A high school junior and UCLA sprinter combined to help make the first annual Northern California Invitational Track and Field Meet a success in the eyes of some 1,500 track fans who were present at Sequoia's Terremere Field Saturday evening.

The prepster, Santa Clara's Larry Guilford, amazed coaches, athletes, officials and fans with a 14.6 victory in the high hurdles after high running a 14.9 preliminary heat, the first time he had ever been over the college height (42 inches) hurdles.


