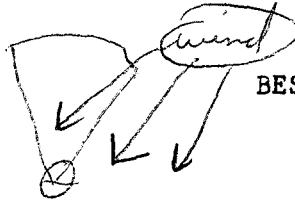

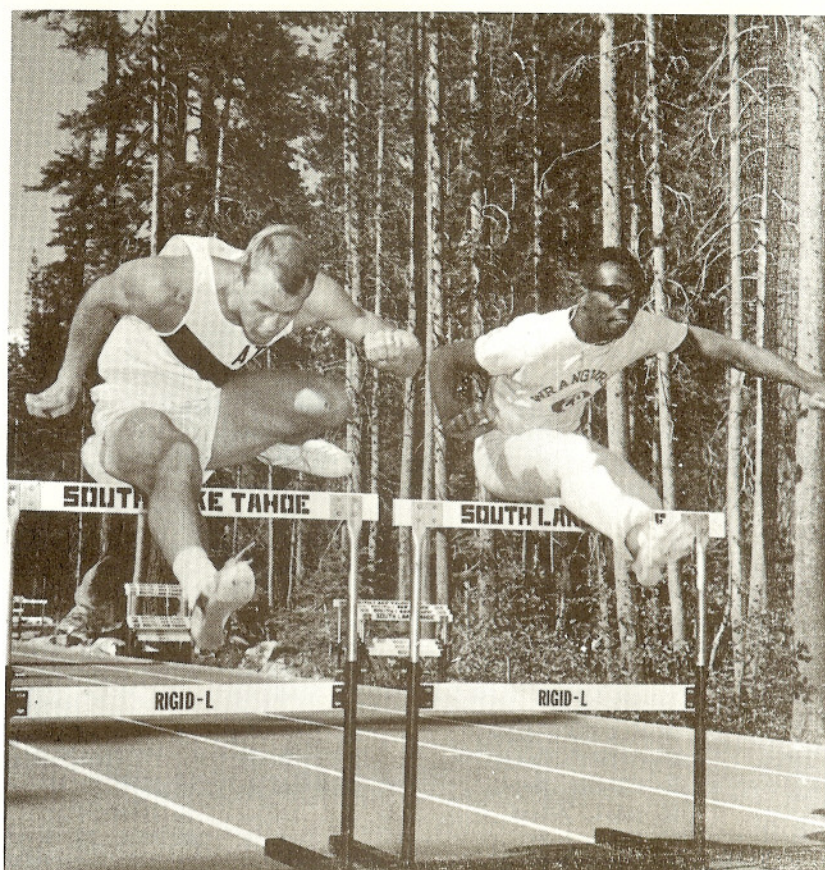

Evans' mark is as good as the Olympic record at the distance and, when Lee emerged from minutes under oxygen, he predicted a world record at the Mexico City Olympics in October.

Evans' performance came at a meet among U.S. Olympic hopefuls just three weeks before the final trials at this specifically constructed track which is at the same elevation as Mexico City.

"My lungs are really burning," Evans said after the

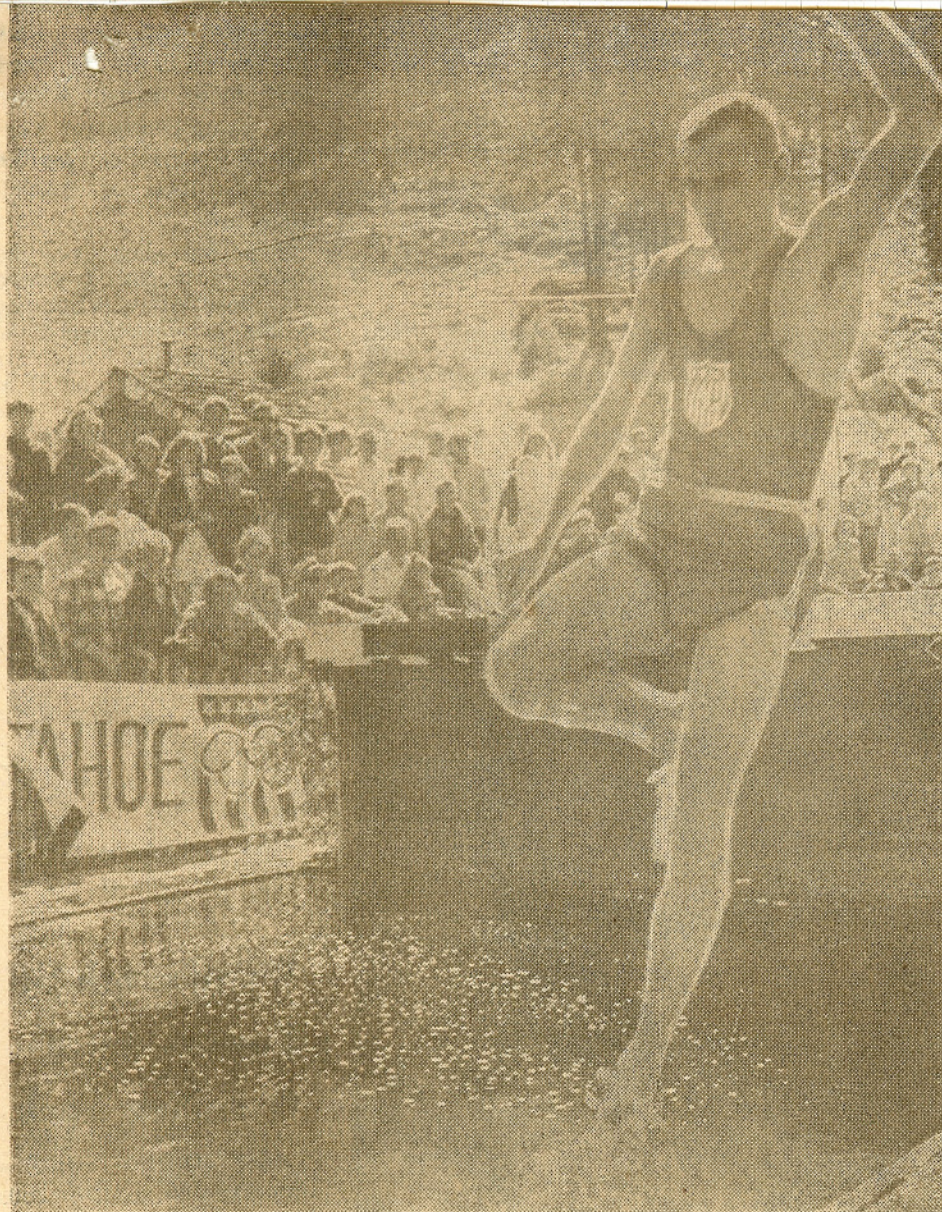
race. "I want to run to 44.7 here for the trials and 44.3 at Mexico. I think I can do it after today."
