have been "numero uno" any other year, exceeded 144 feet at least five times, was runner-up to Connell in the AAU Junior, fourth vs. USSR and won the Canada/ Japan triangular. 3-SUE KOBZA (9th in 1976), the best of a strong Nebraska contingent, tcssed 146 feet to win the National JO title in her "back-yard", a distance she had reportedly attained twice in smaller meets.

4-KAREN STAMPFLI, California high school champ, was fourth in the AAU Junior and had an unconfirmed mark over 150 to rank ahead of her near neighbor 5-LESLIE DENIZ, who was only ninth in the AAU Junior, but second in the JO National and fifth vs. Canada/Japan with five meets over 136 feet in her first year as a Junior. 6-VICKILEE COBERN and 7-DANA OLSON, Texas high school champs, each had their moments. Vicki had five meets over 138-9 and placed sixth at Westwood and Lincoln. Dana failed to qualify in the former but placed third in the latter meet, reaching the same distance twice. 8-DONNA LAKE, Marylands number one prep thrower, and 9-BECKY McGRANAHAN, who had a disappointing Kansas school finale, placed fourth and fifth in the terrific National JO meet and Becky was over 138 feet four meets. 10-JANICE STUCKY, Kansas school champ, had two meets in the same range.

Other high schoolers with similar records included Laura Messner and Cheryl Voight (Wisconsin), Robin Hruby (Nebraska), Brenda Denney (Colorado) and Susan Springer. Despite the best efforts of AAU, Junior Olympic and other national officials to keep it a secret, this event is improving at a rapid pace. For example, Gina Piatt ranked fourth in 1976, threw slightly further in 1977 and went unranked: Never have so many thrown 130 or 140.
