Mrs. Brown, a 24-year-old Seattle junior high school teacher, sped through the 830 in 2:08.5, a new women's world indoor record. This eclipsed the 2:08.6 mpt by Zsaba of Hungary.

It was clear from the outset that Lindgren and Paillie had the two-mile to themselves. Baillie, in his initial outing this winter indoor season tour, took charge at the outset and led the first six laps.

Lindgren, wo till be a WSU junior this week, sped to the forefront on the backstretch of the seventh lap, and was never headed. The two were not separated by more than two yeards until Lindgren burst shead on the 20th with warming.

The municipal duo sprinted the remaining distance on the 160yard track but Gerry proved to have the greater reserve. Baillie was 25 yards back at the finish and was timed in 8:37 .

Tindgren's effort is the third best two-mile ever run indoors.

Ron Clarke of Australia holds the world mark of 8:28.8 and Jim Bestty is the American record holder in 8:30.8.

Baillie's leading solit for the first quarter was 63, and he hit leading the half in 2:08. The reafter, Gerry's quarter times were 3:13, 4:16, 5:19.5,6:27; and 7:33. Both lost contact with the field after the ninth lap when they surged to a 30% yard lead.

It was a race in which such a pair of outstanding performances might end to be expected, although it was billed as the top event of meet.
