Serra Spikers Smother Bells ⁵⁻⁶

SAN MATEO — Serra High's track team whipped rival Bellarmine 75-47 here Thursday to close its dual and triangular meet season with a 12-1 record.

Serra's Jerry Tallon ran the 880 in 1:56.5 and the 440 in 50.8 while Bellarmine's Jim deDiego won the sprints in 10.1 and 22.4. Scott Pardi won both hurdles for Serra.

Bellarmino's final dual and triangular record was 9-6.

Tallon 880 Paces Serra ⁴⁻²⁸

SAN MATEO — Jerry Tallon ran the third fastest high school 880 in Northern California this spring, 1:55.5, to lead Serra High to victory in a triangular track meet here Wednesday.

Tallon broke the school record he set last week by a full second as Serra scored 75 points to 64 for St. Mary's and 12 for St. Joseph. Tallon's mark is two-tenths of a second off the NorCal best this season.

Another Serra school record was set by Jack Keehan, who high jumped 6-2 $\frac{1}{4}$, breaking the record of 6-1. Victory pushed Serra's record in dual and triangular competition to 10-1.

Jim Marshall Clocked in 9.6

EAST PALO ALTO — Ravenswood High senior Jim Marshall ran the 100-yard dash in 9.6 seconds, fastest in history by a San Mateo County prep, in a triangular meet with Bellarmine and St. Francis here Friday.

Marshall, whose previous best was 9.8, got a nearly perfect start and ran away from Bellarmine's classy Jim deDiego, who was timed in 10-flat. Two watches caught Marshall at 9.6 and a third at 9.7.

The stocky 160-pounder, who played fullback for Ravenswood's football team last fall, came back later to win the 220 in 22.4, two-tenths of a second off his seasonal best which is the best reported in Northern California this season on a turn.

Marshall cracked the County record of 9.7 held by three other

Sequoia District athletes — Sequoia's Bill Rupp in 1952, Dick Burns of Menlo-Atherton in 1960 and Jim Cheatham of M-A in 1961.

Marshall's time equals the fastest in Northern California this season, turned in by Mel Gray of Santa Rosa's Montgomery High. Ernie Provost of San Francisco's Washington has a wind-aided 9.6.

The weather was hot and calm at Ravenswood Friday.

The mark is the best in history by any runner for a current member of the South Peninsula Athletic League. Dick Brown of Lincoln High in San Jose, no longer in the SPAL, ran 9.6 in 1956.

In the 220, teammate Frank Romo was leading Marshall coming off the turn when he suddenly pulled up with a muscle twinge. Coach Buddy

Miller was uncertain how serious the injury was.

Ravenswood won the meet handily, scoring 79 points to 47 for Bellarmine and 22 for St. Francis. Bellarmine might have made it closer but was missing several athletes, including John Reardon who had to leave to catch a plane after winning the meet-opening high hurdles in 15-flat.

Bellarmino's Phil Murphy put the shot 53-1 and Ravenswood's Oscar Jones high jumped 6-feet for other good marks.

Ravenswood also won the B and C meets. Freshman Dave Cartwright won the B 100 in 10.3.

The 1966 edition of the Bell varsity track team, under the able direction of head coach Father Mark McConville, S.J., began practice on Jan. 5. Father is assisted by Father Ray Devlin, S.J., who handles the distance men; and by field event coaches Mr. Wells Longshore, S.J., and Mr. David Johnson, S.J.

The team's goal is to capture an unprecedented fourth straight C.A.L. Championship. The Blue and White's chief rivals appear to be Serra and Riordan.

A strong nucleus of eleven let-terms have returned from last year's team. Top point-getters appear to be triple C.A.L. winner John Reardon, in the high and low hurdles and relay, and sprinter Jim DeDiego.

Outstanding among the distance men are lettermen Phil Flores, Jim Gilman, Bill Mack and Frank Ru-

gani in the 440, 880, mile, and two mile respectively. Also contributing valuable points will be juniors Andy Frey, Bob Burt and Dave Smith.

In the field events, the difficult job of replacing State Discus Champion Bruce Naglee falls upon Walt Briggs and Dennis Minister. Other field men on the team include Pat Clowers and Dennis Conte in the pole vault, junior Greg Smoak in the high jump, and Jim Miller in the shot.

Depth is where a meet is won or lost. Important assets in this department are Mullin and Elrod in the hurdles, McAuley, Giorgi, and Duarte in the field events.

Expected to stand out among the J.V.'s are freshmen Dave Snyder and Mike Byrne in the distance events. Bob Salopek and Ed King will also help the team.
