

THE FIRST EASTER RELAYS

Many of the fine young athletes competing here today have been publicized as the finest in Northern California when actually they rank with the best in the nation.

One of these is Dixon Farmer, the all-around ace from Miramonte High School in Orinda. Farmer chalked up the third best effort of all time for a high school boy in the decathlon as well as stenciling his name last season on the national honor roll in the 440, low hurdles, broad jump and hop-step-jump.

Farmer won the state title in the 440 (48.6) and was second in the low hurdles (19.0) in 1958. Thus far this year he has run the 880 in 1:57.1, the 440 in 50.4, and the low barriers in 19.8. He will be much in evidence today in a number of events.

Though Farmer is the star shining brightest in today's constellation, don't take your eyes off a tremendous group of distance runners developed through an outstanding fall cross country program.

Emphasis today is on relay events and the national record most likely to fall is the 4-men 4-mile mark of 18:17.7 set in 1956 by a foursome from Grossmont (Calif.) High School. Palo Alto is capable of going well under 18 minutes by running their great George Linn (4:21.0), Mike Chilton (4:22.4), Mike Lehner (4:29.1) and Ric Brady (4:37.5).

The Great Central Valley promises to send a fast troupe in the form of a Fresno High School troupe in the two-mile relay. Highly regarded boys on this team are Eddie Hamlin, Valley cross country king who ran 4:28.8 in the mile in 1958, and Dick Woods.

Carlmont is one of the strong teams entered in the distance medley. The Scots will run a team consisting of Al McCain (52.3 in 440), Todd Ragsdale (2:01 in 880), Marion Haley (3:30 in 1320) and Jim Reams (4:33 in mile).

Los Altos will be a threat in any baton event it enters. The Knights have two standouts in miler Dave Boore (4:25.6) and half miler Robin Ruble (1:59.1). Both boys are juniors capable of doing much better and who probably will in tough competition. Serra of San Mateo also promises to make a good showing with Bill Yaley in the mile (4:23.0) and Steve Kelly, an ever-improving half-miler.

Competition is scheduled in all of the regular field events plus the 1000yard dash, high hurdles, and a special two-mile race.

Among the top entrants in the field events are discuss tossers Dave Weil of Las Lomas, Ron Snidow of San Rafael, Barry Rothman of Capuchino, Doug Schoenwetter of Fremont in Sunnyvale, Dave Nickel and Steve Barnett, Washington in Fremont.

High jump talent will be headed by Alameda's Steve Carnahan who has done 6-3½ already, plus Camden's Lynn Gold and Cubberley's Mike Nichols who have done 6-2 . Phil White of Carmel with a practice effort of 13-3 heads the pole vault field. Among a number of fine broad jumpers are Camden's Pete Dana at 22-5, and Palo Alto's John Pastenicks and Farmer who represented the North Coast Section in the state meet last year. Turlock terrors Mike Parker and Bob Stiles, both over 55-0, loom as the top shot putters.

We hope you enjoy the meet and will attend the many top events scheduled in the bay area during the remainder of the season.
