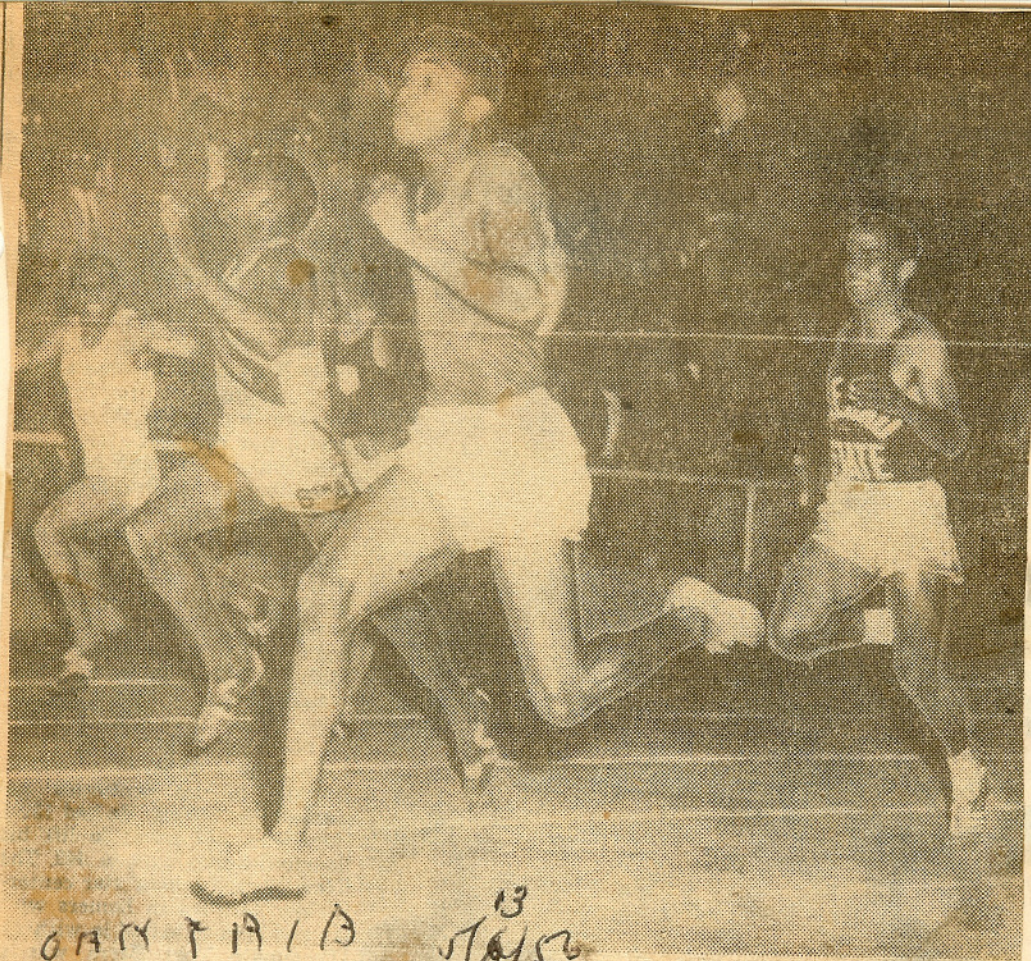

Texan Runs 9.2 Hundred, But Wind Nullifies Mark

FAYETTEVILLE (Ark.), May 12. — (AP) — Bobby Whilden of Texas ran 100 yards in 9.2 to better the world's record today to furnish the only record in a Southwest Conference track and field meet dominated by Texas.

Whilden's 100 cannot be submitted for a world record because he had a 9½-mile per hour wind at his back, but it will stand as a conference record. He also equalled a conference mark when he won the 220 in 20.4.

The world's 100-yard record is 9.3.

Texas captured the meet with 76 points with Texas A&M winding up second with 53½ and Baylor third with 52½.

Sime Nabs Triple

DURHAM, May 12.—(AP) —Duke's Dave Sime, who

ran the 220 yesterday in world record time of 20.1, broke the conference record today in the 220-yard low hurdles and won two other events to take individual honors in the Atlantic Coast Conference track and field championships. Maryland won the team title.

Sime, 19 year old sophomore whiz from Fair Lawn, N. J., who has bettered three world records this year, was clocked at :22.4 in the 220-yard low hurdles. He set a conference record dash with :09.5 and tied this in winning today.

Sime was awarded the Robert A. Fetzner award for being adjudged the outstanding athlete.

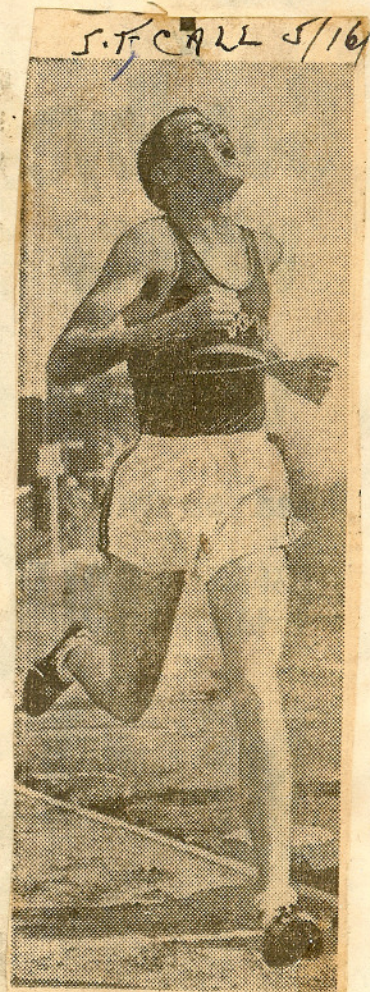
AAU's Hansen Loudly Booed At Fresno

FRESNO, May 13.—(AP) —Booing, starting low and gathering volume, greeted the introduction of AAU President Carl Hansen of Oakland at the West Coast relays here.

But he said today: "I'm used to it."

Last year a starter at the relays was miler Wes Santee who recently drew a lifetime suspension from the AAU, accused of getting too much expense money.

"Folks just don't realize the union is trying hard to completely eliminate any taint of professionalism from amateur athletics," said Hansen.

For King the University of California sophomore with unlimited speed, his was another masterpiece of competitive racing.

Overcoming a somewhat slow start, King put on a tremendous stretch drive to overcome all opposition and finish a clear cut two yard victor over Alex Burl, former Colorado A. & M. speedster now running for the Sixth Army.

AGOSTINI 5TH.

Far back and a poor fifth was Mike Agostini, the Fresno State ace by way of Trinidad, who, himself was caught in 9.3 last Saturday in the California Collegiate Athletic Association meet at Long Beach.

There was nothing that could prevent the Delano flash's name from going down in the record books alongside those of Mel Patton, who was the first to earn the clocking in 1948 on this same track; Hector Hogan of Australia, who turned the trick in 1954, and Northwestern's Jim Golliday who tied it last year.

Official measurements showed the aiding wind to be a whispering 1.4 miles per hour, well below the allowable 4.473.

KING DOUBTFUL.

What made King's race all the more brilliant was the fact that only last week he missed the big meet because of a tender ankle and because he had been able to do little more than jog and practice his starts this week.
