of two heats qualify for finals.

FINALS: 11 a.m., discus throw.
1:30 p.m., high jump, pole vault.
2 p.m., broad jump, shot put.
2 p.m., all track events.

SCORING: Five places, with points distributed on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis in all
events, including the mile relay. Total points, all events - 195.

ENTRIES: Limited by sections; 16 men in each event.

STAFF: Meet managers are George Canrinus of San Francisco Academic Athletic
Association and Dave Snyder of Oakland Athletic League.

DEFENDING CHAMPION: Jefferson High School of Los Angeles (40 points).
