Ironically, all three divi-sions were won by two point margins. Poly wrapped up the margins. Poly wrapped up the 130 pound title, nipping Wash-ington, 43-41, while Lincoln edged Lowell in the 120 cate-gory, 36-34. Washington grabbed the overall crown with 96½ points to second place Mission's 821/2.

Besides Mitchell's two recbesides Mitchell's two rec-ords, the high jump standard fell in the 130 pound class and the 660 mark tumbled in the 120 division. The 130's 120 yard low hurdles record was tied and a few more marks were missed by tenths of a second second.

Mitchell was the outstand-ing performer before an esti-mated crowd of 3,000 chilled spectators as he established two new records in the high two new records in the high and low hurdles. However, the excitement of the afternoon didn't, by any means, begin and end with the hurdle races.

Mission had to go down to the final event—the 880 relay —to gobble up the v a r s i t y crown, beating Washington's onrushing Eagles by a mere two points, 38½ to 36½.

MISSION BREEZED

The two schools were tied, 33½ to 33½, until Mission's re-lay quartet breezed to a 1:32.2 first place finish in the half mile relay ahead of Balboa and Washington in that order. VARSITY
