Gamez 2-Miler Rips Prep Mark

A brilliant 9:03 two-mile by Berkeley's smoothrunning Ralph Gamez and a faltered try from Montgomery High of Santa Rosa provided the major share of highlights in the tried annual North Coast Section track and field championships at U.C.'s Edwards Stadium yesterday.

Scoring almost solely on the efforts of Mt. Gray, Stan Wise and Bob Walker, Montgomery's Vikings ran away with the team title by registering 10 points compared with runner-up 11 for Marin's Mt.

PUT THERE was little doubt in anyone's mind that Gamez was the star of the show in this qualifying meet that will send the first four finishers in each event to next weekend's State CIF championships at the same Edwards Stadium.

The defending State two-mile champion, who certainly now must rate the use to best in next week's State, made maximum of what was supposed to be a close three-man battle.

HOLDING OFF his charge in second position while Montgomery's Walker set the pace in the first three laps,

Gamez suddenly started to the front on the back stretch of the final revolution and finally left the rest of the field in the dust.

Pounding it on by operating most of the way on his strides and dual legs, Gamez tagged a blistering 9:03 seconds and 10th fastest two-mile ever and shattered the North Coast record of 9:05.5 he set last year by a whopping 1.2 seconds.

HE PUT TOGETHER times of 4:38.8 and 4:39.7 to account for the second best prep two-mile mark this season. The best mark is held by Chula Vista's Tim Flum, who will be running the miles at Berkeley next week.

Gamez was a good 45 yards in front of Mt. Eden's Eric Lindley (9:11.6) and third place finisher Walker (9:11). All three bettered the North Coast record. Herdman's sophomore sensation Jim Tracy came through with his best-ever mark of 9:05.5 for a fifth place.

The other North Coast section records finished in the vicinity division.

MARINA'S JERRY TALLON—who made the most of a handicapped one after influenza

kept him out of the sectional last week—closed a swift 9:12.2 half mile.

Pointsmaster Jim Peters presented the other record when he lowered the discus 100-4 in the morning trials.

Montgomery's Gray was a survivor going the full 100 yards in the 100-yard hurdles winner Dave Masters of El Cerrito and Drake's Dean Lanzetta), won the long jump with a leap-over 21 feet which led to victory in the race in 11.5 seconds and achieved the Viking last-mile relay team to first place by passing Redwood's Clarence Johnson in the final 40 yards.

W.L.E. CHIPPED in a fourth in the 100-yard high hurdles, turned in an easy 13.4 win in the 100-yeard dashes and got the relay team off to a good start.

Other big performances on the cloudy but warm afternoon included a 4:07.1 mile by Del Norte's Dennis Barnes and a 26.7 shot put by Castro Valley's sophomore Chico G. Vasquezoff.

The best D. performance was a sailing 3:07.8 1000 by George Altars, a senior graduate of Pittsburg's Central Junior High.

Gamez Streaks 2 Miles In 9:0

Peters Takes Discus

A sensational 8:02.1 two-mile by Ralph Gamez, the first discus thrower for Mike Louisiana and an 800 in which the Field Meet records were under 20 highlighted the West Coast Section track and field championships at Edwards Stadium yesterday.

Gamez, the defending state champion from Berkeley High, held off Eric Lindsey of Mt. Eden by .4 seconds to set one of three records in the qualifying meet for the California Interscholastic Federation championships next weekend at the same site.

Philadelphia's Jim Peters, who had finished behind Louisiana the Legion year, in three previous discs meetings, finally came out on top with a record-breaking throw of 80-4 and Gerry Taylor of Sierra accepted for the third mark with a 10:03 triumph in the half mile.

Montgomery's Linda Ross, winning four events and placing in three others, scored a point to clinch the Ed Corcoran for the team championship.

DeAnna, with sister Debbie Barley posting a career-best of

4:17.1 and hurdler Larry Bates longer taking a pair of seconds, helped him finish for third place with 18 points.

A 24-1 effort by Montgomery double winner Mel Gray topped a long jump field in which all five players were over 20 feet. Eli' Charles Taylor's official jump, a 400 that saw him run across the board, was 20-10 seconds.

Gamez, beaten by Lindsey in the Division I test last week, ran a much shorter race yesterday. He started off the pace for the first four legs, contenting himself with 10.0 for the mile.

Then he passed on the rods and opened up a lead of as much as 20 yards with leg 9:23.6.

Gaines of El' 89 and 88, and circled around the final leg in 9.6 seconds.

Gamez' time was over six seconds under his lifetime best in the Alameda County Athletic League championships last year, and 11 seconds better than his NCL record.
