I tried a new start for the first tie today, so that accounts for my slow start. I'm sure eventually it will come around and will help my over all race. On my 28-day trip to Europe I ran a total of 23 races.

I realize 13.7 isn't great time but I felt so good and strang that the actual time doesn't bother me one bit.

## WAYNE COLLETT--440

I felt real good. I put on one real good drive in the stretch and & could have held it longer if necessary. But I eased up near the end. I we been working pretty hard at UCLA but only for the past two weeks. I'll be going up to Tahoe on Monday.

# RON FREEMAN--440

I'm pooped. It was hard work all the way but it's a real honor to beat a guy like Lee Evans. It's the first time in about eight tries this year. I really didn't think I could do it but my good lead in the stretch did it. I've been working hard back home in New Jersey and will go to Tahoe tomorrow.

### JON VAUGHN--Pole Vault

This is a paradox but it's nothing new with me. I really didn't feel 'up' for today's meet. But I didn't feel real well before the first time I cleared 17ft indoors. But once the competition got under way today I suddenly felt great. I had a lot og good jumps, including one at 17-81. I still say any one of four U.S. vaulters can clear 18 feet on any given day now. I wouldn't be surprised if it happened before the year is out. I was vaulting with a new pole today. I've used it only since last Tuesday, so I was surprised to get the feel of it so soon. I'll be going up to Tahoe next Friday.

### JIM HINES--220

This is the first real workout I've had since the L.A. Trials. I've worked out just a little, lightly, because of the injury in my thigh. Even today I played it safe. I ran hard off the blocks and off the curve but went into a glide down the stretch. I'll be going up to Tahoe next week. I think I can run 19.9 before the season endds.

### JIM RYUN--mile

I feel fine about everything except that somebody swiped my shoes.

But the race went fine. I did feel flat at the start and was concerned that the first two lap times were so slow. They felt faster. I felt heavy. I wasn't too concerned when Divine came up to me, I expected that. But I was still concerned about that last drive, I opened up with about 500 yards to go, and really let it all out with 300 yards left. I must admit I felt real good and strong coming down the stretch. But there is still a long way to go. Mostly, I need speed work now. That's what I will be working on when I get back up to Flagstaff next week. I'll be there two weeks, then go to Tahoe, My weight is back up to normal, about 165.

### GEORGE YOUNG--5000

I had hoped to run faster but really there's nothing wrong with 13:38. I felt good all the way, strong and relaxed. I suppose I could have knocked off at least five seconds if I had started to take the lead with about three laps to go. But that's not the type of tactics you can do in Mexico City so there was no use in trying it here. Actually, I'm not sure which event I will try for in the final trials at Tahoe. I may even try for a double in the steeplechase and 500. But that's really tough.

# Ryun Runs 3:55.9 for Mile Triumph

Shows No Trace of May Illness in Mt. Sac Race

Jim Ryun erased any doubt about his complete recovery from mononucleosis in the Olympic Development track and field meet at Mt. San Antonio College Saturday night.

Running his first big competitive race since being stricken last May, the world's finest middle distance racer turned on a 55.1 final quarter to win the mile in the excellent time of 3:55.9.

The Kansas Flyer, whose world record is 3:51.1, led the field from the start with one brief lapse in the second lap, and finished 15 yards ahead of Roscoe Divine of Oregon.

"I was a little heavy at the start, but I am very pleased with my performance," said the handsome Jayhawker. "I wasn't the least bit exhausted. What I needed now is some speed work."

Ryun's was not the only comeback performance that made United States Olympic coach Payton Jordan happy.

### Mills Wins

Billy Mills, Olympic 10,000 meter victor in 1964, ran away from the field at that distance in 28:43.6, the fastest by any American this year. The San Diego insurance salesman had missed the trials in Los Angeles because of a sore back.

George Young, who set American records in the two mile and steeple-chase in June, fell only a little short of a third here when he was clocked in 13:38.8 for 5,000 meters.

The feature in the field events was the pole vaulting of Jon Vaughn of UCLA. Handicapped earlier in the season by a sore back, the Bruin cleared 17-5, the fifth best performance in the world.

The Bruin almost cleared 17-8½ on his third try for a world record, flicking the bar off with his arm.

Ryun's pleasure with his performance in the mile and his clocking of 3:40.5 for 1,500 meters was dimmed by the fact that somebody stole his shoes and some prized pictures while he was unwinding after the race.
