

SEAGREN VAULTS RECORD 17-5 $\frac{1}{2}$

Striders' Star Sets World's Mark at Fresno

FRESNO—The spectacular Coliseum Relays was a mighty tough act to follow, but Saturday's windup of the West Coast Relays proved to be equally smashing.

It was climaxed by a world record vault of 17 feet 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches by 19-year-old Bob Seagren.

On his final try, the Glendale College student who represents the Striders and is headed for USC, erased the mark of 17-4 established by Fred Hansen at the Coliseum in 1964.

Holds Other Records

Seagren's previous high was 17-1, made earlier this season. He also holds the indoor record of 17-0 $\frac{3}{4}$ and at Mt. San Antonio College last year set a JC mark of 16-3, since bettered.

The slim (6-1 and 165) Pomona native tried 17-8 Saturday but didn't come close in three attempts.

It was by no means a one-man show.

The Striders' Art Walker upped the American triple jump record to 54-4 $\frac{1}{4}$, emphatically bettering Ira Davis' existing mark of 53-11.

USC's two mile relay team, after setting a world record of 7:17.4 at Los Angeles Friday night, had to

settle for 7:17.6 here after going into the anchor leg 1.6 seconds ahead of its record pace.

Two national junior college marks were broken and another tied.

Seven meet records tumbled, including that for the shot put, where world champion Randy Matson of Texas A&M, in his first Fresno appearance, did 66-8½.

Until Seagren's belated performance, which came long after all other competition ended, San Jose State's fabulous Tommie Smith had given the 13,000 fans their greatest thrill.

Taking the baton eight yards back on the anchor leg of the 440 relay, Tommie ran down Don Domansky of UCLA and Steve Caminiti of New Mexico to win by three yards. It was an almost unbelievable sight.

Spartan Hurt

Unfortunately, Smith didn't get a further chance to demonstrate his speed. The Spartans' No. 2 man, Tim Knowles, pulled up lame in the 880 relay and San Jose then scratched from the mile baton race.

Junior college marks were achieved by the Bakersfield 880 relay team, which was clocked in 1:24.7 and by England's Neill Duggan who, representing Hancock, toured the two mile course in 8:54. San Francisco's 440 relay combine matched the record 40.9 posted earlier this year by Pasadena.
