Tabori, Henderson Vie in Mile July 19

REDWOOD CITY-The possibility of the fastest mile ever run in the Bay Area looked good today with the announcement that Hungarian Laszlo Tabori and Australian Alex Henderson will duel in the feature event of the Redwood City Track Carnival Saturday evening, July 19.

Tabori, who has a best-ever of 3:59, and Henderson, who has covered the four laps in 4:03.1 this season, both have set their sights on the fourminute mark.

Although Henderson, who attends Arizona State College, is best known for his marks in longer distances, he has let it be known that he feels he has a good mile in him and wants to get it out of his system in the Redwood City meet.

The lean Aussie set an American record of 8:46.3 in winning the NCAA two-mile at Berkeley and he took the National AAU 3-mile title in 13:37.1 at Bakersfield, edging Tabori in so-doing.

Tabori, who came to the United States as one of several Hungarian athletes who defected to the free world following the 1956 Olympic Games at Melbourne, has been aiming at the Redwood City meet for his top effort after lowering his season's best to 4:00.5 at Compton, where he finished second at Australia's Herb Elliott.

The Track Carnival, formerly known as the Northern California Invitational, draws entries from throughout the United States. It will be the climax to a three-day civic promotion, Sidewalk Days.

Tabori and Henderson will run in a special invitational mile race which will be held apart from the regular open mile and will be held early in the program to take advantage of the best track conditions possible on the Sequoia High School oval.

The remainder of the Invitational Mile field will be announced later.

3d Lap **Spoils** Sub-4 Meet Star S.C. Miler

RED WOOD CITY - Lazlo Tabori, Santa Clara Youth Village, withstood challenge by Jack Larsen to win the Redwood City Track and Field Carnival special invitational mile run Saturday night at Sequoia High School.

Tabori clocked 4:05.5, running a 59.8 final lap, to 4:05.8 for the surprising Larsen, who ran the second fastest race of his life.

Alex Henderson, Australian runner wearing an Arizona State uniform, took third in 4:16.1. Henderson, working on a construction job during the summer in the Palo Alto area, has been nursing a back injury. He announced this was his last race of the year.

The mile found Henderson setting the early pace, with the Australian and Tabori jockeying for the lead the next two trips around. Henderson led at the quarter in 60.1. Tabori was right behind in 60.2, and Larsen came in by 60.5.

Tabori nosed into the lead at the 880 mark in 2:02.3, with Henderson a step back in 2:02.4, and Larsen at 2:04.9. The runners were still on a sub-four minute pace, but a slow third lap ruined their chances. Tabori led with a 3:06.3 at three quarters. Henderson went by at 3:06.5, and Larsen 3:06.7.

Tabori opened up a five yard lead going into the back stretch with Larsen going past a fading Henderson at that point. Larsen closed the gap going into the final turn and took a momentary lead 100 yards from home. Tabori, however, had enough in reserve and went into the tape a stride ahead of Larsen.
