
Quinet enters Golden West long jump event

SACRAMENTO - Homestead High School's Phil Quinet, California's second best long jumper, will be trying harder here Saturday night to improve his marks against the top prep track talent in the nation in the ninth annual Golden West Invitation.

Quinet, who leaped 24-5¾ in the state meet, will compete against seven other top preps in one of the sixteen events that have drawn 120 entrants from 28 states and Puerto Rico.

Puerto Rico's lone entry quarter miler Juan Franceschi, who electrified the track world in 1967 with a fourth place finish in 400 meter in the Pan American Games with a time of 46.0. He will be tested by four speed-sters who have run the quarter principally in 47.0 or better, Compton's Edesell Garrison, who won the state title in 46.7.

Perhaps the top entrant in the field events is shot putter Sam-my Walker of Dallas' Samuel High School. Walker has put the 12-pound shot 72-31/4 and has bettered the old prep standard of 69-6 eight times this season.
