

Official Scores Show Hollister Winner C.C.A.L.

The San Benito county high school's track and field team carried away first place honors in the "A" section and with the honor, permanent possession of the big loving cup which goes to the first three time winner. Santa Cruz, Salinas and Hollister had each won the cup twice, previous to last Saturday, and it only remained for Coach Andy Hardin's men to put on the finishing touches, which they did, with 13 points to spare over their closest competitor, Santa Cruz.

Charles Garcia held a field meet all of his own by taking three first places and running a lap of the relay for good measure. Charlie tied his own record of 26:1 in the low hurdles, beating his closest competitor by a full hurdle; broke the 12 pound shot put record by about two feet, putting the ball out exactly 49 feet and 2 inches, and ran the 100 yard dash in the fast time of 10 1/2, making him high point man for Hollister with 15 points.

Tommie Williams, the local lightweight speed burner, had to be given second honors with nine points to his credit, while third place resulted in a tie between Rodrigues and Shore, who each gathered in eight digits.

The two most exceptional showings, according to the writer's estimation, was the performances of Brack in the mile, and John Gambetta, in the pole vault. Brack, the local miller, who was conceded a fair chance for third place in his event before the race, came from third place to break the tape first in the last 75 yards, it being by far the most exciting finish of the day and proved to all that Brack can be depended upon to "come through" in a pinch.

John Gambetta, who, with his brother, Frank, placed first and second in the unlimited pole vault, set a new C. C. A. L. record when he topped the bar at the height of 11 feet and 4 3/4 inches. This is the first time in the history of the C. C. A. L. that three brothers from the same school placed in the same event in the same year, John and Frank taking first and second in the unlimited pole vault and their younger brother, Alfred, taking third place in the lightweight event.
