This record book, listing the foremost performances by Southern California's high school track and field athletes for the 1951 season, is the fifteenth annual edition prepared and issued by Helms Athletic Foundation, in the interests of high school athletics,

The facts and records listed herein have been gathered from sources which are believed to be authentic. Information has been provided by high school coaches, and it has been compiled from many Southern California newspapers.

Helms Athletic Foundation, with offices in Helms Hall, Los Angeles 34, California, is sponsored by Paul H. Helms. The Foundation was established on October 15, 1936. One of the purposes of Helms Athletic Foundation is that of recording the achievements of athletes, and athletic teams in all sports and in all divisions.

This Southern California Prep School Track and Field Record, as are all athletic record books of a similar nature, are prepared by Helms Athletic Foundation, under the supervision of Bill Schroeder, Managing Director, and are distributed to Schools, the Press, Radio, Television, Athletic Coaches and Officials, and others without charge. Those who assisted in the preparation of this edition, include Braven Dyer, Jr., and Margaret Uscola. Valuable assistance was also given by Al Krebs of the Los Angeles Examiner.

BOB CUNNING, CLARKE MERRILL CHOSEN TRACK AND FIELD ATHLETES OF THE YEAR FOR 1951

Two California State Meet champions, Bob Cunning of Glendale Hoover High School, and Clarke Merrill of Behont High School, Los Angeles, were chosen for Helms Athletic Foundation - All-Southern California Board of Track and Field Athlete of the Year honors for the 1951 season.

Cunning was named Southern California C.I.F. High School Track & Field Athlete of the Year, while Merrill was chosen Athlete of the Year in the Los Angeles City High School division,

Cunning won first places in both the 100, and 220-yard run in the Southern California C.I.F. Meet, and came back a week later to capture the California State 100-yard run, and finish second in the 220. * Cunning's best time for the 100 was 9.7, made in the State Meet, while his best clocking for the 220 was 21.2, made in the Southern California Meet.

Merrill soared over the bar at 12 feet, 9 inches to nab the Los Angeles City Meet title, while he moved up to 13 feet to capture the California State Meet crown. Merrill's best vault of the year, however, came in the Northern League Meet, on May 4th, when he topped 13 feet, 3 inches.

Cunning was coached by Victor Francy, who has won 3 Southern California C.I.F. titles, and tied for 1st in another, since 1945. Clarke Merrill's coach F. S. G. N. Tivillard.

For having been chosen All Southern California Board of Track and Field Athletes of the Year for 1951, Glendale Hoover's Bob Cunningham, and Bolmont's Clarke Merrill have had their names engraved upon the Paul H. Helms Trophy which is lodged in Helms Hall, in the Prep School Hall of Fame section.

Bob Cunningham's name has also been engraved upon the Charles L. Paddock Memorial Trophy, and Clarke Merrill's name has been engraved upon the Fred W. Kelly Trophy, both of which are lodged in Helms Hall. Cunningham and Merrill were both the recipients of the Helms Athletic Foundation Athlete of the Year medal awards.

Selection of Cunningham and Merrill as Athletes of the Year was made by members of the Helms Athletic Foundation's All Southern California Board of Athletics. This Board has made selections since 1937. Members who made 1951 selections were: Ralph Alexander, John de la Vega, Mary Kapp, Jerry Weiner, Ed Chipp, Mannie Pineda, Russ Cochran, James Leigh, Tom Burdick, Ward Gillilan, Eddie West, Bill Whitney, and Bill Schroeder, Chairman. Braven Dyer, Jr. served as Secretary.
