

JACK KAISER, AL LAWRENCE, MEL PATTON Prep School Track & Field Athletes of Year

JACK KAISER, Fullerton Junior College Track and Field Team Inon Man; AL LAWRENCE, Glendale High School hurdler and broad jumper extraordinary; and MEL PATTON, University High School, West Los Angeles, Sprint sensation, have been chosen Southern California Prep school Athletes of the Year for the 1943 Track and Field season. Selections were made by All Southern California Board of Track and Field, composed of Bill Clark, Examiner; Bill Hunt, Herald-Express; John Bookman, Daily News; John de la Vega, Times; and Dick Saunders, Hollywood Citizen News; and Bill Schroeder of Helms Athletic Foundation. Helms Athletic Foundation serves as cooperative organization for the Track and Field Board.

JACK KAISER was regarded the outstanding Track and Fiend competitor of the 1943 season in Southern Cal fornia, including those in collegiate ranks. He was a brilliant all-roung performer, participating in the high hurdles, high jump ploe vault, shot put, discus, javeline throw and the broad jump and excelled in all events.

In the Southern California Junior College meet on May 7th, Kaiser won four first places, finished second in 2 and took third in another event. He scored a total of 31 points in the Southern California meet -- half of the 62 points scored my his team. Kaiser rallied 17 points in the Fresno Relays and tied for 1st place in the high jump, tied for 3rd in the pole vault and finished 3rd in the high hurdles in the AAU meet held at the Los Angeles Coliseum on May 29th.

Kaiser's best marks of the year were as follows: High Hurdles 15.0; High Jump 6ft. 2in; Pole Vault 12ft. 6in; Shot Put 42 ft. 3 in; Discus 122 ft. 3 in; Javalin 188 ft. 2 in and Brand Winn 21 ft. 04

Javelin 188 ft. 2 in.; and Broad Hump 21 ft. $9\frac{1}{2}$ in.

AL LAWRENCE was Southern California Meet champion in the high and low hurdles and in the broad jump. His best marks of the year were as follows: Broad Jump 23 ft. 1 in; High Hurdles 14.7; Low Hurdles 23.4. His mark of 23.4 in the Low Hurdles bettered the Nationa Interscholastic record for the event.

Lawrence was chosen for three events on the All Southern California High School Track and Field Team for 1943 -- The Broad Jump and High and Low Hurdles.

MEL PATTON was the Los Angeles City High School Track and Field Meet champic in the 100 and 220 yard runs. He was also 100 yard champion, and co-champion in the 220, in 1942.

Patton consistently ran the 100 in 9.9 this year, turning the trick on 4 occasions. His fastest time for the year in the century dash took place at Pasadena, when he accounted for a 9.8 performance. His best effort of the year in the 220 was a sizzling 21.2, made in the Dorsey meet on April 30th. It was the fastest time recorded by a 220-man in Southern California prep school ranks this year.

Presentation of Helms Athletic Foundation medals will also be made to those persons for Southern California Prep School Player of the Year honors in BaseballBill Lewis, Fullerton Junior College,; Dick Bishop, Inglewood High School; and Bob Masters, Bell High School -- at Silverwoods Prep School Hall of Fame, at the same time ... It is probable that Al Lawrence, of Glendale High School; and Mel Patton of University High School, West Los Angeles, will make the trip to New York City to participate in the National AAU meet, and may not be able to be on hand for the Athlete of the Year, and Player of the Year ceremony at Silverwoods Prep School Hall of Fame on Saturday Morning, June 19th. If so, a representative from Glendale High Achool and University High School will be invited to the program to accept the Helms awards on their behalf.
