### Chambers Double Winner; Campbell Wins 125 Crown

#### Los Gatos Ace Runs Half Mile In 2:02.3

Bucking a strong wind on the backstretch, smooth-striding Bob Chambers nevertheless turned in a couple of fine distance running performances yesterday as Los Gatos completed its domination of Santa Clara Valley league athletics for the year by winning the varsity track title at Santa Clara. Campbell captured the 125-pound meet.

The championship was the fourth the Wildcats have won or shared this season. They took the football crown, tied for the basketball title. and earned the baseball and track championships.

Passing up thoughts of a record attempt because of the stiff wind which hit runners in the face on the back straightaway, Chambers opened the meet by winning the mile in 4:33.5 and came back an hour and a half later to cop the half in 2:02.3. Both marks bettered the league standards, but will not go into the books because records are out for the duration due to the fact that all teams cannot be fully represented.

Chambers also placed third in the high jump, and ran a leg on the relay team that pulled into first place when Mel Azevedo. Santa Clara anchor man, tripped and sprawled 15 yards from the tape. In all he scored 1314 points for the Cats.
