Krenz of Stockton added three and seven-tenths feet to the discus rec-ord. He hurled the object 114 7-10 feet. Kaer's time under the condition of the track was considered very good. Frank Whippen, Willard Warner, Charles Willi, Revere Cole, Tilden McKee are athletes Parker will take to the meet. Whittpen make good hight in the pole-vault; Warner runs Lockhart a close race in the mile and also throws the discus; Willi and Cole press Adams in both the sprints, and Mokee has a record of twentytwo feet in the broadjump.

If the meet depends upon the relay the winner in all probability will be the Sacramento High School because no school in this section of the State has been able to come close to the time of the Sacramento relay team which is composed of Adams, Wilson

The meet is expected to be the closest in history of high school track and field in this section of the State and in all probability a large number of records will be shattered.
