

One of last year's major sport championships was kept in Salinas for another year as Coach Stan Hiserman's varsity tracksters won the heavyweight division of the C.C.A.L. track meet at Hollister Saturday afternoon.

The Cowboys pulled away in the late stages of the meet to shake off threats from a surprisingly strong King City squad and Santa Cruz, which finished in second ahead of the Mustangs.

Santa Cruz high won the lightweight division of the meet, setting the only new C.C.A.L. record of the day's competition.

An unusual feature of the meet was a nine-way tie for first place in the lightweight pole vault in which two Salinas entries figured.

The meet ended track competition for the year as far as Salinas is concerned as the squad will not participate in the annual North Coast C.I.F. meet next week-end because of the transportation problem.

The varsity points were:

One new meet record was set when Macaulay of Santa Cruz high's lightweights squad broad-jumped 20 feet, 8 inches to better the mark of 20 feet, 2½ inches set by Beron of Monterey last year.

While a number of events were hotly contested, the cool, dark weather and a slow track surface were factors which figured as obstacles in any record shattering performances.

Feature race of the day was the 880-yard run which ended almost in a photo-finish between Leslie Hiserman of Salinas and Fontes of Santa Cruz. Hiserman had to turn on the steam coming into the home stretch to pull up to first position. His sprint effort here wore him down and cut him out of a consideration in the 440 which Blaine of Santa Cruz won in a burst of stretch speed.

The meet ended track competition for the C.C.A.L. schools for the season and was the only major track meet this spring since tire rationing regulations cut the schools out of chances to travel as had been the custom before the war.
