

AGE GROUP TRACK IN THE CANAL ZONE ...

/There are track enthusiasts (some call us "huts") anywhere. The following excerpts from a letter from Milford Stern, a teacher in the Panama Canal Zone, are a case in point/

The track program at Curundu Elementary begins in kindergarten. We build them up to a three minute sustained run.

When first graders and grades 2-6 are built up to a five minute sustained run, we then begin competition in events from the 50 to the 600 yard Run. All children, grades 1-6 are timed at each of these distances, a task that takes some four months to complete.

All children use running as a warm up activity for other sports and skills (which includes circuit training for strenght and motor perceptual).

The weather is always hot (80's) and humid (85-95%) every day. The rainy season lasts from April to December, and the dry season is approximately four months long.

Our gym is a 125' x 45' structure, with a tile floor and a metal roof, with sides about 60% open. We have a 205 yard oval, cement track and a long jump pit outside.

In addition to running during class periods, some 70 boys and girls, grades 1 to 6, also run between 1/2 and 1 mile each morning, as soon as the school bus departs.

Eventually some of these will form the two track teams that will compete here in the Zone and run against Panama also. Any child that does well at any event is invited to join us in the morning.

Most of the other elementary schools do not put the emphasis on running that we do at Curundu, but many are now willing to go along with some of our proposals, such as the inclusion in competition of an 880 this year and possibly a mile next year. We have a long way to go, but we are getting there.

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE COIN....

/This is an open letter by Ted Riley, president of the Salinas Valley T.C., to Larry Neverkovec, coach of the Northern California TC, in answer to a "protest" published in the Forum section of the January/February issue of Starting Line Magazine/

We are writing to you in response to your letter of February 2, 1976, written to Charles Townsend of Long Beach, CA, and printed on this page in the last issue.

Upon seeing this letter, one is left with the impression that your facility and capability to run a State meet should not be questioned. At no time was our Pacific Association aware of your interest in running the boys age group State Championships. It is our belief that all track clubs were notified of the scheduling meeting. All clubs present voted for the Salinas Valley bid.

As for your part in State Championships held in Sacramento, Larry, you did a very presentable job in the P.R. area. We will leave the evaluation of meet officials' competence, meet organization and actual execution of the meet with those who attended.

The Salinas Valley Track Club was founded in 1969 and we have been very proud of our athletes and their performances. We are also proud of the manner and methods used in organizing and executing track and field meets, as well as the competency of our officials.

Since our founding, our club has been selected to run Boys Pacific Association Championships for 6 of the 7 years, and 3 of the Girls Championships. This year we have been awarded the Boys-Girls combination (two days) championship - a first year experiment. I feel that this honor indicates a true vote of confidence in our management abilities.

This is the first year we have ever made a bid for a State meet, and we realize that to properly conduct a meet of this importance, we would want to place emphasis on conducting a fair, competent and proper meet that will benefit all the athletes.

Allow me now to set you straight on Neverkovec's misquotes:

- Seating capacity for Hartnell College is limited.
 But its seating capacity at present is closer to 600 and we have other bleachers coming for our championship meets.
- 2) The nearest airport is not in San Jose. Actually, there is a local airport in Sa-linas, but mainly for private planes. Monterey Airport is the nearest airport if anyone intend to fly it is 15 miles from Harnell College.
- 3) Restroom facilities are limited. In the track area only. There are restrooms in the main school area and we have compensated with a few portable restrooms.

4) Parking is limited.

a) there is plenty of parking on both sides of Hartnell College - one lot (1/4 to 1/2 mile from the track) has a capacity close to 600 cars, while the other two lots have a combined capacity of 75 cars.

b) there are many parking spots around the track area- (some 100/200 cars)

5) Accomodations.

Salinas has 40 motels with a total of 1500 rooms. I guess this could be considered limited when Salinas holds the California Rodeo, and attempts to accomodate 100,000 people. But I don't think on could consider this a limitation when accomodating at the most some 1,000 to 1,500 people.

6) Facilities.

The Hartnell facilities are very good. I am the assistant Coach at the College and can verify this. It is an all-weather resilient track with tartan approaches to the long jump, high jump and pole vault, a beautiful grass infield and an inside jogging track.

 In reference to the 16-17 year-old division.

At our meeting we felt (and I have always felt this way) that the 16-17 division (Senior) should be a part of another and separate meet. The reasons:
a) This added division made the meet too long and it placed emphasis on the wrong athletes. Our age group athlates don't have a high school program and therefore must depend on the AAU. Since many of the 14-15 year olds are not in H.S. as yet, this division was seen as necessary in fulfilling their needs.

- b) Also there were very few entries compared to the other age groups, and these entries generally consisted of local talent.
- c) At the present, many 16 year olds will be competing in the 14-15 group (intermediate), since the cut-off is January 1.

As for Larry Neverkovec not participating in the State meet, that's his loss - or rather his inconsideration for his athletes and their loss.

RESULTS

Include first and last name of at least the first three competitors in each event, along with hometown or team affiliation, time or distance of each competitor listed, type of track (dirt or all-weather), wind conditions (the more specific the better), height of hurdles, weight of implements (shot, discus, etc.). Also include heat or qualifying round marks (if better than final mark) and birthdates on top athletes would be helpful for best performance lists.

NEWS

General interest items (in contrast to news merely of your team or of one individual) are more useful. We want material on both boys and girls (such as schedules of upcoming events, new teams or programs), background info on area, athletes, etc.), especially from areas which haven't gotten much space before.

(Photo at right) Thom Hunt will remember February '76 as the month in which he ran two of his finest races in his HS carreer. The 17 year-old Patrick Henry HS senior (San Diego, CA) first defeated a first class field in the two-mile at the LA Times meet, winning over such heralded HS standouts as Eric Hulst and Don Moses in 8:52.4, 3rd All-Time prep performance. Two weeks later in San Diego, running in the feature mile event with stars such as Filbert Bayi and Rod Dixon, he recorded a 4:02.7, a new indoor mile prep record. Thom's pace in this race was ever quickening, with a 62.4 opening quarter (which may have kept him from a sub-4:00), followed by a 61.4, speeding up still with a 60.0 third lap and ending it with a final 58.9. In passing he also broke the 1500m record in an official 3:46.6, 3.4 seconds better than the old standard. Hunt is so fresh at the end of his races, that he runs victory laps only slightly slower than his race pace.

(Photo at left) Falmouth's JOHANNA FORMAN, shown in this photo in the early stages of the National AAU Indoor 880 race, pulled off the biggest upset of the year, when she defeated a star studded field in the finals of the 880 Run in Madison Square Garden, Feb 27. The talented 16 year-old Falmouth HS junior was in the race all the way. Pan-Am 800 meter champ Kathy Weston, from Reno, Nevada, led through thefirst 440 in 59.8, with Forman passing at 60.6. This was the fastest first 440 of the year. With one lap to go on the 160 yd Garden track, Johanna moved around Weston and tried to reel in the leaders, Wendy Knudson, a 1972 Olympian and Florida TC's Pulling even with the leaders, Forman gradually Robin Campbell. inched ahead around the last turn and had about a four foot lead over Campbell, when Robin stepped on the inside curb and fell. Johanna crossed the line in a PR best time of 2:07.9. By virtue of her victory, Johanna Forman was chosen to represent the USA in the dual match against the USSR in Leningrad. /Photo & Text submitted by JOHN CARROLL/

NOTES on '76 BOYS & GIRLS ANNUALS

We are very thankful to our loyal readers who have taken the time to point out some errors and omissions in our Annuals. Here are some of the more obvious of the traditional "goofs" - In the Girls Handbook, the title of the event on page 34 should read 1500m/One Mile Race walk, not Run. In the Boys book, it was the year of the missing titles . On page 27, the title "One Mile Run" was missing and on page 35, the "70 yds Low Hurdles" heading had been left out.

A few corrections that make a difference: Age-9/880, at 2:38.5, the name should have been Eric Anderson (not Eric Smith); the birthdate of Riley Moore of Richmond, CA, should read $\frac{4/12/65}{6}$ (not 8/12/65), which removes him from the Age-9/220, 440, 880 and Mile lists; Ricky Romero, of Albuquerque, NM, had turned 10 the day of his Age-9 list leading mile (5:26.2). The mark belongs in 5th position Age-10/Mile (1975).

We welcome such corrections and we want to encourage everyone to participate at this interesting detective game.

Entries will be due at STARTING LINE by July 10, 1976.




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

One day last fall I was approached by three boys from our track club. I was not only unprepared for their request, but my immediate "gut level" feeling was -- "you got to be kidding."

Their request was merely to get permission to run in the Fiesta Bowl Marathon to be held in December.

I kept my cool as I patiently double talked with monumental arguments such as.. "Gee, I don't have any information about it"..
"I don't know whether we are ready for that sort of distance" ... etc. etc..

This didn't appear to deter them as nearly every day they would pester me with references to the race, but I was equal the challenge, maneuvering around theirapproaches with ease. to the challenge, maneuvering around their approaches with

A week or so later, I was discussing with several teachers the need to keep children busy and challenged and, where possible, to make decision about themselves.. when all at once it struck me... I was standing in the path of someone who wanted to "climb a mountain". At that instant, I made a committment that if they wanted to run the marathon, they could.

That afternoon I sat down with the boys and discussed the project. We decided to invite our most outstanding girl distance runner to become a part of the activity, and, with little urging, she agreed. Our next step was to find out what it was all about, so a meeting was called with all the parents, so that their questions could be answered.

To conduct the meeting, I called on an old friend, Fred Moore, who had coached many distance runners, including Marjorie Kaput, who is a national caliber marathoner. The meeting took care of all the fears, except for the mother who had recurring nightmares about her child running such a distance.

And so it was that in December, early, on a cool, breezy, overcast morning at Cave Creek, Arizona, I watched my runners line up with around 350 others and point their little noses towards Scottsdale, and a finish line 26 miles 385 yards away.

They created considerable attention, as nine year old SANDRA SAUCEDA and TROY NAVARRO put together wouldn't tip the scales at 100 pound. DARRIN PAWLUK, age 10, and RUSS YAW, 12, were older but not much bigger.

The race started in a mob type scene typical of all marathon, and with my kids (and my stomach) lost somewhere in that stampede. It sorted out after a while and we were able to find our runners and patrol their progress in cars. Other members of our glub "relayed" Sandra with one or two running up to five miles at a stretch, so she wouldn't have to run alone. Russ came across in 3:32, Darrin and Troy came in together in 4:07 and Sandra completed our day, running across the line in 4:20. The times were, and are, unimportant as our goal was to run and to finish.

I didn't write this article to merely give credit to four kids who took on a challenge. Neither am I advocating one way or another marathon running...and I certainly don't want to get embroiled in controversies as to whether nine year olds should be involved in marathons....please not that !!!

I guess, what I am really advocating is when your athlete wants to "climb his mountain"...get out of the way !



BEST PERFORMERS OF 1975

SPRINTING EVENTS

MIKE CARTER of Albuquerque, NM, continued his rise in the track world. Starting as a long jumper in 1971, he grew into one of the finest sprinting prospect. He was the double National Champion at Gresham, winning with personal bests of 9.6/100 and 22.0/220. He was also the the New Mexico H.S. champion in both events as a sophomore.

<u>RUSSELL WEST</u>, from Columbus, Ohio, was the leading sprinter in this division in his state and gave Carter a good fight in the 100 with his best of 9.7.

CYRIL WYATT of Orlando, FL, was the double Regional JO winner at Gainesville and took a valiant third at the National Junior Olympics. His year's bests were 9.9 in the 100 and 22.0 in the furlong.

ERIC BUTLER of Los Angeles, CA, showed great promises, taking his league finals with 9.9 and 21.8 as a 15 year-old sophomore. He also was the SPAAAU JO Champ in the 100.

MARK SHAW of Washington, D.C., was the steady top performer he has been for years, winning both sprints at the East Coast Classic over the best in the East, in personal bests of 9.8 and 22.7. He is always a solid contender.

One of the finest set of twins to be seen in Age Group competition had to be 15 year-olds BERNARD and BENNETT LONG of Philadelphia, PA. Bernard, although he didn't win any major titles was most consistent under 10.0, with a best of 9.8 at Ft. Meade, and under 22.5 (best of 22.2). His brother Bennett was just amazing. Not only did he rank 3rd and 4th in the sprints with 9.8 and 22.1, but he led the year's list in the 440 by over one second, with a sparkling 48.0, a mark second only to to the "Bob Beamonish" 46.7 of Don Webster, back in 1960. He had the 4 best marks of the year in that event, with three under 49.0 and six marks under 50.0. In addition, he also long jumped 20-11 1/4. A most remarkable athlete. Should be watched carefully.

DISTANCE EVENTS

ROBERT GOMEZ of Gulfport, Florida, didn't compete out of his state and his best performances were recorded in high school meets. It's lucky for those who competed in more standard age group AAU meets, as he proved to be the best half-miler in this division. As a 14 year-old he recorded a fantastic 1:55.9 at Clearwater (all-time best), and ended the year at 1:53.9 a few weeks later, having just turned 15. He also won the mile at St. Petersburg in 4:18.6 (4:28.2 as a 14 year-old). A great year should be in store for him, as he is returning in this division this season.

<u>WILLIAM CONTEE</u> of Washington, D.C., was right on schedule in his steady maturing as a top middle distance runner. Back in 1974 he had been the National and Youth Games champion in the Half-mile. Last year he didn't go to Oregon, but still had plenty to brag about. He earned a double win at the Model Cities Invitational (49.7/440 and 1:55.1/880) and won the two-lapper at the East Coast Classic, while sprinting to a 49.1/440 (2nd best of '75). At the Natuonal JO meet (16-17 age group) he placed 6th, recording a PR 1:54.7 in thr heats (3rd best mark of the year)

A new name in our files is <u>ROBERT BUCHANON</u> of Dayton, OH, who had bests of 49.1 and 1:54.8 as a 15 year-old in High School competition. We don't have all the information on this boy, but we'll learn about him this track season.

BOB BUNDY of Spokane, WA, a very steady performer for years, came through with the big win at the age group Nationals, taking a well deserved title in 1:58.5.

BRETT HOFFMAN of St. Petersburg, FL, may well be one of the most talented distance runner in age group track. As a 15 year-old he recorded the 2nd best all-time mile performance in the mile at 4:15.0, as well as 9:12.0/2-mile (4th best all-time performance). Three weeks after his birthdate he ran a winning 8:56.4/2-mile (!).

In 1975, this time was exceeded only by the amazing <code>BILLMcCHESNEY</code> of Eugene, OR, who was his state's 2-mile champ as a sophomore and who had run an 8:55.9, top for the year. As a 16 year-old, he owns the 6 mile and 10,000m Bests with 28:31.2 and 29:27.2 respectively, as well as a 14:11.8 in the three-mile, the 2nd best mark ever for that age.

<u>DOUG OVERFELT</u> of Titusville, FL, confined his activity in his state, competing primarely at the HS level. He recorded, as a 15 year-old, a series of outstanding marks such as 1:57.9 in the 880, 4:21.0 at the mile and 9:55.0 in the 2-mile.

JUMPING EVENTS

The jumping star of the year was without doubt CHIP BENSON of Los Angeles, CA. At the famed Arcadia Invitational he triple jumped 48-5 as a 15 year-old, winning the event over top high school competition. Naturally it is an Age-15 Best, 1 1/2 feet farther than the old standard held by Olympic Games winner Randy Williams. There was no one near him in this event. He also led the year in the long jump with 23-0 1/2 (22-10 as a 15 year-old). In this event he bettered 21-4 ten times! A very gifted athlete, he also ran the 330 Low Hurdles decently enough in 40.5 and 120 HH in a very good 15.2.

The Nationals featured <u>TERRY SCOTT</u> of Ocean Shores, WA, winning the long jump at $2\overline{2}$ -6 and taking the runner-up spot in the triple jump with 43-5 l/2. That was his only loss of the year in the Intermediate division.

One boys who probably dominated his event more than anyone else was RAY CROOK of Reno, Nevada, in the pole vault. Whether it was the Junior Olympics, the Cal State meet or the Nationals, no peers were to be found, winning everything in sight by large margin. He had the three best marks of the year, all over 15-0. He won the Nationals by 28 inches, in a personal best of 15-4. Without the assistance of a pole he also high jumped 6-3 3/4.

An athlete who routinely could jump over most people's head was 15 year-old ERIC LOVE of Harrisburg, PA, who scaled a fantastic 6-10 1/4, which is an all-time best by 1 1/4 in. He led the year over such proven performers as JEFF LAWSON of Placentia, CA (6-9 1/4 - Region 13 JO champ), AUDREY TAR-BER of Jacksonville, FL (6-8 1/2) and DAN COUTS of Urbania, Ohio, (6-8 - runner-up at the National JO championships).

WEIGHT EVENTS

"Veteran" JIM FAVROW of Manhattan, KS, was in the lime-light for the 4th consecutive year. He was the double National Champion for the 3rd consecutive time. As a sophomore, he placed 2nd in the shot and 3rd in the discus at his state meet in his best mark of the year of 56-10 3/4 and 163-5 respectively. This was one of his most consistent year as he recorded half a dozen marks over 55-5 with the 12 pound shot and three over 158-0 (1.6kg discus).

Although they never met head-on, <u>VINCE GOLDSMITH</u> of Tacoma WA, was one of the athletes who had a better mark than Favrow Unbeatable in his state, he pushed the ball 59-9 3/4 to lead the year's list and moving up to second spot on the all-time Age-15 list of best performers.

Washington State was particularily rich in top prospects with PAT SPOONER of Sumner (56-6 and 142-9), CHRIS FRIDAY of Ariel (47-8 and 151-3) and LANCE NEUBAUER from Bellingham, at 51-7 and 141-10.

Another young man to follow is KENNETH LANIER of Columbus, OH, the runner-up at the Nationals with 55-3.

Among the all-around performers, the most outstanding was <u>ROURKE LOW</u> of Portland, OR, who lost only once (later reversed) in a variety of events. He leads the year in the 180 low hurdles (national Champ with 20.4) and the 330 Intermediates at 38.2 (2nd all-time). He was also on top of the list in the 120 HH at 15.1. His hurdling technique is most impressive and added to his speed of 10.3/100 and 22.9 in the 220 will make him one of the finest prospect in this event.

15 year-old <u>JOHN HALLOWAY</u>, from Festus, Missouri, was the National JO Champion in the Decathlon with a year leading 5642 points. His better event were the jumps, with 6-0 in the high and 21-4 3/4 in the long.

Another excellent decathlete was BILL WELCH of Urbania, 0H, the runner-up at the National JO (5435 points) whose best events are the shot put (45-8 3/4) and the long jump (19-10). He is returning in this division this season.

PROMISING RETURNING ATHLETES

The athletes mentioned below were already competing in this division in 1975 with some measure of success, and will be returning in this same age group this year. With last year's experience and the added maturity and poise, they may be the boys to watch in this 1976 season.

From the PACIFIC STATES:

STEVE LITTLEJOHN (Eugene, OR) - very solid sprinter with bests of 10.1 (twice) and 23.2; JOHN ANDERSON (Portland, OR) - one of the most promising sprinter/quarter-miler in the country. He was particularily effective in the 440 with a best of 51.1 (3rd all-time/age 14) - he also ran 10.4/100 (5 marks under 10.5) and 23.1 (five at 23.5); JOEY GRANT (Rialto, CA) - with a 9.9/100 and 20- 6 1/2/LJ should be a strong contender this season; CARY BURT (Huntington Beach, CA) - versatile athlete with good quarter-mile (51.6) and high jumping (6-0) ability;

ERIC LITTLE (Fresno, CA) - Central Cal JO Champion in the 880 with best marks of 53.8/440 and 2:01.9/880 (5th best performance of '75); BURT SHIRLEY (N. Hollywood, CA) - runner-up in the National 2-Mile at 9:41.8 (4 marks under 9:57). Also was excellent in the mile with a best of 4:25.0 (4th all-time/age 14) and half-miler (2:07.8) - very promising; KEVIN PITCHFORD (Spokane, WA) - surprised many by his performance at Gresham. He was the National titlist in the mile in a startling 4:27.5 and placed third in the two-mile at 9:46.3 - very good under pressure; MIKE GIFFORD (Huntington Beach, CA) - excellent middle distance ace who placed 3rd in the mile at Gresham in a PR 4:31.4 and was the SPAAAU JO champ in the 880 at 2:03.1;



ROB ARKES (Portland, OR) - very steady performer with bests of 4:34.6 and 9:51.2 as a 14 year-old. He had four marks under 4:4:37.5 in the mile; MARK DAGG (Beaverton, OR) same class and age as Arkes, very reliable and always in contention, with bests of 4:32.5 (4 marks at 4:36.8) and 9:53.0; DAN MARTINEZ (Redwood City, CA) - one of the finest Race Walker, winning the national title at 7:35.0 - good style, hard worker, he will be difficult to beat; SCOTT ERTZ (Newport Beach, CA) - good jumper, especially in the triple jump - bests of '75: 39-4 3/4/TJ and 5-10/HJ; KEN GEORGE (Santa Rosa, CA) - excellent prospect in the weight events, with '75 bests of 44-4 and 131-7;

One of the best all-around athlete in this division was GREG HANSEN (Woodland, WA) - best marks of 1975: 21-0/LJ (3rd at Gresham), 12-9 3/4/PV (4 marks over 12-0) and 38-10 1/4 in the triple jump; RICK LUTTRELL (Redwood City, CA) central Cal JO champion in the decathlon with 5229 points his best event was the pole vault, recording a fine 12-0.

From the MIDWESTERN STATES:

TIMOTHY TRIPP (Dayton, OH) - versatile runner, can do it all from the 100 to the 880 - had bests of 10.3/100, 22.8/220, 51.3/440 (with 4 marks at 52.0) and a winning 2:04.0/880; possibly the most talented distance runner in this division anywhere was ALAN SCHARSU (Austintown, OH)-at 5-4 and 110 pound, this 14 year-old boy recorded an in-credible (but true) 9:15.6/2-mile at his HS District meet, destroying the old standard held by top .US Olympic hope Craig Virgin (by almost 17 seconds!). He also had a 9:20.2 and a 9:24.8; both marks under the old record;

DAN STARK (Ypsilanti, MI) - promising distance runner, with '75 bests of 4:32.5 and 9:46.5 (6th and 4th at the Nationals); JEFF BUCKINGHAM (Gardner, KS) - unbeaten in the pole vault until Gresham, where he finished 3rd. His best mark of '75 was 13-6, with 3 vaults over 13-0.

From the EASTERN STATES:

TIMOTHY STREET (Washington, D.C.) - double winner at the Model Cities Invitational with excellent range of abilities. Best '75 marks were: 10.3/100, 23.0/220 (3 marks under 23.5) and 51.9 (runner-up at the East Coast Classic);

RON FROATS (Burgettstown, PA) - if anyone can challenge Martinez in the Race Walk, it would be this 14 year-old boy, whose 7:53.1 was third on the year's list and one of the best time ever recorded at that age.

From the MOUNTAIN STATES:

PHIL TRENT (Albuquerque, NM) - excellent speed and capable of creating a surprise - had '75 bests of 10.1 and 23.0; MIKE HUBBARD (Greely, CO) - versatile athlete with good spee (10.3 and 23.4) and excellent jumping ability (20-11 3/4);

NATHANIEL CHRISTIAN (Denver, CO) - was close to being the upset winner of the 880 at the Nationals, losing by the smallest of margin in 1:58.6, 4th best all-time performance at 14

From the SOUTHERN STATES:

JOE JONES (Miami, FL) - untouchable in Florida -double JO Champ with personal bests of 9.9 and 23.0; THEODORE DAVIS (Houston, TX) - same as Jones in Texas - double JO champion as a 14 year-old, with marks of 10.0 and 22.7 (ties him for 5th all-time); ARTHUR WESTPOINT (Richmond Heights, FL) - outstanding sprinter/jumper, with promising marks of 10.1 (3 under 10.3), 23.4 and 20-9 1/2 in the long jump (runner-up at JO District meet);

CLARENCE SPRINKS (Orlando, FL) - one of the more gifted junior high schooler in this powerful track area. He recorded bests of 10.2, 23.9 and 52.2 as a 14 year-old; MARQUIS RESHARD (Orlando, FL) - great quarter-miler. His winning effort of 50.6 at Winter Park, was the second best performance all-time at age 14 (behind Dan Webster's 49.5); DANNY FLATT (Memphis, TN) - top weightman in his state with bests of $53-4\ 1/2$ and $137-5\ 1/2$ in the shot put and discus respectively; RALPH BUTLER (Baton Rouge, LA) - up-and-coming weight specialist with top marks of 48-0 and 131-1.






