

on Washington, Gilroy Share Other Titles

LOS GATOS, May 29.—Santa Clara high school, scoring only four first places but scoring heavily in the middle distances and weights, became the new Santa Clara Valley Athletic track champions here today, succeeding Gilroy high school.

The Panthers accumulated 47 points, nine and a half more than second place Mountain View, while Los Gatos pulled up a close third with 34 and Washington nosed out Gilroy for fifth, 13½ to 13. Live Oak, Fremont and Campbell brought up the rear in that order.

Gilroy's 110 and 120-pound teams, likewise defending title holders, retained their championships in convincing style, while Washington again claimed the 130-pound divisional crown.

Only one new record found its way into the unlimited book and it took four men to establish it. The Mountain View relay team of Holt, Schraub, Fulride and Levens turned the trick, crossing the tape in 1:33.8 minutes, lowering Live Oak's mark of 1:34 made in 1938 when Harold Davis anchored the team.

Elbert Levens, classy Mountain View sprint man, chased teammate Hal Fulride home in the hundred and then came back to win the 440 in 51.1 seconds, one-tenth of a second over the record he established last week.

DOMINATE SPRINTS.

Mountain View dominated the sprints and Holt led the field sprints and Holt led the field home in the 220-yard low hurdles.

Ken Sanford, Gilroy high hurdler, ran into tough luck in the high barriers when he tipped over one hurdle after being clocked in 16 seconds flat, three-tenths of a second better than his own mark of 16.3 made in last week's trials.

The expected battle between Sanford and Grover Portlock of Live Oak didn't materialize, as Hill of Los Gatos sneaked through for a second place, barely nipping Portlock at the finish.

Another forecasted personal battle between Al Kaiser, Gilroy, and Cunha of Santa Clara likewise turned out with someone else doing the running, as Kaiser was forced out of the race before it ended.

FAST MILE.

Cunha went on to win but missed making a new record when he was clocked in 4:39 minutes. Janovich of Mountain View holds the league standard at 4:38, made in 1937.

Santa Clara nearly had a clean sweep in the 880 when Rose came through with a beautifully run race to win over teammates Cunha and Oteri. Fourth place went to Havey of Washington in 2:06.8 minutes.

Santa Clara's other winners were Lynn in the discus with a heave of 123 feet and Sciarrino's 11-foot 4-inch vault in the pole vault.

Dave Phillips was the only other double winner besides Fulride, taking both the high jump and hop-step-jump. Capable of doing over six feet, Phillips hit only 5 feet 10½ inches in the hop-step-jump.

GOULD WINNER.

"Mike" Gould was another Los Gatos winner, taking the shot-put at 42 feet 11 inches.

The broad jump went to fourth place Washington when Merritt cleared 20 feet 3 inches, beating out Karner of Los Gatos.
