MacArthur Lane of Fremont accounted for the other meet record with a toss of 56 feet 11 inches in the shot put. The old mark was 55-5½ by Oakland's Nick Sims in 1957.

The Tigers got the meet's only sweep when Jack Cope-land and John McAllister finished second and third behind Lane in the shot. Lane also captured the pole vault.

Whitfield won the highs in 14.6 and the lows in 19.3, both times being helped by a slight wind. Tech's Jerry Bridges finished second in both races.
