Farmer Stars in No. Coast

SUNNYVALE, May 24.—Despite record breaking performances by Larry Guilford and John Northway, Miramonte's one man track team, Dixon Farmer, stole the show during the North Coast Section championships here tonight.

Farmer won three eventsthe 440 in :48.7, broad jump at 22-734 and the 180 low hurdles in :19.2. This was good enough to give him second in the "team" standings with 24 points.

Berkeley amassed 27 for the title Palo Alto was third one

Guilford, a Santa Clara entry, set his record in the 120 high hurdles. He hit the tape in :14.4, one-tenth of a second under the mark established by Piedmont's Monte Upshaw and equaled by Joe Griffin of Ala-meda and Cebron Russ of Berkeley.
