Bruin Bert West easily captured the 440 from his U. C. L. A. pal, Bob Russell, in 50.6 seconds. And the pair later combined to win the relay for Harry Trotter in 3 minutes, 25.3 seconds, beating the Trojans by yards and yards.

Russ Tausheck was another hard worker for the Bruins, winning the discus with a toss of 136 feet, 1 3/4 inches, taking second in the shot put at 42 feet, 8 inches, and tying for second in the high jump at 5 feet, 10 inches. Jim Benjamin, Trojan Negro, won the high leap with a 6 foot effort.

Bob Edmonston brought California victory in the javelin throw with a rather mediocre toss of 164 feet, 4 1/2 inches, and then came back to take third in the broad jump. Bruin Don Nelson won the broad jump at 22 feet, 1 1/4 inches.

The pole vault went to Troy's Bob Carlson at 12 feet even.
