## King City Wins Track Meet; Cowboys Fourth

KING CITY-King City's Mustangs took the King City Invitational track and field meet here Saturday, Coach Roland Dickie's varsity, sparked by Don Schmidt, Lee Frudden, Jack Lafferty, and Lee Avila, piled up 211/2 points to win first place. Los Altos was second with 19 points, Madera, third, 18, and the Salinas Cowboys fourth, 171/2 points.

Then in order came Pittsburg 15, Monterey 14%, Sunnyvale 11, Campbell 11, San Luis Obispo 9 3/4, Palo Alto 9. Fremont 8, Santa Maria 7, Watsonville 7, Bellarmine 5, Live Oak 5, Mountain View 4, Andrew Hill 4, Carmel 2, Paso Robies 11/2, Santa Clara 3/4, and Santa Cruz 34.

In the lightweight division, Madera was first with 42 2/3 points. Next in line were Santa Maria 35 1/6, Watsonville 21 2/3, Santa Clara 21, Monterey 17, Mountain View 10 1/3, Fremont 81/2, Salinas 7 2/3, Bellarmine 7, Samuel Ayers 5, King City 4 1/6, Campbell 31/2. Gonzales 31/2. Carmel 3, Sunnyvale 2, Paso Robles 1, Andrew Hill 1, Arroyo Grande 1/2, Pacific Grove 1/6, Santa Cruz 1/6, San Luis Obispo 0, Willow Glen 0.

Gary Marinovich of Watsonville set a shot put record with a heave of 58 feet, 61/2 inches. The old mark of 51 feet, 934 inches was set in 1940 by Minini of Paso Robles.

Salinas coaches Gene Kinman and Jack Fourcade were pleased with the efforts of Danny Liston, Loren Hunt, Leo Arredondo and Lewis Adams in the 880 relay. They stepped the distance in 1:34.4, good for second place behind the winning Los Altos combination which won in 1:34.1.

Liston disappointed somewhat in the 100 and 220, but was up against a crack field.

Bill Allen had a long day against topflight competition in the pole vault before the

Cowboy won with a leap of 12 feet, 31/2 inches.

Competition provided the drive to spur Lewis Adams to his best efforts in the high and low hurdles. Adams turned the 180 lows in 20.6, good for fourth place, and the 120 highs in 15.5, a third place effort.

Don Roberts heaved the shot 51 feet, 1 inch after he had fouled with a toss of 53 feet, 21/2 inches. He placed fourth in the field which saw Marinovich set a new meet record which surpassed the one set in 1940.

Russ Kellum and Dave Guardino ran the fastest miles of their careers and yet didn't place in an exceptionally star-studded field. Kellum came in in 4:42.40 and Guardino in 4:50.8, Boore of Los Altos won the mile in 4:25.5.

In the lightweight division Kinman and Fourcade praised the high jumping of Darryl Young who tied with three others for first at 5 feet, 7 inches.

Hank Cassady and Pat Mahin hit their highest leaps in the pole vault at 11 feet. Bob Diamond of Watsonville set a record jump of 12 feet, 21/4 inches.

Coaches in the meet congratulated King City mentor Roland Dickie for a wellplanned, well-run meet. Pittsburg held a meet Friday and left for King City immediately after and stayed overnight in a King City motel to rest for Saturday's meet.

Madera tracksters left at 31

a.m. in order to arrive in King City in time to compete.

CCAL coaches were "awed" at the size of invading lightweights. Some areas apparently do not weigh their lightweight athletes after the initial September weigh-in, which allows room for "expansion." CCAL and North Coast section track men are weighed the first week of March.

Fourcade was keenly disappointed when a foul was called on ace 1,310 runner Bobby Ramirez, Officials said Ramirez was guilty of shoving early in the race while jockeying for position. He ran the best of his career to come second in the good time of 3:23. Fourcade pointed out that Ramirez was surrounded by a huge field when the officials pegged him for "shoving."
